I attach a copy of a letter which has been addressed by the Air Minister General Piacentini, to Air Vice-Marshal Bowen-Buscarlet who is Chief of the Air Force Sub Commission, A.C.C. I have spoken to Air Vice-Marshal Bowen-Buscarlet about this matter. He is very anxious that Italian Air Force property should be safeguarded during the advance of the Allied Armies in the North. I understand that valuable material and equipment in the Florence area were lost to the Air Force because they were not properly guarded.

I think it should be possible to arrange with Patriots in the North that this property should be safeguarded against German and Republican Fascist efforts at destruction, and also against Allied souvenir hunters and general ignorance. I would be very grateful if you could undertake the task of contacting the Patriots in the North on this matter.

Herewith letter received from the Air Minister, General Piacentini, and a memorandum addressed to me giving the gist of this letter in English.

2. The matter of the safe-guarding of Italian Air Force property during the advance of the Allied Armies is one of considerable importance to us, as we have already lost some very valuable material and equipment in the Florence Area due to it not being guarded.

3. You will see that there is a statement at the foot of the page that Major De Hean of No.1 Special Force considers that this can be arranged. I should like to have your views on the subject, and to know whether you would like to make the arrangements yourself, or whether we should take the matter up through No.1 Special Force.

MEMO DUE FOR A.M. BOWEN-BUSQ NEXT

In the attached Gen. PIACENTINI puts forward the proposal that the safeguard of the Italian Air Force property during the advance of the Allied Armies be temporarily entrusted to the patriot hands in the region until such time as the Italian Air Force can send a detachment to take over.

Since Col. REMONDINI was himself in charge of patriots in Rome, I asked him how he would propose to contact patriots in the North and give them these instructions.

He was unable to supply a solution.

I think the people to contact would be No. 1 Special Force or C.S.E., but I doubt if the latter would be very helpful.

1. It is understood that instructions have been issued to Patriots in Emilia to frustrate German attempts to flood the Po Valley. If it is not too late now, it is desired to urge that they be instructed also to note accurately the location of any breaches, causing ingress of flood water, which they are unable to prevent. This information is urgently required by Public Works Division Region IX, because it is difficult to locate speedy breakages in widely flooded areas.

SUBJECT: Protection of Land Reclamation and Irrigation Projects.

TO : Patriots Branch.

1. A very substantial part of the food produced in Northern Italy is grown on irrigated or artificially drained land, which can be kept in production only so long as artificial water channels remain free of obstruction and, in some important areas, only so long as pumping stations remain in operation. Damage to these works will enormously aggravate the food problem, which, as is well-known, is far above all other Italian problems in seriousness. It will also cause a great increase in malaria.
2. It is requested that you take whatever action you consider appropriate to help or induce patriots to prevent damage by the enemy to essential irrigation and drainage works, with special reference to the following:
 - a. River levels, particularly those of the larger rivers, and most particularly the dangerous points on these levels; dams; and sea dykes.
 - b. Pumping stations, power lines serving them, and stocks of fuel for pumping stations.
 - c. Artificial reservoirs for irrigation; works for drawing water from rivers, canals and lakes; and irrigation channels.
3. For detailed information and advice regarding the location, general nature and importance of such works in enemy-occupied territory it is suggested you consult Prof. Angelo Sullam, who is employed as a consultant by the Agriculture Subcommittee.
