1. Request has been made by CCS thru AFHQ G-5 Section for any information available on the overstamping and raising in amount of lire currency in enemy-held Italy by clandestine committees of liberation. The following press report dated 20 November 1944 appeared in the Swiss newspapers:

"Despite neo-fascist measures and owing to certainty in upper Italy of German defeat and defiance of fascism there, Clandestine Liberation Committee is able to circulate its own currency. A large number of 50 lire notes have been stamped as 500 lire notes and accepted, and even hoarded, by dealers in TURIN. They serve as evidence of patriotism and are regarded as having a greater chance of recognition by Anti-Fascist Forces. As result of hoarding, notes of 50 and 100 lire denom as rare as those of 5 and 10 lire denom."

2. Will you kindly have your field representatives investigate the above press report noting especially the denominations raised, the amount of the raise in each case, whether the notes were purchased for cash, or for goods and services, whether such raised notes have circulated and to what extent such notes have been issued. If possible, please obtain specimen samples of the overstamped notes for forwarding by this Sub-Commission to AFHQ.

SUBJECT: Note Circulation in Enemy Occupied Italy.

TO : G-5 Section (Finance) AFHQ.

1. Reference your G-5 123.7 dated 25 January 1945 in respect to TIN 436 dated 23 January 1945.

2. According to the Credito Italiano, Rome there were rumors in June and July 1944, that in Lombardy and Tuscany "special bonds" or other "instruments" were circulated by Italian partisans as part of a "loan of liberation". These rumors have never been confirmed.

3. In December 1944, according to the Credito Italiano, reliable sources reported that in Lombardy a number of 500 and 1000 Lire notes were overstamped with a seal of C.L.N. (Committee of National Liberation) raising them to twenty (20) times their original face value. It is said that these overstamped notes were purchased for cash by wealthy people in Turin and Milan at their raised value, did not circulate, were closely held, and that the total amount issued has not been large.

4. There is no information here at present on the over-stamping of 50 and 100 lire notes by Italian partisans in the North.

5. Request has been made to the Patriots Branch, AG, for a field report on the above and that they obtain, if possible, specimen samples of the overstamped notes. Their report and any samples received will be forwarded to you upon receipt.
