1. Reference is made to the following letters relating to travel between Switzerland and Italy, copies to you
33A

(a) AC/14080/21/PS Travel from Switzerland to Italy, dated 14 June, 1945, which states that civilians entering Italy from Switzerland must be in possession of Allied Force Permits.

(b) AC/14018/1/PS Travel of civilians from and to Italy, dated 7 August, 1945, which states that Allied systems of control are still in operation for the control of travel into Italy.

2. With regard to travel from Italy to Switzerland and return, ACWQ has advised this Headquarters that the following system has been instituted :

(a) Swiss and Italian nationals domiciled in Italy who produce to the Travel Control Agents at Chiasso or Domodossola valid passports or valid visas for entry into Switzerland will be permitted to leave Italy, and return to this country without Allied Force Permits provided the re-entry into Italy is made within the time limits imposed by the Control Agents and endorsed upon the passports.

(b) The time limits imposed by the Control Agents during which re-entry may be made into Italy from Switzerland without Allied Force Permits will be 5055

- (1) Holders of Swiss Passports
Periods not exceeding three months.
- (ii) Holders of Italian Passports

1. Reference is made to the following letters relating to travel between Switzerland and Italy, copies of which are being furnished to you.

- (a) AC/14010/M/50 Travel from Switzerland to Italy, dated 14 June, 1945, which states that civilians entering Italy from Switzerland must be in possession of Allied entry permits.
- (b) AC/14010/C/275 Travel of civilians from and to Italy, dated 7 August, 1945, which states that Allied systems of control are still in operation for the control of travel into Italy.

2. With regard to travel from Italy to Switzerland and return, AMIN has advised this Headquarters that the following system has been instituted:

- (a) Swiss and Italian nationals domiciled in Italy who produce to the Travel Control Agents at Chiasso or Domodossola valid passports or valid visas for entry into Switzerland will be permitted to leave Italy, and persons to this country without Allied Force permits provided the re-entry into Italy is made within the time limits imposed by the Control Agents and endorsed upon the passports.

- (b) The time limits imposed by the Control Agents during which re-entry may be made into Italy from Switzerland without Allied Force permits will be 30 days.

- (i) Holders of Swiss Passports - Periods not exceeding three months.
- (ii) Holders of Italian Passports - Periods not exceeding three months or the periods of validity of the Swiss visas which ever are the shorter.

- (c) Passports will also be endorsed to show the exacting points at which re-entry into Italy must be made.

3. All concerned are reminded that persons travelling to places outside Italy do not require travel orders unless

transportation controlled by the United Authorities
is required.

1. (a) The Rear Army Security Control Line is re-named "The Security Control Line". For the purposes of this instruction, the territory forward of the Security Control Line will be described as "The Security Control Zone".

2. A further control line is established 35 kilometers inside the frontier and running parallel to it. This line is known as the Prohibited Frontier Zone line and the territory enclosed is known as "The Prohibited Frontier Zone".

3. The Restricted Line is abolished.

4. The restrictions on civilian movement are now as follows:

(a) Security Control Zone and Security Control Line.

Movement of civilians inside the zone is restricted to 10 kms., and movement into or out of the zone is forbidden unless such civilians are in possession of Movement of Civilian passes approved for issue by the Senior Civil Affairs Officer / Regional Commissioner concerned inside the Zone. The provisions of Executive Memorandum No. 71/45 para 5 (a) will apply with regard to the issue of these passes.

1. (a) The Rear Area Security Control Line is re-named "The Security Control Line". For the purposes of this instruction, the territory forward of the Security Control Line will be described as "The Security Control Zone".

(b) The Security Control Line now runs as follows:

South of the River Piave - crossing River Piave and Route 11 - Ronchi - Vittorio Veneto - Pieve di Cadore - St. Stefano di Cadore - due north to frontier.

(c) All towns mentioned, and the direct roads between the towns, are exclusive to the Security Control Zone.

2. A further control line is established 25 kilometers inside the frontier and running parallel to it. This line is known as the Prohibited Frontier Zone Line and the territory enclosed is known as "The Prohibited Frontier Zone".

3. The Restricted Line is abolished.

4. The restrictions on civilian movement are now as follows:

(a) Security Control Zone and Security Control Line.

Movement of civilians inside the zone is restricted to 10 kms., and movement into or out of the zone is forbidden unless such civilians are in possession of Movement of Civilian Passes approved for issue by the Senior Civil Affairs Officer / Regional Commissioner concerned inside the Zone. The provisions of Executive Memorandum No. 71/45 para 5 (a) will apply with regard to the issue of these passes.

Prohibited Frontier Zone, and Prohibited Frontier Zone Line.

(b) Movement of civilians inside the zone is restricted to 10 kms., and movement into or out of the zone is forbidden unless such civilians are in possession of Movement of Civilian Passes. Passes may be issued at the point of departure by ACO/AC Officers.

7. The issue of passes will be a public safety responsibility.
8. Special attention is drawn to the fact that persons wishing to leave Italy must be in possession of Military Travel authorizations or of dividend documents authorizing them to leave the country.
9. Members of the Italian Armed Forces may be sent on duty and on leave to places in the rear of the Security Control Line and prohibited zone. "Poggio di Vigonovo" and "Poggio di Vigonovo" will be sufficient authority for such travel. A frontier communication will be forwarded with regard to the movement of Italian Armed Forces in the prohibited zone and with regard to movement into the Security Control Zone and Prohibited Frontier Zone.
10. The provisions of Executive Memorandum No. 77/45, which will hereby be released, will continue to apply where applicable.
11. Order No. 14 will not be published. Suggested draft for Regional Order is attached. (A.D.I.O's and R.C's only)

5. A person not included in paragraph 4 (of whatever nationality) wishing to leave Italian territory (including Sicily and Sardinia) should obtain application forms for Military Travel Authorization from the nearest Allied Commission Officer or from the Questura at the Capital of the Province in which he finds himself, or such other officer or agency as may be deputed. Two copies of the application form will be completed. They will be typewritten, or written in block capitals where no typewriter is available. The applicant must furnish, where photographic facilities exist, two full face and two profile photographs of passport size, which will be affixed to the two copies of the application form as indicated in the spaces provided. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be made on the application form, in the presence of the agency accepting the application.

6. In the case of applications for diplomatic and consular officers and members of special economic or political missions, however, applications will be handled by Headquarters, Allied Commission. Photographs will not be required.

7. The agency receiving an application will satisfy itself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his proposed journey, and will note in the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments. Otherwise, the receiving agency will indorse the Military Travel Authorization application forms "Nothing known against" ("Nulla Osta"). The agency will then fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and Office Stamp" and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank. The terms of this paragraph will not apply to applications under paragraph 6 above.

8. Both copies of the application form will then be forwarded by the receiving agency through Headquarters, Allied Commission to G-2 (CI) AFHQ.

9. G-2 (CI) AFHQ after consideration of the applications, will return one copy of the application form to the appropriate section of AFHQ with the decision as to grant or refusal, and where the application is granted will forward together with the form the appropriate Military Travel Authorization for transmission to the applicant.

10. Agencies handling applications will on no account communicate to persons whose applications have been refused the grounds for such refusal; nor will they attempt to indicate, in view of the detailed research which will be necessary in many cases, the time which may elapse before applications are decided.

11. It should be made known to intending travellers that the Military Travel Authorization is merely an authorization to leave Italian territory and it does not authorize their entry to the country of destination, whose entry requirements must be complied with.

12. This instruction does not apply to Allied-organized parties of refugees, or repatriates, leaving Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. In the case of such refugees and repatriates a nominal roll with appropriate biographical data will be submitted by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission ALCOM to G-2 (CI) AFHQ who will issue a block Military Travel Authorization if approved.

13. Military Travel Authorizations will be issued only to approved individuals proposing to travel for purposes which benefit the Allied War effort, and to:

a. Scholars, artists and members of the learned professions who are nationals of Italy or of one of the United Nations, if journey is approved for the purpose of free trade in knowledge and learning between the peoples of Italy and the United Nations. Ecclesiastics and journalists will not be considered in this category.

b. Officials serving at posts in the Vatican who are appointed to posts outside Italy involving permanent change of station.

c. Approved refugees and repatriates.

14. In cases where the appropriate Section of Allied Commission considers that the travel of an applicant is urgent, application may be made to G-2 (CI) AFHQ by telegram or telephone; and in the event of a favorable reply, the applicant may be authorized to proceed without being in possession of a Military Travel Authorization. G-2 (CI) AFHQ will in such cases warn the Security Control at the Italian port of exit. In such cases the application form will none-the-less be forwarded to G-2 (CI) AFHQ to complete their records.

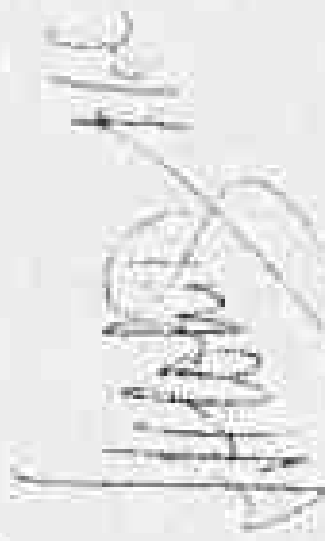

This is to inform you that a letter was sent by the Chief
Commissioner to the Italian Government which included the following text:

"As a matter of urgency I must ask you to give immediate instructions,
as a temporary measure, that no Patriot Representatives will be sent
into Military Government Territory except with the consent, to be
obtained in writing, of an officer of the Patriots Branch of the A.C.,
and further that such representative be furnished with written in-
structions by the appropriate Ministry stating the amount of currency
which he is carrying and the exact terms upon which he is to dis-
tribute such currency amongst Patriots and their dependents."

It was found necessary to send this letter in view of the fact
that numerous Government representatives had been going up into Military
Government Territory without prior notification to this Branch for the
purpose of distributing funds amongst Patriots which they had collected
through their own initiative.

Efforts are being made to arrange for the Government to budget
for a lump sum so that all Patriots will receive demobilisation payments
when they come through the lines, and it is hoped that in the near future
a settlement will be reached. You will be notified in due course as to
what happens.

1. The importance of exercising a strict control over the movement of civilians, especially in the Army Zone, needs no emphasis.

2. Recent reports, however, indicate that:

(a) standard passes are being issued to places north of the Rear Army Control Line without reference to the S.O.A.C/PC concerned;

(b) passes are not completed correctly before issue;

(c) members of the Italian and United Nations Armed Forces and members of the G.C.R.R. and G.C.P.F. are attempting to enter the Army Zone with spurious duty passes and otherwise in contravention with the regulations relating to movement;

(d) civilians in possession of letters of "authority" and "recommendation" from Military Units, Embassies, Legations, Vatican, etc., attempt to enter the Army Zone without standard Movement of Civilian Passes.

3. In future the issue of passes to places north of the Rear Army Control Line without reference to the S.O.A.C/PC concerned will be regarded as a grave breach of security. This instruction will be drawn to the attention of all concerned.

4. With regard to the issue of passes:-

(a) a series of passes must be issued in respect of each person;

(b) applicants full names, address, and identity card number must be shown on the pass;

(c) the holder will not be authorized to be out of doors after sunset except for valid reasons;

(d) each pass must be signed by the applicant before issue;

(e) no alterations or additions will be made to a pass except by way of endorsement on the back;

5. Regional Administrations and Legations will receive all applications for passes to places north of the Rear Army Control Line and as the journey will directly benefit the War effort.
6. Applications for passes which are referred to S.C.A.O/PC's for approval will contain full particulars of itinerary, reasons for travel, and dates involved. It will be their duty to complete passes in full.
7. Documents in Italian will be transmitted before they are transmitted to the S.C.A.O/PC's concerned.

6. Passes to places in the vicinity of the Rear Area Control Line will not be issued unless the issuing office is satisfied that the reasons for the journey are good and sufficient. Many cases are occurring of persons travelling to such places with regular passes and on arrival making application for additional passes into the Army Zone.

7. It is emphasized that the only regular pass is the standard Yellow Movement of Civilian Pass. All irregular passes found in use will be confiscated and forwarded to this Headquarters with a covering report. After investigation a proper pass may in suitable cases be issued in place of a confiscated pass.

8. Passes or permits which purport to enable persons to use motorcars or perform special duties in the Army Zone will not be issued unless in conjunction with regular Movement of Civilian passes approved by the S.O.A.O/R.C. concerned.

9. The provisions of Executive Memorandum No. 77 will be cancelled with effect from all occasions.

1. All persons leaving Allied-occupied Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) must be in possession of Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ, with the exception of persons listed in paragraph 2 below.

2. The exceptions are:

a. Allied service personnel on duty; but not Yugoslav nationals travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.

b. Accredited Diplomats and Consular Officials; but not:

(1) Italian nationals.

(2) Yugoslavs travelling to destinations other than Yugoslavia.

c. British and United States civilians employed by and travelling on duty for, the following Governmental Agencies:

Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits (issued in Washington), or Allied Force Permits (issued in London), provided that these documents are not indorsed "for single journey only" (unless for single journey Italy - France or Corsica).

3. A person not included in paragraph 2 (of whatever nationality) wishing to leave Italian territory (including Sicily and Sardinia) must obtain application forms for Military Travel Authorization from the nearest Civil Affairs Officer or such other officer or agency as may be deputed. Two copies of the application form will be completed. They will be typewritten, or written in block capitals where no typewriter is available. The applicant must furnish, where photographic facilities exist, two full face and two profile photographs of passport size, which will be affixed to the two copies of the application form as indicated in the spaces provided. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be made on the application form, in the presence of the Civil Affairs officer.

4. In the case of applications for Italian diplomatic and consular officers and special economic or political missions, application forms should be forwarded in duplicate by the Political Section, The Allied Commission (ALCOM), to G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ direct. Photographs will not be required, and the applications will not be subject to local screening unless G-2 (CI) Section specifically requests it.

5. The Civil Affairs officer or appropriate Section of ALCOM will satisfy himself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his proposed journey, and will note in the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments of his own. He will also consult the local (British) Field Security Section, or (American) Counter-Intelligence Corps Detachment, regarding each application. If the applicant is in any way suspect or unsatisfactory as regards security, Field Security or CIC will submit a written interrogation report direct to G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ noting the reference of the report on the MTA application form. Otherwise, they will indorse the Military Travel Authorization application forms "Nothing known against". The Civil Affairs Officer or appropriate section of ALCOM will then fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and Office Stamp" and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank. The terms of this paragraph will not apply to applications under paragraph 4 supra.

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B. SECRET

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 (SEC-0, dtd 7 November 1944 (Cont'd))

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6. Both copies of the application form will then be forwarded by Civil Affairs Officer through HQ ALCOM to G-2 (CI) AFHQ.

7. G-2 (CI) AFHQ after consideration of the applications, will return one copy of the application form to the appropriate section of ALCOM with the decision as to grant or refusal, and where the application is granted will forward together with the form the appropriate Military Travel Authorization for transmission to the applicant.

8. Civil Affairs officers will on no account communicate to persons whose applications have been refused the grounds for such refusal; nor will they attempt to indicate, in view of the detailed research which will be necessary in many cases, the time which may elapse before applications are decided.

9. It should be made known to intending travellers that the Military Travel Authorization is merely an authorization to leave Italian territory and, with the exception of French North Africa, it does not authorize their entry to the country of destination, whose visa requirements must be complied with. In the case of travellers from Italy to North Africa, a French entry visa is not required by holders of Military Travel Authorizations.

10. In the case of travellers from Italy to the United States, other than United States nationals, and of travellers to British territory, other than British nationals, Civil Affairs officers will satisfy themselves as to whether the applicant holds a passport bearing an entry visa for the United States or British territory respectively, and will note this fact in the remarks section. Applications will not be forwarded in any case in which an entry visa has been refused, whatever may be the country of destination.

11. This instruction does not apply to Allied-organized parties of refugees, or repatriates, leaving occupied Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. In the case of such refugees a nominal roll with appropriate biographical data will be submitted by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission to G-2 (CI) AFHQ who will issue a block Military Travel Authorization if approved.

12. Except in the case of refugees, and repatriates of British and United States nationality, Military Travel Authorizations will not be issued except for journeys which benefit the war effort.

13. In cases where the appropriate section of ALCOM considers that the travel of an applicant is urgent, application may be made to G-2 (CI) AFHQ by telegram or telephone; and in the event of a favorable reply, he may authorize the applicant to proceed without being in possession of a Military Travel Authorization. G-2 (CI) AFHQ will in such cases warn the Security Control at the Italian port of exit, and (if necessary) the North African port of entry. In such cases the application form will none-the-less be forwarded to G-2 (CI) AFHQ to complete their records.

14. The Security Controls at Italian sea and airports are instructed to forbid the exit from Italy of any passenger who may present himself without a Military Travel Authorization, unless he produces documentary evidence that

(attention of Capt. Baker)

It often happens that the Patriots Office of the Presidency of the Council, which I officially recognised by Allied Authorities has to send home some Patriots, temporarily in Rome on official duty or because wounded or ill.

Most of these Patriots have arrived here on regular permits issued by Allied Authorities, and with A.M.G. transportation.

When the stay in Rome is no longer requested it would be necessary to make the Patriots reach their residences as soon as possible to avoid a lot of hardships depending on the well known difficulties connected with a long stay in Rome.

It must be kept in mind that although the Patriots are not members of the regular Armed Forces, they are bona fide combatants, who for many months, and until lately have been fighting side by side with the Allied Forces; it would therefore be appreciated and timely to help them in returning to their homes.

To eliminate the long procedure of the release of the normal travel permits, it would be appreciated if your office will authorize and stamp a visa on the travel passes, as by enclosed form.

The above travel passes will be issued individually by the Presidency of the Council and its own responsibility.

1. Reference is made to 316/76/CA of 26 April 1944 (a copy of which is attached for easy reference).

2. Para. 4 (f) of 316/76/CA is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(i) Government Officials of the Central Italian Government.

The method of issuing passes to Government Officials of the Central Italian Government will be as follows: the official will apply to the corresponding AGC Section, Sub-Commission or Branch for a pass. If approved, Sub-Commissions or Branches of the Admin, Economic and R.C. & M.G. Sections will forward the passes in duplicate through their Sections to the Secretary-General for signature. In the case of the Political Section, Independent Sub-Commissions and Public Relations Branch, passes approved by them will be forwarded direct to the Secretary-General for signature. All passes in duplicate will be on the standard A.C.O. yellow and blue forms and will bear the following endorsement, before they reach the Secretary-General:-

'The facts set forth in this pass have been verified and the provisions of letter Ho. AGC, file 316/76/CA 26 Apr 44 have been fully complied with.'

(ii) Special passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Govt.

Special passes will be available for Ministers of the Central Italian Government. Such passes will be issued by the Sub-Commissions concerned in duplicate and forwarded through their Section to the Secretary-General for signature. The passes will be on the AGC yellow and blue forms only and will be made out to cover movement anywhere south of the Army Control Line. They will be for a period of three months and will bear the following endorsements:

'S....., (designation of office) is hereby authorised to proceed to any part of Italy south of the Army Control Line. He should be given every facility and courtesy.'

SUBJECT: Control of Civilian Movement.

TO : National Commanders Regions I, II, III, V, and VI.
S.O.A. 12356, Section 126 394

1. Introduction.

It is evident that the enemy intends to continue his efforts to interfere with our war effort and to stage events into Southern Italy on a considerable scale. In order to meet this threat and to neutralize as far as possible the activities of such agents, it has been decided that a wider and more effective system of control of civilian movement will be introduced.

Allied Control Commission officers are therefore requested to secure the Military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restrictions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2. Restrictions.

(a) Army and Corps Areas.

In the Army (and Corps) areas the existing regulations will continue to apply whereby civilians are forbidden to travel more than 10 km. from their own homes without an I.C. pass.

Those civilians who wish to proceed into such areas will require to obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the AGO authority of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under AGO.

In territory under Allied Military Government in areas of the Army (and Corps) areas, restrictions on inter-provincial movement is to be re-imposed forthwith, i.e., civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one province to another without an AGO pass.

(c) Italian Administrative Territory.

There will be no restriction on movement within that part of Southern Italy which is administered by the Italian Government, nor within Sicily and Sardinia. In Allied control areas passes will, however, be required for movement between Southern Italy, Sicily and Sardinia, and also for all movement from AGO territory into Italy and vice versa.

3. Check Posts.

(a) In Restricted Areas.

1. Introduction.

It is evident that the enemy intends to maintain his efforts to introduce espionage and sabotage agents into Southern Italy in a considerable scale. In order to meet this threat and to maintain an air of possible the activation of such agents, it has been decided that a wider and more effective system of control of civilian movement will be introduced.

Allied Control Units will therefore be requested to report the military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restrictions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2. Restrictions.

(a) Land and Road Areas.

In the Army (and Navy) areas the existing regulations will continue to apply strictly, and in the civilian areas travel will be limited to 10 km. from their own homes without an A.P. pass.

Where civilians are asked to proceed into such areas will require to obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the military authority of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under A.P.

In Territory under Allied Military Government in rear of the Army (and Navy) areas, restrictions on inter-personal movement so as to be in and forthwith, i.e., civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one province to another without an A.P. pass.

(c) Italian Administered Territory.

There will be no restriction on movement within that part of Southern Italy which is administered by the Italian Government, nor within Sicily and Sardinia. In Allied military administration areas will, however, be required for movement between Southern Italy, Sicily and Sardinia, and also for all movement from the territory into Italy's Italy and vice versa.

3. Check Points.

(a) In Restricted Areas.

In Army (and Navy) areas and in territory administered by Allied Military Government every effort will be made to enforce the above restrictions by means of a widespread system of 'stop' check points, which will be established for a few hours daily at regular times and at varying points. The responsibility of arranging such checks will rest with R.S.S. or C.I.C., Units.

- 2 -

The subject of these check posts will be: (i) to turn back those seeking to move outside the prescribed limits without a pass, (ii) to take action against those who have committed serious and repeated breaches of the regulations, (iii) to question or detain for investigation persons whose conduct or "story" is suspicious.

(b) In Unrestricted Areas.

In territory administered by the Italian Government a similar system of "way" check posts will be established. In this instance, however, the objects will be limited to (1) initially questioning those passing the point with a view to discovering suspicious individuals who should be subject to further investigation, and (2) installing a net so of accessibility in the minds of groups or other undesirable individuals so that they may hesitate to move about or even abandon their mission.

(c) Organisation and Composition.

This system of check posts will be organised by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and NOT by AMG/ASC, both AMG and ASC territories.

These check posts will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances of U.S.P./C.I.O., S.I.L. (C.S.), G.C.R.R. and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

4. Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Forts.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westwards across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the River Tevere and Volturno) or to enter Foggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMG/ASC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMG authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMG Provinces.

For other journeys involving movement into, or between, Provinces within the restricted area (S.E. from Bari to Avellino or from Foggia to Naples) a pass will be issued by the local AMG/ASC representative at the point of departure.

(c) Discretion of Provincial Commissioner.

The procedure described in para (b) above may be employed in cases described in (a) above when, for urgent administrative, economic or other reasons, the procedure described in (a) would be impracticable owing to the time factor. In such cases the passes will be issued by the

In territory administered by the Italian Government a similar system of "enclaves" check points will be established. In this instance, however, the check points will be limited to (1) strictly questioning those passing the point with a view to discovering suspicious individuals who should be subject to further interrogation, and investigation, and (2) installing a screen of security in the minds of allies or other unaligned individuals so that they may hesitate to move about or even abandon their mission.

(c) Organization and Composition.

This system of check points will be organized by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and GCI by AMM/ACC, both AMM and ACC territories.

These check points will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances of L.S.D./S.I.C., S.I.C., C.C.H. and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

4. Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Fortia.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westward across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the River Ebro and Volturno) or to enter Foggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMM/ACC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMM authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMM Provinces.

For other journeys involving movement into, or between, Provinces within the restricted area (e.g. from Bari to Avellino or from Foggia to Naples) a pass will be issued by the local AMM/ACC representative at the point of departure.

(c) Discretion of Provincial Commissioner.

The procedure described in para (b) above may be employed in cases described in (a) above when, for urgent administrative, economic or other reasons, the procedure described in (a) would be impracticable owing to the time factor. In such cases the passes will be issued by the Provincial Commissioner or by a member of his staff on his behalf who will immediately forward details of the issue of such passes to the SCAC or PC of the area of destination.

26

(d) Reasons for Travel.

It is essential that the issue of passes to cross the "Control lines" or to enter Puglia Province be strictly limited to those cases where the journey will benefit the Allied cause, or where there are important administrative or economic reasons, or in exceptional cases. There shall be urgent administrative grounds. The issue of other passes will be limited to persons who are good and genuine reason why they wish to travel, whether on official matters, business or family grounds.

(e) Issue of Travel Tickets.

Allied Central Commission officers will ensure that transport tickets will not be issued by the railway authorities or other travel agencies to places within restricted areas unless the persons applying for tickets are in possession of a proper pass to their intended destination.

(f) Italian Government Officials.

Passes for Italian Government officials will be issued by the Headquarters and signed by the Secretary General or by the Deputy Secretary General, Allied Control Commission, and will be issued after application has been received from the Government Department concerned or from Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, and considered by the appropriate Sub-Commission who will be responsible for examining the application as to actual necessity for the proposed journey. Such passes will be prepared for signature by the Sub-Commission concerned.

(g) Italian Military Personnel.

The movement of members of the Italian Military Forces is unrestricted, providing they are on duty and in possession of proper credentials. The Italian Military Forces when not on duty, C.I. when on leave, are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(h) Issuing Officers.

It will be within the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner to authorize specified and approved officers of the Gendarmerie or C.I. to issue passes for inter provincial travel. It is emphasized, however, that passes permitting persons to enter the Army areas or Puglia Province must be issued by AGC/AGC officers.

(i) Semi-Permanent Passes.

In the case of persons living near a Provincial boundary and whose place of employment is in, or partly in, and adjoining Province or Provinces, a semi-permanent pass may be issued and such passes shall expire on 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December annually, and then become renewable upon further application. Such passes may also be issued to all persons who have sufficient reason for frequent travel between Provinces.

(j) It is suggested that when an application for travel in or an Army area or into Puglia Province is received in AGC/AGC territory that the officer concerned completes the pass on behalf of the officer concerned.
