1. The rather garbled account of the alleged conduct of Avv. Secondari fails to make out a proclamation offence unless (a) the acts charged constitute an offence under Italian law or, (b) were committed in or in connection with a prohibited meeting or assembly.
2. The statements attributed to Secondari amount to a violation of Article 290 of the Italian Penal Code in that they may be regarded as a public vilification of the Crown and probably also of the Italian Armed Forces.
3. We believe that in the state of public opinion on the Institutional Italian Court which is predicated upon an attack on the Crown, question, no charge should be prosecuted either in an Allied Military or Italian Court.
4. We further are of the opinion that in so far as the attack was certain to succeed in an Italian Court, since it could be argued that there is no attack on the army as distinct from the Crown. We are however definitely of opinion that it would be a mistake to charge Secondari before an Allied Military Court with the commission of an offence against Italian law based on these considerations.

5. The facts surrounding the making of the statements are not given in sufficient detail to enable us to advise whether an offence has been committed against Procl. 1 Art. V Sec 33 or Procl. 3 Art. IV. If however an offence has been committed against either of these Proclamations there is no reason why Secondari should not be charged in an I.M. Court.

1. The a/m Italian Officer was appointed Patriot Representative in Pesaro in Feb. last. When the Region was passed to Italian Government control, this Branch ceased to have any connection with Capt. Margheri, who became a direct representative of the Ministry of Occupied Italy, acting under their orders.
2. A report, dated 21 May, has now been received from him, from which it appears that he is operating in Ancona, and signing himself the "Patriot Representative, H.Q. AMG. Ancona".
3. May we be informed please whether you do require his services (in which case he can remain with you, and under your orders) or whether the Ministry of Occupied Italy should be asked to withdraw him, or transfer him to some place under Italian Government control?.

Nella scorsa settimana ho visitato Urbino, Gagli, Cantiano, Pianello e ho fatto una puntata verso Forlì allo scopo di prendere contatto con l'Ufficiale rappresentante di quella città, per essere orientato sulla situazione della Provincia confinante e per stabilire le modalità di assistenza a patrioti che hanno operato nella mia zona, ma che risiedono in quella di Forlì.

2. Tendenze Politiche

La tendenza politica prevalente è quella comunista però vi sono molti tra i patrioti delle zone visitate che non sono iscritti ad alcun partito o appartengono al socialista e democristiano.

3. Numero dei patrioti reimpiegati.

Il numero dei patrioti reimpiegati si mantiene sempre molto basso (5 nella settimana in corso) perchè urta contro difficoltà grandissime. In proposito ho in mente di raccogliere, allorché mi saranno tutte pervenute, le segnalazioni dei vari sindaci, e di studiare un piano per l'impiego dei patrioti disoccupati anche in località fuori della Provincia.

4. Numero dei patrioti fatti rientrare alle proprie case.

8 sono i patrioti rientrati alle proprie case ma ve ne sono ancora in attesa di andare al nord. Alcuni non potendo resistere al desiderio umano di ritornare alla propria casa dopo lunghi

mesi di assenza hanno tentato il viaggio clandestino.

NOTE

- 1) I patrioti assistiti nella settimana scorsa ascendono a 306. Tra questi sono comprese alcune famiglie di caduti.
- 2) Ho riportato l'impressione che la mia visita, sebbene sia di brevissima durata, porti un pò di aereo ed un poco di fiducia. I patrioti hanno la sensazione di non essere stati dimenticati e possono constatare che, sia pure tra grandi difficoltà, c'è chi lavora per loro e cerca di attuare quelle provvidenze annunciate dalla radio e dalla stampa.
- 3) Il mio lavoro si svolge in ambiente favorevole anche nel campo politico e particolarmente in quello comunista. Ciò infatti è essenziale se si considera la tendenza politica delle formazioni patriottiche.
- 4) Il mio collega di Forlì, Ten. Salvadori, mi riferisce che le acque si stanno agitando e che praticamente la sua presenza è diventata inutile.

In Pesaro la situazione nei giorni scorsi si stava intorbidando e si verificavano numerose violenze personali, ora funziona una Commissione partigiana di inchiesta nella sede dell'A.N.P.I. ed a quanto pare sono cessate le violenze.

Mi risulta che elementi notoriamente fascisti e comunque compromessi sono invitati verbalmente o per iscritto a presentarsi. Se ciò avviene, sono interrogati (nei riguardi di ex fascisti giovani vi è molta comprensione e tendenza a perdonare) e, se riconosciuti colpevoli, sono denunciati ed accompagnati alla Questura (fino ad oggi una ventina di arresti). Dopo quanto è successo al Nord, e se si considera che elementi odiati e col-

laborazionisti ritornano alle proprie case da dove si erano allontanati per seguire i tedeschi, ritengo che questa sia la più piccola e migliore reazione che ci si poteva attendere. In questo modo, chi è assolto da tale commissione, riacquista sufficiente fiducia in se stesso e nei propri simili e, nella maggior parte dei casi, può riprendere le proprie occupazioni, sufficientemente sicuro di non essere più disturbato. Non credo che ciò avverrebbe nel caso di assoluzione da parte dell'Autorità Giudiziaria. Concludendo, non mi sembra che quanto sopra, sebbene illegale, rappresenti una cattiva iniziativa. Al contrario sono convinto che se ciò avvenisse in tutte le Province e si riconoscesse ufficialmente tale iniziativa riservandosi di controllare i componenti la commissione (la quale ora presenta l'inconveniente di essere composta da partigiani ma quasi esclusivamente comunisti) molti problemi potrebbero trovare facile soluzione.

L'Autorità Giudiziaria indipendentemente dalle decisioni della Commissione partigiana potrebbe svolgere a carico dei denunciati tutte le pratiche usuali e, nel caso, di inesistenza di reato potrebbe sempre rimettere in libertà gli elementi precedentemente arrestati. Questi nel frattempo sono stati sottratti alla giustizia sommaria (botte e peggio) ed hanno trascorso qualche tempo rinchiusi. Cosa questa che, anche nel caso di riconosciuta innocenza, non sarebbe di grave danno perché l'innocente, per essere stato denunciato ha dovuto almeno essere e dimostrarsi fascista convinto.

- 5) Il mio lavoro, pur avendo preso una piega molto soddisfacente, sia come ritmo, sia come utilità, forse dovrà durare più del previsto. In questo caso, nei primi giorni della prossima settimana potrei trasferirmi ad Ancona, iniziare qui l'altro lavoro e recarmi a Pesaro e nei comuni saltuariamente.

G. Sento il dovere di ringraziare il Ten. Col. Elves perche dopo due mesi della mia poco utile permanenza a Pesaro, in cinque giorni da quando sono passato alle sue dipendenze, ha brillantemente risolto le difficoltà che mi impedivano di lavorare.

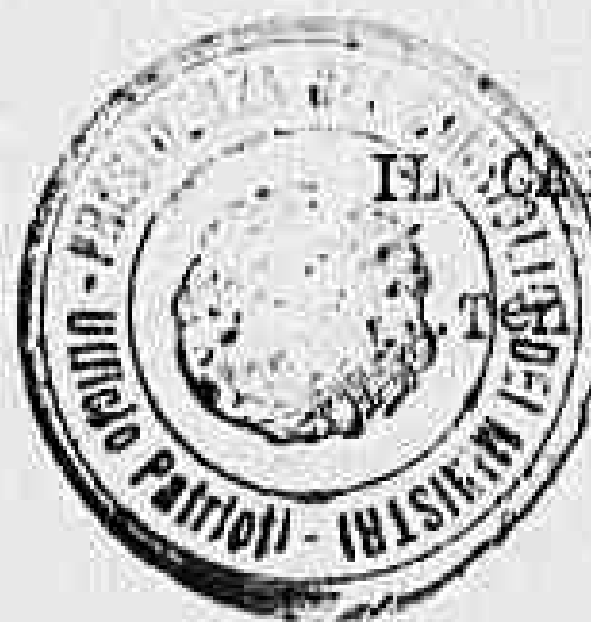

The letter ref 1225/R.T. dated 21 inst. of the Central Patriotti Office, has arrived on 27 inst. through the District Military of Viterbo.

Regarding your communication, we wish to inform you that notwithstanding all good will it has been quite impossible to complete the work within the established time. The reasons are the following:

a) Many partisans must still receive the indemnities for wounds, some days ago 25 of patriots have not yet received compensations having lost a relative; all this is the fault of the man who had been appointed to make the payments, because of little

interest which he showed in his work, and because he closed the accounts and turned the books in at your office before having completed his work.

b) The issue of certificates would not be completed to the 1500 patriots of the Viterbo Province, because of transportation difficulties, the seasonal bad weather and because the arrival of the certificates has been delayed and it is impossible to prepare more than about 60 certificates each day; furthermore the Allied Provincial Commissioner has chosen to have the certificates distributed in the places where the patriots operated rather than have the partisans come to Viterbo. The only day fit for such ceremonies is Sunday, and this is another reason which delays the completion of the task.

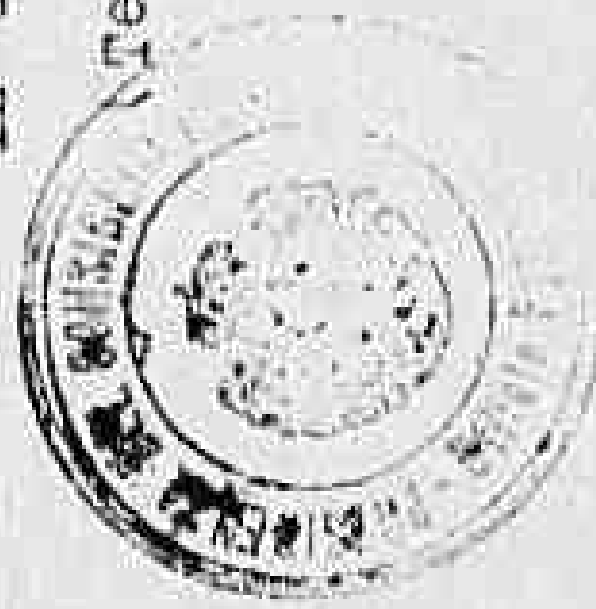

- 2 SECONDARI was ordered not to incite persons against joining the Army. Moreover he was required to sign a statement of which a copy is attached that he would not engage in any of these activities.
- 3 It was pointed out to him that if in territory subject to Allied Military Government he should ever again in any way try to persuade persons not to join the Army he would be prosecuted under Proclamation 1 Art V (42).
- 4 Copies of this letter are being sent to SCAO's Fifth and Eighth Army, Toscana Region, Abruzzi-Marche Region and IRTA, so that they may be informed of the history of this case and be ready to take prompt action should there be any violation.

Part I. Employment of Patriot Representatives.

1. If and when asked for by all or Regional Commissioners, Patriot Representatives will be provided to assist in the handling of Patriot problems.
2. Nominations of all Patriot Representatives must be confirmed by the Italian National Patriot Committee who are providing pay for each Representative at the rate of one hundred (100) lire per day from the time they are called up, and two hundred (200) lire per day from the time they receive their appointment.
3. Patriot Representatives who are selected by the Italian National Patriot Committee to receive pay until their appointments have been confirmed by the Italian National Patriot Committee who reserve the right to withhold payment if they wish.
4. Patriot Representatives who engage in political activities will be immediately dismissed.
5. Serving regular army officers on full pay cannot be employed, and any now serving in this capacity must be released by mid-November. Regular officers on minimum pay can be employed until called back by the Ministry of War.
6. Patriot Representatives will be organized in pairs, one being civilian and the other military. Normally one pair of Patriot Representatives will be engaged for each Regional and Provincial Headquarters provided Regional Commissioners ask for them. Upon completion of their course of duty, which should vary between one and two months, they should be returned to the Italian National Patriot Committee by Regional Commissioners who must not retain their services for longer than is necessary.
7. Headquarters will have agreed that Patriot Representatives shall receive free petrol, free billets and a free issue of rations. They will not be allowed 1/2 day for messes of their own, but will be allowed 1/2 day for messes of their own.

Part I. Employment of Patriot Representatives.

1. If and when asked for by a Regional Commissioner, Patriot Representatives will be provided to assist in the handling of Patriot problems.
2. Nominations of all Patriot Representatives must be confirmed by the Italian National Patriotic Committee who are providing pay for each Representative at the rate of one hundred (100) lire per day from the time they are called up, and two hundred (200) lire per day from the time they receive their appointment.

7. Headquarters. I have agreed that Patriot Representatives shall receive free petrol, free billets and a free issue of rations. They will not be allowed M.O.S. for messes of their own, nor will they draw supplies from R.M. or Post Exchange Services. "Free billets" is not to be construed as including furniture or bedding. Patriot Representatives, if admitted to Allied Officers messes, will be required to pay the local messing fee.
8. Any Patriot Representatives found to be in possession of mail, or party to, or acting as an agent for, the carrying of mail will be subject to immediate dismissal and severe punishment.

9. Lists of Patriot Representatives will be sent fortnightly to Regional Commissioners who are responsible for ensuring that all representatives in their area are duly and punctually paid, as laid down in Part II.

Part II. Payment of Patriot Representatives.

1. Regional Commissioners will notify the Regional Finance Officers of the names and location of all Patriot Representatives in the Region. Any change in the personnel of the Patriot Representatives or in their location will at once be reported to the Regional Finance Officer by the Regional Commissioner.
2. On the basis of the information received from the Regional Commissioner, the Regional Finance Officer will make arrangements to pay, through his Provincial Finance Officers or other sub-accountants, the Patriot Representatives who will be distributed throughout the Region.
3. Patriot Representatives will immediately be paid by A.C. as from the date of their appointment or as from the 1st of September if their appointment was prior to that date, up to 15th of October 1944. Thereafter they will be paid on the last and the 15th day of each month.
4. The rate will be two hundred (200) Lira per day for a 7-day week. The rate will be the same for civilians and for officer personnel irrespective of rank.
5. The pay of Patriot Representatives will eventually be recovered by A.C. from the Italian National Patriot Committee. It will therefore be necessary for all Patriot Representatives to be paid on a separate payroll, two original copies of which, signed by each Patriot Representative drawing pay, will be forwarded with the monthly report of Receipts and Disbursements to the Chief Accountant A.C. 6. Attached is a schedule with the names of existing Patriot Representatives. This schedule should be used as a basis for making the original payment. Thereafter, the schedules will be sent periodically to the Region; as, however, the Regional Commissioner may change the personnel or location of the Patriot Representatives in his Region, these lists may not subsequently reflect the actual situation. For this reason they will only act as the authority for payment, up to the end of September, and subsequent payment will be made on the authority of the Regional Commissioner.

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PART III. Hire of Motor Vehicles.

1. Motor vehicles may be hired on behalf of the Patriot Representatives on the specific authority of the Patriotic Branch, Headquarters I.C., who will issue instructions through the Regional Commissioners. In all such cases the prior agreement of the Italian National Patriotic Committee will be obtained.

2. The Sub-accountant making the payment will obtain a receipt on a Payment Voucher, P/F 2, in triplicate (using two originals and one in duplicate), and will mark them clearly to show that the payments in question are in respect of the hire of vehicles for Patriot Representatives.

The two originals will then be sent, with his Monthly Report of Receipts and Disbursements, to the Chief Accountant, at Headquarters. Such expenditures will subsequently be recovered from the Italian National Patriot Committee by A.C. in the same way as the pay of the Patriot Representatives.
