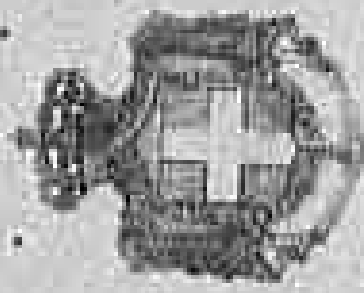

He requests instructions, as necessary, concerning the disposal of such material as the machinery and gun-mounting items, and V/T gear.

3. In view of the quantity of Italian manufactured material available, it is suggested that the Ministry of War be informed of the position, with a view to Italian Naval authorities collecting and disposing of their type of equipment as convenient.

MEMORANDUM TO ASSISTANT NAVAL WIGGS OFFICER, FROM: LETTER OF 28 JUNE, 1947.

Form 1- PORTUGAL

Location 1- Junction of routes 13 and 91.

The works visited were the "Fabbrica Ferrocefal" which had apparently been manufacturing agricultural implements. An army unit was in occupation, using the front of the factory and the yards for M/T maintenance.

2. Located in the rear of the main building are several heaps of metal :-

- (a) 1 pile, estimated at 10 tons, of iron plates, varying from 4" x 9" to 6" x 18", and up to 1/4" thick.
- (b) 3 piles, estimated at 25 tons, of iron, copper and brass scrap (in sheet, strip and piping).
- (c) 1 pile, estimated at 5 tons, of some 60 No. copper or phosphor-bronze ingots, each approximately 10" x 13" x 6".
- (d) 10 No. empty acid carboys.

3. Outside this building, and on the opposite side of the railway track, are approximately 100 No. logs of average circumference 8 feet, and 20 feet in length.

Location 1- North of route 14, between Carrizosa and San Felipe.

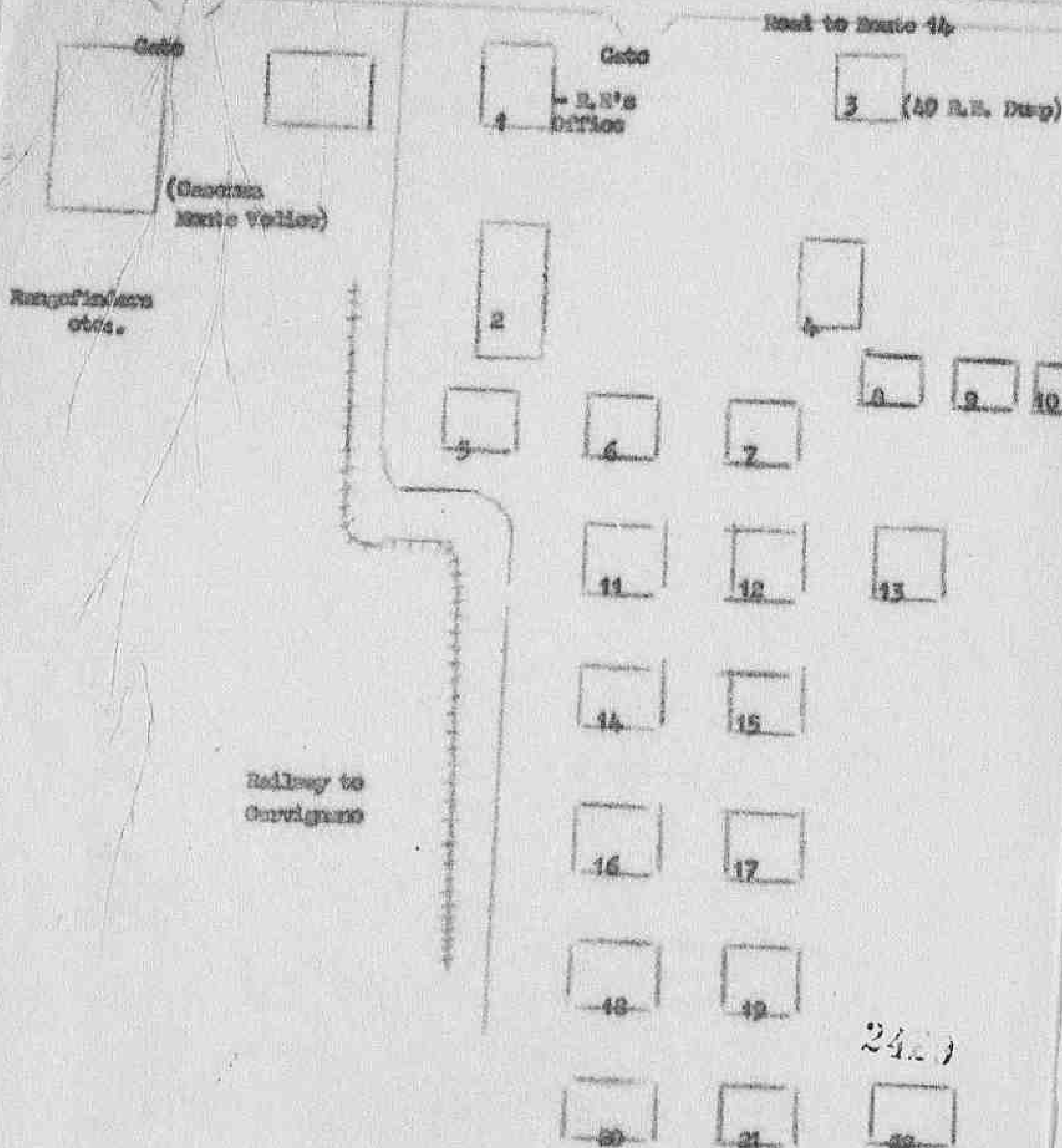
