LOMBARDIA: In that part of the province under Fifth Army, disarmament had taken place at parades, but in that area under IV Corps little or no disarming had taken place as it had not at that time been ordered by IV Corps Commander.

 Partisans were well organized and were initially instrumental in the liberation of their various communes. They took great pride in their part in bringing about the collapse of German tyranny in Italy, and in helping to establish government with the local Committee of National Liberation. Many problems arose in disarming these bands. In those areas where the army swept through and quickly demonstrated power, the Partisans responded at once to the order to disarm and return to civil life. The war had passed them and there was no real need for them to fight to protect their land. Partisans of Bologna, Modena, Mantova and Verona were examples of this favorable reaction.

In other sectors in which complete liberation was slower there was another and more difficult problem. The Partisans were loath to surrender their weapons until the surrendered German troops were disarmed and removed from such areas. Also there were fascist groups organized for resistance and until they were tracked down the Partisans were disinclined to part with their arms. Milan, Turin, Trento, and Bolzano provinces were examples of this problem.

There was accordingly issued by the Commanding General IV Corps, in collaboration with the Chief of Staff of the Italian Army, an order that Partisans should be disarmed and their weapons turned in on or before the 7th of June. This order was in general well obeyed. By the end of May a steady stream of weapons - mostly rifles - was coming in from the Partisans to the collection centers. The June report will show the totals turned in up to the deadline.

Partisans. The program of disarming the Partisans has been continuous during April and May. Two methods have been followed: one, using stand-down parades with the arms turned in after the parade and certificates issued to the various band leaders and selected Partisans; the other, collecting the arms through the local Partisan leaders by a designated date. Disarmament can never be complete, but many thousands of arms have been collected since the German surrender.

It is estimated there are 22,500 needy Partisans in the IV Corps area alone that will be supplied with food and clothing. For this need 83 tons of clothing has been allotted for movement to Milan and will be transported as soon as possible.

In many cases Partisans have joined the local police forces under the direction of the Public Safety Officer with favorable results.

The III Comando Militare Territoriale Italiano is taking up the matter. 560 Partisans have been found work by the IIR. 78,556 Partisans have returned to their homes. 44 Partisans are still in hospitals. 2,600 are waiting to find work. Few days clothing will be issued. At present it is being stored in proper warehouses in Milano, and being delivered. All work in the regions are saying mobilization bonuses according to instructions. All the collecting centers will be closed by 9 July 1945. Up to the 30 June 45, 50,000 allied ration have been issued. The finance side of the mobilization is being done through the Prefects' budget in each Province.

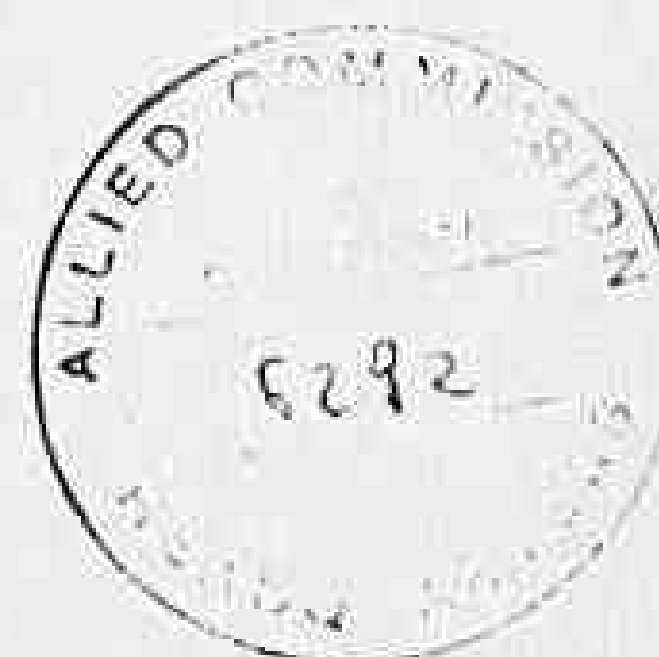

REPORT OF THE WEEKLY CONFERENCE
HELD ON THE 13th NOVEMBER 1945
IN THE PATRIOTS' LIAISON OFFICE FOR NORTH ITALY.

The present are:

Mr. Col. DE GARSTON, SPORGIO for ANPI, BOLDRINI for ANPI, ARCA for Post War Assistance, ARGENTON and DE ANGLIIS for General HQs CVL, BARBIERI and DI COCCO for the ALG Liaison Office.

Col. QUARONE is absent, on duty.

DE GARSTON opens the meeting by reading circular letter covering the appointment of the Allied Patriots Liaison Office for North Italy. He asks all present to state their opinion as to the possibility of a closer cooperation towards the solution of patriots problems.

ARGENTON : Developing a subject already started by ARCA, he stresses the injustice of the directives stopping the distribution of bonuses. At the outset such payments were effected with a certain liberality, but the new directives will probably deprive the best partisans of their well deserved material and moral acknowledgment.

DE GARSTON : Answers that payment of bonuses was made according to directives issued by the Comando Generale CVL (Gen. Orders).

DI COCCO : Submits a circular letter which reduces the difference of treatment stressed by Argenton, who insists on the necessity to separate the payment of Lire 5000 bonuses and granting of Alexander certificates, from the acknowledgment of partisans, as per DLM 516 issued by the Ministry for Post War Aid.

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ARGENTON : On the delicate problem of assistance to the families of deceased partisans, who are now more or less abandoned. Typical is the case of a woman, mother of three sons, all partisans shot, to whom no bonus and no assistance have yet been granted.

ARCA : Agrees with these observations and stresses the necessity to communicate to all IMPRs their precise functions as regards payment of Lire 1000, 5000, 10.000 and 20.000 bonuses.

ARGENTON : Points out also the necessity that the IMPRs' functions should be communicated to all Provinces and even to Municipalities in order to avoid that the ignorance of directives leaves partisans unsatisfied.

BOLDRINI : Mentions some discrepancies arisen between IMPRs and local Partisan Associations. Such differences should not be let known to higher offices, but settled at the beginning.

ARCA : Proposes to inform all the IMPRs and all the representatives of Post War Assistance about their duty to keep in close contact and cooperation with the local ANPI.

DE CARSTON : Agrees and gives the necessary directives in this connection (circular letter to all regional IMPRs for North Italy).

ARCA : Mentions the problem of small assistance, which should be entrusted to ANPI, this being the very appropriate organization.

ARGENTON) After having examined the circular letter
ARCA) regarding the appointment of this liaison
BOLDRINI) office, they acknowledge its utility and
the advisability to start operating with an exact
knowledge of the interdependence of the various partisan
Offices.

ARGENTON : States the different functions of the two recently appointed commissions: the one for the

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acknowledgment of partisan's title and the other for the military status of Patriots. These commissions should be controlled and coordinated by a central authority, in order to reach a severe discrimination in the inflation of the partisan movement.

BARRIARI : It is necessary to fix a number of the partisans to be recognized as such.

ROLDINI : The weekly meetings with this Liaison Office should not only determine the number of partisans to be recognized, but also study the problems to be submitted to the Government.

BARRIARI : proposes to elaborate the reports of each meeting, which, after having been duly signed, shall be forwarded to the superior central authorities.

ARGENTON : wants to examine the problem of the many collaborators of the various Allied missions. Which will be the principle of acknowledgment of such persons?

ROLDINI : Realizes the importance of this problem and the necessity of studying the question.

BARRIARI) It is agreed that this Liaison Office after ARGENTON) each meeting should issue directives to the members of the various commissions.

ARCA : Hospital expenses for the assistance given to sick partisans are to be borne by the Ministry for Post War Assistance.

ARGENTON : Points out the considerable amounts already paid to this end by the Comando Generale, issuing from the funds reserved for payment of debts made by patriots during the underground period. Unfortunately the Government, to whom the HQs CVL have repeatedly applied for funds, have not yet replied.

BARRIARI : Invites Argenton to submit to this Office copies of the applications, for the necessary action.

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BOEDRINI : Considering the financial difficulties of the Government which is very reluctant to grant funds, mentions the proposition already made for Romagna. Namely to grant exemptions from payment of taxes and other fiscal facilitations for people damaged for the cause of liberty.

DIORIO : wants to know the total amount of debts made by partisans.

ARGENTON : the debts contracted by Partisans amount to about one milliard, this being the sum requisitioned from the Italian Government. But it is expected that, after rigorous discrimination and classification of the claims, the total amount will be reduced to about half a milliard, not including the amount already paid (about 300 million lire).

DE GARSTON : asks Barbieri to inform the Allied Commission of this delicate situation, for the necessary action.

ARCA : Reverting to the assistance to sick partisans states that hospital expenses are borne by Post War Assistance, while indemnities for sickness and convalescent leave (Lire 30,-) are paid by IPRs.

Another important subject is the Lire 20.000 bonus to be paid to the relatives of deceased partisans. Who is the titular of this bonus?

DE GARSTON : Directives for Lombardy have been issued, for a bank deposit to be made on behalf of the deceased.

BARBIERI : Proposes to ask Banks to grant free legal assistance for the collection of such bonuses.

ARGENTON : Mentions the problem of transportation of deceased partisans, whose bodies frequently are not buried in a cemetery and far from their parents. 2321

BOEDRINI : Has already drawn the attention of Minister Lussu on this matter. In view of the present difficulties, the Minister is inclined to stop the transportation of deceased partisans on long distances.

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This problem could be solved only after resumption of the railways service. Meantime ANPI and the Municipalities should provide burial in the local cemeteries.

DE GARSTON : Asks Barbieri to inform the A.C. thereof, for the necessary directives to be issued to the territory still controlled by AMG.

ARCENTON: Closes the meeting with the request that this Office take the necessary action for the restitution of the 50 million lire forestalled by the General HQs CVL to the Regional HQs CVL, Liguria, who apparently now refuse to return the amount back. General HQs CVL wants this money in order to be able to meet, partially at least, the debts made by Patriots.

RELAZIONE SETTEMBRE - OTTOBRE 1945

Riepiloghiamo un bimestre di attività dell'Ufficio Patrioti, dal 1 settembre ad oggi, riprendendo lo schema della relazione riassuntiva maggio-agosto, consegnata alla chiusura del primo periodo di gestione del Patriots Office.-

QUALIFICHE.-

Lo schedario dei Patrioti, dei Feriti, dei Caduti, che ha ottimamente servito per la identificazione e la elencazione delle forze operanti nelle Formazioni della Provincia di Pavia, è stato continuamente aggiornato e controllato, attuando quella deflazione di nominativi che agli inizi del nostro lavoro faceva ascendere ad un numero assai rilevante il complesso dei Partigiani e specialmente dei Patrioti partecipanti alle giornate dell'Insurrezione.-

La copia dello schedario trasmessa alla Patriots Division ed al Ministero dell'Assistenza Postbellica alla data del 15 ottobre raggiunge globalmente il n.° 3579 di elementi. Detta cifra alla data 15 novembre sarà adeguata con le nuove inclusioni, specialmente di quei nomi per i quali è stato ultimato il processo di identificazione.-

Allo scopo di evitare l'inevitabile stillicidio di nuove domande di riconoscimento, data anche la cessazione di fatto di ogni controllo da parte dell'Ufficio Stralcio, abbiamo provveduto a diramare a tutti i Sindaci della Provincia, in data 20 settembre, una comunicazione da pubblicarsi all'Albo Comunale redatta come segue:

"AI SINDACI DELLA PROVINCIA,

Con il giorno 30 corr. si chiude definitivamente lo "Schedario dei Partigiani, dei Feriti, dei Caduti e dei Benemeriti per la lotta di liberazione nella Provincia di Pavia".

Non si riceveranno quindi ulteriori domande di registrazione o di rettifica nelle predette categorie. Si ritiene infatti che, dopo cinque mesi da la liberazione, ciascun interessato abbia provveduto a regolarizzare, attraverso i Comandi di Formazione, di Zona e gli Uffici Stralcio ora dissolti, la propria posizione agli effetti delle benemeritenze acquisite.-

Questo Ufficio sulla base degli Organismi definitivi, così costituiti, provvederà al completamento dell'erogazione dei premi e dei sussidi, all'assistenza ai feriti, alla distribuzione dei brevetti, agli accertamenti storico-statistici ed agli altri compiti assegnati dal Ministero.

I sigg. Sindaci sono pregati di rendere nota la presente disposizione, pubblicandola all'Albo Comunale.-

Compresi però della necessità di dare corso a tutte le pratiche giacenti e non ancora istruite, presso l'Ufficio Stralcio sia presso l'Associazione Partigiani, abbiamo creduto doveroso di concedere tacitamente un certo periodo di tolleranza durante il quale affluirono altri numerosi nominativi al nostro necessario vaglio.-

La chiusura definitiva dello schedario alla data 29 ottobre, è

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stata comunicata e pubblicata dalla stampa e trasmessa agli organi interessati. A li stessi davamo notizia della ulteriore procedura da seguirsi in virtù del D.L. 21/3/1945 n. 518 e precisamente:

"Tutte le richieste che venissero in seguito presentate dagli interessati, dovranno essere raccolte dagli Uffici dell'A.P.I., istruite e tenute a disposizione della costituente Commissione di cui all'art. 1 del D.L. 21/3/1945 n. 518 (D.U. 109), la quale essendo competente al riconoscimento delle qualifiche già assegnate, sarà investita anche dell'assegnazione delle qualifiche a coloro che non sono stati compresi negli elenchi e che pure sono in possesso dei requisiti richiesti dall'art. 7 del decreto predetto.

Questo Ufficio invece riceverà per la registrazione le pratiche riguardanti i Caduti e quelle relative ai componenti del C.V.B. che furono deportati e che rientrano ora dai campi di internamento.-

Anche per questa collaborazione si fa augurio al valido interessamento dell'Associazione Partigiana della provincia.-

Sono ora le carte supplementari di istruttoria su nominativi insufficientemente corredate di indicazioni, oltre come si è detto, le pratiche riguardanti i feriti ed i Caduti.

A questo proposito abbiamo espresso una serie di quesiti agli Enti Superiori che approvarono le nostre distinzioni proposte per i "Deceduti per causa di servizio", per i "Feriti per causa di servizio lieve".-

La registrazione dei Caduti e dei Deceduti per servizio ha raggiunto oggi la posizione n. 245.-

Quella per i "Gravemente Feriti" la posizione n. 253; per i "Feriti lievi per servizio" il n. 15.-

Le visite di controllo ai feriti sono state ultimate ai primi di ottobre.-

PREMI DI MOBILITAZIONE E SUCSIDI-PREMIO.

Nel bimestre cui la relazione si riferisce abbiamo ordinato il pagamento, dopo quello già effettuato per le Divisioni della Zona, di due tenenti aggiuntivi a carattere misto, il primo per un totale di 34 ¹²³¹⁷ a Patrioti e di 151 premi a Partigiani; il secondo per un totale di 153 premi a Patrioti e 330 a Partigiani.-

Quattro scaglioni di pagamenti di sussidi-premio ai Feriti vennero ordinati rispettivamente l'8, il 14 settembre, il 3 e il 22 ottobre.-

Quattro scaglioni di indennità ai Caduti vennero ordinati in data 8, 14, 22 settembre ed il 22 ottobre.-

Allo scopo di agevolare coloro che risiedono in Provincia o lontano in altre regioni d'Italia, abbiamo disposto per il trasferimento delle somme presso le competenti Filiali della Cassa di Risparmio delle P.P.II. o presso Istituti corrispondenti.-

La comunicazione a mezzo della stampa dei nomi dei Feriti e dei Caduti ha facilitato e regolato il tempestivo ritiro degli assegni.-

Aggiungiamo di avere eseguito anche trasferimenti e saldi di premi e di indennità per conto di Uffici Patrioti di altre Provincie.

Giungono ora numerose, e vengono soddisfatte, le richieste di indennità giornaliera, per comprovata degenza in Ospedali.-

ARMI.-

Il deposito centrale di armi istituito a Pavia presso la Caserma Benabrea, del quale abbiamo dato la consistenza alla data 31/8, ha avuto

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successivamente nuovi apporti di materiale portatile.

L'Armeria è stata visitata dagli Ufficiali Alleati preposti al servizio e sia la classificazione, come la registrazione sono state pienamente approvate.-

In data 24 ottobre il Governo Militare Alleato di Pavia, ha dato disposizioni per la consegna delle armi al Parco di Artiglieria di Alessandria, incaricando per il trasporto la X^a Divisione Indiana.-

Perciò il materiale è stato sgomberato impiegando gran numero di autocarri e il deposito è stato chiuso con la liquidazione del personale di fatica e di custodia.-

Le munizioni sono rimaste in consegna al Genio Militare.-

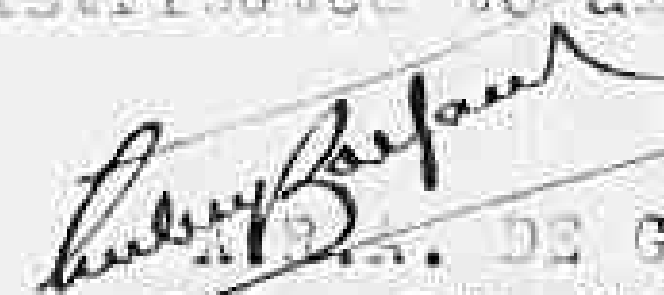

MONTHLY REPORT ENDING 31st OCTOBER 1945

1. On the 9th October all the Prov. I.M.P.R. passed under the administrative control of the Prefecture : only three I.M.P.R.s of this Division remain on duty in the Regional Office A.M.C.
2. During the month of October this Regional Patriots Office has been as busy as ever in giving assistance to Patriots and controlling the A.M.P.I. The Ministry for Post War Aid is gradually taking over all the activity of this Office as regards aid to Partisans and Patriots. This Ministry has nominated representatives in each Province who will work in connection with the Prov. I.M.P.R.s as regards assistance to ex internees, etc.
3. A special Decreto Luogotenenziale has been issued for the nomination of a Commission for the recognition of the title of Partisan.
4. I have discussed with the Representative of Partisans at the Consultative Assembly the possibility of granting vehicles of war booty to the Partisan Cooperatives of Central and South Italy.
5. Until the hand over of this territory to the Italian Government, this Regional Patriots Office remains on duty. The Regional Patriots Officer visited Rome with the Final Report and was informed by Col. White that he would be expected to act as Liaison Officer for North Italy between the Ministry of Post War Assistance and the Allied Government as well as to continue supervision of Lombardy Region.

4. Ho discusso con il Rappresentante dei Partigiani alla Consulta la possibilità di concedere dei veicoli di preda bellica ai Partigiani delle Cooperative dell'Italia centrale e meridionale.
5. Sino alla consegna dell'Alta Italia al Governo Italiano, questo Ufficio Regionale Patrioti rimane in attività. L'Ufficio Regionale dei Patrioti che ha portato a Roma la relazione finale, è stato informato dal Col. White che si prevede gli sarà affidato l'incarico di Ufficiale di Collegamento per l'Italia del Nord fra il Ministero dell'Assistenza Post Bellica ed il Comando Alleato. Egli dovrà pure continuare il controllo della Lombardia.

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ACTIVITY OF THE BORDER POLICE OFFICE

From the 1st May 1945 to the 15th
September 1945

(Final Report)

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1. PREFACE

The problem of the Partisans of North Italy (especially of the Lombardy partisans) assumed, at the very first beginning of the Allied Military Government in the liberated regions a vast and most delicate aspect.

An imposing number of men, already tried in the hardship of the underground movement, readily gathered in the various Lombardy centres around the specially appointed allied officers.

The Lombardy partisans approached the IMPR of the A.S.G. Lombardia Region with great confidence and certainty that their problems would have been understood and recognized.

The Patriots Office and the Provincial Centres immediately proved of great value in the social and psychological normalization with a purpose, perhaps not wholly unfruitful, of giving a beneficial impression to all those who applied to these offices.

The following pages, together with graphs and documents are intended to summarize the different phases and sides of the activity of this Patriots Office for the period between 1st May and 15th September 1945.

The reader may often wonder why the present report attaches so much importance to the documentation of the figures collected during the above period. The

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reason for it is a very simple one : our work is closely connected with the problem of public order and the return to the urgent work in the fields and in the factories of many peoples just emerging from their underground hardships.

It was necessary for this Office to collect precise figures at fixed dates, which would nearly represent the different phases of our work, a really difficult one, even if it was only a little known and not appreciated by everybody.

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2. PREPARATIONS IN ROME

The two months preceeding the liberation of North Italy : March and April, were months of very busy preparation of plan of work for the Patriots Office in Lombardy Region.

Through interview between Allied HQs and the Italian authorities a decision was taken (which afterwards proved to be the right one) namely that it would not have been sufficient to deal merely with the Central HQs of the CVL.A.I. (Corpo Volontari della Libertà dell'Alta Italia). After a through examination of the problem it was quite clear that notwithstanding the unifying efforts, the HQs of the C.V.L. could not successfully bring unity and uniformity among the numerous bands scattered all over the vast territory of Lombardy, this being partly due to the unavoidable influence of various political colours. Therefore the Patriots Office proceeded to the nomination of a Military Representative (I.M.P.R.) for every province, who had to contact every band leader, for the purpose of persuading, disbanding and reaching the expected normalization of the partisans.

After some difficulties, the I.M.P.R. who had to cooperate with the Allied Military Government were appointed and this choice proved to be an excellent one.

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I am glad to mention here the highest in rank of my

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collaborators, Col. Quaroni and the Inspection Regional Commission charged with keeping close contacts with the Lombardy bands in order to intensify the influence of the Allied Military Government and obtain obedience for their directives, which they intended to give soon after the liberation of North Italy.

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In Rome, after long internal discussions about eventual interferences and administrative controls on the various

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C.V.L. regional and provincial offices, it was decided that the Patriots Office was to take no initiative or responsibility in financial matters in connection with the above offices prior to our arrival. This decision proved to be a very appropriate one, in view of the unavoidable difficulties and resistences which would have arisen, should the funds of the C.V.L. have been controlled, even if only partially, by this Allied Office.

Therefore the Patriots Offices had its own administration controlled by the Provincial Finance Officers and through the Provincial Prefects.

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3. ACTIVITY OF THE PATRIOTS OFFICE DURING THE FIRST DAYS OF THE LOMBARD LIFE.

The Regional Patriots Office started its activity on the 1st of May, even before arriving in Milan, by contacting the Provincial Office in Mantova, Brescia Bergamo etc.

These first approaches enabled us to learn the principal problems of the partisans and their necessities.

As soon as circumstances allowed, the Lombardy Patriots HQs was established in Milan, where it immediately contacted the C.V.L. General HQs, with General Cadorna and his collaborators, the City and the Regional HQs.

The scope of the Patriots Office was thus clearly shown to Lombardy.

As one of the first steps I accompanied by Col. Quaroni attended at Bergamo, where a particularly efficient partisan organization successfully held a ceremony which served as an example to other Provinces.

This ceremony preceded, by only a few days, the imposing partisan manifestations held in Milan.

In the first days it was impossible, by reason of military operations, to visit the partisans of Varese²³⁰² and Sondrio. This Office systematically watched and studied the partisan life in Milan and the Provinces, by methodical inspections effected by the Regional

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Inspection Commission and ourselves, whose task was, as already mentioned, the control of partisan formations, disarmament, and collection of informations on the necessities of the partisans.

On our periodical inspections to the Provinces our officers contacted not only the Provincial Commissioner and Provincial I.M.P.K.s, but also the different formations scattered all over the Lombardia area, as has been shown in the weekly reports.

It was through these more or less repeated contacts that this Office obtained a considerable friendship with all partisan formations. The I.M.P.K.s and the officers of the Inspecting Commission had some difficulties in Varese and Milan. In the course of these inspections this office had the opportunity of collecting a lot of information of a social, financial security and intelligence character.

Such informations was forwarded to the competent authorities (Allied Police, Economic Commission etc.)

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4. PARTISAN PROBLEMS AND THEIR SOLUTION IN MAY 1945

May 1945 has undoubtedly been the most intense for problems to be solved and work to be done by this Patriots Office.

In the first place the Patriots Office had to aim for the return to public order, which was naturally more or less upset during the insurrection. The attention of this Office was particularly concerned by the number of dead found in the outskirts of Milan during the first days of May, in order to be able to take appropriate measures.

This Office particularly collaborated with the Police in executing the regulation prohibiting partisans to carry arms, with exception of members of the C.V.L. Hqs. especially appointed by the Allied Government.

The authority of the C.V.L. Hqs. in connection with partisans formations, was gradually limited by us in periodical meetings with members of the C.V.L. Regional and City Hqs..

It was in one of these first contacts that the "Guardia Partigiana" - Partisan Guard was founded, whose ends and vicissitudes are summarized in the following paragraph.

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The large number of Patriots concentrating in the Lombardy towns, especially in Milan, during the first weeks of May, obviously put into full light the most important problems that this office had to meet and solve : demobilization and disarmament of thousands and thousands of men not always conscious and responsible for their arms.

It was necessary to grant them not only a just acknowledgement of their valour, but also material comfort and moral aid for their return to civilian life.

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5. DIRECTIVES FOR A GRADUAL BUT DECISIVE DISBANDMENT
OF ALL THE PARTISAN FORMATIONS.

This office followed a clearly defined plan for the demobilization of partisans : immediate disarmament and reestablishment of public order through gradual but resolute steps directed to create the psychological climax for the disbandment of partisan formations whose existence was no longer justified.

It was in compliance with this principle of slow progressive action that the Partisan Guard was founded.

This corps was formed by some thousands of partisans, distinguished by an armband whose task was the guard to the collection centres and dumps of war material or material salvaged from nazi-fascists dumps. Initially this guard had also a police and patrol task in towns and minor centres.

The Partisan Guard cooperated with other corps of Allied and Italian police for the maintenance of public order.

The motive justifying this institution was quite clear : to allow the best elements, still full of enthusiasm for the insurrection, and reluctant to abandon their victorious arms, to retain them for a little while longer in a public service.

However it was soon clear that the arms of the

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Partisan Guard were not used for preserving public order, but to continue carrying out crimes and robberies : actions which might have been necessary in the underground period, but were now illegal in the already so difficult rebirth of social life.

In other words the Partisans thought this Guard was to be used for easy profit and personal vengeance, and they objected to discipline and restrictions imposed by us and the C.V.L. Hqs.

Under these circumstances we experienced some difficulty in the execution of the demobilization and disarmament order as a consequence of resistance put up by partisans, who were reluctant of entering the ranks of a well disciplined and armed guard, but controlled by military principles.

This was the true reason for disbanding even the last remnants of the partisan armed formations and to further stress the illegality for any partisan in carrying arms, with exception for the members regularly enrolled in the civilian police, railway police and similar corps.

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6. DEMobilIZATION AND DISARMAMENT.

The most important and delicate task of this office has been the demobilization of the partisan formation, which was the base for returning to order and discipline in those areas, where the heat of the insurrection was still dangerous.

The Patriots Office, in agreement with the Allied Police issued directives for the general demobilization to be effected through individual formation leaders who were considered responsible for all eventual disorders.

To this end collection centres were set up in Milan, in the provinces and in the most important places, where partisans could live during the short period of transition.

When the first difficulties were surmounted, these centres were plentifully supplied with food and clothing, to make as comfortable as possible the last period of the partisan life.

Arrangements were made for the Regional Inspection Commission to visit regularly the Collection Centres to advise and to help in the organization and to control the progress of disarmament.

Regarding the disarmament I want to point out that this was concurrent with demobilization and both were

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facilitated by the order denying partisans, after our arrival, the acknowledgment of their status unless their arms had been proved to have been surrendered.

It was not be expected that such task could be accomplished in only one day. This task developed gradually thus avoiding friction and conserving close touch with same elements of this movement. In other words, our object was not so much to disband as to collect arms and to documentate completely the partisan movement.

Graph E .1 of the appendix shows how the Patriots Office tried to shorten the demobilization time by concentrating as much as possible in the first month of its activity. Of the 83277 partisans demobilized during the quarter May-July 1945, 56188 partisans namely more than 67% were led to civilian life during the first month of our activity.

The demobilization in the following month reached the 96% of the total partisans.

In July we took care of the remaining 4% thus completing our task, which was a difficult one, both from the administrative and psychological point of view.

Concluding, in ninety days, the Patriots Office disposed of 80,000 partisans, according to the directive of the A.M.G.. Through the Provincial I.M.P.R., all

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the partisans regularised their position and supplied the P.O. with voluminous records whose present and future value can easily be appreciated.

But the results of the first quarter of our activity are still more remarkable, if we consider the quantity of arms surrendered.

More than 100,000 rifles were collected in Lombardy namely a number superior to that of the demobilized patriots in this Region.

Although thousands of these rifles were not equipment of patriots, but were abandoned by the nazi-fascists, the quantity surrendered is still remarkable, if we consider that these fire-arms might have been dangerously dispersed after the general demobilization.

But not so satisfactory is the surrender of automatic rifles which amounts to 1847 only. This is but a little quantity compared with the supplies made by the Allied during the underground period, and the quantity abandoned by the nazi-fascists.

I must however mention often it is only a sentimental motive which holds back the patriot from handing in his automatic rifle, he having taken it from the Germans or fascists and now considers it as a trophy of an unforgettable and dangerous period of his life. This explains also the number of pistols collected, which is a very small one, if we take into account that partisans very

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seldom were without pistols.

The sub-machine guns and machine guns collected amount to nearly 3,700, which is a good figure compared with the total presumably existing in this area.

Considerable is also the number of guns and mortars, A-A and A-T guns which amount to 538 : a number easily explained by the difficulty to conceal such heavy arms which at any rate would not give any preoccupation for the facility with they can be located.

The hand-grenades handed in amount to more than 30,000 . This weapon as with shells and other ammunition was denounced and this Office did not occupy itself with the collection which was left to the Military Authorities.

Concluding, the arms collection has not given bad results, considering that many were collected direct by the Allied and by other Italian military authorities, Army, Navy and Aviation, without reference to us and in amounts of which we have no knowledge.

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7. THE NORMALIZATION WORK IN ITS PSYCHOLOGICAL ASPECTS.

The demobilization and disarmament, even if only partially obtained (this being the natural consequence of many psychological and political factors leading to the concealment of arms) would be a phenomenon of but scarce importance, if it was not accompanied by the whole hearted work of spiritual and social persuasion, which would diminish the fire of aspirations and ideals nourished during the month of fight and sacrifice.

To lead into civilian life thousands and thousands of unsatisfied and embittered elements was perhaps a still greater danger than the presence of arms in the immediate post-war period.

This is why the Patriots Office refrained from issuing drastic orders, preferring to elaborate directives in agreement with formation leaders, who were in a better position to know and satisfy the needs of partisans.

In compliance with this policy on the 30th May, all the representative formation leaders were assembled at the Patriots Office for the discussion of the most important partisan problems.

In this meeting it was decided to dissolve within a week all formations HQs. transferring their activity to the Collection Centres.

This is a very important decision, which stopped the independent life of the C.V.L. Commands, met with no

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resistance, because of the same persuasion applied by this Office.

Subsequently there were weekly meetings with the leaders of the C.V.L. Regional HQs. in which problems were studied and difficulties confronted in mutual agreement.

Minutes of these meetings are available in this Patriotic Office. They are evidence of our loyal cooperation with the members of the C.V.L. HQs. and of our good will to normalize the delicate partisan movement.

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8. MORAL AND MATERIAL ASSISTANCE TO FORMATIONS AND SINGLE PARTISANS

The partisans, after the liberation of the North Italy, were not abandoned to themselves : the leaders provided for their maintenance, drawing money and food from different quarters, in the final phase of the insurrection.

When the demobilization was being effected on a very large scale and most patriots had already returned home ; allied rations were received and plentifully distributed to all centres where remained only those partisans who had no immediate position in civilian life.

Every partisan living at the Centres was given the following rations :

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The allied rations were augmented with Italian rations, namely with fruit, wine, etc.

During the first two month of their life Collection Centres received 95.000 allied rations later followed by 60.000 Sepreal rations. A total of 150.000 rations were distributed. This quantity, if compared with the total number of partisans, is a very small one, even if we consider that it was given only to the minority who lived at the Collection Centres. These were the Patriots waiting to regularize their position, attendants of the centres and guards for salvaged material waiting to be surrendered to the competent authority. All these centres were fully provided by this office, who distributed not only food but also the following clothing.

Clothing was both new and second hand, but in very good condition.

To all this material we must add what was requisitioned by the various formation leaders during the insurrection. In conclusion, Partisans were supplied by their leaders, by the Allied and by the Italian Government.

The Italian Government granted a demobilization bonus

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of £.1000, 5000, 10.000 and 20.000 respectively to patriots, partisans, wounded and dead. In total this plan represents a large financial obligation entered into by the Italian Government.

Graph N. of the appendix (Demobilization bonuses already paid) shows that 200 millions have already been paid in Lombardy to over 60.000 persons.

All the partisans who visited the Regional and Provincial Offices, found actual assistance in every section of civilian life. They obtained from the I.M.P.R.s brotherly advice, facilities of all kinds, introductions, etc.

The relations between I.M.P.R.s, and partisans were characterized by mutual respect. It was our policy that the Regional Patriots Office could be freely visited by all patriots without any need of a special permit.

Thus hundreds of partisans came daily to this Patriots Office, everyone finding some comfort.

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9. SYNTHESIS AND OPINION ON THE PARTISAN MOVEMENT IN
LOMBARDY.

It is not easy, after so short time, to express a definite opinion on the Lombardy partisan movement. This because the movement has not yet been concluded and because it has not been possible to examine with the full calm and serenity of an historian, the large amount of historic material and testimonies of what was done during so many months of conspiracy and battle. But if an opinion can be expressed beforehand, I consider that many of the Partisans of Lombardy have effectively contributed to the liberation of North Italy through remarkable sacrifices and complete devotion to the cause of liberty.

The constructiveness and ideals of the bands who operated on the mountains, whose really glorious feats are part of recent Italian history, can never be lessened or effaced by the faults of the partisans of the last minute.

The number of dead in military actions (appendix 1 Graph) is the best evidence that the partisans actually fought when it was necessary with the strength and hope of the best pioneers.

This mentality was not created and justified by sporadic speeches and addresses of factious agitators, but by the²⁸⁷ valorous band leaders, always ready to execute orders received by radio from Allied HQs.

Many of these leaders continuously attended after the liberation this Patriots Office, relieving themselves, with

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the sincerity of old friends, of their sentiments and very often, of their bitterness, without asking anything, and nothing expecting from us.

In this Office I have met many honest and dignified partisans, who deserve our high esteem as many others in the fight and the sacrifice, who returned after the liberation of North Italy, to their homes and their works, often surmounting diffidence and difficulties, perfectly satisfied in their conscience with having fulfilled their duty. This is a fact that cannot be overlooked by those who, after a certain lapse of time, will have to write a more careful opinion on the partisan movement.

As the above mentioned facts are intended to contribute to the favourable opinion on the partisans of North Italy, it remains to explain why the partisan tradition is more losing the public opinion, almost to the point of identifying the name of partisans with that of crime or at least in classifying a patriot as a personae non grata. However there are undoubtedly some partisans who having efficiently contributed to the cause of liberty, now do not realize that what was allowed and heroic during the underground movement, naturally becomes forbidden or even criminal after the liberation. Long suppressed instincts which were left free during the underground fight can now hardly be controlled and brought to normality.

To this phenomenon are connected some crimes and robberies done by otherwise deserving partisans, with

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the result of considerably reducing the public esteem in which they were held during the golden days of the clandestine organization. We must however recognize that such criminals are but a very small minority in the ranks of the honest partisans. Unfortunately it is just this small minority with their faults which now is all in the public eye.

It is clear that these few criminals, mainly false partisans and patriots, who flooded the original true bands on the days immediately preceding the liberation, cannot destroy the unshakable tradition of valour and sacrifice previously established by the honest partisans. On the other hand experience teaches one that insurrectional movements destined to suddenly change a whole system of government, are almost fatally doomed to resort to violence and illegality. The liberty obtained and sanctioned in the '89 was the result of tragic events. But once this sad period is over, the social benefits reaped fully repay for all the suffering caused by confusion and crime, turning revolutionary leaders into pictures of popular heroes.

In order to stave off attacks which might be made on all true and honest partisans, a careful epuration has now been started, which will defend the traditions of this movement. 2285

If the various political colours on one hand jeopardized the unity of the movement, on the other hand they acted

as control and self epuration, which resulted, to a certain extent, in a beneficial influence for the whole organization.

I have heard here and there, in the interviews with partisan leaders of talk of intellectual and moral training, of spiritual elevation, as indispensable means of national recovery. These are aspirations which testify to the positive essence of a social category whose value, notwithstanding the unavoidable faults and trials, cannot be denied in such a decisive hour for the national recovery of Italy.

It was this end in view that the officers of this Patriots Office considered the partisans movement of Lombardy during their four months' work. They all agree that this movement, if suitably guided and moderated, can be logically compared to the glorious tradition of the "Risorgimento Ottocentesco".

10. ORGANIZATION OF THE ALLIED PATRIOTS OFFICES AND
THEIR INSERTION IN THE MINISTRY FOR POST-WAR AID.

The original organization of the Patriots Office of the Lombardia Region, such as arranged at Rome, has so far remained essentially unchanged. The Regional Patriots Office is headed by the Allied Regional Patriots Officer, whose collaborators are: Col. Quaroni, Major Barbieri, Capt. Di Cocco, Ten. Morandini. The Provincial Patriots Offices are subordinate to the Reg. Patriots Office. They are organized according to their particular appointments. Their different functions of payments, aid and conservation were entrusted to employees especially selected among deserving members who collaborated under the IMPR.

In compliance with directives issued by the Office, in July 1945, the IMPRs nominated as their collaborators and advisors some of the most representative formation leaders, to assist and allow the easy transition to normality.

The presence at the Patriots Office of the old leaders was a sure guarantee for the patriots that everything in their favour would be duly looked into.

Such organization was not only very successful, but gave us experience and insight which now we strive to maintain, even against any possible reform. 2283

This is the reason why the recently created Ministry for Post-War Aid, inheriting the Patriots Office, has decided to keep the organization in their bigger structure.

This organization, which is to be attached to the Ministry for Post-War Aid, will be formed by a Patriot Office for North Italy, connected with the Allied Commission by an Allied liason Officer ; a Regional Patriots Office and Provincial Offices in each Province, which will take care of patriots, ex internees, ex prisoners of war and of any one who having assisted in the fight for liberty, needs aid and assistance in these hard times.

11. CONCLUSIONS

This Patriots Office was set up with the following purposes :

- 1) Get in touch and control, immediately after the liberation of Lombardy, the C.V.L. movement. Individualize worthy partisans and properly recognize them.
- 2) Disarmament and disbandment, possibly without applying any compulsion or force.
- 3) Give assistance to Patriots during the transition period prior to the return to civilian life, through the distribution of food and clothing.
- 4) Procure work and employment to Patriots out of job.
- 5) Watch the partisans movement in all its psychological and social aspects, epurate it and transform it into an actual and efficient movement for the reconstruction of the country.

Has the Patriots Office succeeded in this work?

The datas included in this report testify that :

1. At the very beginning of the Allied Military Government in the Lombardia Region, Patriots received orders only from the Patriots Office and its I.M.P.R. . The title of Patriot and Partisan was granted only by our I.M.P.R. in compliance with directives issued by the A.C. Patriots Branch.
2. All our activity was directed towards disarming and

Disbanding Patriots. No one could be recognised as Partisan or Patriot without having first surrendered their arms.

As regards the collection of arms it may be stated that although the amount collected does not represent the full total of the existing arms, it certainly is a very high percentage, undoubtedly superior to that collected in other Regions of North Italy. I want to point out that this result was obtained through persuasion, without having recourse to military police aid and, with exception of a very few cases, this delicate process was carried out without any clashes or incidents.

3. Partisans were largely provided with food and clothing, although with some delay. They received both Allied and Italian rations.

4. As regards the return to civilian life, I point out that only a small percentage applied for enrolment into the Civil Police, Railway Police and other similar corps. Not many applied to this Office for jobs in private firms. However we gave ample assistance to every one who wanted our help to obtain an honest work, and contacts were made direct with industrial firms.

5. Perhaps the most delicate part of our work was represented by the effort of our officers to get in close touch with formation leaders and patriots with the object of separating the partisan movement from undesirable

speculation and opportunism.

It is difficult to furnish evidence of this hard side of our work, but the confidence and the sureness with which patriots have approached and are still approaching this office, testify that the work of the Patriots Office has not been in vain.

The Italian Government has decided that all I.M.P.Rs should become part of the Prefectural staff, and under Administrative Control of the Prefect. The I.M.P.Rs will be responsible for dealing with correspondence with the Ministry of Post War Aid and answerable to that Ministry for the manner in which they carry out their work.

The Prefect will be responsible for seeing that suitable accommodation equipment and staff is supplied and for pay and general control.

It is proposed that this transfer be made on 30/8/45 and I.M.P.Rs have been informed to close down as far as A.M.G. activities are concerned on that date.

No "Alexander" Certificates will be issued to Patriots coming in after 15/8/45.

Incoming Patriots from Germany or elsewhere will be dealt with in the same way as heretofore by the I.M.P.Rs.

Arms collection will continue 22/7/45 dealt with in accordance with the attached extract from Land Forces Sub Commission.

Each I.M.P.Rs have copies of all Patriots Office instructions which are completely self explanatory and should be adhered to.

The present I.M.P.Rs distribution is as follows:

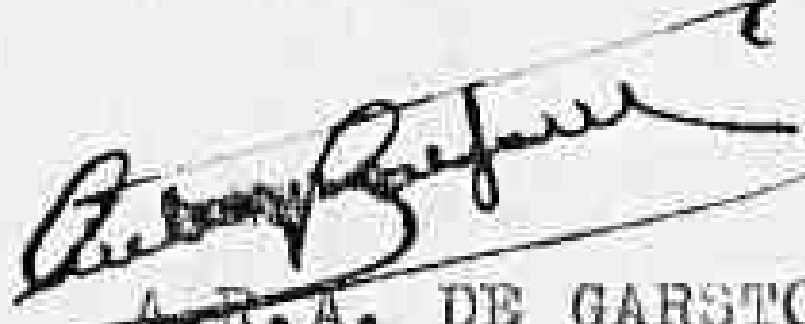
- a Magg. DALMAZZO and Lt. MORANDIN Milan City and Province with office in Milan.
- b Cap. COMPAGNUCCI COMPAGNONI for the Bergamo and Brescia Provinces with office in Brescia.
- c Lt. RICCI for Mantova and Cremona Provinces with office in Cremona.
- d Major D'ANGELO for Como and Sondrio Provinces with office in Lecco
- e Capt. LAMPINI for Varese Province
- f Major VIVANTI for Pavia Province.

The staff in each Provincial Patriots Office should be decided upon by the Prefect and the I.M.P.Rs concerned .

The A.M.G. records should be handed over to this Headquarters and all surplus "Alexander" Certificates. These latter should be sent in as soon as possible.

The Allied Regional Patriots Officer will visit each Province after 30/8/45 to see that everything is working smoothly and to advise on any matter which the Prefects wish.

It is suggested that I.M.P.R. contact immediately their Prefects and submit at once a working plan for the period after 1/9/45.

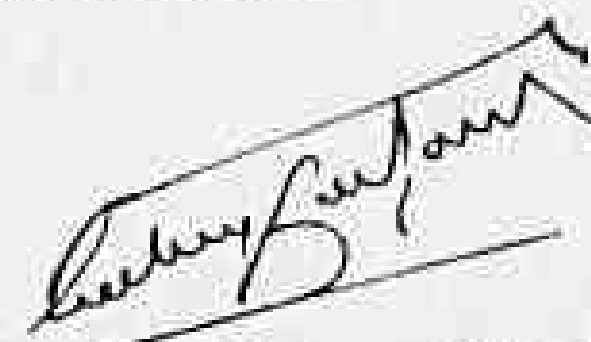

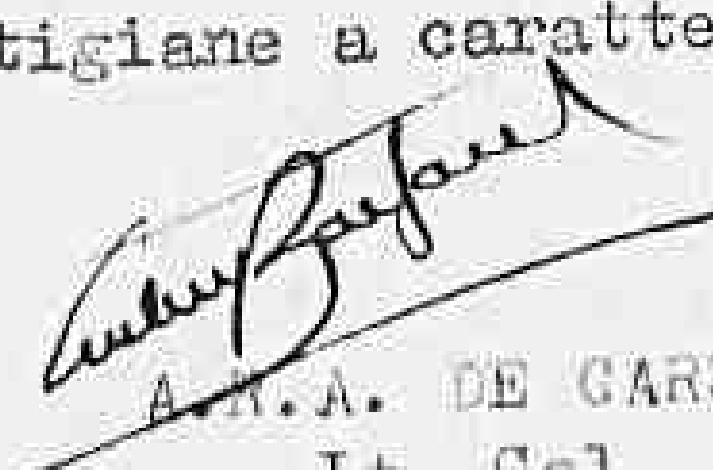

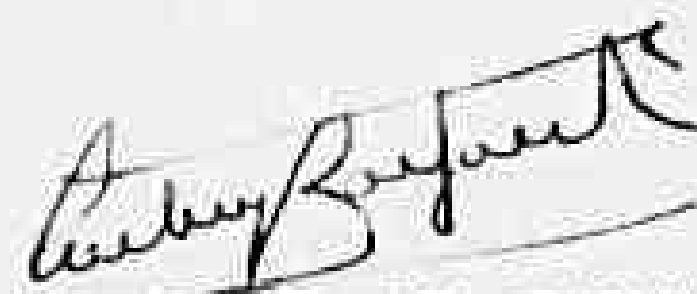

3. LOMBARDIA (June 9).

Regional Patriot Officer explained the situation in the Region; he has ordered the closure of all patriot Zone HQs and is establishing one patriots centre for MILAN city. He held a meeting of all band leaders to execute this which was highly satisfactory. A copy of minutes is attached (Appendix "A") - 4B. As will be seen from these minutes the leader is in VARESE wishes to retain an operation battalion for what he describes as "per giustiziare" Lt. Col. De Garston has vetoed this idea.

MEETING OF THE FORMATION LEADERS, REGIONAL AND
PROVINCIAL COMMISSIONERS, HELD AT 16.30 hours
of 30 May 45.

After a brief report from Col. De Garston summarising the assurances of the Allied Command concerning help to be given to patriots, the following individuals spoke:

MORANDI for the Como area, enquires concerning the enlistment in the police and asks how such enlistment will take place. Col. De Garston explains that a special school has already been approved for those who wish to join the police force and explains how the partisans will have to make their applications in order to enter freely the above school. Everybody can be accepted.

SPINA for the Varese area, points out the necessity of retaining a body of partisans to ensure the policing of those areas still full of fascist elements. Such zones would be in particular the Varese and Bergamo provinces.

Col. De Garston draws attention to the fact that in order to enter this new police force, an adequate period of training would be required, however in view of the urgency of the matter he will discuss the matter further with the Local Commander of Police.

RIEET: It is necessary to ensure the personal safety of demobilized partisans, in order that such partisans being disarmed, should not suffer from reprisals of fascist elements.

VAL CANNONICIA. In this Valley there are regular fascist forces and if help is not received forthwith, we will remain unprotected. Hence the impossibility of immediate demobilisation.

Lt. Col. VINCENT H. We will go together and point out the situation in order that the CO IV Corps can take the necessary measures for the protection of that area. We will endeavour to obtain a definite reply on the matter. I can assure you that 500 fascists have already been captured these days by Allied Forces. It would, however be General Grittenberger's responsibility to ensure the safety of this zone.

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SPINA points out how the rounding up operations could efficiently be carried out by partisans, as has been shown in the recent round up of the Varese area, which lead to the capture of 300 fascists.

FORMATION CHIEF OF THE CREMONA area points out that this Zone also is infested by fascist elements who hide in the woods beyond the River Po where forces coming from Emilia can easily leak through. He suggests that a certain number of armed partisans should be kept mobilized under the personal responsibility of the leaders.

2

MORANDI states that it had already been decided in agreement with the Questare of Cono to transfer 1500 chosen men into the Police Corps which would also ensure the control of the Swiss border.

The execution of this plan has been postponed as a result of further contradictory orders. Col. De Garston notes that if such a plan should be put into action it would happen under the personal responsibility of the Questare of Cono. However the problem of the control of the borders will have to be further discussed.

RIEHT. The partisan as a rule refuses to join the Police force unless it has already been purged by the many fascist elements still on the force.

EDUARDO leader from across the Po stresses the insufficiency of the present force of the Carabinieri to ensure public order under conditions which are still abnormal and in some where the communications, fuel etc. are lacking. It must be noted that such forces should also enforce the food rationing. The insufficiency of such forces of the Carabinieri makes the institution of an armed force of partisans indispensable.

Col. De Garston observes that in peacetime the Carabinieri have always been sufficient but he is answered to the effect that the present times are far from peacetimes and that many irresponsible elements are still holding arms.

RIEHT asks who will take over the storerooms at present held by partisans and what use will be made of the materials from the above store rooms.

COL DE GARSTON stated that these storerooms will be taken over by Allied Forces (IV Corps 5 Army) or by National Forces which will be assigned later. The handing over must take place before 7 June.

RIEHT. The material has been collected in many small store rooms located in various zones. To gather all the above equipment into general storerooms will require motor transport and POL.

MORANDI. Motor transport is also necessary to displace the fascist elements at present concentrated in seven camps, holding 700/800 men each. COL. DE GARSTON. Concentration of equipment should have first priority. To concentrate such equipment the necessary transportation will be supplied through the Transport Office.

Garibaldi Zone across the PO suggests a special battalion for epuration, whose members should be very carefully chosen and he insists that the Allied Military Government should continue to regard partisan forces with the same confidence as was shown during the war. Such forces have given ample evidence that they are capable to achieve something.

COL. DE GARSTON The epuration shall proceed through legal channels.

PIRELLA The present directives foresee a period of three months for the demobilisation of partisans; such a period is obviously insufficient.

COL DE GARSTON Such a period is purely a bureaucratic rule. In other Zones it has extended up to 6, 7 and 8 months.

RIEFT acknowledges that partisans during such a period of demobilisation, will benefit of billets, rations and assistance at the patriot centres which are being instituted.

EDUARDO It would be necessary to know the force required for the police. It is necessary to let into this corps carefully chosen personnel. Such a choice must take place forthwith in order to ~~prevent~~ avoid nothing but poor elements being available.

COL DE GARSTON Each Commissioner can contact the local questore for information from this Authority as to what is the requirement of personnel.

ANOTHER FORMATION LEADER points out the possibility of letting partisan elements into the State Administration in replacement of the many officials who followed the alleged republican Government to the North and who in the majority of cases should therefore be purged.

COL DE GARSTON Partisans can enter any service provided they have the necessary qualifications. The labour cards which will be duly filled in will show the preferences of the single elements and where possible, individual wishes will be respected. He pointed out furthermore the necessity of knowing as soon as possible the number and the grade of posts available in the State Administration in order to make a timely choice from within the partisan formations.

RIEFT This problem has no immediate importance and will be dealt with at a later date. He points out the impossibility of disbanding immediately the Zone Commands which should continue their activity ~~under~~ to close routine matters.

COL DE GARSTON agrees. Such Commands will be taken over by the patriot centres meanwhile he wishes to know the names of the various formation commanders and of the men of undoubted integrity in order that Alexander certificates may be presented to them forthwith.

RIEFT asks that the better known patriot leaders and those who are more exposed to possible fascist reprisals should be allowed to carry arms. Col de Garston assures that such request will be favourably considered.

PIETRO PAOLO insists again on the harassing problem of expropriation and on the absolute necessity for the institution of a chosen battalion for this purpose.

COL DE GARSTON stresses again the fact that expropriation must be done through legal channels. Only the laws of the State can decide on the matter. He gives assurance that expropriation will remain within legality and asks that patriots should believe this statement.

PAYMENTS TO PATRIOTS ON DEMOBILIZATION

1. A program for payments to patriots immediately upon their demobilization has been worked out and it is effective immediately in Lombardy.
2. This program, which cancels all previous instructions on the subject, provides for demobilization payments to patriots and families according to the following scales:

To recognized patriots:

- (a) Recognized patriots who have completed less than three months active service prior to 1 June 1945 will be paid 1,000 lire.
- (b) Recognized patriots who have completed three or more months active service prior to 1 June 1945 will be paid a total sum of 5,000 lire.
- (c) Recognized patriots who have sustained serious injuries, irrespective of their total length of active service prior to 1 June 1945, will be paid a total sum of 10,000 lire.

To families of recognized patriots killed or missing:

- (a) The nearest of kin of recognized patriots missing or killed in action or who died as a result of reprisals or of wounds or illness contracted on active service rendered prior to 1 June 1945, will be paid a total sum of 20,000 lire.

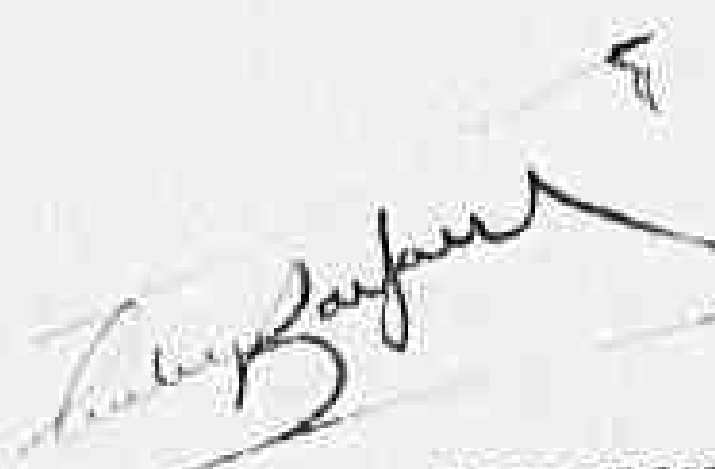

REPORT WEEK ENDING 2d June 1945

- 1 - All the Officers of this Division have concentrated their efforts during the week to the disarmament and disbanding of the formations in the City and Province of Milan and laying the ground for the disbandment by the 7th June in the rest of the Region.
- 2 - The results have been better than anticipated as regards arms collected (vide the figures attached).
- 3 - The week has also been marked by incidents in Varese, which are to be deplored. Regional Security Officer has already reported on these.
- 4 - In Varese also there are formations who so far have flatly refused to obey any orders given. I am visiting these formations on Tuesday 5th, but in the meantime. I have sent an Officer of N. 1 Special Force to see what he can do about persuading them.
- 5 - Areas visited during the week: Pavia, Bergamo, Brescia, Varese, Milan Province and the centres in Milan City.
- 6 - I am closing down the Comando Regionale and Comando Piazza by the 7th inst. and taking under my direct control their various services, I am leaving an Ufficio Storico and a skeleton staff to collect data etc. for the future.

REPORT WEEK ENDING 24/3/45

- 1 - This week has been marked by more orders - counterorders, broadcasts and press notices which this office never knew about.
- 2 - I attach reports from my staff which speak for themselves.
- 3 - The position in Milan Province and Varese Province seems to have deteriorated and in both Provinces a fair amount of shooting has been going on.
- 4 - I have been keeping the P.F.S. Officers of P.S.S. informed of any matters concerning them, and action has been taken by them.
- 5 - In a meeting with Eric Upjohn and H.P.S. Officers it was decided, on my recommendation, not to use locally picked up C.O. N.E. in the areas in which they were picked up.
- 6 - In conjunction with Cap. Lambert, 5th Army Partisan Officer, it was decided to post 2 Officers and their Staff to Lombardy to start or set up 2 or 3 regular Centres - Both these Officers had run the Centres at Pesce and Florence, this should result in a reduction of armed and so called disarmed command and help to centralise all colours under one control.
- 7 - The authority of the General Command, Regional Command and Commando Piazza appears to get less and less each week, and the time appears to be approaching when these should be closed entirely and a completely new set of Offices centralized under AMO.
- 8 - Col. Cripps visited the offices at Via Brera and ^{22/3} the morning discussing the various problems.
- 9 - I would like to repeat the warning that incidents will arise now if any hasty move is made and if reinforcements of troops for

- 2 - I attack reports from my staff which speak for themselves.
- 3 - The position in Milan Province and Varese Province seems to have deteriorated and in both Provinces a fair amount of shooting has been going on.
- 4 - I have been keeping the R.S.M. Officers of P.S.C. informed of any matters concerning them, and action has been taken by them.
- 5 - In a meeting with Brig. Upjohn and R.S.C. Officers it was decided, on my recommendation, not to use locally picked up C.C. R.S. in the areas in which they were picked up.
- 6 - In conjunction with Cap. Lambert, 5th Army Partisan Officer, it was decided to post 2 Officers and their staff to Lombardy to start or set up 2 or 3 regular Centres - Both these Officers had run the Centres at Pesce and Florence, this should result in a reduction of armed and so called disarmed command and help to centralise all colours under one control.
- 7 - The authority of the General Command, Regional Command and Commando appears to get less and less each week, and the time appears to be approaching when these should be closed entirely and a completely new set of offices centralized under AMI.
- 8 - Col. Cripps visited the offices at Via Brera and ²²the morning discussing the various problems.
- 9 - I would like to repeat the warning that incidents will arise now if any hasty move is made and if reinforcements of troops for the C.C.S.M. and Agents of Public Security are not immediately available at whatever spot they are needed.
- 10 - The disarmament will be entirely ineffective unless detailed orders and directives are issued by the authorities undertaking the disarmament. These instructions should specify exact places

for depositing arms and should be backed up with sufficient force to see them carried out immediately.

11 - A meeting with the most influential leaders of formations is being arranged for next week. It is my intention to put a great deal more responsibility on them and short-circuit the commando who are unknown to the partisans and who are not trusted by them.
