 2. The attached copy letter received from Ancona Province seems to indicate that there is no unemployment amongst the patriots.
 3. In Pesaro Province the only information obtained is that in the town of Pesaro there are approximately 30 unemployed Patriots, and these persons are only unemployed because they refused unskilled work offered to them by military Labour Office.
 4. In the absence of reports to the contrary it seems reasonable to assume that in this Province there are no cases of Patriots suffering hardship on the grounds of unemployment.
 5. Any further information received regarding unemployed patriots will be submitted to you immediately.

In reply to your letter dated the 29 Dec 44 and 12 Jan 45 regarding the employment and dispersal of Patriots, it is impossible to collate accurate figures so far as relates to the province generally in the time given. I have discussed the question with the patriot Representative, who assures me that broadly speaking there is no unemployment amongst patriots in this Province, with the reservation that there are many Communes he has not visited.

So far as Ancona City is concerned, I am able to state definitely that there is ample employment for all the patriots in the area, and large numbers are daily transported into Ancona to work.

1. Ref your R5/507/24 dated 17 Nov 44.
2. Attached herewith is a copy of a report on the Communal Patriot Committees from the Deputy P.C. TERAMO.
3. It would appear that the same observations apply equally to the Provinces of CHIETI and PESCARA. The AC Patriot representatives in all 3 Provinces appear to have done little or nothing to organise the Communal Committees.
4. In the Province of CHIETI, the Sindacos were informed that they should organise the Committees in accordance with HQ.AC. instructions, but in view of the unwillingness on the part of the majority of the Communal Administration to assist the Patriot representatives, very little appears to have been achieved.
5. In view of the fact that the Patriot Representatives have now left the Provinces, it is not considered that it is worth while going any further into this matter again.

1. Reference your letter of the 21st November, 1944 CPT.28, attached hereto is a translation of the report received from the Patriot Representative.
2. He is very hazy on the matter and had no knowledge of Communal Committees. I very much doubt whether he has left the City of Teramo itself, in an endeavour to find employment for Patriots.
3. In view of the fact that he returns to Rome this week, and that the Patriots are very seldom in evidence in this Province to-day, I do not propose to open the matter again, unless you wish me to do so.

Provincial Command of Patriots, TeramoDemobilization.

Demobilization of the Patriot Bands was begun immediately on the arrival of Allied troops and was finished within the first ten days of July with the delivery of arms to CC.R of the various stations of the province and with the return of a great part of the men to civil life.

In this province took place (immediately after the end of German domination the participation of patriots in the civil administration and patriots took possession of police-agents places. The chief of a band, Cpt. Giovanni Lorenzini, was appointed chief of the province, communes of all the province were administered by patriots or by cooperators of theirs. These are the names of communes which are still administered by patriots; Giulianova, Castelli and Sivli. The ration-police was formed in its greatest part by patriots; the corps of the Guardia Forestal was renewed by numerous patriots. The Fire Brigade absorbed about 10 patriots; about 20 CC.RR. returned to their service; about 10 patriots were taken over by P.S. as agents. Most part of patriots returned to their agricultural labour and began the reconstruction of the interrupted roads. There were only few patriots who, belonging to the category of employees, returned to their offices. 310 former interned Slaves took active part in the fighting against Nazifascists, and after the liberation of the province they joined there commands at Bari; only a group of 15 of them remained at Teramo until the end of October. Actually there are at Teramo only two slaves, one of them is ill and finds himself in the Civil Hospital; he was wounded by a shot gun on August 44, another is here for his assistance. I am informed that the injured man has to be transported to a Military Hospital at Bari.

There was only a small number of Italian volunteers for the Army: seven for the regular Italian Army, 15 for the Regiment of "Patrioti della Maiella". Their fighting spirit has been considerable and much can still be done by them, but the patriots would prefer not to be separated in various units; what they want is to be united in close bands with their former guerilla chiefs.

Whilst there had been an occupation for almost all of the patriots during the first months after the liberation, now many of them are unemployed as far as the reconstruction of the province is either finished or numerically diminished, ration-police was dissolved, the auxiliary men of the Guardia Forestale were released and also those patriots who had been employed in the census of the population are now employed.

There are no exact numbers of unemployed patriots and it is thought that they are much superior to 30; this latter one would be the number which is applying for work through this office.

Out of a total of some 800 Patriots, who are to receive certificates, only 79 are now unemployed.
