" The S.S. SERENITAS is hard aground on the south side of the harbour bows on to the shore with the stern holed in two places and resting on the bottom.

There is no other damage evident to the hull although superficial damage to the superstructure and decks is very considerable. It is possible to board her from the land. The depth of water at her stern is approximately 20 feet. Estimated tonnage is 5000 gross, length approx. 388 ft. underwater wreck on starboard side."



A communication has been received from the Italian Ministry of Marine to the effect that at the request of the Italian Ministry of Industry and Commerce resulting from their letter 67931 dated 10th June, 1946, United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration has expressed the worthy intention of providing coal to the Italian Navy for the month of July, 1946.

While it is appreciated that, due to the shortages of coal in Italy, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce desire to investigate Italian Naval coal consumption with a view to establishing an even allocation to commerce in proportion to their respective requirements, it is considered that such specific action is warranted for and thoroughly justifiable.

The suspension of the supply of marine coal to the Italian Navy pending the completion of the requests and investigations in accordance with Ministry of Industry and Commerce's letter, may lead to very serious consequences. The very serious dangers for the Navy of this coal are already being felt, causing investigation in the supply programme and permitting that some performing other useful work elsewhere. The bulk of this coal is required by the Naval dockyards, especially at Taranto, Venice, Naples and La Spezia, and it may be well to ensure that should this programme continue, it would exclude ship repair work which may be detrimental to the carrying out of the maintenance programme and the already employed Italian sea transport organization. The programme relating thereto is under consideration.

1. Summary of the communication has been received from the Italian Ministry of Industry to the effect that at the request of the Italian Ministry of Industry and Commerce resulting from their letter 677932 dated 18th June, 1946, Italian National Relief and Rehabilitation Administration has suspended the monthly allotment of medicinal coal to the Italian Navy for the month of July, 1946.

2. While it is appreciated that, due to the shortage of coal in Italy, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce desires to investigate Italian Naval coal consumption with a view to establishing an even allocation to commerce in proportion to their respective requirements, it is considered that such drastic action is unwarranted and thoroughly unworkable.

3. The suspension of the supply of medicinal coal to the Italian Navy pending the completion of the requests and suggestions in accordance with Ministry of Industry and Commerce's letter, may lead to very serious consequences. The navy submarines chartered for the <sup>transport of</sup> supply of this coal are already being sold, causing irregularities in the supply programme and preventing them from performing other useful work elsewhere. The bulk of this coal is required by the Royal Dockyards, especially at Livorno, Venice, Naples and La Spezia, and it may be well to assume that should this suspension continue, it would cripple ship repair work which may be detrimental to the carrying out of the mine-sweeping programme and the already completed Italian sea transport organization. The consequences arising cannot be overestimated.

4. In view of the above therefore, it is requested that appropriate steps may be taken immediately, in order that the monthly quantities of coal allotted to the Italian Navy may be made available to them for the month of July, pending the results of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce's investigation.

In accordance with Article 11 of the Armistice Terms, a Committee is to be formed to establish a program for the demilitarization of the Islands of PANTELLERIA, LAMPEDUSA and LIPUSA. This program is to be carried out by the Italian Government under Allied supervision.

It is desired to have as a member of the Committee the Italian Engineer Officer who will be charged with the actual carrying out of this program.

I would therefore be grateful, my dear Mr. Prime Minister, if you would consider the matter so that when the Director, Land Forces Sub-Commission calls for this Engineer, a suitable officer may be available.

2. Of the outstanding items which could not be met from stocks transferred at Taranto, it was agreed with a representative of the Ministry of Marine that the only stores required at present were teak in bulk and India rubber insertion as the remainder could be met from Italian sources.

3. The 200 cu.ft. of teak in bulk has now been shipped from Malta to Taranto on the 29th June, 1946 in the schooner "QUE VADES" under package M.L. 17. Admiralty's approval has been requested for the supply of the India Rubber insertion from the United Kingdom, observing that this item could not be made available from stocks in the Mediterranean.
