With reference to your letter I.3/7/2116 dated 27th February, 1946, in order to bring the status of the Italian Navy personnel forming the Italian Navy Fire Brigade in Messina dockyard, into line with the other Italian Navy units, operated by the Royal Navy, it is requested that as from 15th March, 1946, in view of the existence of an Italian Naval Establishment at Messina, the Italian ratings concerned cease to be accommodated and victualled in H.M.S."HAMILCAR".

2. While the Italian Navy Fire Brigade may continue to remain under the direct operational orders of the Commanding Officer, H.M.S. "HAMILCAR", the personnel constituting it should be administered, accommodated and victualled by the Italian Navy authorities at Messina.

3. The Ministry of Marine are being requested to instruct MARISICILIA to assume the responsibility for the accommodation, and victualling of the Italian personnel in question as from 15th March, 1946.

With reference to your minute No.Y.3/7/1942 dated 19th January, 1946, addressed to the Flag Officer, Italy and Liaison, your attention is invited paragraph 8 of Mediterranean Shore Standing Order 17 with particular reference to the last sentence which states: "It is only in exceptional cases that the special provisions of paragraph 6 are to be invoked, and then only with the approval of the Navy Sub Commission, Ross".

2. The Navy Sub Commission can find no trace in its files of approval given to the Commanding Officer, H.M.S. "HAMILCAR" for the issue of these supplies in accordance with Mediterranean Shore Standing Order 17, and it is requested that the Navy Sub Commission may be informed of the reasons for the supply of these canteen goods contrary to the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean's shore standing orders.

3. It is pointed out, that the Mediterranean Shore Standing Order 17 was promulgated, primarily for Italian Navy personnel attached to British Naval port parties in forward operational areas where no Italian Navy Command exists and where, consequently, the Italian party is accommodated and messes with the Royal Navy Establishment. Only in these circumstances are canteen goods and other items mentioned in paragraph 6 of Mediterranean Shore Standing Order 17 allowed to be supplied to Italian Navy personnel.

4. Observing therefore, that such conditions do not prevail at Messina, it is requested that the issue of supplies of this nature to Italian Navy ratings cease forthwith.






