## PROVINCIAL PATRIOTS' COMMITTEE-PERUGIA

TranslationReport on the last six months:

Six months ago the Provincial Commissioner appointed me to be the president of this Committee in order to carry out all the work in favour of the patriots, as it was established by Higher Allied Military Command.

This activity included among others :

- a) To give to all those patriots who were really fighting the "Alexander" certificate.
- b) Reassuring of patriots into civil life in order to avoid patriots being unoccupied.
- c) Institution of battalions of those patriots who voluntarily desired to fight in order to be part of the Italian Forces.

The Committee started its work and made at the beginning weekly reports on its activities. After the arrival of the two officers from Rome, I did not make any more reports because the officers made them directly and therefore it would have been useless to make them twice at the same time.

The two officers took care of the functioning of the Committee and the offices, while the Committee was carrying out the a/m three main activities.

- A. The Committee contacted all the communal branches and checked on them in order to control the lists which were to be made out including those who had a right for recognition, and they checked that these lists be made accordingly to the circular of Aug 44.

When we had to decide whether these lists were right or not, this Committee did not only make a formal examination, but made its investigations on the place. In several cases errors were to be corrected and recognition was stated as not being due to entire squads of young people, who though having done a good job and having also risked their lives, still cannot be considered as patriots, as they did not really fight because of not having had any arms.

Thus the right for recognition has been denied to all those who have efficiently helped and sided the patriots, but who fall under the category of collaborators in the war effort.

In other words, our Committee had to realize once more the high

value of the patriots' activities in Umbria, but it has paid tribute only to partisans and to those who by forming squads and by connecting their activities are to be considered to be the directors of the clandestine activity.

- B. First of all the Committee tried to have all the former patriots reinstated in their former occupations. This was a social necessity and also our duty. The tranquility of the country was a necessity of military nature to the Allies who were fighting the war; it was also a necessity of ours, in order not to handicap the work of reconstruction which was most urgent to be initiated.
- Our work was directed on this line and this success was excellent, though the help given to us by the "Epuration" was very little. However, we have done well. Today there are only a few unoccupied persons among patriots, or in other words some of them did not get the same occupation as they were used to before.
- C. Volunatristism has also been successful. Certainly, if immediately after the liberation, our youth, who had been promised to be considered in a later date as the advanced guards of the Italian National Army would have been accepted (while instead they have been disarmed and abandoned); if the Allies would have realized since the very first that these boys did not represent the defeated Fascism but the non fascist Italy, more young people would have followed the call up. However from each part of Umbria young boys have left in order to join the Division "Cremona" and others. They have already witnessed their faith for their country and for liberty; our province has already its dead soldiers. Besides this activity the Committee has carried out also an other one: Assistance and help: to political victims, to the families of dead and killed persons, to partisans who require assistance and to those who are passing by in order to reach the front line and to those who are recovered in hospital. The Committee has collected funds and so it was possible to meet certain necessities. The Union of Italian Women has helped very much. As far as clothing is concerned the Allied Command and especially Jr/Cmdr Goggin have tried to meet our requests.
- An so calling at the kindness of the women in every country place I may finish my report.

I Lt. Ferri Enrico, military representative of the Patriots Branch with the Provincial Commissioner of the A.C. in the province of Perugia, submit to the above Commands the definitive report on my activity from 8 Sept. 1944 to 10 Jan. 1945.

I point out that I always observed the dispositions issued by the said Commands: if sometimes I interpreted them somewhat elastically I did it for having been a patriot myself. Knowing thoroughly the characters of the various patriots, I wanted all the partisans of the province to appreciate much better the exertions which the Allied Authorities and the Italian Government are undertaking to settle their situation and to re-employ them.

Thus I have succeeded in creating in the mass of the partisans a conscience such as to awake in them the sense of discipline and duty: the final result is that these men rendered hard and sometimes also indisciplined by the dreadful life of a clandestine guerrilla war which can be fully appreciated only by him who experienced it himself, have now become good and quiet citizens who endeavour everywhere to facilitate the war effort of the Allies against the common enemy.

For this work I have availed myself of two elements: 1° - setting up the Communal Committees of Patriots selecting intelligent persons whom the partisans of the Comune could rely upon; 2° - seeking

to make the acquaintance of all the patriots of the province being thus enabled to state and at the same time to examine their needs and wishes.

I have given strictest orders to the Communal Committees for the recognition of the patriots following for their qualification the definition given by Gen. Alexander. Once this work had been finished by the Communal Committees of the patriots I betook myself to the areas trying to assist in the most proper way all the patriots who needed work and employment. I dare say that every Body, every firm, whether state-owned or private, is counting now among its employees and workers a certain number of patriots. Through the co-operation of the Allied Officers of the Perugia A.C. I could obtain the enlistment of partisans also in police units: many of them are serving indeed in the Forests Division, in the Questura and as agents of the auxiliary police.

All this proves what I have said before: that the partisan, after performing his task against the enemy, has turned again a citizen conscious of his duty and answerable for the grave situation of his country.

And as a citizen the Umbrian patriot has understood also how to respond to another appeal: the appeal of the new and free Italy who applies to her best sons for the organisation of new divisions that soon will be utilised shoulder to shoulder with the Allies against the common, the hated enemy.

On November 18 left the first detachment of 80 partisans of the Brigades "Leoni" and "Francesco Innamorati" whose commands are in the town of Perugia. All these boys have been destined to a fighting group which soon will have the honour of taking the arms up against the enemy.

Ten days after the above news had been announced above 400 partisans had offered to volunteer;except in the case of an act of God they will leave Perugia on January 15.Among them there are men who are 40 and boys who are 18 years old,all of them however linked up by the same feelings and the same enthusiasm.And the weapons will be taken up again for three aims: 1° to give the Allies a contribution superior to that they have given till now for the liberation of their country. 2° To combat with equal arms against that enemy whom they wiped out so often also when being inferior to him. 3° To stress their solidarity and to assist their heroical brethren of the North who in this moment(uttermost difficult for them)show the temper the Italian partisan has been framed of.

I beseech the aforesaid Commands to be substituted in my charge with the Provincial Commissioner at Perugia,desirous of fighting again close by those boys with whom I so often faced the peril:apart from my feelings this is being imposed upon me also by the dutywhich are incumbend on an officer and principled man:to lead one's men in the danger and to fulfill the promise made on the tombs of dead friends:to avenge them.

I thank Col.Bolser,Provincial Commissioner of Perugia, and Capt.Falk, Deputy Prov.Commissioner,who at any moment gave me wise advice helping me enormously for carrying out my task.

This report includes also last week's report that could not be done on account of bad weather and unserviceability of the roads which now prevented me to carry out the inspections to the Communal Committees.

I have visited the Patriots Committee at Città di Castello to follow the work of assistance and distribution of funds to the members of the "Brigata d'Urte" whose commander, Capt. Stelio TARTAGLIA, has received from the "Fond. Città di Castello" the external funds, the sum of 547.000 lire for the first assistance to the members of his band.

In Foligno, the local council Committee has finished the certification of the Patriots, and has transmitted to the A.C.C. U.I. the lists of the Patriots to whom the Alexander certificate will have to be issued.

Both, at Ascoli and Bettola, following a visit I paid to the Mayors of both places, I assure there are no Patriots.

Both in Perugia and Piacenza, I have noticed the good functioning of the Communal Committees, the return to civilian work of the Patriots has been done intelligently and assiduously.

I wish to know from Headquarters of External Funds the amount of money handed to the band chieftains of the Perugia Province, so as to check that all the Patriots have actually received the prize awarded to each one by Headquarters.

This because it appears that many partisans have not received the sum of 500 lire, although the band Chieftain had drawn  $\frac{1}{2}$  lire from such prize from Headquarters.

I have obtained by Major Butterley, Chief of the Allied Police, the enlistment of 30 Patriots as privates in the Regie Forze delle Poste. The enlistment will become effective as soon as the mil-

cations will be completed by the necessary documents.

On Sunday, November 5th, Goncalo Alexander certificates will be awarded to the Patriots of this District.

I hereby notify that the representative of the C.I.I. Mr. Berna Armando, has left for Rose 13 days ago, and has not yet returned creating a good deal of discontent with the Provincial Governor, especially because he is using a motor car "Aurillac" belonging to the A/C.C.

From the middle of August it has been constituted at Perugia a Provincial Central Committee for Patriots (President: Lawyer Abettini Alfredo, President of the local C.I.L.N. too - members: the prefect, the vice-prefect - the chief of the Italian police, three representatives of the military joint, two representatives of the banks and two representatives of the chief of province, which have been pointed out by the archbishop. The constitution of this Committee don't seem to satisfied the active patriots, which can't believe to be justly represented. There is also discontent among the patriots for the lack of work, but now workers are engaged for road reparations. The communal office of the patriots of Perugia is now constituting. In this month the certificates can be delivered by the Allies. Political tendency of the bands - one half without political ideas a quarter communist and the remaining quarter liberals. The demobilization and the delivery of the arms have just been done.

Province of CHIETI (4th October) -

At Lanciano, has just been created a section on the 1st December 1943, which is now led by Mr. Remo Smerigo and Dr. Carlo Scenici, of Hungarian nationality, and an ex-political internee - it seems that some dubious elements have succeed to enter in this section as collaborators. But the leaders are trying to eliminate those elements. Many patriots are without work and we are trying to help them. The remittance of the arms had just taken place ( 250 guns - a machine-guns 4 cases of hand grenades ) - the civil authorities, the CCRA, and the Patriots section are imperfect agreement. The enlistment of volunteers is satisfying besides those elements which had just left we have other 40 requests of enlistment.

The recruitment of volunteers is satisfying besides those elements which had just left we have other AC requests of enlistment.

Province of PIEMONTE (10th October) .-

The situation is rather delicate. Prevalent Communist and extremist tendencies. Villany acts are to report. In nearly all the province the most important charges have been assumed by Communist elements. Communist Committees have been constituted but they meet difficulties because they are boycotted in their work. Generally there is dislike against military men. They have not received well the news of an eventual participation to the war in the front. The arms are delivered unwillingly. It would be necessary to settle as soon as possible the position of the military men and especially of the officers. It would be opportune to constitute a supply office provided of assistance funds. The Allies auspicate to a quick restoration of order and are helping the representatives in their duties.

Province of LUCCA ( 10th October )--

The situation of patriots is becoming with the allied advance always more complicated, so that new orders and instruction are requested to the Allied Government.

The patriot formations are becoming always more perfect, numerous and trained. They are really military organizations which live and act in close co-operation with the allied Command.

The needy conditions of life and of struggle are making the first contacts with the allied forces are very delicate. Vice-versa the allies learn and demobilize the lands as soon as they reach them, and nothing is done to help the patriots with food or lodging. Hundreds of patriots are found in rear lines in the mountainous zones without any supply of food and clothes and they are often sick.

Often it happens that patriots who were wounded in fights and are still suffering of the consequences of the old neglected wounds are not recovered in allied hospitals. This must be still the consequence of old orders issued several month ago by the allies, when the patriots, problem had not yet reached the actual proportion. The desarmament of the districts is done in a way which exasperate the souls and attains exactly opposite results. Therefore many arms are not delivered. Especially the first allied groups or allied authorities which contact with the patriots often act with them without tact and without recognizing the activities and sacrifices of the patriots. Many patriots wishes to continue to fight against the Germans by the allied planes, but these requests are generally neglected. Only few elements are used as guides and informers and only for limited periods. Therefore after a short time the bands dissolve with general discontent and too oftenly the patriots pay attention to ideas which are preached to them and which generally are leading to villainy actions. Remarkable is the difficulties which must support the patriots which are not of this region. Insoluble is the situation of the patriots which are from northern Italy.

LUCCHESE AREA ( 10th October - Verbal report from two representative officers )--

Besides what have been said in the above paragraph about the treatment of the patriots by the allied commands we have to point out the getting worse of the moral and material discomfort and of the state in which the patriots are abandoned owing to the disinterest of the Italian military and civilian authorities. Besides what have been said in the above paragraph about the treatment of the patriots by the allied Commands we have to point out the setting worse of the moral and material discomfort of the state in which the patriots are abandoned owing to the desinterest of the Italian military and civil itellen authorities. In some cases even indifference and fear are shown to the patriots. Generally there is lack of organization which is justified only with the lack of supplies on the place. There is no help from the governments, authorities. In some country the patriots have often found on responsibility places, persons which are known as nazi-fascist elements and for their aversion towards the patriots. Also during the period of the underground movement the patriots have not always the comprehension of the civil population. And this for the lack of a good propaganda for the resistance from the Committee of Liberation. Often the Committees remained inactive just to show themselves only at the last moment, to take the leading places in the country, and demonstrated oftenly very little comprehension towards the patriots who have suffered and fought on the mountains. The patriotic organizations of the area are nearly all without political tendency.

PROPOSALS

The most important problems to solve are:

- To assist the patriots immediately after they have crossed the lines.
- To help the patriots who wish to go back to their families.
- The incorporation of patriots in fighting units and their immediate employment with the Allies forces in places which they know very well.
- Organization of the regroupment centers ( supply offices e.s.o.) for the assistance and the setting out of the patriots. To settle in a short time the military positions of the officers and military men with the payment of the allowances.
- The issue by the Allied Authorities and the Italian Government of measures to solve in the best way the situation of the partisans in all its numerous aspects.

Translation of the 3rd report of the Provincial Committee for Patriots.

After the arrival of two Italian officers of the 8th Army Lt. BENNA and Lt. PERNI, who are encashed with a special service for the patriots, the Allied Command has decided that the formation of the provincial committee, the duty of which is to control the designation for the attainment of the recognition of the title "Patriot", will not be changed. The two officers will collaborate with the committee and will care that work goes on quickly. They have already provided for the installation of the office, which is composed by a secretary (Lt. Bonanni - a partisan); two typists and an usher. Furthermore Marcella Abatini is working together with me, as she has collaborated with me in the Committee of Liberation during all the period of clandestine activity. Logically she does her work gratuitously.

During the last week I have been in ten communes. I might have paid visit to more communes, but I have lost a lot of time because of the bad conditions of the country roads. (Once my car was to be taken out of mire by some oxen). My car needs to be repaired, the tyres ought to be changed and the brakes do not function. I need to get a brake-lining, but it is very difficult to get it.

I have also paid a visit to the CAO of Foligno, who has sent some lists of patriots to the Allied Command, but the lists do not contain any indication of the activity of the bands. Such lists can not be considered a basis, upon which to propose to the Allies to give recognition to the patriots.

In the commune of Città di Castello and in Pietralunga the ceremony of the distribution of the certificates for the patriots has already taken place.

Also in the commune of Foligno great part of the patriots has been settled.

Everywhere I have recommended to send as soon as possible the lists of those patriots who are still unoccupied to the provincial committee, indicating their capacity and their desires.

I think that the sistemation of the patriots will not be

difficult, because there is only a very small part that needs systematically.

In the commune of Karsciano there has been committed the fascist massacre of the brothers CECI.

Considering the horror, connected with the assassination of these three boys, it becomes more macabre and atrocious; it may be considered as the most criminal folly. (The last episode: one of the boys was put into the coffin, not yet dead, but howling and crying being grievously wounded; it was ordered not to "finish" him, but to leave him as he was to die in the coffin.) People is waiting for justice there. No one of the persons who are suspected of having acted as spies or taken part when the boys were arrested, is arrested now. I think that the first assistance to give is to make justice. It would be necessary to make investigations. Such investigations may be entrusted to a college, that will be composed by a magistrate, a lawyer and a member of the Committee of the Patriots.

In the territory of Umbertide there is an episode of extreme German cruelty.

The house of a numerous peasant's family (with whom two other refugee families lived) was surrounded by a group of Germans. After they had placed their machine guns they started shooting so that nobody could leave the house. Then the house was set on fire by the Germans. The Germans went away while the victims were crying and tried to save themselves. Part of the people succeeded in saving themselves. The house and all the other property is completely destroyed. Translation

The activity of the two officers has developed normally. Forms have been sent to all the communes; these forms will be filled up by the communal committees setting out all the elements necessary for valuation and control. For the zone of Polignano work may be considered as finished; indeed we have got a complete list of all those elements who are thought to deserve recognition; all these elements were part of the "Brigate Gariboldi" which has already been acknowledged by the Central Committee of National Liberation, Rome, during the period of Sept 1943 up to June 1944.

The report of the commander of this brigade, Lt. CANARELLI, sets out all the actions made by this brigade and contains also indications on every element of the brigade. Thus the provincial committee may examine all the documents and then proceed immediately to the definitive designation to the Allied Command.

MONTI MARTANI. This report includes also the report of the last week, which I was not able to compile as I was ill for a few days.

During this period the two collaborating officers went to Città di Castello (in order to continue the activity of assistance and of distribution of 750.000 lire received from the Center of Rome to be given to the Patriots who have obtained recognition and to the families of the fallen Patriots: Every Patriot gets 3.000 lire and every family of fallen Patriots gets 10.000 lire); Foligno, Spoleto, Assisi, Settignano.

At Foligno all those who have a right for recognition have been recognized, but they need specific dates for their own necessities of the work entrusted to them from Rome, which is not known to this Committee.

At Assisi and Bertone it was confirmed that there were no Patriots.

I myself could move only once (excluding the days when I was ill) because I am for more than 15 days without any car. By means of fortune I could reach Perugia and Pecialino. Furthermore I have contacted with the north of the province through young boys who were to go there.

At Perugia as well as in Pecialino I have seen that the Local Committees were functioning following the directives. Also the reemployment of Patriots has been carried out in a very satisfactory way. At Pecialino I was informed about the action of reprisal committed by the Germans at Muffa on June 5th 1944. In consequence of this action 6 men died. These men aided the partisans. One of them, Mezzetti, has left his wife with two children. I have asked for a report on the matter, which I have received yesterday (copy of it is hereto attached). On my own initiative I have had collected a small sum of 5.000 lire which I ordered to be given to this woman.

Last Thursday an assembly of the Provincial Committee has taken place. During the discussion, the prefect suggested to give recognition as being 'Patriots' to all those killed by the Germans or fascistic majority of the committee was of the opinion that only those are to be considered as such who have died in fighting, all the others are to be considered only as 'victims'; to them every assistance ought to be reserved, but they cannot encircle among Patriots in order to get recognition from the Allies.

However, I was charged with informing on this matter the Allied Command and the 2 officers so that they may report to their Center at Rome. (The 2 officers state that they had got already instructions which were in accordance with the opinion of the majority of the Committee)
