- 1) Demobilisation of units has been completed without incident and with good discipline. Collection of arms has been sufficient. Recemployment needs to be encouraged.
- 2) Army recruiting agencies have not yet begun enlistment: they appear to be slow and badly organized.
- 3) Payments of bonuses has begun and difficulties have been met.

Total demobilisation in 8 Army area about 6000 partisans.

A list of visited areas from 7 to 20 May.

Observations : In the Friuli Province two separate groups have operated under the united Command of Col. E. Grossi who was appointed on 27 April. The two formations have entirely different methods and political directives. Because of the tension with the Slavs and for security reasons which have been recommended it is impossible to give a precise report on the situation.

For the time being there have been no incidents only a feeling of expectation and discomfort. Political propaganda is strong.

Since the losses of Maj. SNEE and Maj. CORBIN from AC. Patriot Branch and AMG. the presence of another officer who will give directives is indispensable.

OGGETTO: Relazione sulla 66° Brigata Gariboldi "Enero Verona"

Nel febbraio 1944 mentre ero a Casalfiumanese ho preso contatto con i Partigiani tramite tale Ivo Bassi residente a San Martino in Pedriolo (Valle del Sillaro). Nel marzo stesso anno mi sono abboccato con emissari del C.L.N. di Bologna. Nel giugno e luglio 1944 più volte mi sono portato a monte Cerere ove era il Comando della 66° Brigata Gariboldi.

Il 1 Agosto 1944 ero presso la Brigata perchè avevo portato al Commissario Politico Tommaso la somma di L.30.000.- offerta per i Partigiani dal Cav. Martini di Casalfiumanese e in quel giorno fui invitato, col Commissario Politico della Brigata Tommaso (Aldo Bacchilega di Castel S. Pietro), Ivo Bassi, il Capitano medico Iacchini, il Tenente Attila, a recarmi nella Canonica di Vedriano (S.O. di Castel S. Pietro) e lì i menzionati del C.L.N. di Bologna a nome del C.M.U.E.R. mi comunicavano la mia nomina a Comandante la 66° Brigata Gariboldi e fu stabilito il mio nome in quello di Col. Orfeo. Vice Comandante della Brigata il Tenente Attila, Capo di S.M. il Capitano Iacchini, Commissario Politico Tommaso.

Il 2 Agosto la Brigata ai miei ordini, per l'imminente azione di rastrellamento da parte delle forze germaniche e delle co.m. si trasferiva, in formazione di gruppi guerrieri, sul monte Alafine.

Dal 2 al 14 Agosto 1944 la Brigata ai miei ordini ha portato ferocemente a termine azioni di imboscata ed elementi delle forze germaniche nella zona Ciugnola-Piancalcoli-Casoni di Romagna.

Il 14 Agosto tutta la formazione si portava a Rapenno nella cui zona agiva la 36° Brigata Partigiani.

Una Compagnia della 66° Brigata agli ordini del Ten. Attila (deceduto in combattimento nel Settembre 1944) ha combattuto per quattro giorni avanti a Palazzolo le battaglie vittoriose della 36° Brigata; a suo tempo mandai dettagliata relazione al C.M.U.E.R.

Dopo il combattimento la Compagnia di Attila fu assorbita dalla 36° Brigata, il rimanente della 66° Brigata (18 Agosto 1944) si addeveva nella cresta montana fra Monterenzio e Monte Calderaro, cresta dominante le due vallate del Sillaro e dell'Idige.

Con nuovi elementi affluiti dalla formazione G.A.P. di Bologna, la formazione ha continuato senza soluzione di conti-

Nel febbraio 1944 mentre ero a Casalfiumanese ho preso contatto con i Partigiani tramite tale Ivo Bassi residente a San Martino in Padriolo (Valle del Sillaro). 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Con nuovi elementi affluiti dalla formazione C.A.F. di Bologna, la Brigata da me comandata ha continuato senza soluzione di continuità, nel tempo, le sue azioni di programma: "Guerra al nazofascisti".

Il 7 Settembre 1944 per invito del C.M.U.S.R. mi portai col capitano in S.P.R. Serpiari Piero (Pescia) a Bologna dove presi contatto col Comandante il C.M.U.S.R. e col suo capo di S.M. Capitano in S.P.R. Sorani; avevo sfidato il comando della 66° Brigata a Poggi Eros (detto Folino) studente in medicina di Castel S. Pietro), consulente militare il tenente di complemento Paolucci (detto Oreo) di Castel S. Pietro.

L'abboccamento col Comandante del C.M.U.S.R. portava alla mia nozione di consulente militare per la Brigata 36°-62°-66° Mattioli e Stella Rossa, Brigate che dovevano marciare su Bologna.

Col Capitano Serpiari Piero mi portai presso la Brigata Stella Rossa nella zona di Vado per prendere accordi con quel Comandante (Lupo). Circostanze contingenti impedirono l'adunata delle Brigate ed io il 14 Settembre ritornai presso la 66° Brigata e ne riassunsi il comando.

Dal 14 al 27 Settembre molte furono le azioni della 66° Brigata ai miei ordini, in conseguenza di attacchi alla stessa da parte di forze germaniche; azioni brillanti per risultato fattive e delle quali, come sempre, relazionai al C.M.U.S.R..

Il 27 Settembre 1944 a mezzo delle staffette Morino di Varignate, che allora agiva nella zona di Casoli di Romagna, di costiera un Comando unico, di adunare varie Brigate per una eventuale marcia su Bologna.

Giunto il 28 successivo a Casoli di Romagna, non vi trovai la 62° Brigata perchè già in movimento verso Montebelluno, erano in atto combattimenti fra le forze alleate e tedeschi sulla Futa e nella zona Piancaldo. Casoli di Romagna e la Brigata 62° e 66° ognuna per suo conto, efficacemente cooperarono alla battaglia attaccando elementi germanici nelle immediate retrovie del loro schieramento, con azioni di sabotaggio e disturbo.

Con molta difficoltà il 7 Ottobre 1944, col Capitano Serpiari riuscii a raggiungere la zona di Varignate (Ovest di Castel S. Pietro) ove appresi che la 66° Brigata aveva dovuto lasciare la sua zona in quanto sotto al fuoco delle artiglierie degli alleati e germanici che.

La Brigata si ridusse a nuclei di partigiani divisi nella zona che comprende la fascia stradale Idice-Imola (via Emilia) e nel territorio compreso nella locanda Varignate, Castel S. Pietro, Montebelluno, Veduggio, Varignate.

Col Capitano Serpiari ed un forte nucleo di partigiani io avevo il comando a La Gonnadina (S.E. di Varignate) e con esso molta azione, l'incendio di un deposito di munizioni, sabotaggio e, cosa più importante, l'incendio di un deposito di munizioni.

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Il 27 Settembre 1944 a mezzo della staffetta Morino di Varignone ricevevetti l'ordine dal C.A.U.E.R. di portarmi presso la 62^a Brigata, che allora agiva nella zona di Casoli di Ronagna, di costituire un Comando unico, di adunare varie Brigate per una eventuale marcia su Bologna.

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Col Capitano Serpieri ed un forte nucleo di partigiani io avevo il comando a La Cosvadrina (S.E. di Varignone) e con esso molta azione portai a felice esito: imboscate, sabotaggio e, cosa più importante, l'incendio di un deposito di munizioni tedesche nelle immedie vicinanze di Casalecchio dei Conti (S.O. di Castel S. Pietro).

Il Commissario Politico Raccillaga Aldo continuò la sua attività (lodevolissima sempre) stando in Castel S. Pietro.

Non ho mai perso il contatto con i partigiani, col Commissario Politico e col C.M.U.B.R. Ma il 2 Novembre ho dovuto abbandonare la zona perché i tedeschi facevano rastrellamenti casolare per casolare, mi portai perciò a Castel S. Pietro presso quel C.I.N.

Il giorno 28 Novembre per ordine del C.M.U.B.R. mi trasferii a Imola ed ho preso contatto col locale C.I.N. lavorando sempre con esso, perdendo quasi totalmente il contatto con la 66a Brigata; ero però sempre in collegamento col Commissario Politico Bacchilega di Castel S. Pietro dal quale avevo notizie che i gruppi della 66a Brigata, pur divisi, continuavano efficacemente la lotta nella pianura e nel G.A.P. di Bologna.

Il 29 Marzo 1945 il C.M.U.B.R. mi comunicava per iscritto di tenermi pronto per raggiungere Bologna perché assegnato ad altro incarico.

Forse il precipitare degli eventi non ha permesso al C.M.U.B.R. di farmi portare a Bologna e perciò il C.I.N. di Imola mi ha affidato il Comando militare di quella piazza.

Non mi è possibile dare gli elenchi degli appartenenti alla 66a Brigata Garibaldi Piero Iacchia, produrre il carteggio, segnalare i finanziatori della Brigata, segnalare le molteplici azioni partigiane, segnalare il nome dei caduti, dei feriti, segnalare i meritevoli di ricompensa, in quanto tutto il carteggio, ruolini compresi, il materiale del Comando, compresa una radio trasmittente catturata ai tedeschi, è stato dal Commissario Politico Bacchilega interrato nei pressi del Comando la Brigata poco innanzi di lasciare la zona occupata e che poteva essere raggiunta dalle truppe germaniche allora in atteggiamento contrattaccante.

Di ogni azione, di ogni cosa amministrativa e di quanto altro riguardavano fatti o cose della 66a Brigata, con diligenza veniva fatta relazione al C.M.U.B.R.

Segnalo che presso la 66a Brigata trovavano degno posto un maggiore aviatore inglese caduto perché con l'apparecchio colpito dalla controerea tedesca, due sottufficiali aviatori sud-africani, un ufficiale inferiore medico americano.

I quattro su menzionati, alla fine settembre 1944 per loro espresso desiderio, vestendo l'uniforme inglese, furono accompagnati da guide sicure e provate, praticissime della zona, verso la linea di combattimento (zona di Casone di Romagna) per il tentativo di oltrepassare la linea e raggiungere l'esercito alleato. Non posso dire se il tentativo abbia avuto esito felice in quanto non ho

gata, pur divisi, continuavano efficacemente la lotta nella pianura e nel C.A.F. di Bologna.

In piena coscienza affermo che la 66° Brigata Garibaldi Piero Jachia, animata da sicura fede patriottica, per il valore dei suoi gregari ben merita ~~la~~ riconoscenza della Patria; partigiani perfetti, soldati valorosi, hanno affrontato ogni rischio con la serenità dei forti, per amore della Patria, della libertà, con un unico scopo: abbattere il nazi-fascismo.

La 66° Brigata Garibaldi Piero Jachia non è seconda a nessun altra.

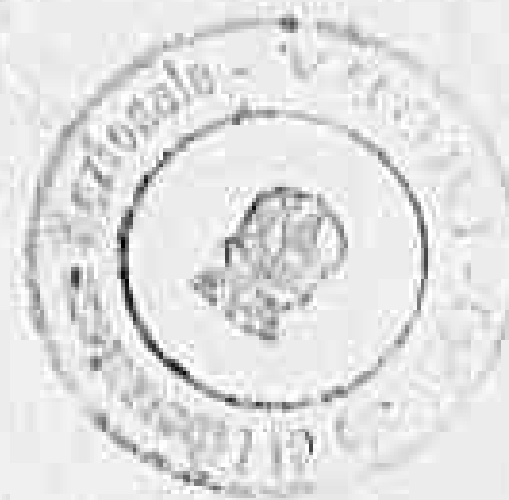

1. Violated arms.  
The organization of my office, the formation of the commission, and the lack of transportation have prevented me from establishing contacts with the patriots of the province and forming a clear idea on the situation in various areas and communes.
2. Political tendencies.  
The political tendencies of partisan formations which already showed a tendency towards extreme policies during the underground period, have now become decidedly communist. According to information I have received the situation has been and is quiet. There have been no incidents worthy of note.

3. Collection of arms.  
Having no data concerning the collection of arms in our area, I have gathered information from the leaders and vice commanders of the bands. Such information is fully trustworthy but I plan to check it as soon as it is possible to establish contacts with partisan and non partisan elements on the outskirts.

Others keep them for personal defense or for the defense of their property, others to trade them, and others having become sentimentally attached to them (especially where pistols are concerned), finally others keep their arms for political reasons.

I will check the matter, make further investigations, and transmit any important information I obtain.

### 4. Enlistments.

About 400 patriots have been enlisted, it is believed though that this figure is below the actual figure because at present it is impossible to check enlistments of members of small formations not included in the reports and lists of the Brigades.

It would appear that many more wish to enlist. The Mayors of the Communes, considering the fact that enlistment are temporarily suspended, have been requested to keep a list of all those who wish to enlist.

### 5. Reemployment.

I do not know the number of patriots that have been reemployed to date. It appears from the files that a few mayors (in reply to a request from HQ) have reported the number of unemployed patriots. These lists are not complete (the data necessary to proceed to reemployment is missing) and represent 4 Counties only. These lists show that there are 53 unemployed.

I believe this is one of the most important problems to solve. I will do everything possible to reach a satisfactory solution.

### 6. Repatriation.

About 20 patriots have been repatriated. In the province there are still many patriots from Northern Italy, as soon as possible, I will arrange that they find a satisfactory position in civil life.

### 7. Issue of certificates.

Certificates have already been issued some while ago. It appears that many worthy persons have not received the certificate because they were not members of the major bands, or for other reasons.

I will investigate the situation and possible a new issue of certificates may be necessary.

### 8. Ceremonies.

On 25 of February the "Day of the partisan and of the soldier" was celebrated. It was not possible to accept volunteers because of the suspension of enlistment.

### 9. Hospitalisation.

None. A short while ago a patriot from Lombardia was wounded while clearing mines. As a result he had to have a leg amputated. I wish to be informed if there is a convalescence home where the patriot could be sent awaiting the liberation of his home.

### 10. Notes.

1. The selection I intended to do amongst the patriots has proved impossible because of the time that has elapsed since the liberation. In the past it would have been possible to obtain the bona fide collaboration of the patriots leaders, to-day it is much more difficult because the leaders are all interested in showing that they have been commanding very large formations.

2. It is of paramount importance for my work that a motor vehicle should be put at my disposal. HQ. AMG. 8th Army have authorised me to hire a motor car at the normal rates. The second half of January was spent in collecting at Ancona and Jesi the necessary equipment for the organization of the Patriota Centre and to look for an adequate building in Ravenna.

Such premises equipped with indispensable installation will accommodate up to 500 partisans. At present accommodations are foreseen for 300. The centre will begin operating from 1 February. For the above reasons it was impossible for me to inspect the area of the Canadian Corps, but I understood that there are no more.

Partisans up at the front live in good harmony with the Italian Soldiers, and praise the behaviour of the latter. In town also there have been no difficulties. Partisans now show more interest for the National Army.

No recruiting Officer has so far come in this area with the exception of a Captain who once came to contact us and never returned. ))

The propaganda section of the partisans is carrying out a campaign favourable to the Army, and this attitude has coincided with the return from Centre Italy of Commander "Bulow".

During the last days 20 more patriots have been demobilized, and one of them asked and found work, the other 19 being peasants have returned to their land. Of them, two came from Southern Provinces and were recruited. Three Russian partisans have been passed and recommended to P.S.S. for recruitment.

Visited areas. On 18 and 23 January, in the area of the "Indochina" (Soviet). Considerable activity of the patriots numbering from 110 to 150, 100 of which belonging to the S.P. Batt., 15 to the G.I. detachment of 28th Brigade, about 10 in the 36th Brigade and 100, very few in the "Corpori" formation.

Political tendencies. Communist in the members of 36th Brigade and 28th Brigade (many members belonged to these formations not so much for their political ideas as for the better organization of the units.)

Non-political in the members of the G.I. and Corpori batt.

Collection of arms. Arms have been turned into the M.C. following the Allied arm. I will presently send in the figures of collected arms. During the underground period an airborne load of arms was nearly totally lost because of the desertion of the arms.

Present situation of the patriots. The transfer from guerrilla to normal life has taken place with no hindrance. Almost all patriots have returned to civil life. Those who had their families in other provinces have been repatriated. There have been no casualties yet in the Italian Army although many patriots went to fight and await the arrival of recruiting agencies.

Arms. The patriots Pelli Bruno, wounded in hospital, at the moment are in the local C.I. given a daily subvention of 50 lire to his dependents. The Brigadier J.S. has distributed about 15,000 lire to the patriots of the area.

The Second Patriots Committee has not yet been instituted but the Mayor is M. Petrovic, appointed by the C.I. In the "Soviet" there are several patriots.

Suggestions. Many patriots want to enlist in the Italian Army, and although I signalled the matter to the 3rd recruiting detachment nothing has so far been done. I suggest that Patriots Representatives be authorised to decide directly about the patriots who have found applications for enlistment.

Personal situation. May I point out again that I must be given a roadworthy motor car or at least 5 new tyres which I could fit on a motor car which could be hired or requisitioned. But I must have a means of transportation and cannot be dependent of half hazardous motor vehicles which might or might not be found.

I enclose a form of the displacement of the main formations that operated in the area.

2. Enlistment in the Army. I have already previously signalled the utter inefficiency of the recruiting Agency, at least as far as areas North of Cattolica and on the Adriatic shore are concerned.

I am aware of the considerable difficulties that were met, but I believe that much more could and should have been done. I understand that on 26 January enlistments were suspended. Could you please give me confirmation of this news (vide report No. 1 dated 10 Sept. last and letters ref. 0044 dated 25 Jan. last and letter ref. 0022 dated 15 Jan. last.).

3. Issue of certificates. Considering the importance of the matter, I have always sent the lists of those to whom certificates were being issued. Foreseeing the large bodies of patriots that will be met in the future it will be necessary to give bigger lots of certificates to the C.A.C. and A.B.C. not to be caught short of certificates when the necessity will arise.

4. Suggestions. I refer to my letter ref. 0044 dated 23 Jan. and I find that closer liaison amongst the Patriots Representatives would be necessary. A fortnightly meeting could be held to exchange ideas and mostly to enact the same policy. Closer contacts with the center would also be useful.

Observations concerning enlistment of partisans.

I point this out so that provisions may be taken in due time and thus avoid a standstill in the work.

Following my letter dated 10 November 1944 I inform  
of to the following

- On 16 November I went to Macerata to bring some documents concerning the screening of Patriot non commissioned officers and to ask Allied Authorities to hasten the issue of certificates to the "Spartaco" Brigade.
- On 17 November I went to Jesi to give the AMG Officer the documents concerning 351 certificates already issued and received by the above officer.
- On 18 November in Ancona to hand to the Command of the "Ancona" Brigade the list of the Patriots who died and whose families have already been awarded the 5.000 lire compensation. Such list had been requested by the Provincial Commission for the assistance to Patriots.
- On 19 November I returned to Jesi to fetch the documents of operational actions of the II Settore (underground military organisation) and to give a few certificates.
- At Macerata I found out, from the Patriot Nicola Rampa, that the 36th Brigade "Garibaldi" - Bianconcini - presently in Florence, was commanded by "Bob" of Faenza, and operated at Brisighella. The Brigade is an off-spring of the Centro Patrioti of Bologna.

Strength : about 1600 men;

Formation : 3 Btgs. each of 5 Companies.

Political tendencies: Prevailingly communist; a minority has

The Brigade is now in Florence, billeted at the Rossini

- 26 Oct. 8th Army H.Q. - for general instructions.
- 27 Oct. GATTOLICA - To hand in the report to the C.A.C. and clarification of the position of the partisans of the Area.

Observations. The motor vehicle assigned is nearly unserviceable. Another one has been requested from the local Allied Authorities. In consideration of the state of the roads it is essential that Motor Transport should be in perfect running order; the assignment of semi unserviceable motor vehicles means only a waste of time, hindrance to the service and necessitates constant application to local authorities who have their own exigencies and who can not always detach motor vehicles from their own duties for our use.

Situation at Figline Valdarno (Prov. of Florence).

In the area of Figline Valdarno acted a formation of partisans, commanded by BRUNORI Narciso and by POGGESI Athos, both of Figline. I have discussed with them all the problems concerning the partisans. The formation was composed of nearly forty men who acted in the territories of Figline, Mugello, Veggio, Incisa, Monastero, Castelnuovo, Gaville and Pavilli. They killed about a hundred of Germans and fascists and captured 15 German soldiers who were delivered to the British troops, they destroyed about a sixty enemy vehicles and shot about twenty *E-4000*, and thirty bridges, as well as war material and rolling stock.

The formation had lost in fightings 5 killed (among them a Polish deserter belonging to the German army, whose name is not known) 2 wounded and 2 prisoners.

The formation had for armament 101 guns and machine-guns - 66 of them are at S. Giovanni Valdarno by a certain BILLI Gualfo and the other 35 are delivered to BRUNORI Narciso in the carabinieri barracks of Figline. The formation was of a communist political tendency. The disarmament has caused pain to the partisans, but it has provoked no incident. Some of the partisans are now employed as auxiliary police, and they argue because they have to work with the carabinieri, who had just been at the *1674* of the

...over



germans, and had helped the patriots during the Nazi-fascist period. The kind and correct behaviour of the British troops has favourably impressed the partisans and has elicited all points of attention. Only one unpleasant incident happened among some civilians and a group of Italian soldiers (No 2 A.M.G. Evacuation Camp) - who sang the fascist hymn "Giovinezza". The commander of that group is Lt TOTTI Tuccio. A woman and a partisan already wounded by the few men had been ill treated by the soldiers. The incident has been closed later on without further consequences. To-day on my presence and upon my proposal the G.I.W. of Fighine held a meeting. After having observed the advice and the gratefulness of the actions, which had been accomplished by the partisans, it has been promised to effect proximately a ceremony in their honour and assign to each partisan, a sum of L. 1000 as a recompense of demobilisation. He also assured to help ~~the~~ as much as possible the needy families of partisans, who were killed in the fight for the liberation.

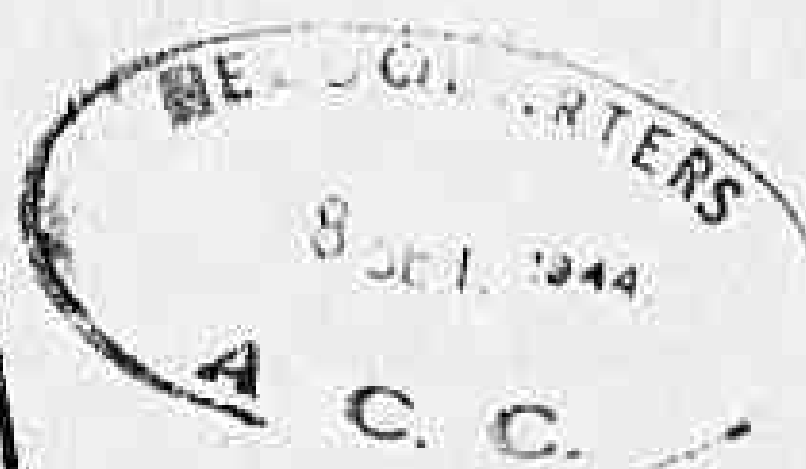

26 August 44.

Repairs to Car As I expected and stated in my previous report dated 19th August, my activities during this week amounted to almost nothing due to lack of transportation. At Arezzo it was impossible to find a car to be requisitioned or a workshop with the necessary spare parts, therefore I was obliged to send the car with my driver to the Boni garage at Perugia. Probably the car will be back in Castiglione Fibeschi to-night or to-morrow morning at the latest.

Arezzo: I contacted two Italian officers of the Patriot Branch for the Province of Arezzo, Lt. Antiochia Corrado patriot representative of the C.I.M. and Lt. Torrini patriot representative of the Military Centre.

With the above mentioned representatives an agreement was made, which only needs the approval of Col. Griffin, with regard to the bands of the 23rd Garibaldi Brigade Pio Borri concentrating in Arezzo, that certificates should be distributed by means of the local Patriot Branch which is compiling lists of partisans wishing to enroll in the Italian Army. The Patriot Branch was also getting a list of undesirable elements. The Patriot Branch would arrange repatriation of ex-partisans to their homes in liberated territory and would provide employment to ex-partisans of the area and of provinces still under enemy occupation. For the autonomous bands, that is, formations not under the 23rd Garibaldi Brigade, distribution of certificates would be made at the H.Q. of the bands by means of the local A.M.C. officer, possibly together with the Italian representative of the Patriot Branch.

Latenina: Certificates for the Raoul Band, not under the Garibaldi Brigade, which has declared itself autonomous, have been given to the A.M.C. officer yesterday. Distribution has been fixed for Monday 28th August and I mean to be present at the ceremony.

Lt. Lustrucci Bands It is operating under the Commando of the 1st Indian Cavalry Regiment. On the 24th August the Italian liaison officer in the name of his colonel expressed satisfaction for the work of the band in the Talla area. The band receives food rations direct from the Regimental Command and is more than satisfied with the treatment received. The only thing the band would like to have is more butter in order to have from time to time a hot meal, and some soap for personal cleanliness.

During the <sup>past few</sup> ~~last~~ days I went several times to Impruneta, where the local situation repeatedly required my intervention. In said locality, <sup>there</sup> operated the "Arno Group" now "Teseo", organised by the demo-Christian Party (Committee of Liberation of Florence) under orders of Lt. A.A. De Luca. The group, of the strength of 200 men, was divided into 4 bands, respectively at Impruneta, Samolò, Pozzoleatico and Galluzzo. In the Comune there was also a detachment of the 22 bis "Garibaldi" Brigade (organised by the Communist Party of Florence) under orders of a certain Pozzi, operating in liaison with the Arno Group. The disarmament of this last group was effected without any difficulty (there are still some partisans doing police-service); the communist detachment is rather reluctant to deliver the arms, especially in the locality of Tavarnuzze.

The representatives of the Local Communist Party showed scanty good-will towards collaboration with the A.M.G.. The C.A.C. complained of several incidents: two communist ex-partisans had been arrested while <sup>by</sup> ~~by~~ <sup>posting</sup> non-authorised manifestos of the Confederation of <sup>Labor</sup> ~~Workers~~; in the locality of Tavarnuzze a certain Gino Boccherini, representative of the P.C.I. had assumed a position decidedly opposed to the communal authorities, especially <sup>against</sup> ~~to~~ the Mayor, acting, especially in matters of voting (in opposition with the orders from the Comune, posting non-authorised manifestos, and occupying the ex-Municipio building.

I contacted the communist representatives, who excused

The C.A.C. complained of several incidents: two communist ex-partisans had been arrested while <sup>by</sup> ~~by~~ <sup>arresting</sup> non-authorized persons of the United Nation of <sup>Labor</sup> ~~work~~; in the locality of Tavarnuzze a certain Mino Roscherini, representative of the P.C.I., had assumed a position decidedly opposed to the communal authorities, especially <sup>against</sup> ~~for~~ the mayor, acting, especially in matters of rationing) in opposition with the orders from the Commune, posting non-authorized manifestos, and occupying the ex-Fascist building.

I contacted the communist representatives, who excused themselves for their behaviour to the mayor by saying that he is not a native (he is a Sardinian) and therefore not liked by the population, and moreover hostile to the Party. In order to accent collaboration they required a new mayor, and a number of members in the communal Council equal to that of the other organized party of Impruneta (the demo-christians). Judging it impossible to grant such requests, the mayor had proved to be a very competent and honest man and was

was trusted by ~~the~~ A.M.O. I did my best to persuade them. Following ~~the~~ the release of two young men who had been arrested, which helped helped to the pacification, the communists promised to change their minds and to examine the possibility of joining ~~in~~ the Council. They also promised to try to persuade the Tavarnuzze communists to deliver the arms. No later than Aug. 31, as fixed by the C.A.O.. The situation at Impruneta is now less strained.

I then went to Sesto San Giovanni, where <sup>there</sup> had been organizing a "Tricolore Berser" formation, organized by the democratic Christian Party of Florence, of the strength of 100 men, under orders of Politi Giuseppe, called "Erasmo Forte". The band was operating since March in the area from Consueto to Castelfranco; it had a very good individual armament, 1 skoda; 3 "mitras": ~~it had~~ <sup>of its it had been</sup> 3 men killed. Then I visited them, about 60 men were still serving with the allied commands, patrolling and ~~recommending~~ <sup>doing reconnaissance work</sup> in the zone of Sesto San Giovanni, Castelfranco and Pign di Sec. For this reason it did not appear to be fit to talk of disarming and dissolving the band; but I do not think this will offer any difficulty.

For the third time I went to S. Giovanni Valdarno, the situation of which ~~at~~ <sup>indicated</sup> I had signalled in my former report; the Billi band has finally dissolved without incidents.

In Florence I informed the Tuscan Committee of the situation of the commune of Montespertoli (see my 4th Report of Aug. 11) and of that of Impruneta, as above mentioned. I made investigations on Brogi from Certaldo, whom I mentioned in my report of Aug. 11) and the Committee not only denied charging Brogi to speak in their name, but said that they had never even heard Brogi's name.

REPAIRS TO MOTOR VEHICLE: AS I had <sup>anticipated</sup> ~~known~~ in my former report dated 19 C.T., during this week my activity was nearly ~~nil~~ <sup>nil</sup> existing owing to the lack of transport. In Arezzo it was impossible to find a car which could be requisitioned, or a work-shop with spare-parts for the necessary repairs, so that I had to send the car to Perugia to the Boni garage. I expect it to be back in Castiglion Fibocchi to-night or at late t to-morrow morning.

AREZZO: I met there two Italian officers, representatives of the Patriot Branch for the province of Arezzo: 2nd Lt. Antiochia Corrado representative of the C.I.N. and Lt. Torrini representative of the Military Center.

Said representatives and I have agreed that, previous authorisation from Colonel Griffin, the release of <sup>certificates</sup> ~~titles~~ to all bands belonging to the XIII Caribaldi Brigade Pio Bonni, gathered, or about to gather in Arezzo, would be effected through the local Patriot Branch, which would also see to making lists of ex-partisans asking to be enlisted in the Italian Army. The Patriot Branch also agreed to make a third list of the undesirable individuals.

The Patriot Branch would also see to reactivating the ex-partisans belonging to the South provinces already liberated, to reemploying the ex-partisans of the zone itself, and those residing in still occupied <sup>red</sup> ~~occupied~~ north provinces.

Further to my ~~lines~~ of 2nd, 5th and 12th inst., to which I have received no answer to date, I beg to send you herewith copy of the weekly report which I have to-day presented to the A.M.S. of the 10th Corps. The reports dated 2nd and 12th were sent you through A.M.G., whilst the report dated 5th was handed to you personally by Prof. Guido Lucastello, Rome, with whom you can get in touch, if required, at the head of ice of the Istituto Libere Italiano in Rome, Via Frattina 39.

a) 2nd Lt. Mancini can still not be traced. I beg you once more to have someone else take his place.

b) I must again ask you for funds. I repeat that I have already to advance considerable sums and I cannot continue to operate on this basis. As you will gather from the attached report, the car needs further repairs. The English military workshops cannot effect the repair, so I shall be forced to take the car to a private garage and pay for the repairs myself.

c) At present, rations are being delivered to me with satisfactory regularity. I think we can take it that the difficulties encountered during the past weeks have been eliminated.

CASIGLIONE FIBOCCHI. I visited the twenty partisans, commanded by Lt. Lastrucci of Florence, who are going to serve with the 1st Indian Cavalry Regiment in the Talla area. I delivered to them one "mitra" with four magazines which I had received from two partisans of Raoul's band on 10th August. Lt. Lastrucci is an excellent and experienced partisan leader. His men, who as Lt. Lastrucci himself know the area in which they will have to operate perfectly, are all excellent fellows. On the 16th inst. the Colonel commanding the Indian Regiment expressed his satisfaction to 2nd Lt. Rossi, Italian liaison officer, <sup>for</sup> with the profitable work which the partisan band is doing.

ASSISI. I interrogated Lt. Cristoforo Mescioni Negri (Vittorio) Commander of 3 Battalioni, 5th Garibaldi Brigade Pesaro, who had previously declared that he could give precise technical details on the Gothic line and had offered to pass through the German Y lines in order to give news of German troop movements by radio transmitter. I gave a verbal report on the result of the conversation to Col. Giffin.

It was formed at the beginning of February and has been operating in the area of Lenciolini, S. Giustina Valdarno, Petrerke, Arcuaberre, Laveno. Bob, though owing to be a communist, maintains that the band was non-political. The arms have been delivered to the local Command of RR.CC. Most of the partisans have settled down.

#### LORO CIUFFENNA.

The local band is from every point of view one of the best I have seen up to date. It is composed of 43 men still operating on demand of the British Command. Giovanni Val d'Arno, infantry captain of the reserve, is a real animator and has succeeded in making his band a perfect formation. The band was formed by him on Sept. 25. It is absolutely non-political: the only aim inspiring all its members is the liberation of the national <sup>soil</sup> ground from the Germans and the fascists. I suggest that the Command should award the Commander and all the members a special praise. Area of operations: LORO CIUFFENNA, PRATOMAGNO. The list of the members of the band has been delivered to the Governor of Terranova Bracciolini. The diplomas have not yet been delivered.

CASTELFRANCO DI SOPRA. On the 15th inst. the "Libere" band composed of 41 men <sup>under</sup> at orders of Non-commissioned Officers TULLI Vittorio, from Pratovecchio, presented themselves. This band seems also to be well disciplined and well commanded. Non-political. As a band the "Libere" started to operate about May 15th of the c.v., assembling men who had been dispersed.

CHIESI, whose brilliant activity I have already mentioned.

2 automatic revolvers were delivered to the A.M.G. Command. The men of the "Libero" band left on the 16th of the c.m. for Arezzo.

I have also conferred with CANNONI Egisto, commander of the already dissolved band "Ugo Cannoni". It was composed of 22 men, who have all settled down; it was a non-political band. The captain ~~delivered~~<sup>ed</sup> no arms, saying that he had sent them back to the Mameli band of Capt. Chiesi; but I do not believe this to be true. Cannoni ought to be watched.

RAOUL Band. I have at least been able to meet the commander. This band is autonomous, non-political, composed of 30 men, most of whom ~~have settled down~~<sup>are well organized</sup>. He will deliver the lists to the Governor of Laterina and of Perna. He delivered the arms to the RE.CO. of Laterina: 28 Italian and 8 German muskets, 11 ~~grenades~~<sup>supplies</sup>, 103 Italian and 60 German magazines. I have a faint ~~feeling~~<sup>impression</sup> that the band may have hidden some automatic arms.

TO THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION

ROME  
Aug. 11. 1944

Last week I visited the Valdarno zone. In nearly all <sup>m</sup> ~~Comm~~ Partisan Bands, mostly organized by the C.I.N. of Florence, were operating.

ICRO CIUFFENNA= In this Comune a company of the 22bis "Garibaldi Brigade" (organized by the Communist Party of Florence) was operating. It consisted of about a hundred men, scarcely armed (13 guns, 1 tommy-gun). Zone of operation: Pratomegnò. The formation is well disciplined and its work has been appreciated by the Allied Commands; when I was there the Patriots were being employed by said Commands especially in reconnoitering. I should think that when this service is over, there will not be any difficulty in dissolving and disarming said company.

In the territory of the <sup>Comunes</sup> ~~Comm~~ of S. GIOVANNI and of FIGLINE and CAVRIGLIA another company (4) of the same "Garibaldi Brigade" under control of the C.I.N. of Florence was operating; Commander: Candidate Officer BILLI Guelfo, resident of Caviglia. The company amounted to 120 men and when they formed they had only 3 muskets and completed their equipment with arms (tommy-gun, and muskets) taken from nazi and fascists. They have supplied excellent work performing acts of sabotage, attacking German columns, etc. I attach a brief report, signed by Billi. Even after the arrival of New-Zeelanders the company has gone on working with the Allied troops. When I was there only a detachment of this company was still operating, while most of them in the <sup>m</sup> ~~Comm~~ of S. GIOVANNI had been released and was dissolved. The C.A.C. of this Comune complained



men, scarcely armed (13 guns, 1 tommy-gun). Zone of operation: Pratommagno. GIOVANNI and of FIGLINE CAVRIGLIA another company (4) of the same "Garibaldi Brigade" under control of the C.I.N. of Florence was operating; Commander: Candidate Officer BILLI Guelfo, resident of Caviglia. The company amounted to 120 men and when they formed they had only 5 muskets and completed their equipment with arms (tommy-gun, and muskets) taken from nazis and fascists. They have supplied excellent work performing acts of sabotage, attacking German columns, etc. I attach a brief report, signed by Billi. Even after the arrival of New-Zeelanders the company has gone on working with the Allied troops. When I was there only a detachment of this company was still operating, while most of them in the <sup>Comune</sup> of S. GIOVANNI had been released and was dissolved. The C.A.C. of this Comune complained that too few guns had been assigned; the same complaint we heard in other places. Apropos it has been noted that, when the Allies arrived, they took away the guns from part of the Patriots. To tell the truth Partisans are rather unwilling to give up said arms which represent a souvenir. I tried my best to persuade the Commander and the Patriots and I maintain that the situation here will be brought back to normalcy as soon as the Partisans resume their civilian act-

In the <sup>Communes</sup> ~~area~~ of S. GIOVANNI and MONTEVARCHI the local Committees of National Liberation, with representatives of the 5 Tuscan parties, are in full development. They are strictly collaborating with A.M.G. authorities and no difficulty has arisen. In CASTELNUOVO DEI SABIGNI and in METERO the Nazi have perpetrated savage deeds when they withdrew, with mass execution of the male population; the Patriot Band under Command of Billi did the utmost to assist the inhabitants. I point out that in LORO CIUFFENNA the nazi<sup>s</sup> hanged three old men and the ropes hanging from the trees as a warning to the population.

Quite different is the band operating in TERRANUOVA BRACCIOLINI, which has been stigmatised by the Mayor, by other citizens and by the local A.M.G. authorities, rather as a gang of thieves than a band of Patriots. The inhabitants complain of unlawful actions of this band, who, even after the arrival of the Allies, have been causing incidents especially in the frazione of CAMPOGIALLI. The band is under orders of a person who makes himself be called by the pseudonym of BOBBI, and who appears to have been sentenced for theft. The band is composed of about 60 men; "Bobbi" insists that they were <sup>sent upon</sup> depending on the C.I.N. of Florence, but the Committee for National Liberation of the Terranuova Comune and the Mayor maintain that the band acted always independently and never took orders from any political authority. In effect the band, besides molesting the population, acted sometimes against the Germans from whom they captured some Tommy-guns and some machine-guns. When I was there the situation was calming down; some of the men were still being employed by the Allied Command in reconnoitering. I had a long conversation with "Bobbi" in the presence of the local C.A.C. and he seemed to have been persuaded into releasing and disarming the band as soon as the service under

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In all the <sup>Comunes</sup> ~~Comuni~~ which I visited I gave the Mayor and the Partisan leaders the necessary orders for the creation of Patriot Committees (as foreseen by notice 30/1/Pat of July 1 of this Section) which will see to the recognition of the

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Patriots and to their reemployment in the zone I am concerned with offers no particular difficulty

I then visited some <sup>Communes</sup> ~~Comuni~~ of the Province of Florence. In CERTALDO operated a detachment of the "Garibaldi Brigade" "Spartaco Lavagnini" of Siena, led by Franz Bianchi (Called Guerri) under direct orders of the Command of the Brigade. It was composed of 20 men, well armed, <sup>as</sup> ~~so much~~ inasmuch, they had been supplied by allied airplanes, <sup>and</sup> ~~as~~ because they had taken arms from the Germans. They performed several acts of sabotage (interrupted telegraph and telephone lines, blew up a bridge); disarmed some Germans and some "Militians" of the National Republican Guard, and handed over the city to the Liberators. At present the group is being dissolved; some men are still employed in police service at the orders of a marshall of the Carabinieri (himself an ex-Partisan); these men will also be released as soon as a sufficient number of carabinieri have come.

This <sup>M</sup>Comune as well as CASTELFIORENTINO are among those which have suffered severe war damages. There is functioning a local C.I.N. to which, together with representatives of the Communist Party, belong men <sup>of</sup> ~~with~~ different tendencies. The Committee works in close collaboration with the A.M.G. authorities. This Committee wanted, as well as the Partisans, to compel the ex-fascists to do compulsory work (same thing happened in other <sup>at</sup> ~~Comuni~~ of the Province of Florence as I will specify <sup>hereafter</sup>). I believe I have succeeded to persuade the representatives of the C.I.N. and the Patriot Leader to desist from this arbitrary and illegal activity.

In this <sup>M</sup>Comune I must point out a certain Brogi, resident of a frazione of Fiano, described by everybody as a dangerous individual, and as a disturber of public order. He makes speeches and calls himself an envoy of the C.I.N. of Florence (but the Certaldo Committee absolutely disowns the doings of

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orities.

Some political elements of the Comune of CASTELFIORENTINO are less favourable to collaborating with the A.M.G. Together with the C.N.L. I have tried to persuade them. In said city there are about 30 Patriots, some of whom served with the above mentioned "Lavagnini Brigade" of Siena, while some other served with the "Guido Bosceglia" which had been organized by the C.I.N. of Pisa. They performed various deeds, disarming Fascists and Germans (whom they handed over to the French troops); killing a marshal of the Republican Guard. ~~This~~ Partisans, like those of Certaldo, mostly belong to the Communist tendency. About ten of these men are still being employed in police service.

In MONTESPERTOLI <sup>there</sup> was acting an autonomous company (3rd company "Agostini") of the Carlo Rosselli III Brigade, organized by the Partito d'Azione of Florence and composed of men of different political tendencies (here also mostly communists). The commander was first Rossi, and afterwards Carabinieriere GALLI Emilio, residing and operating with about 20 men in a place called Montagnana, while 40 more men under orders of the assistant-commander of the company MONTU Antonio, were operating near Montespertoli. This company performed acts of sabotage: in May they fought a nucleus of the militia and disarmed them, killing two and wounding two more; when the New-Zeelanders arrived, they joined with them in actions of reconnoitering and took part in an action where the Patriots had one dead and one wounded. Besides their muskets the Partisans were armed with 6 Tommy-guns. Their disarmament does not present difficulties; whereas the reemployment question is particularly important, owing to the fact that a great many patriots belong to other regions (there are a great many Livornese, Sicilians, Sardinians). We point out to the local C.A.C. the advisability of repatriating them as soon as possible.



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<sup>On the</sup> Contrary, <sup>to that</sup> the local political situation appears to be rather delicate, owing to the fact that after the Liberation a second Liberation Committee was created, as the underground Committee (chiefly composed of immigrated men <sup>and</sup> had strongly displeased the local people. Among others, the underground Committee was charged with falsifying a great many Liberation Bonds of the Tuscan C.I.N. As this rivalry

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might interfere with collaboration with the A.M.G., in a conference with the local representatives we came to the agreement that temporarily only the second Committee will function, till the C.I.N. of Florence (to whom I shall report as soon as possible) take the necessary measures. The same kind of difficulties has arisen among the Partisans, as a certain Bini, (a Patriot who had been working with the Lavagnini Brigade of Siena and had come to Montespertoli after the Liberation) had turned up as appointed leader of the local Partisans. Following the request of the C.A.O. and after agreements made with said Bini, we appointed Galli to represent the Patriots in the <sup>3</sup>Comunal Council and to be responsible to the Allied authorities for the disarmament of the Patriots.

As I wrote in my last report (Aug. 1) I again inform you that another company of the III Rosselli Brigade, who had been operating in the territory of Montelupo, have not been able to effect the order of retiring to Florence and have dispersed. Some men could pass the front-line, among others the Commander of the Company, Lt. Carli, who has been seen by the Montespertoli Patriots.

In the <sup>Commune</sup> ~~Comuni~~ of Tavernelle Val di Pesa and S. Donato in Foggia was <sup>also</sup> acting the "Paliero Pucci" Group, in touch with the C.I.N. of Florence, composed of 45 men at the orders of SIMONETTI Sebastiano. They fought three battles, capturing from the enemy some arms and a motor car; they had 2 dead. The Patriots have all been disarmed and are employed; those residing in liberated countries are beginning to repatriate.
