Sir,

With reference to your letter dated 6th December 1946, concerning the return of your ship named "GILMETIO" confirmation has been received to the effect that whilst flying the Italian flag she grounded in the Preveza channel in the middle of August 1943, was refloated in January 1946 at the expense of the Greek Salvage Organization and was sold by auction to M. Georges Triandafyllides, who legally transferred the ownership to the Yannakaroni brothers. The ship is still at Piraeus undergoing repairs.

2. It is observed, that at the time of grounding, Italy had not surrendered and was still considered to be an enemy of the United Nations. It would appear therefore, that the fate of "GILMETIO" did not come under the provisions of any agreement signed after 8th September 1943, but was governed by prize law as internationally applied to the capture of enemy vessels in time of war.

3. The Greek authorities accordingly brought the case before a Prize Court on 4th February 1947, but it is understood that the court's decision has not yet been issued. In the event however, of the Prize Court confirming the capture through adjudication of the prize, thus rendering its appropriation final, the Greek Government will have acted within their legitimate rights.

4. Since I am not in a position to give a final decision on this matter, and observing that Italy has now resumed diplomatic relations with Greece, it is suggested that any further representations which you may wish to make, be addressed to the Italian Ministry of Mercantile Marine for eventual transmission, if necessary, to the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, for presentation to the Greek Government through diplomatic channels.

1. With reference to your letter No.1178 dated 7th August 1946 and subsequent correspondence concerning your claim for payment of hiring charges in connection with the employment of the barge IDOLAIKE ex KÖNIGSBERG, I have been instructed to convey to you the British Admiralty's decision on the matter.

2. The Admiralty are of the opinion that in view of the information furnished by the Compagnie Maritime in their letter dated 26th January 1947, copy of which is enclosed, any contention by the French Authorities that this vessel has earned profits during the course of trading operation appears to be clearly erroneous. Moreover, as the vessel was requisitioned out of prize for service with the Allied Commission (on which the French Authorities were represented and which operated in the general Allied interest) no grounds whatever would appear to exist for payment of any hiring charges to the French Government. In any event, the amount due to the Admiralty to meet the cost of salvage services and essential repairs rendered to the IDOLAIKE ex KÖNIGSBERG, is considered to be a French liability in accordance with the terms of the Liberated Ships Memorandum. In this connection the Admiralty stresses furthermore, that no question of set-off of hiring charges can be contemplated.

3. In view of the dissolution of this Branch after ratification of the Peace Treaty, it is requested that any further correspondence on this subject be conducted by the "Office Nationale de la Navigation" direct with the British Admiralty through diplomatic channels.

1. Further to reference (a), information has been received from the British Embassy to the effect that a decision has now been reached by the Foreign Office in London regarding the future disposal of SS STAMIRA.

2. The British Foreign Office take the view that the Greek Government should be asked to return the vessel to the Italian Government in accordance with the terms of the undertaking given by the Greek Government at the time of the ship's allocation to Greece. The American State Department's agreement has therefore been sought in this connection, since the vessel was originally allocated to Greece by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean and the Greek undertaking is expressed to be made to the Governments of the United Kingdom and the United States jointly.

3. Observing therefore, that negotiations appear to be proceeding favourably, it is considered that no useful purpose will be served by the further intervention of this Branch, and it is accordingly recommended that any further enquiries on this matter be addressed to the First Secretary (Commercial), British Embassy, Rome.
