Reference is made to this HQ letter 109/3 of 7 August.

1. This H.Q. has been considering the question of Patriot Representatives for the provinces to be occupied in the event of a further advance. While it seems inadvisable to increase the number attached to each Corps it is thought that a pair should be available for each Provincial Commissioner to act as Liaison Officers between him and the local leaders, of whom increasing use is being made, until such time as the Patriot question can be handled by the ordinary Italian Provincial Administration.

2. While it is impracticable to order up such teams in advance it is imperative that they should be available immediately when required, and the time when they are most urgently required is upon first entry into new provinces.

3. Will you therefore, please, confirm your previous offer of pairs of representatives to be available to leave Rome within 24 hours of receipt of a cable from this Headquarters.

4. It is estimated that some 30 pairs ^{might} ~~will~~ be required in due course and this number should be held in readiness from 1st September.

1. As Col. PAVA, Liaison-Officer to this H.Q. explained to Your Excellency in his recent call, this H.Q. has requested that one representative of the Patriots of the C.L.N. (Prof. BAUER) and one of the Military Centre (Lt. Col. BERNABO') should be sent to H.Q.'s 5th and 8th Army and to the Provincial Commissioners of 4, 5, and 8 Region.
2. Such pairs of representatives have to organize information and employment agencies in order that the necessary assistance can be given to patriots and to meet their wishes either to enlist in the Italian Armed Forces, or to return to their homes and normal employment.
3. These representatives do not receive pay either from the Allied Command or from the respective department upon whom they are dependent.
4. We would therefore request that Your Excellency examine the possibility of authorising a daily rate of pay for these representatives for the duration of their mission, the amount to be fixed by Your Excellency.
5. This Branch will forward the names of the representatives together with the dates of their mission.
6. Such a provision for pay would allow these representatives to carry out their duties with more tranquillity regarding their families whom they have to leave.

Undersecretary of State with the Premier.ROME.

1. As Col. FAVA, Liaison-Officer to this H.Q. explained to Your Excellency in his recent call, this H.Q. has requested that one representative of the Patriots of the C.L.N. (Prof. BAUER) and one of the Military Centre (Lt. Col. BERNABO') should be sent to H.Q.'s 5th and 8th Army and to the Provincial Commissioners of 4, 5, and 8 Region.

2. Such pairs of representatives have to organize information and employment agencies in order that the necessary assistance can be given to patriots and to meet their wishes either to enlist in the Italian Armed Forces, or to return to their homes and normal employment.

3. These representatives do not receive pay either from the Allied Command or from the respective department upon whom they are dependent.

4. We would therefore request that Your Excellency examine the possibility of authorising a daily rate of pay for these representatives for the duration of their mission, the amount to be fixed by Your Excellency.

5. This Branch will forward the names of the representatives together with the dates of their mission.

6. Such a provision for pay would allow these representatives to carry out their duties with more tranquillity regarding their families whom they have to leave.

7. We enclose herewith a list of the representatives of the C.L.N. and M.C. already appointed with the respective dates of their missions and shall forward further lists as soon as they become available.

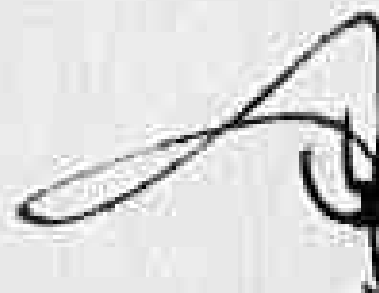

1. The Patriot representatives at present serving in the Army area are giving very good service and no addition to their numbers is at present required as they are already covering the Provinces of Pisa and Livorno.

2. In the case of the third Province, Grosseto, which has up till now been in the Army area, the Provincial Commissioner may require two representatives but it is requested that this be ascertained through Region VIII, to whom the Province is being turned over.

3. In general it is the policy of this Headquarters to treat the absorption of Patriots as part of the normal duties of the CAO and it is feared that the presence of Patriot representatives in the rear Army area will tend to magnify rather than solve the absorption problem. It is therefore asked that no representatives be sent up from the rear until a specific request is made by this Headquarters.

4. With regard to your request for Patriot stories every effort will be made to include as many facts as possible about relations with the Patriots in the normal routine reports submitted to and by this Headquarters along with other equally

important matters such as progress in reorganising local government and the collection of the harvest. If however anything elaborate in the way of "stories" is meant, it is regretted that it is quite impossible to expect our field officers to submit such material and it is suggested that a Public Relations Officer be sent up to collect it.

Having made contact with the Allied troops, the patriots under the command of Danesini Santo, were lead to the attack of a peasant's house of the "pratacci" occupied by the Germans who were keeping imprisoned about 40 people (men, women, children and 6 patriots) gone there, not knowing about the presence of the enemy, to fetch bread reserved for the band.

After concluding this operation, the patriots put themselves at the disposal of the American commander, operating in this sector, and participated in the conquest of a more advanced post.

The next day, the American commander, acknowledging the valour of the patriots, asked for 4 volunteers to be used as guides on the mountains of "Pian de Prune". The following day two other volunteers were demanded for the same operation. A group of patriots led by Dallari Aldo participated in the attack against Germans near Chiarni. Having received orders to enter Castellina to ascertain the number of enemy forces left in the town, they sustained a fight of 7 hours with the enemy.

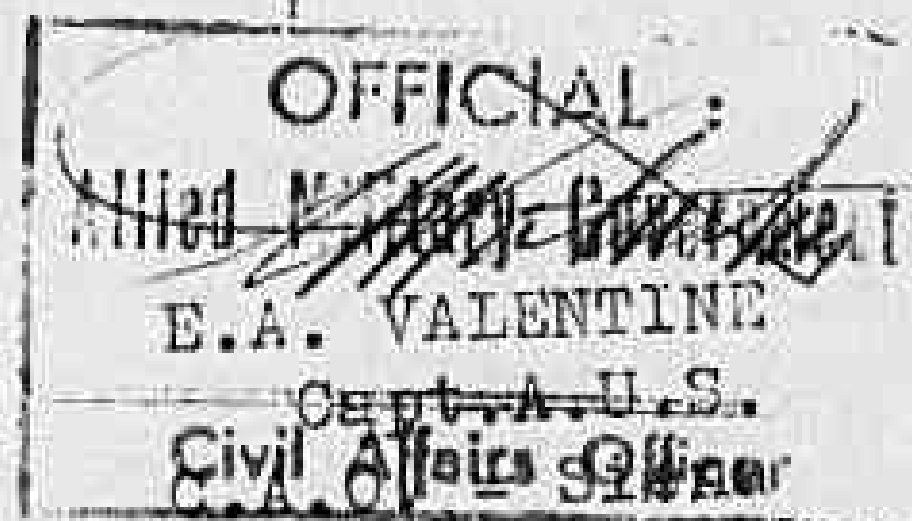

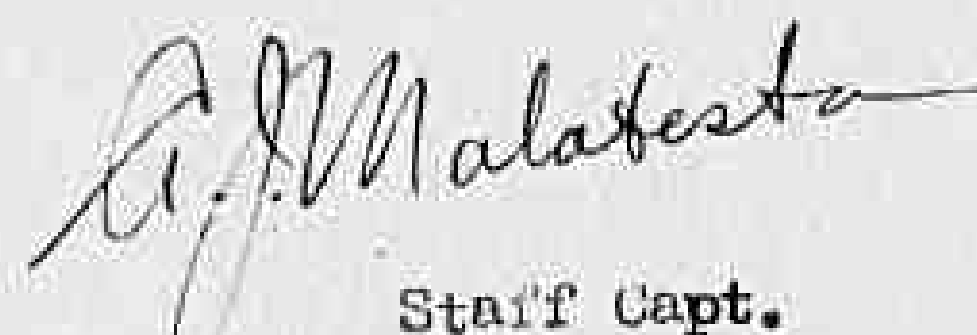

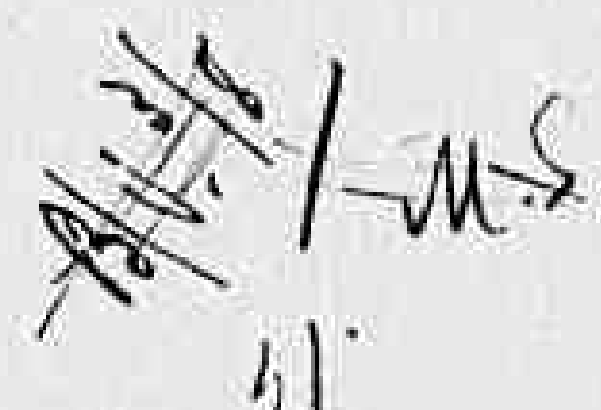

1. We have received information that a band of 300 Fascist saboteurs has been formed for operating behind Allied lines.
2. It is reported that the Fascist band is armed with rifles and M.G. It appears that it has been instructed to act as a Patriot Band.
3. The Fascist band is supposed to start operating in the area VOLTERRA - MONTECATINI - CASTELNUOVO - MONTEDIVINIO when they hear the following signal "ROMA O MORTE" on the Fascist radio.
4. It is further reported that the leader of the Fascist band is at present in AREZZO or somewhere in the AREZZO district. He appears to be a Col. OSFPO who carries identity documents belonging to a Communist who was shot.
5. It would be advisable to warn the representatives sent by this Branch about the possible existence of this Fascist band so that they may notify the Patriots Bands with which they are in contact. There is little doubt that the Patriots Band will gladly co-operate in unmasking the Fascist band.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE DELEGATES BY THE ALLIED UNITIES AND
THEIR DRIVERS.

1. So as to discipline and regulate the smobilization of the patriot reports, having completed their mission, the allied authorities have made the request to the Militar Comity and to the Militar Command "Bande Esterna" of the R.E. for the nomination of delegates to be accredited by the Allied Commands in line. The Militar Command has in consequence nominated five delegates (2 for the front of the 5th. Army and 3 for the 8th.Army.)
2. The departure of the foresaid delegates has an urgent character.
3. Each delegate or for him his party shall have to provide the details of a civil machine (plate,type, number, owner).which shall be claimed by the Allied Authorities and set at his disposition. Selection a car in good condition and with robust awnings.
4. Each delegate or for him his party must provide to choose an help who will have to follow him in function of driver or attendant.
5. The delegates and the drivers will be taken in effectiveness by the allied for what concerns the food.
6. The delegates and their drivers will have to take with them the necessary clothing and whatever is needed for an eventual night in the open air with the only refuge of the machine.
7. Each delegate and each driver must be provided (in 3 copies) of credential letters delivered by the Militar Comity that attest his identity and his function giving herself as warrant by the allied authorities.
8. The delegates and drivers,at the departure will receive from the allied authorities, the opportune documents of ricognizion valid for the control authorities in line.
9. Before the departure the delegates and drivers , with their cars and cards must present themselves, all together to the A.C.C. (Ministry of Corporations) and precisely to Col.Mc.Carthy, who will control if everything is in order.

ACC, dealing through AMG with both armies, will be responsible for all dealings with resistance groups as soon as the territory in which they have been operating is liberated by our troops. ACC will provide a suitably worded document, thanking the patriot for his good work and at the same time acting as a receipt for the arms he hands in.

Most patriots will wish to return to their normal occupations. They should be encouraged to do so. There will be some, however, whose homes are in Northern Italy and who will require subsistence. These will be directed by AMG to camps to be established by ACC in the East and West sectors.

Use will, of course, be made by military personnel of any information which the patriots can give, but military personnel will not employ patriots in any fighting role once they have been liberated.

It is emphasized that military personnel must not become involved in problems raised by resistance group leaders or patriots, and no promises will be made to them. They will in all cases be referred to JAG with whom the representatives of the various organizations will be working in close touch.
