SUBJECT: Requisition Procedure

TO : See Distribution Below

1. It has come to the attention of this Headquarters that numerous officers of the Allied Commission have presented requisitions to the Peninsular Base Section for supplies and equipment for civilian use not previously authorized by AFHQ.

2. In this connection, your attention is drawn to AFHQ letter, AC-400.312/031 CEC-O of 28 February 45, subject, "Requisitions for Civil Supplies", para 6 of which states:

"All requisitions from lower echelons will be submitted through country (e.g., Italy, Greece, etc.) agency or Headquarters (S&R) channels where they will be reviewed, consolidated, and coordinated, having regard to the maximum use of overall local resources. Requisitions will then be forwarded to this Headquarters for attention of Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5".

3. All concerned are directed to comply fully with the foregoing letter covering requisitions for civil supplies.

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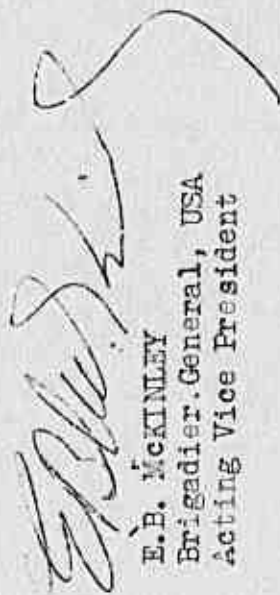

Answer to your letter Ref. 121/9/PAT

In reply to the above letter we inform that the Ministry of War to whom the issue of tobacco to patriot Centres has been submitted has answered as follows:

" We wish to inform your Ministry that tobacco rations (free and on payment) can be issued to Patriots, of the Fascia, Florence and Ravenna Centres only if the patriots are entitled to it, as members of the Italian Army or of units attached to Allied Troops.

" We wish to add that we will bring the matter up to the Land Forces Sub Commission A.C. (M.M.I.A.) in order that the bodies who are responsible for the issue of rations to the patriots, should distribute the cigarettes as well".

Have discussed this with Capt D. Robilant, who agrees that it is intended to be in effect the same as the ruling given by MMIA (see appendix G, para 3, of Patriot Directive), viz - That Patriots who are authorised to draw Aid Rations (i.e. while in Centres) are virtually attached to Allied Tps & will therefore be granted the ration of cigarettes etc issued to the Italian Army.
