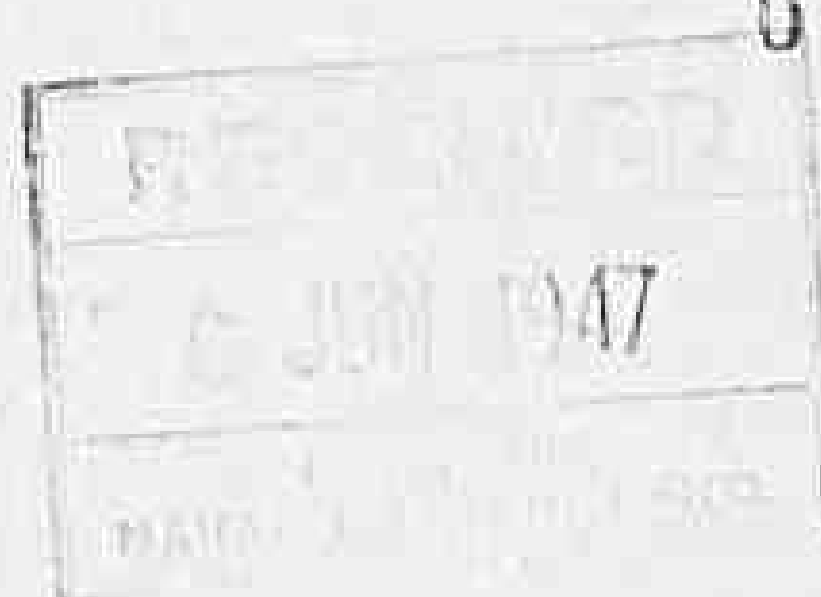

1. Enclosure (A), prepared by the Captain Minesweeping
Mediterranean, was forwarded to the Italian Ministry of Defence (Navy)--
(ex Ministry of Marine)-- for inclusion in their overall import programme
in accordance with the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean's instructions.

2. Observing however, that Italian Government purchases from
abroad are strictly controlled by the Italian Treasury owing to the Italian
Government's limited sterling assets, the Ministry of Defence (Navy)
requested to be informed of the individual and total prices of the stores
listed in enclosure (A).

3. Owing to the non-availability of this information locally,
it was therefore requested from the Commander-in-Chief Mediterranean who
directed, in reply, that the prices be obtained from the Rate Book of Naval
Stores, B.R. 810/43, which was forwarded by the Flag Officer, Malta, and
that an approximate percentage charge of 25% with a surcharge of 5% on the
total be applied, varying dependent on the shipping and handling charges
of those stores which would require to be shipped out from the United Kingdom.

4. On examining the Rate Book of Naval Stores, however, it
was discovered that while the price obtaining in April and July 1943 is listed
against some of the items, others have "cost price" listed against them.

5. In view of the possibility therefore, that the prices of
the items in question may differ at present from those established in April
and July 1943, and in order to furnish the Ministry of Defence (Navy) with
an accurate estimate of the cost of these minesweeping stores, it would be
appreciated if the information required by them in paragraph 2 above, could
be forwarded to this Section as soon as possible for onward transmission to

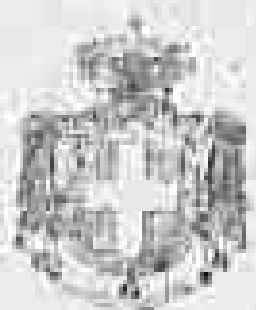

Subject : IXP and W/A stores and stores for Postwar Mine Clearance.

Further to Navy Sub Commission's letter HSC/4651 dated 26th February, 1946, regarding supplies of proposed minesweeping gear to the Italian Navy, the enclosed copy of an estimate, prepared by the Captain Minesweeping, Mediterranean, of Italian minesweeping requirements of "IXP"/34 stores for the year November, 1946, to October, 1947, is forwarded.

2. These requirements have been worked out on the basis of 16 Motor Minesweepers. It is estimated that 6 Motor Minesweepers will require battery renewals by mid 1947 and should protected ground sweeping after the end of 1947 be necessary, the remainder may require renewal of batteries also; requirements for Exide IL cells being 1,200 and 3,200 respectively.

3. It is requested that necessary arrangements be made as soon as possible, for these requirements to be included in the Italian Government's overall import programme as mentioned in paragraph 3 of Navy Sub Commission's letter referred to above.

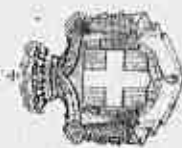

SUPPLIES OF OROFESA MINESWEEPING STORES

Be pleased to lay before Their Lordships the attached statement which gives a very approximate estimate of the requirements of orofoesa stores from British sources for Italian, Greek and Turkish Minesweeping Forces for the period November, 1946 to October, 1947.

2. In accordance with Admiralty Signal timed 071658/December, 1945, these should be demanded by the various Governments under their overall import programmes and in consequence only stores estimated to be required for British Forces are being demanded in the normal Naval Store Demand.

3. Requirements of the other nationals for the period up to 31st October, 1946, will be dealt with as follows:-

Greeks:

An initial supply can be made from stocks transferred to the British Minesweeping Base, Piraeus, with this object in mind. Subsequent requirements will then require to be notified to the Mediterranean Zone Board for screening and transmission to Admiralty.

Italians:
