It is a matter of considerable difficulty for this Branch to estimate numbers of Patriots for whom it will be necessary to provide ~~up~~ up to the week ending 28 Feb. 45.

However on a basis of the best information obtainable at this time it is estimated that material may be required to clothe some 10,000 Patriots.

The articles most badly needed will be boots. Other articles will be socks, underwear trousers, shirts, jackets, belts, ties, bootlaces.

The Armies may be able to provide a number of blankets but a supply of blankets would also be desirable.

Notes of a Conference
to Discuss Securing Salvage Clothing, etc.

1st Nov 44.

1. The following were represented; CA Section and the following Sub-Commissions or branches - Public Health, Public Safety, Displaced Persons and Repatriation, Commerce, Patriots, Devastated Areas and the British Red Cross.

2. Commerce informed the meeting that there was reason to suppose that very considerable quantities of salvage clothing was in fact available.

3. The following action was decided upon:

- a) That a Senior U.S. Officer should proceed to MTOUSA to request the issue of a direction to U.S. depots that AC should have prior claim on all salvage of clothing, boots, blankets, bedding, tentage, etc.
- b) That Land Forces be asked to agree a basis on which salvage clothing etc, should be allotted to rival necessities.
- c) That Sub-Commissions should submit estimates for their requirements to the 28 Feb 45 for an area not substantially greater than that at present held.

4. A further meeting would be called when action under 3 had been completed.

1. I attach a letter to me from the Minister of War on the above subject.
2. While sympathising with the Minister of War point of view, I do not see that much can be done about this end.
3. As you know, we are having the utmost difficulty in clothing over the official Italian Army and call-ups. Any diversion of clothing or boots to patriots can only be at the expense of the official Italian Army and thus the war effort in ITALY. Moreover, patriots are regarded as civilians. We cannot issue them with Army clothing, equipment or rations - see para 6 of your M.091.711/169 G.O.R. - of 16 Nov.
4. The matter of liaison with and re-organisation under Allied Command in FRANCE is outside my purview.

 SUBJECT: Patriot Formations in the PYRENEES Valleys
 Ref: 68/LG Date: 19 Nov 1944

You are well aware of the situation of the Patriots in the PYRENEES Valleys - It seems to be a case of over 20,000 men engaged in the Guerilla warfare against the overwhelming Nazi-Fascist Forces - Under extremely difficult conditions.

Their situation, which was already bad during the summer period when the mountain roads were open, is rapidly worsening with the approach of winter, because the snow - which has already fallen - is obstructing communications, the local resources are beginning to lack, the localities and the few passes and tracts which are still accessible are easily controlled by the Nazi-Fascists.

If quick relief is not forthcoming, their definite elimination is to be foreseen sooner or later. Particular mention should be made of the Patriot Formations in the AOSTA Valley - about 2500 men - who, under strong pressure from Nazi-Fascist actions, have retreated into the upper Valleys where they lack ammunition, clothing and food, and are reduced to tragic conditions.

As I believe it to be indispensable, I implore you to please use your high authority with AFHQ in order that:

- Regular Liaison be established between the above formations and the Allied Commands in France;
- The Partisan Formations be supplied with ammunition, clothing (Especially shoes) and food, setting up, if necessary, special distribution depots at the best suited points;
- Those Groups which were forced to cross into France be allowed to reorganize themselves under the command of Italian Officers in order to be able to take up the fight again as soon as possible.

I am convinced that you will back these requests of mine with AFHQ, thus enabling these embattled formations, so well acquainted with Mountain Warfare, to continue, morally and materially supported, their efficient operations which will be a notable contribution to the Allied Operations in the Impenetrable mountain zones.

Their situation, which was already bad during the summer period when mountain roads were open, is rapidly worsening with the approach of winter, because the snow - which has already fallen - is obstructing communications, the local resources are beginning to lack, the localities and the few passes and tracts which are still accessible are easily controlled by the Nazi-Fascists.

1. It is becoming increasingly evident that in the not too distant future many partisans numbering into the thousands will be either filtering through our lines or will be met up with during normal advance. Those encountered heretofore have been almost without exception practically destitute of articles of clothing such as coats, trousers and particularly shoes.

2. It is recommended that Welfare or some such agency be asked to explore the possibilities of securing stocks of the above items. At the moment it appears that there might be an immediate call for 3,000 pairs of shoes. This is based on a report made by Major Drage to this office.

3. It would be appreciated if you would advise this Section as to steps you may take. If stocks are located within your area, transport could be arranged from here to pick them up.

2. Your request that clothing for Italian patriots or partisans raises a new departure in the policy of this HQ which as you know has not previously supplied clothing for patriots. If you desire this HQ to reconsider this policy and to provide clothing for patriots, will you please put up a case for providing clothing, fully supported with your reasons and with details of the amount and type of clothing which you estimate may be required for future operations, making for the purpose of such an estimate such factual assumption as you deem necessary.

3. Pending a reconsideration of policy by this HQ it will not be possible to supply further clothing items for Italian patriots.

I have been charged by the 8th Brigata Garibaldi Romagnola which as known is fighting on the Appennines of Romagna, on request and close in cooperation with the 8th Army, to urge by the competent Authorities, the supply of indispensable clothes to continue to fight.

The Brigade is composed of 650 men all badly dressed and without winter clothes.

It is considered indispensable the supply of at least 300 series of : shoes, underwears, trousers, cloakes, stockings.

I beg you to consider that if such supply wouldn't be furnished, the fight effeciency of the Brigade would be remarkably reduced.

Considering that the Brigade has been able to gain the esteem of the Allied Command and the faith who animates all the members of the Brigade, this fact would be a very unpleasant one.


