



MEMORANDUM FOR CAPT. BUTLER, U.S.N.

In reply to your request for information regarding clothing items from Allied sources:

- a) - The Ministry of Marine does not yet know the prices in dollars or sterling at which these items are charged by Allied Authorities.
- b) - Clothing from Allied stocks is not sufficient for a regular periodical distribution to all naval personnel. It is therefore necessary to integrate it with other items of local production bought at current prices.
- c) - For the above stated reasons the "Direzione di Commissariato Militare Marittimo" has fixed average prices. The excess in price for clothing items from Allied sources will compensate the loss on the prices fixed for clothing items of local production and will so enable all Naval personnel to have clothing at moderate prices.

In accordance with the Commander in Chief, Mediterranean's  
Mr. War. 305/8/1 of 13th March, 1944, Superintending Victualing  
Stores Officer, Malta has shipped considerable quantities of salvaged  
clothing to Naples. At the commencement 557 B.O.D. accepted these  
consignments but showed growing reluctance to do so, stating finally  
that they could only accept army type garments. Arrangements were  
therefore made direct with the Allied Military Government Commerce  
Division at Naples Commune for its disposal - Navy Sub-Commission's  
Letter No. NSC/2158 of 17th April, 1945, not to the Commander in  
Chief, Mediterranean or the Flag Officer, Taranto Adriatic & Liaison,  
Italy, refers.

2. Allied Military Government required that the wear should be  
sorted into the following categories: wool garments, cotton garments,  
footwear, and non-clothing (i.e. sunhats and mattresses), and that  
all packages should be weighed. Transport to A.M.G. agents had for the  
most part also to be supplied by the Royal Navy.  
A.M.G. are paying 20 lire per pound for items delivered; the  
initial price was 10 lire for cotton and 35 lire for woollen clothing  
per pound but sorting and classification difficulties render a  
standard price necessary.
3. It is, however, considered that the present system of  
returning salvaged clothing to A.M.G. or the Allied Commission for  
repair and distribution is most unsatisfactory, on account of the  
price paid for the salvaged clothing and the price and the general  
standard of the "repaired" article when received for issue. It is  
believed that Allied Commission pays only 20 lire per pound for the  
clothing which is considerably less than would be obtained in any  
normal market.

4. Furthermore the clothing which has been received from  
Allied Commission for sale to civilians purposes has been of a

Allied Military Government required that the gear should be sorted into the following categories: wool garments, cotton garments, footwear, and non-clothing (i.e. sunhelmets and mattresses), and that all packages should be weighed. Transport to A.M.G. agents had for the most part also to be supplied by the Royal Navy.  
A.M.G. are paying 20 lire per pound for items delivered; the initial price was 10 lire for cotton and 35 lire for woolen clothing per pound but sorting and classification difficulties rendered a standard price necessary.
3. It is, however, considered that the present system of returning salvaged clothing to A.M.G. or the Allied Commission for repair and distribution is most unsatisfactory, on account of the price paid for the salvaged clothing and the price and the general standards of the "repaired" article when received for issue. It will be noted that Allied Commission pays only 20 lire per pound for the clothing which is considerably less than would be obtained in any normal market.
4. Furthermore the clothing which has been received from Allied Commission for sale to civilian employees, has been of a deplorable quality and both at Leghorn and at Naples less than 50 per cent could be disposed of despite the general shortage of civilian clothing. Not only was it dirty and carelessly repaired so that much intrinsically good material was wasted, but the prices laid down for its sale were too high. For example 100 lire was asked for old, crudely patched underpants, and 110 lire for excellentlycombe vests. The difference in the price paid by A.M.G. for the garments and that which is required by them from the civilian purchasers is remarkable, and the present system of collection, repair and delivery involves risks of waste, loss and possible mal-practice.

5. From experience gained it is not considered that the clothing obtained from Allied Commission for re-sale to civilians is worth the trouble of collecting. Neither does it seem desirable nor in the interests of the service to dispose of salvaged service clothing to Allied Commission at the present uneconomic price.

6. It is again submitted for consideration that service salvaged clothing should be repaired and altered for issue by the service to civilian employees direct (Commander in Chief, Mediterranean M.C. Med. 45/02100/34 of 2nd March and previous correspondence re:vers). If half issue price plus the cost of alterations were charged to purchasers the charge to them would be considerably less than at present, and receipts by the service considerably greater. Moreover it would be ensured that a fair proportion of the more suitable and useful garments did pass into the possession of Italian civilians who are known to have contributed actively and directly to the allied cause.

7. If the above recommendation cannot be approved it is submitted that authorities shipping salvaged clothing to Naples may be instructed in future to arrange for it to be sorted and packed as follows:-

- (a) Only items of one category to be placed in one container
- (b) Containers to be marked with description of contents stating whether cotton or wool.
- (c) Net weight of contents to be marked on containers.

The average consignment from Malta consists of four hundred bales, and the task of sorting, repacking and weighing is beyond Marlies resources and the difficulties of preventing pilferage are almost insurmountable.

1. The Royal Navy has a quantity of clothing which it wishes to dispose of through regular channels. It has been offered to M.M.I.A. as A.F.R.C. regulation requires but as M.M.I.A. is only interested in the Italian Army it has refused the offer.

2. The clothing in turn has been offered to this Sub Commission which has accepted it and instructed that it be turned over to Commerce Division, Naples.

3. This clothing will be consigned in the same way as the clothing available from M.M.I.A. A receiving report will be given to the Royal Navy in which cotton clothing will be credited at the price of 10 lire per pound and wool clothing 35 lire per pound. Copies of this receiving report will be forwarded, according to established procedure, to the Chief Accountant, A.G., who will make the necessary debits to the Italian Government.

4. You may expect a visit from the Base Supply Officer, Royal Navy, Naples in the near future in order that arrangements for delivery and collection may be made.

1. In recent weeks demands for repaired army clothing and boots have been diminishing steadily. At the same time it has been increasingly difficult for Commerce Sub-Commission to find trained personnel for carrying on the reprocessing of salvaged garments.





While the proposals in paragraph 6 of Naval Officer-in-Charge, Naples' letter are appreciated, the continued reduction of Royal Navy personnel in Italy and the consequent discharge of civilian employees, does not justify the setting up of an organisation, in Italy, for the repair and issue of salvaged clothing by the Service, at this stage. Unless it is intended therefore, that the Italian Government should continue to benefit by the use of this clothing, it is for consideration whether future consignments from Malta should be re-directed to Greece or Alexandria for disposal after processing.

1. In recent weeks demands for repaired army clothing and boots have been diminishing steadily. At the same time it has been increasingly difficult for Commerce Sub Commission to find trained personnel for carrying on the reprocessing of salvaged garments.

2. Therefore it has been decided to transfer the supervision of the repairing process and the work of allocating the finished garments to the Italian Government. Thus in the future the Istituto Nazionale per il Comercio Estero will exercise control over the reprocessing of clothing and shoes and all allocations will be made by the Ministry of Industry and Commerce. Commerce Sub Commission will no longer be responsible for either repairing or allocating.

3. Thus in the future there will be no further weekly allocations made to your office by this Sub Commission. If clothing and boots are still needed for civilian employees under your supervision than your request for the same should be forwarded to the a/m Ministry via your corresponding agency in the Italian Government. No further requests for these items ~~will~~ be accepted by this Sub Commission.

NOTE OF REPAIRED SALVAGED CLOTHING TO CIVILIANS.

N.Y.

In accordance with the Commander in Chief, Mediterranean's  
Mc. Ed. 905/8/1 of 13th March, 1944, Superintending Victualing  
clothing to Naples. At the commencement 557 B.O.D. accepted these  
consignments but showed great reluctance to do so, stating finally  
that they could only accept army type garments. Arrangements were  
therefore made direct with the Allied Military Government Commerce  
Division at Naples Committee for its disposal - Very Sub-Commission  
Letter No. MSC/2152 of 17th April, 1945, not to the Com under  
Chief, Mediterranean or the Flag Officer, Taranto Adriatic & liaison,  
Italy, refers.

2. Allied Military Government required that the gear should be  
sorted into the following categories: wool garments, cotton garments,  
footwear, and non-clothing (i.e. umbrellas and raincoats), and  
that all packages should be weighed. Transport to A.M.G. agents  
and for the most part also to be supplied by the Royal Navy.  
A.M.G. are paying 20 lire per pound for items delivered; the  
initial price was 10 lire for cotton and 3 lire for woollen clothing  
per pound but sorting and classification difficulties rendered a  
standard price necessary.

3. It is, however, considered that the present standard "80"  
returning salvaged clothing to A.M.G. or the allied Commission for

## SALE OF REPAIRED SALVAGED CLOTHING TO CIVILIANS.

N.T. In accordance with the Comander-in-Chief, Mediterranean Victim Clothing Stores Officer, Malta was shipped considerable quantities of salvaged clothing to Naples. At the commandant's (557 H.C.) accepted these consignments but showed great reluctance to do so, stating finally that they could only accept army type garments. Arrangements were therefore made direct with the Allied Military Government Commerce Division at Naples' Command for its disposal - NAVY Sub-Commissioner Letter No. NMC/2198 of 17th April, 1945, not to the Comander-in-Chief, Mediterranean or the Flag Officer, Taranto territorial division, Italy, refers.

2. Allied Military Government required that the gear should be sorted into the following categories: wool garments, cotton garments, footwear, and non-clothing (i.e. sunhats and mattresses), and that all packages should be labelled. Transport to A.M.G. agents had for the most part also to be supplied by the Royal Navy. A.M.G. are paying 20 lire per pound for items delivered; the initial price was 10 lire for cotton and 3 lire for woollen clothing per pound but sorting and classification difficulties rendered a standard price necessary.

3. It is, however, considered that the present system of ~~system of~~  
returning salvaged clothing to A.M.G. or the Allied Commission for repair and distribution is most unsatisfactory, on account of the price paid for the salvaged clothing and the price and the general standard of the "repaired" article when received for issue. It will be noted that Allied Commission pays only 20 lire per pound for the clothing which is considerably less than would be obtained in any normal market.

4. Furthermore the clothing which has been received from Allied Commission for sale to civilian employees, has been of a deplorable quality and both at Taranto and at Naples less than ten per cent could be disposed of despite the general shortage of civilian clothing. Not only was it dirty and carelessly repaired so that much intrinsically good material was wasted, but the prices laid down for its sale were too high. For example 100 lire was asked for old, crudely patched underpants, and 110 lire for especially coarse vests. The difference in the price paid by A.M.G. for the garments and that which is required by them from the civilian merchandisers is remarkable, and the present system of collection, repair and delivery involves risks of waste, loss and possible mal-practice.

5. Your experience gained it is not considered that the clothing obtained from Allied Commission for re-sale to civilians is worth the trouble of collecting. Neither does it seem desirable nor in the interests of the service to dispose of salvaged service clothing to Allied Commission at the present un-economical price.


6. It is again submitted for consideration that service salvaged clothing should be repaired and altered for issue by the service to civilian employees direct (Commander in Chief, Mediterranean). If half issue price plus the cost of alterations were charged to purchasers the charge to them would be considerably less than at present, and receipts by the service considerably greater. Moreover it would be ensured that a fair proportion of the more suitable and useful garments would remain in the possession of Italian civilians who are known to have contributed greatly and deserve the allied cause.

7. If the above recommendation cannot be approved it is submitted in future to arrange for it to be sorted and packed as follows:-

- (a) Only items of one category to be placed in one container
- (b) Containers to be marked with description of contents stating whether cotton or wool.
- (c) Net weight of contents to be marked on containers.

This storage arrangement from Salvoe consists of four hundred boxes, and the task of sorting, repacking and weighing is beyond Republic resources and the difficulties of preventing pilferage are almost insurmountable.



- (b) Containers to be marked with description of contents stating whether cotton or wool.
- (c) Net weight of contents to be marked on containers.

This severe congestion from Maine consists of four hundred boxes, and the task of sorting, repacking and weighing is beyond Naples resources and the difficulties of preventing pilferage are almost insurmountable.

1. The Royal Navy has a quantity of clothing which it wishes to dispose of through regular channels. It has been offered to R.M.I.A. as A.P.H., regulations requires but as R.M.I.A. is only interested in the Italian Army it has refused the offer.

2. The clothing in turn has been offered to this Sub-Commission which has accepted it and instructed that it be turned over to Commerce Division, Naples.

3. This clothing will be consigned in the same way as the clothing available from R.M.I.A. A receiving report will be given to the Royal Navy in which cotton clothing will be credited at the price of 10 lire per pound and wool clothing 35 lire per pound. Copies of this receiving report will be forwarded, according to established procedure, to the Chief Accountant, A.C., who will make the necessary debits to the Italian Government.

4. You may expect a visit from the Base Supply Officer, Royal Navy, Naples in the near future in order that arrangements for delivery and collection may be made.

It is recommended that approval be given for the transfer, by local arrangement in Naples, of all available materials to the Commerce Sub Division, Southern Region, Allied Commission, P.M.G.Q. Building, Naples, for transport and disposal. The allocations of used clothing by the Commerce Sub Commission will, as heretofore, be made in favour of the Royal Supply Officers, Taranto, Naples and Leghorn. In accordance with the procedure outlined in my 221101 February, a copy of which is enclosed for the information of the Comander-in-Chief, Mediterranean Station.

4. If this arrangement is acceptable, the Commerce Sub Commission will be so informed and requested to take over all material supplied to the Southern Region Sub Division by the Royal Supply Officer, Naples, on the terms stated in paragraph two above.

DISPOSAL OF UNSERVICEABLE UNIFORM CLOTHING

With reference to Med. 905/8/1 of 13th March, 1944, discussed clothing from Naval sources is held at Naples, including a recent consignment of 355 bags from Malta.

2. In view of the great shortage of clothing among civilian employees, it is submitted that approval may be given for this clothing to be repaired for issue to civilian employees of the Royal Navy at Naples and Leghorn.
3. Arrangements would be made for all items to be stamped with a distinguishing mark and a phrase such as "AUTHORISED CIVILIAN ISSUE" and the employees concerned would be issued with a pass. All uniform badges, buttons, etc., would of course be removed.
4. It is suggested that issue should be on repayment the actual cost of alterations, marking and repairs. Any form of loan issue would be quite impracticable to enforce, as there would be no means of ensuring muster and eventual return of items on loan and concerned could in no way be supervised by British personnel and would, if left to Italian civilians be inefficiently and probably dishonestly performed.





Of the allocations made to Royal Navy, Leghorn, by Commerce Sub Division, Economics and Supply Division, clothing specified by Issue Vouchers numbered U/20, 42, 48, b3 bis, 69, 96 and 94 were collected in accordance with the conditions of issue, deposits of cash were made with the Banca d'Italia, Naples, £ 174080 Lire and 134930 Lire in order that these issues could be collected from the warehouse, with the exception of Issue No. 94 for which deferred payment was permitted. Banca d'Italia's receipts No. 108 of 8th March and No. 121 of 28th March are held for these deposits which, hitherto held as open vouchers, are now shown in Leghorn Cash Account for June 1945 under voucher numbers 15/2 and 15/3.

3. Of this clothing, garments to the value of 63810 Lire were sold, others, consisting of 95 Field Jackets and 174 Trousers & Gloves of a total value of 42990 Lire were not available for collection (Appendix A) and various garments which were transported by sea (Appendix B) to the value of 14810 were lost in transit from the warehouse at Naples to the Clothing Store at Leghorn. This deficiency is attributed to the system of issuing at fumigated Contraf. Warehouse Naples. The clothing was not baled but was made up in loose bundles of ten, the staff and working party consisting entirely of Italians. It was not possible to effect an accurate check of the amounts collected until the master at Leghorn. The Commerce Division in Naples launders and disinfects all clothing, repairs it and dyes it black per order of Allied Force Headquarters. No clothing is released or allocated until it is reprocessed into the best condition possible. The price of each garment when sold to the worker covers only the cost of repair, 74/- laundering, dyeing, etc., and it is held to an absolute minimum.

It is known by this office that this clothing is not of superior quality but it is allocated with the idea of usefully serving heavy workers when doing dirty out-of-door labour and as a means of saving good clothing if they have any. It is sold at a small cost as it would seem worth the price if considered from this point of view. Furthermore many thousands of garments have been allocated by Commerce Sub Commission for this purpose.


