On 4th January 1944 as indicated in Requisitioning Note No. 657700 you requisitioned a diver's pump, property of this Company, with accessories acting through H.O.I.C. Ravenna represented by Lieutenant R. Alexander R.N. Commanding Officer.

As this irreplaceable equipment is indispensable for the execution of any reconstruction work whatsoever to the quays and moles in Ravenna harbour, which have been destroyed by acts of war, and as furthermore the reasons for which this material can be of interest to A.M.G. no longer exist, the undersigned now requests that you will approach the Commands concerned in order that it may be restored.

Should it prove impossible to trace the machinery in question the undersigned begs to request that another similar pump may be returned to him.

For your assistance, this equipment was at Marghera (Venice) until 20th August last, whence it appears to have been taken to Naples subsequently.

As you already know, following the report made by Lt.Col. Colloerto, it would be of great importance for the work of the Ancona Navy Yards that the Allied Authorities consented to leave some material and machinery belonging to the Allied Forces and up to now used for the work needed by the same Allied Powers.

The machinery is the following:

Movable Machinery

- No. 6 trucks of 3 tons.
- " 2 and 3 self moving cranes No. 1 of the petroelectric type (petrol motor-powered generator and electric motor) on rubber wheels (Ropier)
- " 2 cranes of the link belt type carrying from 3 to 6 tons
- " 1 motor air compressor
- " 1 electric (welder)

Construction material

It would be necessary to ask the Allied Navy to leave in the Navy Yard the greatest possible amount of material like : bolts, nails, gaskets, wood (boards and beams), varnishes, 200 tons of cement (which is stored on the sunner); corrugated sheet iron, tar paper, asphalt, tar and other various materials which are stowed near the "Officina Pelli Presenti" in the San Clemente area. This material is held by the Officer in charge of works.

This material is held by the Officer in charge of works.

Allotment Equipment

A part from the request of the above mentioned construction material, it would be important to obtain the allotment of supplies for the navy repair work such as plate iron and section iron or common gages (plates 5 to 10 mm, thick angle iron and bulk iron of W, P 40 and K, P 80).

The little quantity left (about 150 tons) is almost null compared to the quantity used during the year passed under the control of the British Navy in which period on behalf of the Army and Navy 950 tons of material was used.

Other Material

In the present situation it is most important to have material such as POL for the work of the Navy Yard, therefore it would be well if, while expecting a regular assignment by the Italian and Allied Authorities, in the meantime the British Navy will give us the following supplies :
