PATRIOT MEDAL

1. The Gazzetta Ufficiale of 7 July contains a decree authorising the issue of a medal ribbon to Patriots. The ribbon is red with the national colours in stripes at the outside vertical edges, and bears the letters "VL" (Volontari della Liberta) in gilt in the centre.

DIMINISHMENT OF MAIOLLA BAND

2. Members of the Maiolla Band (whose stand down parade on 17 July was referred to in Patriots Branch Sitrep dated 18 July) have not been conveyed to their homes in Allied Military transport. The band numbered approximately 800 men, the majority of whom were drawn from the Abruzzi. At the Parade the Government was represented by the Ministers of War, Air, the Interior and Post War Assistance, and 100 decorations were presented.

CENTRES

3. By the 20 July the number of Patriot Centres had been reduced to 45; it is intended that these shall be closed by the end of the month.

ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

1. The Branch has established contact with the new Minister of Post War Assistance (Sig. Fizzara), although his Ministry has not yet officially taken over from the Ministry of Occupied Italy responsibility for matters connected with Patriots.

LOMBARDIA

2. It is considered necessary to retain for a little longer 3 "skeleton" centres and a few feeding centres in Lombardia, but all other Patriot establishments in this Region were closed on 10 July 45.

DEMOCRATIC AND DISARMAMENT

3. On 7 July a stand down parade was held at Udine for the Italia Patriot Division, which was composed almost entirely of Italian troops and had operated in Yugoslavia. The Maiella Brigade which had operated for many months with the 8 Army stood down at a similar parade on 17 July 45.

1. ITALIAN GOVERNMENT - RESPONSIBILITY FOR PATRIOTS

No decree has yet been issued giving authority to the Ministry of Post War Administration, for the time being administered by the Patriots and I.M.P.D., or P.S.S., after being supplied with a report by his "Hand Leader".

2. GERMAN NATIONALS WITH ITALIAN PATRIOTIC TRENDS

Instructions have been issued to all regions for German nationals (including deserters) who were members of armed Patriot Bands to be reported to A.I.F.A. or P.S.S. after being supplied with a report by his "Hand Leader".

3. PAX OF PATRIOTS DURING THE WAR OF LIBERATION

Explanations were requested from the Ministry of War regarding a letter addressed by them to A.N.P.I. on 15 May 45 concerning back payments of patriotic not on active service on 6 September 43. A conference was held with H.E. SPATRIO, Lt. Col. White and a representative from Finance sub Commission, and the matter is now being discussed by the Italian Govt.

4. GENERAL SURVEY BY REGIONS

(a) Lombardia No report received during this week.

(b) Veneto

After reiteration of the Venezia Giulia problem a marked decrease has been noted in the tension amongst Patriots. Except for a tendency by Rino Manetti Divisions to hang on, the dispersal of bands is more or less complete and practically all arms have been surrendered. A large parade was held at Udine on 26 June, but details are not yet to hand.

On 6 July the stand down of the Garibaldi Division which had fought in Yugoslavia took place. Mario Belando, former Unit Secretary of State for War attended. It has been decided to make an exception in the case of this Division and to pay military rates for the time served prior to Armistice although such services was not in Italy.

From 25 June 102,000 and 6,000 have been attached to the Patriotic Divisions to assist in the defense of the frontier and 50,000 others have been sent to

Explanations were requested from the Ministry of War regarding a letter addressed by them to A.W.P.I. on 15 May 45 regarding back payments of patriots not on active service on 8 September 43. A conference was held with H.E. SPATARD, Lt. Col. WHITING and a representative from Finance Sub Commission, and the matter is now being discussed by the Italian Govt.

4. CENTRAL SURVEY BY REGIONS

(a) Lombardy No report received during this week.

(b) Venetia

After relaxation of the Venezia Giulia problem a marked decrease has been noted in the tension amongst Patriots. Except for a tendency by Mino Manetti Divisions to hang on, the dispersal of bands is more or less complete and practically all arms have been surrendered. A large parade was held at Udine on 26 June, but details are not yet to hand. On 6 July the stand down of the Garibaldi Division which had fought in Yugoslavia took place. Mario Palamò, former Under Secretary of State for War attended. It has been decided to make an exception in the case of this Division and to pay military rates for the time served prior to Armistice although such services was NOT in Italy.

From 25 June 1 Officer and 6 NCOs have been attached to the Patriotic Division of the Region by arrangement with SI PRC who have been sent to provinces where they are giving their valuable assistance to I.M.P.R. Patriots in Belluno Provinces are said to be urgently in need of clothing, this matter is in hand.

Most of the partisans in the Udine area are specialized workers and the only available employment is for labourers. More and more partisans are therefore asking for admission to the Centres to await suitable employment. The following report appeared in the Union Jack of 9th July 45.

"A group of partisans invaded Schio jail near Vicenza, sorted out 73 political prisoners from among the inmates, shot 47 of them to death and wounded 26, it is reported in a Milan newspaper". It has now been confirmed that a raid did take place and was carried out by elements of CANTU Division(PAT)."

(e) Liberals

On 4 July 4 partisans awaiting trial by the Court for murder of 11 prisoners were illegally released by the Quartier et Gendarmerie, the latter is being taken up wth Public Safety. Patriot Police Forces in the region were as follows on 5 July 45.

Many associations are being formed for the assistance of partisans but the A.R.P.I. has not yet been constituted.

2. Sufficient clothing for 5000 men is being made available for Venetian Region from the consignment of salvage garments allotted to 5 Army (see Weekly Sitrep of 5 June, para 3).

PERSONNEL.

3. Major Henderson and Capt. Beast who have recently joined Allied Commission from SO(H) have been assigned to Venezia Giulia as Patriot Officers.

THE LOCAL AUTHORITY HAS BEEN NATIONALISED

Information has been received from which it appears that 2000 horses have been employed by the V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services. In addition, 1500 horses have been substituted to enable certain centres to be converted into installations for the treatment of horses.

SITUATION WITHIN THE COUNTRY

In some other districts the work has been completed but has been suspended or delayed. The work, last month, of 500 horses was suspended by the V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, due to the arrival of 2000 horses from the Soviet Union.

3.

GENERAL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

(a) Lokomotiv. In great parts of the region under V.N. Comas the railway was converted to gauge 1067 mm. In the V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, 1577 mm to 1067 mm. In 1956, Lokomotiv, here V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, has converted all 2000 horses back to 1067 mm. The District Centres and the operating

(b) Voronezh. The situation in this province is favourable. Information to V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, shows that 1500 horses will now be available in the districts of Voronezh, Tula, Ryazan, Kursk, Belgorod, and the Donets Basin, except Ryazan, being closed, and the Tula and Military District centres in each numbered 5, 7, 3 and capital.

(c) Stavropol. The railway centres in Stavropol have been closed.

(d) Krasnodar. In Krasnodar province no information is available.

(e) Novocherkassk. Information to V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, shows that 1500 horses will now be available in the districts of Novocherkassk, Rostov, and the Donets Basin, except Novocherkassk, being closed.

(f) Ufa. Information to V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, shows that 1500 horses will now be available in the districts of Ufa, except Ufa, being closed.

(g) Samara. In Samara province no information is available.

(h) Tashkent. In Tashkent province no information is available.

(i) Nukus. Information to V.A.T. Army Veterinary Services, shows that 1500 horses will now be available in the districts of Nukus, Kokand, and the Fergana Valley, except Nukus, being closed.

- (f) PERU. In Alessandria Province the work was ordered

this work on roads and bridges. Approximately 400 workers
have been handled in and a centre established at Cuzco where
has handled some 250 workers.

SURVEY OF PATRIOT VETERANS' ASSOCIATION.

(a) Liguria.

45,600 veterans and 13,500 handicapped had been registered in and
47,892 Patriots domiciled, in Liguria, up to 26 May. A considerable
number of returning soldiers remain, however, and also causing some
discrepancy, particularly in the City and province of Milan and in the
Provinces of Trieste. A number of centres have been opened in Milan.

(b) Veneto.

The Italian Government has informed the British Embassy to
Patriots to the following point:

- (a) Patriots with "Temporary Service" time 1000
- (b) " " " " " " " " " " 500
- (c) Patriots who have rendered service " " 500
- (d) In consequence of length of service " " 10000
- (e) Cleveron of patriots killed, died or missing " 20000

PATRIOTS, ABANDONED.

Up to 22nd of May, 15,000 arms of various kinds have been handed over to the Italian Patriotic Forces, and further 25,000 have been handed over to the French Patriotic Forces, and further 25,000 have been handed over to the British Patriotic Forces.

CONFISCATION.

U.S.A. have been unable to find the necessary clothing for patriots in Sardinia, and A.C. has therefore agreed to release to ANY for patriots the following items of salvage clothing and equipment originally intended for ordinary civilian purposes.

A.D. trousers	25,000 Pcs.
Jackets ID	10,000
Remained boots	25,000 Pcs.
Helmets	14,000

SUPPLY OF PATRIOTIC ARMS FOR USE.

(a) Liguria.

47,602 patriots demobilized, in Liguria, up to 26 May. A considerable number of arms have been retained, especially, in the northern part of Liguria and in the Province of Genoa. A number of centres have been opened in Milan.

(b) Veneto.

Centres are now operating at Udine, Verona, Bolzano and Venice. Except for the Provinces of Bolzano and Belluno, where the patriots have retained their arms in their old numbers of arms, centres still at large, the patriots have been ordered to store their arms in central armories, from which they can be drawn when required operationally.

(c) Miliz.

In Emilia Region a total of 26,400 weapons had been handed in by patriots up to 26 May.

(d) Pozzana

The Regional Commandant was present at a ceremony on 15 May in Apulia Province, when 362 Patriot Certificates were presented. In this and other northern provinces of Sicily, the Italian Military Attaché representatives are handling a number of Patriots from the north of Italy to transit to their bases in the south.

(e) Liguria

Four centres are now operating in Liguria, at the following places:

La Spezia	carried by	200

Savona	"	450/500
Liguria	"	300

The names are reported to have been placed in a number of previous La Spezia Province.

(f) Piemonte

In Piemonte, a general disarming of Patriots, except in the frontier districts, has been ordered, and efforts are being made to locate caches of arms which the Patriots may hope to retain.

In the agricultural areas and in rural ones adjacent to large cities, in other areas, particularly in the large cities notably Milan and Turin and in the mountain areas adjacent to the frontier, parades have already been discontinued. CIVIL AFFAIRS.

1. Reports from N. Italy during the last week do not give a very comprehensive picture of the Patriotic situation, but the following information received by Patriotic Branch of Venetian General Association of the Land of events, which are so far reported, see note attached, seem to have been established.

(a) MURANO.

Only reports received concern patrols still being used operationally.

(b) VENEZIA.

On 1 May patrols at Padua were causing slight anxiety, but the next day it was reported that both there and at Venice they were being gradually dispersed, that all was quiet, and that patrols would be held later. Seven thousand patriots at Vicenza have landed in their areas.

(c) BLINDA.

At a parade at Modena on 5 May 8,000 to 10,000 patriots were disbursed, and the leaders presented with "Alexander" certificates by General Varese (SMG 5 Army). One hundred and fifty wounded patriots have been admitted to the Emergency Military Hospital.

At Parma the patriots were still being used operationally on 5 May, while at Reggio Emilia (where the numbers were estimated at 2000 on 20 April) patriots are in hand for a massing parade in the near future.

CURRENT STATUS.

Reports from Italy during the last week do not give a very comprehensive picture of this latest situation, but the following information received by Patriotic Branch gives a general indication of the trend of events, which are as follows:

(a) LIVORNO.

Only sporadic reports received concern patriots still being used operationally.

(b) VENEZIA.

On 1 May Patriots at Padua were causing slight anxiety, but the next day it was reported that both there and at Venice they were being gradually disarmed, i.e., all was quiet, and that parades would be held later. Seven thousand patriots at Vicenza have handed in their arms.

(c) MILANO.

At a parade at Modena on 3 May 8,000 to 10,000 Patriots were disarmed, and the Leader presented with "Memorandum" certificated by General Mussolini (500 G Army). One hundred + fifty wounded patriots have been admitted to the Emergency Military Hospital.
At Parma the patriots were still being used operationally on 5 May, while at Reggio Emilia (where the numbers were estimated at 5000 on 26 April) planes are in hand for a disarming parade in the near future.

(d) LIGURIA.

Cesena : the Regginal Patriotic Officer is establishing a centre here, and the authorities were hoping to effect the disarming of all uniformed patriots by 30 April. A special Patriot Police Force (strength 500) has been formed for guarding vulnerable points and for anti-fascist work.

1. I have received a complaint from AFHQ that the material contained in the Weekly Sitrep is not satisfactory.

2. The purpose of this sitrep is to provide AFHQ with material to give a concise weekly national picture of conditions in ITALY for the Combined Civil Affairs Committee of the Combined Chiefs of Staff in WASHINGTON. I gain the impression that this is not appreciated and the object of this memorandum is to give directions which will ensure that the activities of this Commission are adequately reported.

3. Previously the basis of this sitrep has been reports from Regions, but since Sub-Commissions receive all regional information of importance from their specialist officers in the field I have decided to rely on HQ to provide this basis. Vice Presidents will give special attention to the provision of material for the sitrep. Two or three lines are all that are required from each Sub-Commission, containing only material which is general in character and is likely to be of value to the CCAC in WASHINGTON: commencing 21 March 1945 this information, or a nil return, to be submitted to this office not later than 1200 hours on Wednesday of each week.
