1598. ACUTE ULCERATIVE GINGIVITIS (PERNICIOUS MOUTH).

The following is published in conjunction with GPO 1058 dated 21 Sept 45, for information and guidance:-

1. This disease, an acute ulcerative condition of the gums is increasing in incidence throughout the theatre and it is necessary to ensure that all possible precautions are taken to prevent its spread.

2. The disease is recognised by the presence of inflamed, bleeding and tender gums and is highly contagious.

3. It is spread:-
- (a) By Direct Contact, e.g., the use of the communal towel, the indiscriminate use of eating and drinking utensils, and particularly by promiscuous kissing.
 - (b) By Indirect Contact, e.g., infection spread by infected hands to food, or through the medium of the cookhouse washup.
4. The following preventive measures will be rigorously adhered to:-
- (a) Men with painful and bleeding gums will be instructed to report sick at once. This applies most particularly to cookhouse personnel.
 - (b) The indiscriminate use of towels will be forbidden.
 - (c) All feeding utensils will be washed and sterilized in accordance with the instruction issued under para 2 (g) of GPO 486/45, which reads as follows:-

"There will be proper facilities for washing and sterilizing all eating utensils, not only in cookhouses but in all messes and canteens. Three suitable containers, such as galvanized iron cans or tin boilers, will be provided and placed in line. The first two will contain hot soapy water and soda if available. The third will contain plain water which must be kept continuously boiling during the entire period of use. Alternatively, the first container alone will contain the hot soapy water, preferably boiling, the second will contain cold water with one tea-spoonful of WSP to every two gallons of water, while the third will contain clean water to rinse away the WSP solution. The utensils will be washed and sterilized by dipping them into each container in turn. This will be carried out before as well as after every meal."

(d) Civilian bars and cafes which do not maintain a satisfactory hygiene standard will be placed "out of bounds".

The following is published in conjunction with GRO 1035 dated 14 Sep 45:-

1. Mainly because of the effects of PYTHON and RELEASE, there will shortly be a considerable number of vacancies for SOs (Edn), Edn Officers, and other rank instructors in the war establishments of the AEC in CMF.
2. A vigorous recruitment of all qualified personnel is therefore urgently required if the educational staff at all HQs are to be maintained at minimum working strength in order that the Army Education Scheme (Release Period) may be efficiently and effectively administered.
3. The shortage of educationists in civil life is acutely acute and for many people who, after release, will either be returning to educational work or entering it for the first time, the experience which immediate participation in the Army Education Scheme can give should prove invaluable.
4. Personnel leaving this theatre for the U.K. will exchange currency only within the limits and in the manner laid down in this GRO.

2. Limits on Exchange.

(a) Officers: a sum not exceeding £50; any officer who wishes to exchange currency will obtain a certificate from his Commanding Officer certifying that the sum to be exchanged represents an unexpended balance of advances of pay which he has drawn.

(b) Other Ranks: a sum not exceeding £10 plus his cash drawings during the preceding two months as verified from AB64 Part II; any other rank who wishes to exchange currency will obtain a certificate from his Commanding Officer showing the total amount of local currency to be exchanged and certifying that this amount represents savings from pay and allowances and does not exceed the sum of £10 plus his total drawings in the preceding two months.

3. Excess Amounts.

Any Officer or Other Rank returning to the U.K. on Release, PYTHON or permanent posting who has legitimately acquired currency in excess of the limits allowed under para 2 above will obtain from his Commanding Officer a certificate to this effect stating the amount; the excess sum will then be paid to a Field Cashier before departure from this theatre, supported by the certificate, for remittance to the individuals pay account in U.K.

This facility is NOT open to officers or other ranks leaving the theatre temporarily, eg, on LIAISON or courses; such personnel will make their own arrangements for safeguarding any currency in excess of the limits allowed under para 2 above during their absence.

Any Officer or Other Rank returning to the U.K. on Release, FLYHOM or permanent posting who has legitimately acquired currency in excess of the limits allowed under para 2 above will obtain from his Commanding Officer a certificate to this effect stating the amount; the excess sum will then be paid to a Field Cashier before departure from this Theatre, supported by the certificate, for remittance to the individual's pay account in U.K.

"1. Members of personnel returning to UK on grounds of long service overseas, on release, on posting to Home Establishment or to another Command, may apply for the repatriation of their wives and children.
"2. Application should be made if possible, three months before the soldier is likely to return to the UK. No assurance can be given that the families will be evacuated at the same time, or by the same means as the husbands, owing to the different travelling routes involved, but every endeavour will be made to make their arrival in UK coincide as nearly as possible.
"3. If the wife is Austrian or German born she cannot be embarked for UK without War Office authority.
"4. Married quarters which are available in UK are adequate to meet regular Army requirements only. Accordingly the offer of married quarters is now restricted to families of soldiers serving on normal

regular engagements on British Establishments only.

6. Owing to shipping difficulties applications for husbands to return to their families while still abroad so that they can be repatriated together cannot be entertained.

FORFEITURE OF CAMPAIGN STARS AND DAWSON MEDAL ON CONVICTION

GRD No. 1001 dated 7 Sep 45 is repeated hereunder for information:-

"Forfeiture"

1. ACI 343/45 provides that until such time as the Army Council may determine, and in the absence of any recommendation to the contrary made at the time by commanders concerned, any officer or soldier convicted of mutiny, cowardice, desertion, or certain other offences specified in the Pay Warrant, 1940, Articles 665 (a) and 1227 (a) shall forfeit all war medals instituted during the present war which have been awarded to him or to which he may be entitled up to the date of the offence.

2. Recommendations by commanders for the retention of war medals gained in the present war and all cases involving the forfeiture of war medals gained in previous wars will be considered by the Army Council in accordance with existing practice.

Recommendations for retention of medals will be forwarded through the usual channels to AMHQ C1 (Br.). For the information of AMHQ 2nd Echelon on endorsement that a recommendation for retention has been made and is under consideration will be made on the AF P252 reporting the conviction. Pending notification of a decision on the recommendation, commanding officers will ensure that the individual concerned does not wear the ribbon of the medal affected.

3. The effect of the ACI is that any person entitled to the award of any of the war medals specified below who is convicted of any of the offences referred to in para 1 above on or after the date of publication of the ACI which authorized the issue of such medal,

Pending notification of a decision on the recommendation, commanding officers will ensure that the individual concerned does not wear the ribbon of the medal affected.

3. The effect of the ACI is that any person entitled to the award of any of the war medals specified below who is convicted of any of the offences referred to in para 1 above on or after the date of publication of the ACI which authorized the issue of such medal, will forfeit his entitlement unless a recommendation for retention of the medal is submitted to the Army Council on or after the date of the conviction.

The effective dates are as follows:- Africa Star is forfeited on conviction of any of the specified offences committed on or after 18 Nov 43. 1939/45 Star is forfeited on conviction of any of the specified offences committed on or after 18 Jan 44.

4. Publication of forfeiture will be made automatically by GHQ 2nd Echelon in all cases where there is no recommendation for retention. Commanding Officers will ensure that persons who have forfeited their entitlement by conviction will not wear the ribbon of the star or medal forfeited.

Restoration

5. Restoration or award under the Pay Variant, 1940, Articles 666 and 1230, will be considered in the case of an individual who is not cashiered, dismissed or discharged in consequence of his conviction or, in the case of an ex-officer who is called up for service in the ranks, after his conviction the individual has performed good and faithful service, or is otherwise deemed to merit the restoration of his forfeited medal or medals.

6. (a) Normally consideration will not be given to restoration or award before the lapse of one year exclusive of any time spent in penal servitudes, imprisonment or detention.

(b) Earlier recommendations may be made, however, where the individual has:-

- (i) rendered specially good service not necessarily resulting in a decoration, or
- (ii) died on service, or
- (iii) been prevented by wounds or sickness not due to his misconduct from completing a year's service, or
- (iv) been prevented by other causes from completing a year's service but is deemed to merit restoration.

7. Recommendations for restoration in the case of individuals who have deserted from the battlefield will only be made if the individual has given satisfactory service on the battlefield after his offence.

8. Application for the restoration or award of war medals under the above provisions will be made as follows:-

- (a) for serving personnel, by the individual's parent O.C. Unit through the usual channels to AFHQ G4 (Br.);
- (b) for personnel who die in service, by the O.C. the individual's late Unit through the usual channels to AFHQ G4 (Br.) as soon as possible after death has occurred.

AFHQ G4 (Br.) will notify GHQ 2nd Echelon of any restorations or awards which are sanctioned by the War Office."

All officers and other ranks, including ATS personnel, who in the course of their duties have had access to "Top Secret" or "Secret" equipment of any kind whatsoever, either during the manufacture, trial or completed stage, are reminded that they are bound by the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 to 1939, and their knowledge of secret matters must not be published or communicated, either directly or indirectly, to another person in any form except in the course of official duties. Military personnel are subject to the conditions of the Official Secrets Acts both during and after they have left the Service: serious penalties may be imposed in the event of any infringement of these Acts.
3. All ranks are therefore warned that they should exercise discretion in the filling in of any questionnaires such as are referred to in para 1 above, or any of a similar nature which they may receive.
