I have said however that these payments would have not been made until the end of the time I was under the impression that the U.S.S. was only doing his military duty, as he is quoted out in your letter, the 1st Army balance notified was that of the 15th of May 1943, and he did not come under me for pay until sometime in March of 1944.

You will understand further the position in which I find myself, and advise as accordingly.

In reply to your letter ref. /52/9 of 19 October, it is agreed that amended arrangements should be made.

The two Cadet Ensigns now in Florence, ATKINSON and LOVE, have a lot to say concerning their financial positions but since they discussed this fully with Miss de Darnall recently you have no doubt heard the story.

On operational reasons, i.e. since the advance into North Italy has not been so fast as was at one time envisaged, these two Cadet Ensigns have not been fully employed, and it is impossible to say when their work would become active.

2. A) Initial Issue. In as far as is known, the only outstanding items  
are one shirt and two ground-sheet caps (to be used as mactintoshes).  
These items are ready for collection in Sierra.

B) This consists of expendable items such as E.A.M.V. shoes, socks, studs,  
banding materials also initial issue of tooth-brushes, combs, hairbrushes  
etc., replacement of which, if required, will be paid for in cash.

C) With regard to replacement clothing - Cadet Design Atkinson was  
equipped from 'Q' supply and therefore, can obtain any replacement  
on hand in the worn-out garment. Cadet Design Dove was equipped  
from a money grant and therefore, when requiring a replacement, must show  
the worn-out garment and will then be issued with a new one. This  
is entered on her A.E.O. 1157A as an initial issue.

It is confirmed that Capt. Torrini has done a considerable amount of good work in the early days of the occupation of Florence and it is very well known both here in Florence and the Ministry of War in Rome. He was first introduced to me in Siena during the month of August, by Col. Pava an Italian liaison officer attached to Col. McCarthy, Headquarters ACC in Rome.
