3. In the event that urgent essential stores cannot be supplied from Italian sources, the Navy Sub Commission should be advised in order that possibilities of issue from Royal Navy stocks may be examined.

Supply of Medical Stores
to the Italian Battleship Group.

The attached demands, two in number, from the Officer Commanding, Italian Battleship Group are submitted for instructions as to whether this Establishment is to undertake responsibility for supply.

2. The estimated cost of complying with these demands, in so far as supplies are available and can be spared, is approximately £130 for the 'Vittorio Veneto' and £120 for the 'Italia'.

3. In the event of supply being authorised, the question arises as to whether the terms of Admiralty message timed 151950 November 1945 as promulgated in Mediterranean Temporary Memorandum No. 652 'Supplies and Services to Foreign Governments on Pre-Payment' are to be considered applicable to supplies to the Italian Government, and in the absence of specific information, a ruling is requested on the matter.

On the grounds of lack of sufficient accommodation in V.D. female wards at the Italian Civil Hospital, Taranto, a request was made by the Medico Privinciale and Director of the Hospital via the Provost Marshal, 52 Area that permission could be given to return prostitutes who were domiciled ex Taranto to their home towns for treatment.

This was referred to me for opinion and I strongly disapproved of the suggestion. Subsequently I visited the hospital accompanied by the D.A.D.H. and inspected the wards.

I found that the trouble was not so much a matter of lack of accommodation as lack of bedding and linen. Many available beds cannot be used on this account alone.

The lack of bedding was particularly noticeable in the female V.D. wards where in many cases a dilapidated mattress with a ragged piece of thin material insufficient to cover the body was all that was available.

These defects were pointed out to me with great emphasis by the patients themselves.

I was informed that as a result of this the women tend to huddle in pairs on one mattress at night. Their ages varied from 14 to 60.

As a result of this visit I contacted O.C. Hospital Ship "TOSCANA" as I had previously noted a considerable amount of Italian hospital stores on board this ship which had never been used and were surplus to requirements. He has supplied me a list of the articles which he could dispense with. (Copy attached).

I strongly recommend that authority be given for the transfer from H.S. Toscana to the Italian Civil Hospital of the stores mentioned in his letter Ref HS59/29/5 dated 30 Mar.45, part I.

The remaining stores mentioned in part II would be useful but not essential as also the Medical Stores noted in his letter dated 29 Mar.45. If there is no other more essential requirement for them I recommend that they should also be transferred.

I understand that the Hospital Ship stores are controlled by the Ministry of War Transport but consider that the approval for transfer would require to be decided by D.M.S., A.F.H.Q.

The lack of bedding was particularly noticeable in the female V.D. wards where in many cases a dilapidated mattress with a ragged piece of thin material insufficient to cover the body was all that was available.

These defects were pointed out to me with great emphasis by the patients themselves.

I was informed that as a result of this the women tend to huddle in pairs on one mattress at night. Their ages varied from 14 to 60.

As a result of this visit I contacted O.C. Hospital Ship "TOSCANA" as I had previously noted a considerable amount of Italian hospital stores on board this ship which had never been used and were surplus to requirements. He has supplied me a list of the articles which he could dispense with. (Copy attached).

I strongly recommend that authority be given for the transfer from H.S. Toscana to the Italian Civil Hospital of the stores mentioned in his letter Ref HS59/29/5 dated 30 Mar.45, Part I.

The remaining stores mentioned in Part II would be useful but not essential as also the Medical Stores noted in his letter dated 29 Mar.45. If there is no other more essential requirement for them I recommend that they should also be transferred.

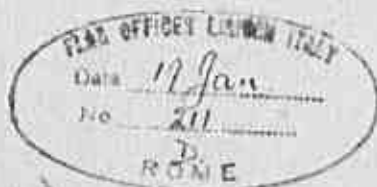
