2. These torpedoes are Italian property and not (R) NOT SPANISH. Italy is not allowed to have submarine torpedoes under terms of peace treaty and it is not in the interest of Allied powers that Spain should have ?? as indicated in my 051258 february 1946 (not to all) to that the only solution therefore is to dump them or to destroy them.

3. The fact that the Italians owe the Spanish for storage of these torpedoes does not concern Allies. Italians must clearly (?) pay their debt. On the other hand the Spanish cannot expect approval from Allies in obtaining payment from the Italians in view of their unneutral conduct in allowing torpedoes to be maintained in Spanish territory during the war.

4. If the situation has not (N) NOT been modified in any way by signature of Italian treaty ?? the torpedoes have not been dumped before ratification, the matter could be conveniently be dealt with by staff of the Council of Ambassadors for supervision of the treaty.

Italian torpedoes at CADIZ.

I have now been in touch with Spanish Ministry of Marine and Italian Naval Attache in Madrid. Present position as follows:

It will be remembered that torpedoes had originally been the (?one or corrupt) Spanish Navy from the Italian and that this order was made before outbreak of late war after arrival at Cadiz in 1941 or 1942 they were retained until surrender of Italy when they were taken charge of by Spanish Naval Authorities. I understand from my Italian colleague that Italians have always wished to be paid for these torpedoes £1 Mnd 1.00. ex GR for naval uniforms but Spaniards have been unable to agree with Italians as to relative value of these torpedoes.

- (a) Spanish Ministry of Marine is claiming sum of 1½ million pesetas for storage of these torpedoes in Spanish Naval Arsenal at LA CARRACA, CADIZ. Italian Naval Attache put their total value at 3 million pesetas now.
- (b) Spanish Naval Authorities are also claiming from Italians a considerable sum for maintenance of Italian Squadron's interest in SAILOR ISLANDS during war. Spaniards are in fact combining these two totally different claims.
2. By Italian colleague state about a year ago Italian Ministry of Marine approached Commander in Chief Mediterranean on this matter and) 760 regarding sale of these torpedoes.
3. I have explained to him but (?) not to Spanish Naval Authorities to be extremely cooperative and will not protest when I start to arrange to have these torpedoes shipped to Gibraltar, but I feel sure that Spanish Naval Authorities will be unwilling to release them until their bill for 1½ million pesetas is settled by someone. I feel equally sure that they would raise no objection to their removal once bill has been paid. They have after all had these torpedoes in their charge for 3 or 4 years.

4. In view of certain intricacies of these negotiations I would be very grateful for further instructions particularly as to whether signature will suffice in any way after signing of peace treaty with Italy which I understand is likely to take place on 10th February.

It will be remembered those torpedoes had originally been the (?one or corrupt) Spanish Navy from the Italian and that this order was made before outbreak of war after arrival at Cadiz in 1941 or '42 when they were retained until surrender of Italy when they were taken charge of by Spanish Naval Authorities. I understand from my Italian colleague that Italians have always wished to be paid for those torpedoes in kind i.e. same for naval uniforms but Spaniards have been unable to agree with Italians as to relative value of those torpedoes.

- (a) Spanish Ministry of War is claiming sum of 1½ million pesetas for storage of those torpedoes in Spanish Naval Arsenal at LA CARRACA, CADIZ. Italian Naval Attaché put their total value at 3 million pesetas now.
- (b) Spanish Naval Authorities are also claiming from Italians a considerable sum for maintenance of Italian Squadron's Intermittent in BALEARES ISLANDS during war. Spaniards are in fact combining those two totally different claims.
2. My Italian colleague states about a year ago Italian Ministry of Marine approached Commander in Chief Mediterranean on this matter and (?) received permission to proceed with their negotiations with Spanish Govt regarding sale of these torpedoes.
3. I have explained to him but (?) not to Spanish Naval Authorities policy of H.M. Government contained in Admiralty messages 101343 December 1946. He is extremely cooperative and will not protest when I start to arrange to have those torpedoes shipped to Gibraltar, but I feel sure that Spanish Naval Authorities will be unwilling to release them until their bill for 1½ million pesetas is settled by somehow. I feel equally sure that they would raise no objection to their removal once bill has been paid. They have after all had those torpedoes in their charge for 3 or 4 years.

4. In view of certain intricacies of these negotiations I would be very grateful for further instructions particularly as to whether situation will change in any way after signing of Peace Treaty with Italy which I understand is likely to take place on 10th February.





Reference: (a) the Ministry of Marine's ltr. No. 3447/UT dated 23 October 1946.  
 (b) Italian Naval Branch, Allied Force Headquarters' ltr. WSI-2/N/98 dated 23 April 1947.

1. In reply to reference (a) and in continuation of reference (b), the gradual completion of the 90 mm. ammunition complement is approved only in respect of guns actually mounted which should be limited to a full ready use and reserve complement of ammunition plus an allowance for exercise.

2. Calculated on the basis of the information contained in the Ministry of Marine's memorandum therefore, the number of rounds required to be manufactured to complete the complement should not exceed 110,080 (one hundred and ten thousand and eighty) rounds, arrived at as follows:-

2. It is therefore requested that a decision in the matter may now be communicated, consideration being given to allowing the 8.533/7,20 and 8.533/6.5 torpedoes (20 in all) to be transferred to the Spanish Navy if desired.

1. At Cadiz there are twenty-one torpedoes belonging to the I.R.N. which await transportation to Italy by a naval vessel.

The Spanish Authorities have told our Naval Attaché' that there are no difficulties to prevent their being taken away.

2. It is requested that an Italian Cruiser in class "A" proceeding to Gibraltar for allied requirements may be allowed to continue as far as Cadiz in order to embark the 21 torpedoes abovementioned.

Should the above be impossible it is requested that these torpedoes may be embarked on any Allied vessel bound for Italy from the Atlantic.
