

Reference is made to your letter of 30 Jun numbered

1. From the facts as outlined by the Navy Sub Commission, Headquarters Allied Commission, the problem of ensuring that lighthouse personnel receive regular supplies of rations would appear to be one of distribution rather than provision, and unlikely to be solved by changing the source of supply.
2. In the circumstances therefore, we regret that we are unable to agree to the issue of military rations to the civilians concerned.

A submission has recently been received from the Ministry of War that certain civilian personnel are suffering undue hardship as a result of the strict application of the allied ruling that no civilians can be entitled to draw armed forces rations.

2. It would appear that, prior to the allied occupation of Italy, the Corps of Navigational Aids Personnel, being a highly organized body entrusted with the manning and maintenance of lighthouses and living as they so often do, in isolated and inaccessible places far removed from inhabited localities, were permitted to draw naval rations from Italian naval sources.

3. In these circumstances, observing the ill feeling and discontent liable to arise from withholding such rations, it is submitted that an exception might well be made of the undersigned personnel, to avoid any possibility of dislocation of this important and vital service.

Civilian personnel of the Italian R.Navy to whom rations are issued on the basis of preexisting agreements between Maristat and F.O.L.I. -

Due to the attached message from the Ministry of War, it is requested that the above mentioned agreements be confirmed by an authorization from M.M.I.A.

1. 403 Lighthouse men.

Civilians of militarized status that carry out duties of the utmost importance also for the Allies. As they usually live in areas which are distant from inhabited centers, they are attached to the nearest military mess from which they periodically get raw food.

✓ 2. 7 Lighthouse workmen travelling on duty

They are workmen specialized in lighthouse repair work, to whom rations are issued when they are travelling on repair work duty. There is an average of seven workmen out on duty every day.

✗ 3. 31 workmen with orders for work out of town 3373

They are mostly Navy workmen detailed to telephone and telegraph line reconstruction or repair, and are obliged to live for long periods in out of the way places with no possibility of finding food. There is an average of 31 of these workmen out every day.

4. 6 militarized civilians on pontoon GA 267

who form the crew of this craft and rations were issued to them after receiving a request from NOIC Ischia.

5. 32 Civilians depending from the Taranto dockyard on

Land Forces Sub Commission A.C. (M.M.I.A.) has re-confirmed instructions that "no Italian unit can draw victualling stores for civilian personnel, even if the victualing of such personnel has been ordered by Allied Commands other than M.M.I.A."

This Ministry is to be immediately advised of any such orders.

Commanding officers of units will be responsible for the withdrawing of victualling stores not in conformity with these instructions.

Any victualling of civilian personnel even if ordered by Allied Commands must cease immediately and be reported to this Ministry.

1. Levent Reval Command informed on 1st ulto. that I.R.N. personnel stationed at Haifa are not receiving the cigarette-match ration as arranged nor the recent increase in flour ration to 15 ounces.

2. Moreover, said Command informs of considerable discontent felt by subordinate personnel due to their being unable to purchase N.A.A.F.I. supplies due to local restrictions which only authorize such purchases when local market prices are "prohibitive".


3. Considering that cigarette-match issue and increased flour ration are established by Allied Authorities, request you kindly bring this fact to the notice of Haifa local Authorities so that such rations be issued to Italian personnel stationed there.

4. At the same time it is requested that said personnel be enabled to purchase N.A.A.F.I. goods, within limits, in view of the fact that due to shortage of local currency (3 Palestinian pounds per mensem), local market prices, so far as I.R.N. personnel are concerned, are practically "prohibitive".



With reference to the Ministry's letter No. 34.5927 of the 25th March, 1945, an investigation into the records of the Allied Detailed Issue Depots concerned reveals that rations have been properly issued on the authorized scale.

1. It is pointed out that food rations from Allied source to outlying I.R.N. Commands on the Adriatic side and particularly at Termoli are not allocated (as we have requested F.O.L.I. to do on numerous occasions) on the basis of the full ration as distributed to Allied Forces personnel.

2. As a result of this, I.R.N. has to make up the supplies to these localities and due to the lack of transport, difficulties and delays occur.

3. Under these conditions the advantages of direct supplying by the Allies to I.R.N. personnel in Adriatic and Tyrrhenian outlying areas - as proposed by F.O.L.I. in letter N°L.182/1 of 16th Aug. last - practically disappear. It is requested, therefore, that Authorities concerned be asked to issue the full ration to above personnel as received by Allied Forces, i.e., "non-combat scale".
