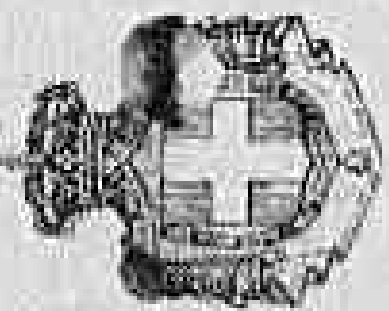

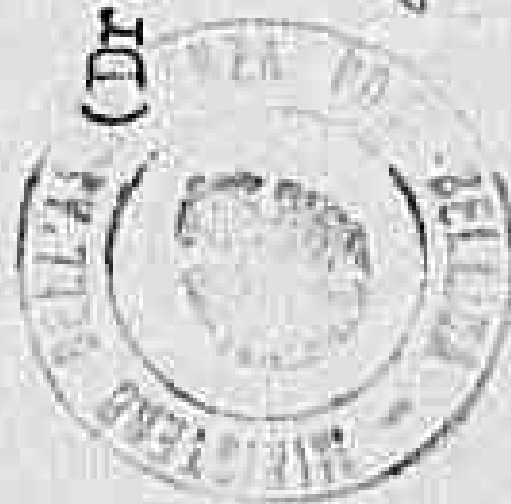

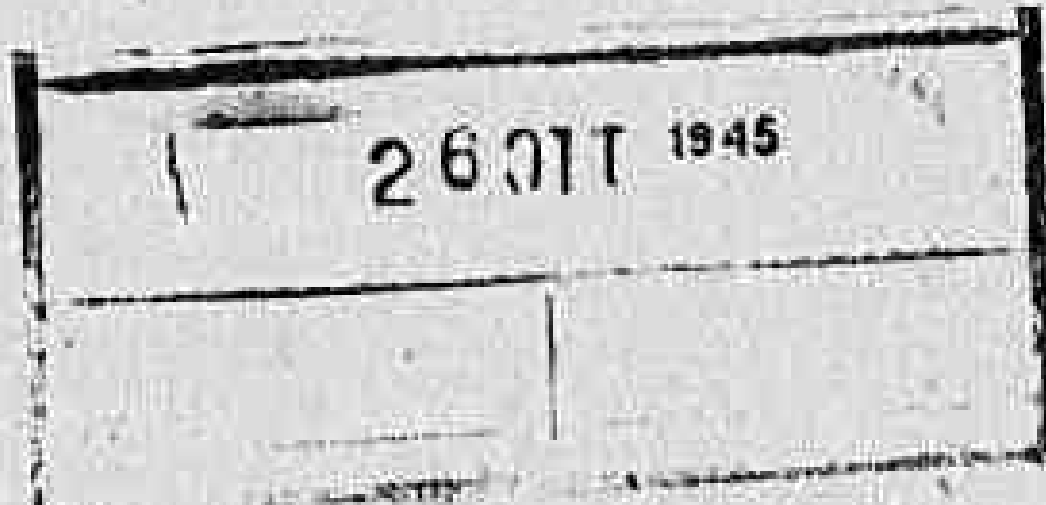

On the 4th. May last, at request of British Major Hugh Jackson - R.A.F.- previously lodged by 23rd. Brigade Partisan forces, this Command bought a Sailing Boat with two lifeboats, with the purpose to make him reach Corsica.

Said Major and partisan (Boccia) Passancini Paolo of Rosario, born and domiciled at Melillo, left Calamarteri Coast at 20.40 with food and liquors for 3 days and a very calm sea. The "Boccia" returned to Brigade after 30 days, reporting to have been taken by a german, about 30 Km. far from the beach; Major Hugh Jackson was interned in germany, whilst the partisan, after having suffered from tortures, succeeded to escape a little before he was shot.

Being in the impossibility to make necessary inquiries to ascertain how matters precisely stand, we beg to apply to your authorities to clear them, letting us know whether Major has been found.

Our Brigade was operating at boundary of the 3 provinces Pisa, Siena and Grosseto.

Mr. Cioni Bruno, charged to buy the boat, owner of the Albergo Nazionale, Colle Val d'Elsa, reports us that the guide Montagnani Aroldo, domicilled at Scarlino (Grosseto) waited both for Major and partisan "Boccia" on the spot where they left from, went to Piombino to see the boat arriving there, and he assisted to the sailing with Montagnani.- Afterward, when the boat left, they returned home.

The owner who sold the boat can be traced at Piombino on the escort of the informations which Cioni Bruno "Eulvio" shall be able to furnish.

We should be glad to receive your news, assuring us of the sort of Major Hugh Jackson.

P.S. - Partisan "Boccia" Passancini Paolo thought to identify and still accuses, as his torturator, Pepi Giovanni of the Siena Prophylactic Institute, who, captured by our partisans, was taken to this Command for hearing.

After informations asked at Siena, we ascertained it was a case of homonymy and freed Mr. Pepi Giovanni who, in the meantime, had suffered damages to his properties.

The action took place as follows:
 The Brigade Command charged me to buy a boat or a motor boat to enable British Major to reach Bastia. By order of the Command, I bought a new sailing boat with two lifebuoys for Lire 15.000,- I left Travale beginning of May together with Major and the guide who ought to take him to Bastia.

When at Maremma banks, as he does not know the way, we stopped at a farmer house for a few hours awaiting for the guide who ought to take us as far as the sea, awaiting ourselves of the dark, considered the danger zone for german control.

The guide who reached Calamartini (Grosseto) coast, is named Montagnani Aroldo, living at Scarlino (Grosseto).

I went at once to Piombino, in a bicycle, soon after we arrived at Calamartini, where I bought the boat, and arranged for it to be brought to above place where Major and the two guides were awaiting.

The Major and the guide "Boccia", a Sicilian, sailed at 20.40 for Bastia, with very calm sea, escort of provisions and liquors for at least three days.- I and guide Montagnani came back to our houses.

"Boccia" returned to Brigade after about two days, stating that, where at 30 Km. from Bastia they were arrested by germans and the Major was interned in Germany. I do not know the name of the boat owner, but, going to Piombino, I might trace him. I believe the boat was not matriculated, as it was unlegally sold to me. "Boccia" might supply more ample informations, as he sailed with the boat together with the British Major and guide Montagnani Aroldo who made us reach Calamartini Coast.

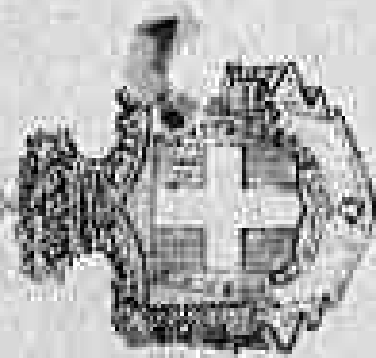

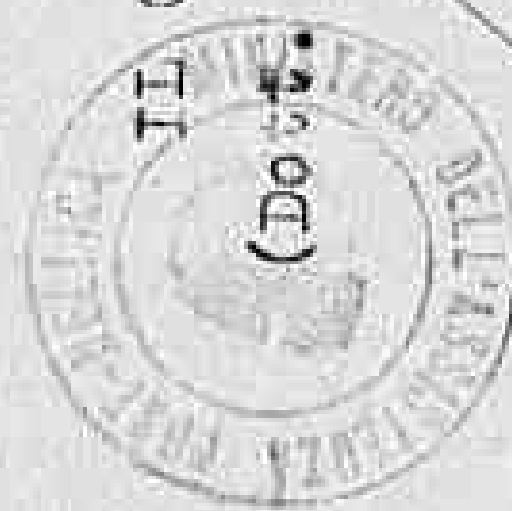

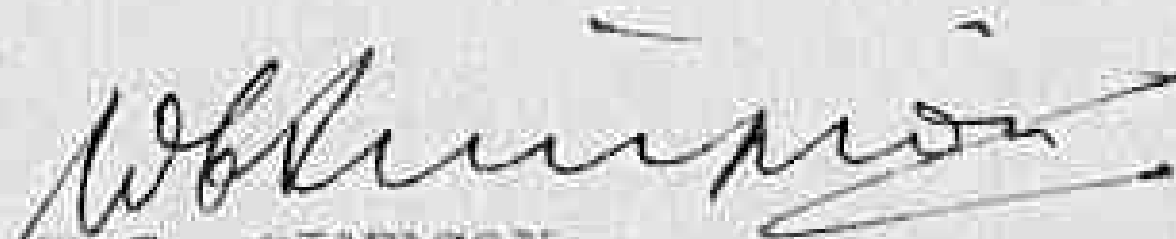

We have here a file on Conte Mario Pignati-Morano, in connection with his assistance given to allied escaped P.O.s. after the Armistice. (reference claim 19801) He gave considerable help, but in view of the fact that it was given whilst he was still an army officer, we cannot do much for him from this office.

The enclosed report is concerned almost entirely with assistance given to leading British troops during the advance after Rome: by a coincidence, I was in the Squadron referred to - and, as a witness, cannot speak too highly of Count Pignati's courage and resource.

REPORT BY MAJOR HESELYNE M.C. 3RD THE KING'S OWN HUSSARS, ON THE COOPERATION OF CONTE MARIO PIGNATI-MORANO OF GALLESE, VIT RSO.

During the Allied Advance up the Tiber Valley about 9/10 June 1944, "A" Sqn 3rd Hussars found themselves in a difficult situation near the village of GALLESE. The Germans has blown up a bridge behind the Squadron and there appeared no alternative route back. This bridge was the one by which the tanks had crossed a small tributary of the Tiber about two miles EAST of GALLESE on the BORGHETTO-ORTE rd. The position could not be consolidated and orders were to get back.

The Commander of a small partisans band came to the Sqn's assistance and personally conducted the tanks over a very difficult route. Thus not only extranting sixteen tanks from a very ugly position but contributing to the general plan of action which had ORTE as its objective.

The Partisan Commander, Conte Mario Pignati, also handed over three Germans (one wounded) whom he had taken prisoner. It was later found out that his partisans had also killed two more. This had happened about one or two days before our arrival when he had ambushed a party near the bridge. One member of this Partisan band has been wounded and we evacuated him to CIVITACASTELLANA Hospital.

For verification, 3rd Hussars War Diary. Lt.Col. P.H.LABOUCHERE, G-1 6 Armd Div then commanding "A" Sqn (myself being 2 i/c). Capt. A.E.WOODLL, 3rd Hussars now employed G-3 P.O.W. Interrogation. Both the above officers at present in this country.

The following information has subsequently come to my knowledge. This gentleman was an Officer in the R. Aeronautica and at the time of the Armistice with Italy was commandant of a small P.O.W. camp. for Allied Air Force personnel. This camp was in the nature of a Transit Camp but during the prisoners' short stay he was meant to glean all the information from them that he could. It was situated somewhere in the hills on the N.E. side of the Tiber valley. (Believed name of camp SAN VALENTINO At POGGIO MIRTUO(?)). I do not know how long he was commandant but he had certainly been there in the summer months. At the time of the Armistice the Senior Allied Officer was Sqn. Ldr. OGILBY, RAF. Conte Pignati set all prisoners free and armed them. Most of them escaped back to our lines.

After this he was wanted by the Germans and became a fugitive but the Germans got confused over his jypenated name and did not find him. Though they enquired twice at his home in GALLESE and ~~went~~ once at his house in Rome. He however travelled around with the fals documents of identity (this I have seen). About this time he shielded Major FAYNE-HARVEY MC., 7 RTR, giving him civilian clothes and a sum of money, and assisted him getting him into the Vatican. The code for the success of this was a letter in Italian from Maj. Fayne-Harvey saying that "His mother was well". I have seen this note.

I believe that he also shielded other Allied o.r. POWs. We collected to from GALLESE during our action. I don't know when he formed his partisan and, but he had it well organised and in telephone communication with the partisans in ORTE. He sent patrols into ORTE on the evening of our action, The family at GALLESE consist of the Count, his wife, and his wife's mother Contessa Anna Tosti. His wife's brother Gino Tosti it would appear was also at GALLESE at the time of Major Fayne-Harve's stay.

I put forward these accounts of help to POWs and conduct during the battle in the hope that the combination of the two may earn Conte Pignati some recognition or award.

I would like to point out, that the Germans knew well of the existence of partisans and escaped P.O.Ws. in this area. Seeing that he must have been well aware of German ruthlessness his conduct throughout since very gallant.

Since serving with the 8th Army I have seen that many partisans and some civilians who have assisted Allied ex P.O.W., helping them in escaping, giving them food, shelter and clothing.

Applications have been filed directly or through my Office in order to obtain reimbursement of expenses or losses suffered in affording the above assistance by patriots and civilians whose financial conditions are particularly difficult and when the loss was of a considerable amount.

There were no claims for reimbursement by those who are financially better off or whose expenses were of smaller importance.

At the beginning, requests for reimbursement were readily granted, as soon as the necessary ascertainsments had been carried out by competent Allied bodies.

Lately many partisans in great need have been awaiting for months a reply granting or rejecting their requests. This has created a feeling of uneasiness amongst those whose applications received no reply in contrast with those who having filed their requests during the first days following the Allied arrival have been immediately reimbursed.

I point out the above matter so that necessary provisions may be adopted and mostly to contribute to better understanding between the Allies and those patriots who have cooperated in the fight.

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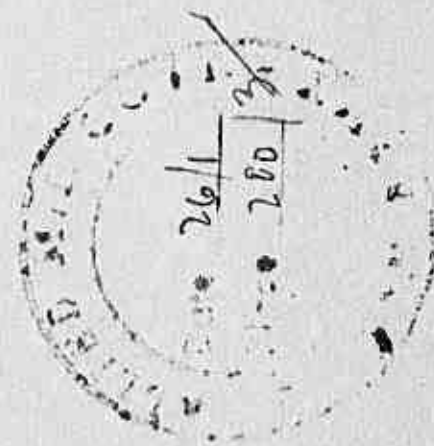

1. It is a G-2 responsibility to settle the claims of helpers of British and USA escapers or evaders in this theater.

2. G-2(P/I) Section, this headquarters, will assume full responsibility for any already existing organizations or future organizations set up to carry out this work in Mediterranean Theater of Operations.

3. a. In order to carry out this task as expeditiously as possible, G-2(P/W), this headquarters, will immediately set up an Allied Screening Commission for this purpose in ITALY and in GREECE.

b. The commissions in ITALY and GREECE will be known as:

* Allied Screening Commission (IS 9), c/o AG, and
Allied Screening Commission (IS 9), c/o AML GREECE, respectively.

c. IS 9 personnel have been attached to all Military Missions in the BALKANS and Central European countries for the same purpose, and will be the only authorized channel for receiving and investigating claims in these countries.

4. Commanders and Heads of Missions will insure that claimants within their area are referred to the nearest IS 9 organization, or to the Allied Screening Commission in the case of ITALY and GREECE.
