Reference your G-5: 386.30 dated 13 May 1946.

1. I am in agreement with the suggestions made in your proposed draft letter, with the following modification.

2. The Land Forces Subcommission and the Navy Subcommission have requested that para 4 be altered and it is suggested that it be deleted and substituted with:

"a. In future your HQ will be authorised to release to ARAR all CEM with the exception of:

- (a) Material required for technical intelligence.
- (b) Material required by the Allied Forces in accomplishment of their assigned mission.
- (c) Material of United Nations origin reported in considerable quantities and of value.
- (d) Material of Naval origin.
- (e) Material of Italian Military origin.

Material under categories (a), (b) and (c) to be reported to this HQ for disposal instructions; (d) material to be reported to Italian Navy and Navy Subcommission notified; (e) material to be returned to Italian Army and Land Forces Subcommission (ISLA) notified".

3. The Service Subcommissions fully agree provided you are in accord with the above alterations.

and amendments thereto.

1. The plan proposed in reference (a) is not acceptable to the Navy Sub-Commission.

2. In accordance with reference (b), the Navy Sub-Commission acting on behalf of the Allied Naval Commander-in-Chief, are responsible for the location and disposal of Captured Enemy Material of Naval origin. The Naval Sub Commission have authorized the Italian Ministry of Marine to form Material Recovery Parties under the officers in charge of Italian Royal Naval centres at BOLOGNA, GENOA, TURIN, MILAN, VENICE AND LA SPEZIA. Their function is to locate and recover recaptured Italian and German Naval material, stores, equipment and supplies of all kinds formerly intended for enemy naval forces in Italy. A monthly report on stores and equipment found is submitted by them to the Navy Sub Commission by the Ministry of Marine. Subject to the requirements of the Allied Naval Authorities, all materials thus recovered and reported to the Navy Sub Commission are taken into custody by the Italian Naval Authorities and utilized at the discretion of the Italian Ministry of Marine for the maintenance of the Italian Royal Navy.

3. In view of the arrangements outlined in paragraph 2 above it would appear that the present procedure for handling naval material is not affected by the general decrease in Allied personnel in the theatre mentioned in paragraph 2 of reference (a).

4. The Navy Sub-Commission does not consider that the plan proposed in paragraphs 3 and 4 of reference (a) would in any way facilitate making CEM available to the Italian Naval authorities more quickly than at present. By the arrangements outlined in paragraph 2 above, even less delay is incurred in turning over CEM to the Italian Government than would be the case if it were reported to ARAR for disposal.

Subject: Disposal of CEM in Italy.

5. It is desired to point out that naval materials falling under the headings given in appendix A to reference (a) have never been reported to AFHQ, but to the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, the representative of the Supreme Allied Commander for all naval matters.

6. The Naval Sub-Commission considers that the present arrangements for handling CEM are entirely unsatisfactory. It is therefore requested that, in the plan proposed in reference (a), provision be made for those arrangements to continue.

7. It is suggested, in this connection, that if ARAR discover CEM of naval origin that their representatives should get in touch with the nearest Italian Naval Headquarters and turn over the material in question to Italian Naval custody, reporting the action taken to the Navy Sub-Commission.

Reference AFHQ letter AG 386.3 Q(AE) dated 2 Oct 45 as amended by AG. 386.3Q(OMS)O of 8 Feb 46 and 8 Mar 46.

1. The majority of captured enemy material in ITALY has now been discovered, examined and disposed of in accordance with the procedures established in the above quoted letters.
2. It is considered most unlikely that any further stocks will be found for which there would be any Allied requirement and in view of the rapid decrease in the numbers of Allied personnel available to handle such matters it is desired to revise the present procedures.
3. It is requested that you instruct AMAR that should any further stocks of CM be discovered by that organization, they will be reported to your HQ. These reports will also include any stocks found by the Allied Military, which will in future be reported to AMAR without any Allied action.
4. In future your HQ will be authorised to arrange release of all such material to AMAR subject to the stocks not coming under the headings given in Appendix "A".
5. Materials falling under the headings given in Appendix "A" will be reported to this HQ for disposal instructions.
6. It is hoped that this procedure, which will relieve the Allied Military authorities of their responsibilities in respect of CM, will also assist the Italian Government by ensuring that CM is made available to the Italian Government without any unnecessary delay.

ITALIAN REPUBLICAN NAVY TRANSPORT - DISPOSAL.

It is requested that favourable consideration may be given to paragraph 3 of the Navy Sub-Commission's signal timed 131758 June 1945, a copy of which is attached.

2. While it is appreciated that, in addition to the Italian Navy, part of the Italian Army is also supplied with transport from British sources (and therefore that Italian Republican Navy transport which is not turned over to the Italian Royal Navy does not necessarily represent a loss to British supply sources) it is the case that Italian Royal Navy transport resources are considerably strained.

3. It is considered that captured Italian Naval transport should be turned over to the Italian Navy for their maintenance in accordance with the policy outlined in paragraph 9(c) of AG 386.3/163 Log-O dated 22nd April 1945.

Subject: Recovery of I.R.N. Motor Transport.

I.R.N. Centres up North are finding it difficult to carry out their work due, mainly, to lack of transport.

This Ministry is aware that Allied Authorities have collected M/T formerly belonging to Italian Armed Forces in various N. Italian localities - principally at Collecchio, Mantova, Modena and Ghedi - which is gradually being handed over to Italian Military and Civil Departments.

In connection with the above I shall be glad if 15th Army Group Command were approached to allow I.R.N. also to draw M/T formerly in the hands of ex-Republican Navy. This would be effected by Naval Commands at La Spezia, Genoa, Turin, Milan and Venice.

To this end it would be necessary for 15th Army Group Command to recognize as valid the proxies signed by the following Officers:-

1. The following instructions on the subject of Italian military vehicles have been issued recently by the Supreme Allied Commander, Allied Force Headquarters and are quoted for the information and guidance of the ministry of Marine:

"TITLE TO ITALIAN ARMY VEHICLES"

The title to vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces falls into two categories as follows:

1. Vehicles captured by the Allied Armies prior to the Armistice with Italy - These vehicles have become spoils of war and remain the property of the Allied Military Authorities who have discretion to allot them as they see fit in accordance with existing instructions covering captured enemy material.

2. All other vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces

a. These remain the property of the Italian Government as outlined in AFHQ Circulars Number 13, and Number 29, 1944.

b. This transport should be used to the maximum benefit of the Italian nation as a whole, bearing in mind the calls made by Headquarters AC on the resources of the Allied Armies to meet essential civilian requirements.

c. The allocation of this transport in accordance with paragraph (b) above will be made as follows:

Italian Army vehicles by the Land Forces Sub-Commission AC (MILFA). Italian Air Force vehicles by the Air Force Sub-Commission AC. Italian Navy vehicles by the Navy Sub-Commission AC. Transport surplus to the minimum needs of the Italian Armed Forces which is desired for civilian use by Headquarters AC will be allotted to civilian use by

the appropriate Sub-Commission, AC, title thereto and operation thereof being by the Italian Armed Forces under the control of the appropriate Sub-Commission, AC.

d. The Italian Armed Forces will exert every effort to locate and acquire vehicles still undisclosed. Allied Authorities will give every assistance possible to the Italian authorities and to the respective Sub-Commissions, AC. Any vehicles coming into the possession of the Allied Authorities will be reported to the appropriate Sub-Commission, AC for disposal."

2. The Ministry of Marine will note that the guiding principle of the above instructions is that Italian military transport shall be used to the "maximum benefit of the Italian Nation as a whole".

3. In accordance with the instructions of the Supreme Allied Commander, quoted above, all Italian Armed Forces' motor transport material must be returned to Italian Armed Forces control and will be disposed of as follows:

(a) Reconditioned for use, if necessary, by the Italian Armed Forces.

(b) Cannibalized to secure parts for reconditioning vehicles necessary for the Italian Armed Forces.

(c) Released to civilian use as not being necessary for the Italian Armed Forces, if requested by Headquarters AC as necessary for the Nation as a whole.

1. All questions relating to motor vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces have been thoroughly considered and discussed.
2. For your information, the Supreme Allied Commander, in Circular No 5 of Allied Force Headquarters, dated 11 April 1945, issued the following instructions in order further to clarify the matter:

4 → "II - TITLE TO ITALIAN ARMY VEHICLES

The title to vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces falls into two categories as follows:

1. Vehicles captured by the Allied Armies prior to the Armistice with Italy - These vehicles have become spoils of war and remain the property of the Allied Military Authorities who have discretion to allot them as they see fit in accordance with existing instructions covering captured enemy material.

2. All other vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces

a. These remain the property of the Italian Government as outlined in AFHQ Circulars Number 13, and Number 29, 1944.

b. This transport should be used to the maximum benefit of the Italian nation as a whole, bearing in mind the calls made by Headquarters AC on the resources of the Allied Armies to meet essential civilian requirements.

c. The allocation of this transport in accordance with paragraph b above will be made as follows:

Italian Army vehicles by the Land Forces Sub Commission AC (MMIA). Italian Air Force vehicles by the Air Force Sub Commission AC. Italian Navy vehicles by the Navy Sub Commission AC. Transport surplus to the minimum needs of the Italian Armed Forces which is desired for civilian use by Headquarters AC will be allotted to civilian use by the appropriate Sub Commission, AC, title thereto and operation thereof being by the Italian Armed Forces under the control of the appropriate Sub Commission, AC.

d. The Italian Armed Forces will exert every effort to locate and acquire vehicles still undisclosed. Allied Authorities will give every assistance possible to the Italian Authorities and to the respective Sub Commissions, AC. Any vehicles coming into the possession of the Allied Authorities will be reported to the appropriate Sub Commission, AC for disposal." <

3. As you will note, the guiding principle is that this transport should be used to the "maximum benefit of the Italian Nation as a whole". You will also note that transport surplus to the minimum needs of the Italian Armed Forces which is desired for civilian use by Headquarters AC will be allotted to civilian use, but that title thereto, and operation thereof is to be by the Italian Armed Forces. It is only reasonable to assume that the Italian Armed Forces are more capable of operating this transport efficiently for civilian use in the interest of the Nation as a whole than are the individual civilians.

4. In accordance with the instructions of the Supreme Allied Commander, quoted above, all Italian Armed Forces' motor transport material must be returned to Italian Armed Forces' control and will be disposed of as follows:

(a) Reconditioned for use, if necessary, by the Italian Armed Forces.

(b) Cannibalized to secure parts for reconditioning vehicles necessary for the Italian Armed Forces.

(c) Released to civilian use as not being necessary for the Italian Armed Forces, if requested by Headquarters AC as necessary for the Nation as a whole.

5. It must be remembered that certain vehicles of the Italian Armed Forces will be available for civilian transport as requested by Headquarters AC after the needs of the Armed Forces have been met and that the Armed Forces will operate these vehicles for civilian transport.

6. Certain vehicles belonging to the Italian Armed Forces may not have any military value, and the Ministries will be authorized to dispose of such vehicles to civilians. This may also include derelicts and spare parts which can be made available for civilian use. There can be no doubt that adequate control of all vehicles and spare parts will benefit the Nation as a whole; and while such control may inconvenience some individual civilians who now have Armed Forces vehicles, the Nation as a whole will be benefited.

7. Every effort is being made to rehabilitate the entire motor transport system of the Italian Army. This is being done at great expense by the Allies, and includes technical supervision by Allied officers, locating and shipping spare parts from the Middle East and Africa, and the use of shipping to transport vehicles from Sardinia. For your information, the transport of civilian food supplies in Sardinia is being done by the use of Army vehicles allotted for that purpose. The efficient use of Army vehicles for military purposes also releases an equal amount of rail transport which can be used for civilian requirements on the mainland.

8. I might add that the question of ownership of vehicles now used by the Fascist troops from German and Fascist resources has not been decided by the Allies. The decision will no doubt depend on the degree to which the Italian Armed Forces effect the repossession and reorganization of their own transport, and this must, of course, depend upon the good faith displayed by the Italian Government, and the Italian civilians, in carrying out the program directed by the Supreme Allied Commander.



Information has been received through the Italian Ministry of Marine from the Italian Royal Naval Center at Venice that 5th Army authorities consider all material formerly belonging to enemy forces to be under 5th Army control for disposition in accordance with the following priorities :

- (a) For the requirements of surrendered German Forces in Italy still in the area under 5th Army control.
- (b) For civilian requirements.
- (c) For the requirements of Italian Forces operating with the 5th Army.
- (d) For Italian Forces.

2. If the above instructions are in fact in force, it is presumed that they are applicable only to materials belonging to the enemy land forces and not to enemy naval materials. Accordingly, it is requested that appropriate instructions be issued to 5th Army Commands as soon as practicable in order to permit Italian Naval authorities to carry out the directives contained in reference (a) for the assembly and disposal of recaptured enemy naval material.

SUBJECT: Recovery of Italian Naval and Air Force Material.

1. AFHQ letter AG/386 3/163 LOG 0 dated 22 June 45, in para 4 lays down the principles to be applied in dealing with enemy Naval and Air Forces Material, but does not detail agreements made with the Italian Government regarding the recovery of Italian Naval and Air Force Material.
2. It appears that in certain provinces, officers of both the Italian Navy and Air Force, are endeavouring to locate material belonging to the two services, and as far as can be seen have bona fide documents to support such activities and have means and authority to compensate where necessary.
3. Enclosed is a copy of a letter received from 5 Army, in which you will observe that some difficulty is arising as to the legitimacy or otherwise, of their right to such material.
4. It is therefore requested that the policy relating to the recovery of material belonging to the Italian Navy and Air Forces, be advised this Sub-Commission, so that 5 Army can be advised as to current procedure.

SUBJECT: Recovery of Italian Naval Material.

TO : Provincial Commissioner, Allied Military Government, Vicenza.

1. Captain Francesco Camicia of the Italian Navy has visited this office this morning and has discussed with us a conference he had with Captain Dickinson, one of your officers, a few days ago.
2. Captain Camicia is apparently duly authorized by documents in his possession to gather material formerly belonging to the Italian Navy. As you are aware, we have had similar parties from the Italian Army operating in the area all along.
3. It seems that Captain Dickinson, in the conference referred to, took the position that Captain Camicia should not actually take any former Naval property from civilians without first reporting to the nearest AMG officer and also does not wish the Captain to pay the civilians any reward for assisting in the recovery. Captain Camicia's position is that such a reward is essential if anything is to be accomplished and further that if after discovering Naval material he must contact AMG before taking it, the material will be hidden by the time he gets back.
4. In the matter of contacting the AMG officer, Captain Camicia's position seems sound and no such prior contact should therefore be required of him. Of course if there is ever alleged that any of the material taken was not in fact Naval material, this claim can be made through channels to the Naval Arsenal at Venice, to which Captain Camicia reports.
5. With respect to the payment of rewards, it would seem that this was a matter for decision by the Italian Government and if it chooses to adopt this method of recuperating material, AMG should not undertake to prohibit it — certainly not on a local basis. If you have very strong reasons for disliking this practice, it is suggested that you set forth those reasons in writing and the matter will then be submitted to higher authority. In the meantime Captain Camicia should be allowed to continue in accordance with his established practice.

1. In compliance with reference (a), directives were issued in references (b) and (c) for the recovery and disposal of former Italian Navy material which has been recaptured from the Italian Republican Navy, including material of German origin. In the basic letter of 21 July 1945, the Commanding General Fifth Army was requested to issue appropriate instructions to permit Italian Naval Authorities to carry out the directives contained in references (b) and (c). Headquarters Fifth Army, in the first endorsement, invites attention to the last sentence of paragraph 9 c of reference (d), which requires that all remaining recaptured Italian war materials not specifically covered by the directive be reported to Allied Force Headquarters and disposal instructions awaited. Italian Republican Navy materiels and German Navy materiels are not included in the directive specifically, except in para 4a.

2. As indicated in reference (e), the Navy Sub-Commission is cognizant of the necessity for the promulgation of directives by Allied Force Headquarters in order to insure that appropriate action will be taken by all Allied Military and Naval Commands. It is, therefore, requested that the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean initiate action with Allied Force Headquarters for a modification of reference (d) to provide for the recovery and disposition of captured material of German and Italian Naval origin, including Italian Republican Navy material as provided for in reference (a). Pending the issuance of these instructions, no action will be taken on reference (f) which requested that references (b) and (c) be amended to include ex-German Navy material in addition to ex-Italian Republican Navy material, including material of German origin.



Memorandum "A" to Navy Sub-Commission Letter No. 200/2771 of the 29th June, 1945.

DEFINITIVE INSTRUCTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

1. The following instructions govern the procedure to be followed with reference to former Italian Navy material which has been recovered from the Italian Merchant Navy or otherwise withheld or found, including material of German origin, except :

(A) Material recovered or found in that part of the Venetian Gialla area recently transferred from Yugoslavia to allied military control.

(B) Material of allied origin irrespective of the manner in which it was acquired.

2. The above material includes communistic naval stores and supplies and military equipment of all kinds formerly intended for and available to every naval force in Italy and, subject to the requirements of the Allied Naval Authorities, all materials found and reported to the Navy Sub Commission, Allied Occupation, may be utilized at the discretion of the Ministry of Marine for the main forces of the Italian Navy.

3. The Ministry will form Material Recovery Parties at the earliest practicable date in areas designated to take possession and control of all such material not required for Allied naval use. The functions of these parties are :

- (a) To locate, mark, classify and list material;
- (b) to report on 31 July 1945 and monthly thereafter to the Navy Sub Commission through the Ministry of Marine particulars of all material taken over under the following headings; distinguishing in each case between (a) material of Italian origin (b) material of German origin. It is particularly emphasized that these reports are not required to specify details of minor items of stores and equipment and for the most part statements in total of various items located will suffice.

1. Navy stores, for example carves, anchors, cables, diving equipment, electrical fittings, pedates, etc.
2. Victualling stores, for example clothing cloth, food, mess utensils, crockery, cutlery and glassware etc.
3. Ammunition stores.
4. Administration stores.
5. Medical stores.

6. Building materials.
7. Engineering stores, for example, engines spare parts, pressure gauges, marine tools, fire brick etc.
8. Motor transport, for which advance instructions were given in paragraph 4 of Navy Sub Commission signal 315th June, 1945.
9. Fuel.
10. Wireless and radio equipment.

DISPOSAL OF RECAPTURED ENEMY MATERIAL.

1. The following instructions govern the procedure to be followed with reference to former Italian Navy material which has been recaptured from the Italian Republican Navy or otherwise retaken or found, including material of German origin, except :

(A) Material recaptured or found in that part of the Venezia Giulia are recently transferred from Yugoslavia to Allied Military control.

(B) Material of Allied origin irrespective of the manner in which it was acquired.

2. The above material includes consumable naval stores and supplies and military equipment of all kinds formerly intended for and available to enemy naval forces in Italy and, subject to the requirements of the Allied Naval Authorities, all materials found and reported to the Navy Sub Commission, Allied Commission, may be utilized at the discretion of the Ministry of Marine for the maintenance of the Italian Navy.

3. The Ministry will form Material Recovery parties at the earliest practicable date in areas designated to take possession and control of all such material not required for Allied Naval use. The functions of these parties are :

- (A) To locate, sort, classify and list materials,
(B) To report on 31 July 1945 and monthly thereafter to the Navy Sub Commission through the Ministry of Marine particulars of all material taken over under the following headings, distinguishing in each case between (a) material of Italian origin (b) material of German origin. It is particularly emphasized that these reports are not required to specify details of minor items of stores and equipment and for the most part statements in total of the various items located will suffice.

The Naval Officer in Charge, Trieste's letter No. 3229/149 dated 15th July 1945 is not a report in accordance with Med.45/1256/4/13 of 27th May 1945, the object of which is to keep the London Munitions Assignment Board informed of certain specified items which are available or have been used locally.

2. In view of the situation obtaining in Venezia Giulia any report in accordance with that letter would be premature since under the terms of the Morgan Agreement, war booty in Venezia Giulia is in general the property of the Jugo Slavs and as such is not available for use or allocation by the London Munitions Assignment Board. Action on that letter should therefore be deferred until Jugo Slav claims are finalised.

3. The point of the letter written by Cantieri Riuniti dell'Adriatico seem to be an attempt to establish a lien on the property of the German Armed Forces because of money alleged to be owed by German authorities. As stated above the Morgan Agreement acknowledges in principle the right of the Jugo Slav Government to acquire war booty in Venezia Giulia and the Royal Navy is not prepared to intervene on behalf of Cantieri Riuniti dell'Adriatico.


