Subject:

• Salvage Clothing.

1. Previous directives of the Board have provided that 40% of salvage clothing and shoes available would be allocated to AC Sub-Commissions who would file claims for their respective segments of the civilian economy and who would distribute to the various civilian activities on the basis most helpful to the Allied war effort and most essential under the disease and unrest formula. Commerce Sub-Commission now proposes that the 40% of supplies for civilian organizations be allocated directly to the Ministry of Industry Commerce & Labor for re-allocation in accordance with the wishes of the Government. It was pointed out that the proposed action would relieve AC of accounting and administrative detail and would be in accordance with numerous other actions aimed at shifting the responsibility for the civilian economy to the Italian Government.

2. It was pointed out that many of the civilian activities in the Italian Government areas were vital to the war effort. Agriculture, mining and the hemp industry were mentioned in this connection. However, it was the opinion of the Board that the Government would cooperate in providing a high priority on clothing for civilian activities of this nature.

3. The representative of the Civil Affairs Section reported that it would be impossible for the Italian Government to function with respect to allocations for Patriots and Displaced Persons, and recommended that a portion of the 40% be allotted directly to the Civil Affairs Section for re-allocation to these two categories. It was agreed that 15% of total availability be allocated for this purpose leaving 25% to be allocated to the Italian Government.

Salvage clothing allocations now are as follows:

- a) Allied Military organizations for distribution to civilian employees in proportion to the number of such employees doing heavy labor in exposed places- 60%.

b) To the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor-25%.

c) To Civil Affairs Section, AC. -15%.

4. The Allocating Sub-Commission reported availability of a very small amount of U.S. Army WAC equipment which was surplus to the War Department requirements. Board approved the recommendation of the Allocating Sub-Commission that this be allotted to the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor for civilian use.

5. The Allocating Sub-Commission reported immediate availability of 320,000 blankets with demands as follows :

The Sub-Commission recommended payment of the blankets borrowed by Devastated Areas S/C; disallowance of the request by Patriots Branch because the blankets were not for immediate use; and the allocations to other remaining claimants should be in proportion to their individual requirements to the total requirements.

6. The Board approved the above proposals and the following allocations resulted :

7. The Allocating Sub-Commission reported that 40,000 blankets for Devastated Areas Branch had been obtained directly from the Prato Mills the output of which had not been considered in availability figures. The Sub-Commission was instructed to report on the possibility of including the output of all mills operating in Army areas in the total availability from which allocations are made. It was pointed out that if more than one source of supply exists there also exists a parallel possibility of duplicated allocations to persons or organizations who apply to alternative sources of supply.

1. As from the date of this letter, all demands for non-subsistence controlled materials reaching you from AC and AMG territories, for civilian needs, will no longer be sent to Commerce Sub-Commission for attention as hitherto. The only exceptions to this are detailed in para 4 and 5 below.

 - (a) Submission at the monthly meetings of the appropriate committees of AFIR(I)B, through this Sub-Commission, in the case of all materials under Category 1 of attached list, dated 14 March '45.
 - (b) For allocation at the monthly inter-ministerial meeting in the case of materials detailed in Category 3 of the above-mentioned list.
3. The usual forms Mat 10 will be used, of which 3 copies will be sent to the Ministry concerned and one retained for your records.
4. Materials under Category 4 of the above-mentioned list will be applied for in accordance with existing directives.
5. Demands for manufacture of rubber products and commercial gases, oxygen and acetylene, will be passed direct to Commerce Sub-Commission for attention, until further notice.
6. The foregoing cancels para 2 of Economic Section's letter ACC/5300/Commerce, dated 25 October, 1944, copy attached. Enquiries for further particulars, if needed, should be passed to Commerce Sub-Commission for attention.

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7. A letter, Ref. AC/530C/Commerce, of even date, copy attached, has been sent to all Regions together with a copy of this letter in order to bring the channeling of demands into line from Provincial officers, to Regional Divisions, from those to Sub-Commissions and, finally, to the Ministries and High Commissioners concerned.

1. As from the 1st November 1944, the duties named under above subject heading, i.e., Pressing and releasing of Controlled Materials and Availability Reports, will be undertaken by the Italian Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labour, in territory under Italian Government Authority.

2. The directions contained in our letter, reference ACC/5300/IC of 22 April 1944, now become non-operative with the exception of paras 6 and 7b, i.e., "6. Demands by Subcommittees or other Agencies. Subcommittees or other Agencies needing controlled materials for purposes outside the sphere of Provinces or Regions will submit their demands on Form ACC-MAT No. 10 in triplicate directly to Industry & Commerce Subcommittee, in accordance with the procedure outlined above".

(NOTE: For Industry & Commerce Subcommittee, read:
"Commerce Subcommittee")

"7b. Where it is known that wanted materials are not available in Italy, proper requisitions for import should be initiated".

3. For your guidance and information, the following are attached:

NOTE: Circolare No. 2 of 5 October 1944 advises Prefects of the preparation of the Legislative Decree suppressing the Consiglio and the Uffici Provinciali dell'Economia on the one hand and reintroducing the Camere di Commercio, Industria e Agricoltura and the Uffici Provinciali del Commercio e dell'Industria, on the other; the latter being the executive organisation of the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labour. It will be noted that the Camere now include Agriculture which, before Fascism, was a separate organisation.

4. The main points of enclosure, para 3 i) and ii) above, can be summarised as follows:

i) Allied Forces have been compelled to block essential war materials and this work has hitherto been done through the agency of AMG/ACC.

ii) On behalf of ACC, the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labour, through the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria, will do this blocking as from 1 November 1944, in the Provinces under the authority of the Italian Government.

iii) The ACC, Commerce Subcommittee, will make available to the Ministry, such quantities of materials for civilian needs as will have been released by AFPS at the monthly meetings of the appropriate Committees. The subsequent release of these controlled materials for civilian needs will be done by the Ministry.

iv) There will be no interruption in the continuity of freezing Controlled Materials as Provinces now under AMG control become released to Italian Government authority. Thus, the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labour, through the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria, will merely extend the functions they are taking over from ACC.

v) In the Provinces under Italian Government authority, factories and merchants producing or possessing controlled materials, will declare to the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria, what quantities they have on hand on the last day of each month. Factories will also pass to the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria particulars of their estimated output for the following month. Manufacturers will also submit demands for estimated requirements for raw materials to cover a period of

Summarised as follows:

- i) Allied Forces have been compelled to block essential war materials and this work has hitherto been done through the agency of AMG/ACC.

Factories will also pass to the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria particulars of their estimated output for the following month. Manufacturers will also submit demands for estimated requirements for raw materials to cover a period of six months production.
- All this information will be sent to the Ministry and, by it, passed to HQ ACC.
- vi) All demands for civilian needs will be collated by the Ufficio Provinciale del Commercio e dell'Industria and forwarded to the Ministry, where they will be examined, collated and passed to Commerce Subcommittee for submission as bids at the monthly meetings of the appropriate committees of AFIRS.
- vii) Particulars of the materials allocated at these meetings, (sub-para vi) above, will then be passed to this Subcommittee which will re-allocate to the appropriate Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria, through a Board consisting of representatives from the interested Ministries. Release Orders will be made out and sent to the individual civilian applicants by the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria.

As far as materials of category 2 are concerned, the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria must henceforth advise the firms owning such controlled materials that duly authorized Agents of Allied Armed Forces have the right of acquiring the quantities necessary for their needs. Purchasing Orders or similar documents of authority issued by the competent Commands, must be endorsed beforehand by the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria. The Ufficio will then inform the Ministry immediately of the delivery which has taken place.

5. Therefore, all requests pending and Terms MAT 19 ready for despatch to this HQ on and after 1 November, in Italian Government Territory, will be passed at once to the appropriate Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria, for action.

6. No further requests for controlled materials will be accepted by ACC officials from sources in Italian Government Territory, who will instruct applicants to contact the Ufficio del Commercio e dell'Industria of their Province. It is understood that the terms detailed in this letter come into force as and when Provinces come under Italian Government control, without further instructions from this HQ.

The Board confirmed a previous informal allotment of 100 tires to Agriculture Sub-Commission, to which the allotment noted above is an addition; both are for use in the olive oil campaign. 1. Basis for Procedure

A Order of Staff memo dated 9 January 1945, redesignates War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission as the AC agency to receive from military Services reports on availability of salvage, scrap and other war material, to collect such reports and distribute them to the appropriate Sub-Commissions of AC. The AC Priorities Board has, in Procedural Bulletin No. 1, divided all materials into four categories and has designated an Allocating Sub-Commission for each category. It is the purpose of this procedure to coordinate the activities of the Allocation Sub-Commissions and War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission.

2. Availability Statements to AC Sub-Commissions and Sections

a. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission will prepare lists of available salvage, scrap and other war materials according to the established categories and these lists to each Allocating Sub-Commission the first appropriate relevant information is received or material; same lists will include quantity and specification of materials; procedures for inspection, claiming and return delivery.

b. Each Section will PD with the War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission a list of its Sub-Commissions on Sections requiring copies of availability lists and the hours required to check. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission will determine the procedure to be followed at the same time as indicated and transmitted to Allocating Sub-Commissions.

3. Availability Statements to Italian Government

Each Sub-Commission on Salvage, Scrap and other war materials will determine if it is necessary or advisable to notify their opposite organization in the Italian Government and will transmit and notifications deemed necessary or advisable.

SUBJECT: AC Execution Board Procedural Bulletin No. 1

TO : Distribution Below

1. The AC Priorities Board established by Board No. 4 of 3 January 1945, will from time to time submit for review the granting of priorities and allocations. This is the form of such procedures.

2. The Board will, in the beginning, deal primarily with allocations among the divisions and Sub-Commissions of AC. The general plan of operation provides that the physical operations of receiving, inspection, determining availability, and establishing the date of support or qualifications will be carried on by sub-commissions designated for the purpose. Applications will come to the Board only through such Allocating Sub-Commissions. Applicants may be 40 Regions or Sub-Commissions and the applications may include requests of material or services requested for Italian civilian organizations. There will be some special cases where applications will not be filed directly with an Allocating Sub-Commission. Such exceptions will be noted in procedure bulletins and discussed in possible applications; one is noted in this bulletin.

3. Definitions:

- a. Board - The body constituted by Executive Order No. 4.
- b. Sub-Committee - The Supply and Resources Division of the Economic Section.
- c. Secretary - A member of the Secretariat and its representative at Board meetings.
- d. Allocation - The assignment by the Board of a quantity of a material or a commodity to a project. The assignment may be made by an Allocating Sub-Commission in accordance with directives of the Board.
- e. Priority - An allocation of resources within the Board by the Board, for such amount of material or services as may be required.
- f. Allocating Sub-Commission - A sub-commission authorized by the Board to receive and forward requests for the Board to supply in accordance with Board directives.

1. The AC Priorities Board established by Executive Order No. 4 of 8 January 1945, will from time to time establish procedures to provide the setting of priorities and allocations. This is the purpose of such procedures.

2. The Board will, in the beginning, deal primarily with allocations among the Regions and Sub-Commissions of AC. The general plan of executive agencies that the physical operations of production, distribution, determining availability, and establishing the facts in support of applications will be carried on by sub-commissions designated for the purpose. Applications will come to the Board only through such Allocating Sub-Commissions. Applications may be AC Regions or Sub-Commissions and the applications may include requests of material or services requested for Italian civilian organizations. There will be some special cases where applications will not be filed directly with an Allocating Sub-Commission. Such exceptions will be noted in procedural bulletins and announced to possible applicants; one is noted in this bulletin.

3. Definitions:

- a. Board - The body constituted by Executive Order No. 4.
- b. Secretary - The Supply and Resources Division of the Economic Section.
- c. Secretary - A member of the Secretariat and its representative at Board meetings.
- d. Allocation - The assignment by the Board of a quantity of a material or a service to an applicant. The assignment may be made by an Allocating Sub-Commission in accordance with directives of the Board.
- e. Priority - The relative importance, as fixed by the Board, for each and use of material or services within its purview.
- f. Allocating Sub-Commission - A sub-commission appointed by the Board to assist and advise the Board in its purview to applicants in accordance with Board directives.
- g. Applicant - Any organization that requests an assignment of a material or a service by an Allocating Sub-Commission by filling the required forms.
- h. Application - A written statement prepared in the proper form by an organization indicating a material or a service required, and filled with an Allocating Sub-Commission. The application must include all information requested by the Allocating Sub-Commission.

4. General Principles

In general any organization of men allied or Italian Government may file application for a material or service with the Allocating Sub-Commission assigned by the Board (under paragraph 6 below).

Exceptions

- a. Salvage Clothing - Any organization applying for salvage clothing for distribution to Italian, Russian or other safety personnel must file

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1. The Agencies Act with the Disposed Persons Sub-Commission of the Civil Assets Section. Disposed Persons Sub-Commission will handle all such applications and submissions and present them to the Allocating Sub-Commission (Committee) for consideration along with applications from other sources and the other new categories.

With the one exception noted, applications will be dealt with Allocating Sub-Commission as enumerated below in paragraph 5.

5. Allocating Sub-Commission -

The following sub-sections are authorized to act on the Board within the limits of their own funding allocations and the subject to the articles and services mentioned for each:

- a. Food Sub-Commission: All food for human consumption.
- b. Ammunition Sub-Commission: All ammunition, cartridges and military supplies except those listed for arms consumption by agreement between the Agencies and Food Sub-Commissions. All supplies and military equipment articles as listed in the attached list, together with accessories and maintenance materials for the operation of this equipment.
- c. Industrial Sub-Commission: Goods and services; raw materials; supplies, articles and equipment primarily used for industrial activities. Articles, services or other operations are not covered and maintenance materials for the operation of this equipment.
- d. General Sub-Commission: P.C.I. and all other types of finished articles except those which are of essentially a general nature, for such as clothing and footwear, supplies, equipment and property.
- e. Transportation Sub-Commission: Fuel, oil, lubricants and other petroleum products, tires, and all other accessories and equipment for motor vehicles (see also attached list).

6. Exclusions -

- a. All items which are classified as "General" or "Miscellaneous" shall be covered under the general provisions.
- b. Great care must be exercised in all applications for the supply for

5. Administrative Sub-Commission

The following sub-commissions are authorized to act on all items within the limits of their respective scope and with respect to the materials and services indicated for each:

- a. Food Sub-Commission: All food for human consumption.
- b. Agriculture Sub-Commission: All agricultural, forestry and fishery products, except those allotted for human consumption by agreement between Agriculture and Food Sub-Commissions. All supplies and materials which are directly used for agricultural, forestry or fishery purposes.
- c. Industry Sub-Commission: Coal; other mined products; raw materials; supplies, supplies and machinery primarily used for industrial activities. Arms, tools, inventory or equipment by business are not necessary and materials available for the purposes of this procedure.

4. Commerce Sub-Commission: P.O.L. and all non-food and non-entirely direct trade items, including sea and air transport, for cargo, heavy construction supplies, equipment and machinery.

6. Administration Sub-Commission

- a. Business: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.
- b. Government: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.
- c. Construction: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.
- d. Transportation: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.
- e. Utilities: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.
- f. Other: All in all conditions and services in which there is no direct supply for and no direct purchase.

7. Materials: All materials necessary to check actual daily price against allocations.

7. The Board will:

- 6. Establish priorities relative to sub-panels, interviews and services.
- 7. Establish sub-panels for the determination of allocation for each priority rating.
- 8. Meet on the 15th Monday of each month to set an agenda and coordinate work.
- 9. Have level committees which will be called upon request of any Allocating Sub-Committee or the Secretary.

8. The Secretariat will:

- a. Receive all information and data from Allocating Sub-Committees for reference to the Board.
- b. Associate all sub-panels with the information provided with in the presentation of each case.
- c. Supply all information and data from sub-panels with relevant material from the appropriate other sub-panels, and summarize relevant activities of the Board in handling or handling cases.
- d. Prepare the minutes including records of Board action, and procedures which will be used to carry out the work of the Board, for the appropriate distribution to each sub-committee.

9. Administration and Board Meeting

10. Minutes

For the purpose of the Board meeting, each Allocating Sub-Committee will supply to the Board the following monthly reports:

- (1) An agenda for the first six of the days of the previous month.
- (2) A report of the consumption and production during the current month.
- (3) A report of the activities and responsibilities for each of the

4. Said such a meeting which will be held upon request of any Allocating Sub-Commission to the Secretary.

The Secretaries Will:

a. Receive all information and data from Allocating Sub-Commissions for reference by the Board.

b. Advise the Board of any information which is in conflict with the provisions of the Act.

c. Supply any information and data from one sub-commission with relevant material from other sub-commissions, and sub-commissions of the Board in similar or conflicting cases.

d. Prepare the minutes of each meeting of the Board, and procedures under which the Board will operate; and provide for the appropriate distribution of such documents.

Examination and Approval:

Materials

For each material to be submitted to the Board, each Allocating Sub-Commission will supply to the Board for its review and approval the following:

(1) An inventory statement as of the close of the previous month.

(2) A statement of changes in all production during the current month.

(3) A forecast of demand and availability for each of the three ensuing months. This forecast must be submitted not later than the 5th of each month.

The Board will exercise its discretion for altering foregoing period when factors of season, production or transportation make such changes desirable.

Transposition

Transposition Sub-Commission will supply to the Board for its review monthly statistics:

(1) A statement of the volume lifted in the previous month by selected types of transposition.

- (2) A statement of estimated life during the current month by material groupings and type of transportation.
- (3) A forecast of the life available during the ensuing three months by type of transportation. This forecast must be submitted to the Superintendent by the 10th of each month.

1. Salvage Clothing - Allocating Sub-Commission, Commerce

- a. The Board had approved an allotment of 50 percent of stocks on hand as of 11 January to military organizations employing civilian heavy workers in exposed places (para. 2, 7 Minutes No. 2). The Sub-Commission now presented memo AC/5134/23 January giving a basis for apportioning this total allotment among the several organizations sharing in it. It was proposed:
- (1) To prorate in proportion to the number of heavy workers employed in exposed places by each applying organization.
 - (2) To use figures supplied by Labor 3/C as a basis for the above prorating.
 - (3) That the allotment to an organization should not exceed the amount for which it applied.
 - (4) That the amount by which any application fell short of the "normal allocation", determined by applying the proper percent prorate to available supplies, be considered "surplus". And, that the same would apply to the entire "normal allocation" of any eligible organization which made no application.
 - (5) That "surplus" be distributed to eligible applicants who have applied for more than their "normal allocation". Apportionment to be in proportion to the number of workers (as defined) employed by the organizations sharing in the distribution of surplus.

The Board approved the above recommendations with respect to Military Organizations.

- b. The Board had approved allocation of 28 percent (70% of 40%) of 11 January stocks to Civil Affairs Section for distribution to Patriots, Disabled Persons and Public Safety Personnel (pers. 4, 5 - Minutes No. 2). No basis for apportionment of the 28 percent allocation among the three groups was advanced but the Board permitted the allocation to stand as approved, Civil Affairs Section to apportion on the basis of day-to-day need.
- c. The Board had approved allocation of 12 percent (30% of 40%) of 11 January stocks to Economic Section for distribution: 45 percent to Public Works & Utilities; 45 percent to Transportation S/C; 10 percent for reserve. Transportation S/C application was so far short of allocation as to suggest the original basis for determining it had failed to consider all factors. It was pointed out that Transportation S/C had recently received a substantial allotment. The Board instructed Allocating Sub-Commission to review the basis for apportioning the Economic Section allotment among the three users, prior to the next application, and permitted the original 12 percent allocation to stand with distribution of the Transportation S/C surplus made according to the formula set for in 1-a(3) above.
- d. The Board approved applying the above and previous percentage allocations to the stocks available as of 17 Jan as stated in memo 40/1134/23 January by Commerce S/C.

2. Tires - Allocating Sub-Commission, Commerce

The Allocating Sub-Commission distributed copies of a preliminary memo which was discussed briefly. The Board indicated:

- a. A need for knowing the relative demands of applicants.
- b. A need for truck and car population figures by use groups by regions, considering for each group the tire sizes required.

It was suggested that Public Safety S/C might supply some data since they initiated and administered the licensing program.

3. The Board approved Draft No. 2 of Procedural Bulletin No. 1 instructing the Secretary to consult Board members individually on the few points remaining unsettled and to incorporate the final decisions into a final procedure for general circulation.

1. Purpose of the meeting was to make allocations among the various claimants for salvage clothing. The meeting was originally scheduled for Monday, 15 January and was postponed. The proposal submitted by the Allocating Sub-Commission (Commerce) was considered.

2. The Allocating Sub-Commission proposed allocating 50 percent of available salvage clothing to Allied Armed Forces for civilian employees; 40 percent to Allied Commission's Sub-Commissions and 10 percent to the Italian Government and UFFRA. The Board modified the recommendation to 60 percent of available supplies for Armed Forces; 40 percent for other civilians (AC).

3. The Allocating Sub-Commission proposed that the allotment to Armed Forces be subdivided as follows: military railways 50 percent; Navy Sub-Commission 20 percent; labor directorate 20 percent; other services 10 percent. The Board felt there was not sufficient factual foundation for establishing these percentages and instructed the Sub-Commission to telephone or signal all Armed Force applicants a request for the number of employees doing heavy work in exposed places and to effect distribution among claimants pro rata according to the number of these workers employed by each.

4. The Allocating Sub-Commission proposed that the 40 percent of total availability allowed for other civilians administered by AC Sub-Commissions should be distributed 70 percent to the Civil Affairs Section and 30 percent to the Economic Section. The Board approved this recommendation.

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- 2 -

5. The Allocating Sub-Commission proposed distributing the allotment made to Civil Affairs Section in equal parts to five sub-divisions of the section. The Board directed distribution be made only to patriots, displaced persons and for public safety personnel according to percentages to be determined by the Civil Affairs Section.

6. The Allocating Sub-Commission proposed that the allotment to Economic Section be distributed 45 percent to Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission for distribution; 45 percent to Transportation Sub-Commission for distribution; and the remaining 10 percent should be held as a reserve for requirements not anticipated. The Board approved this recommendation.

7. The Board directed that the above decisions apply only to stocks available as of 11 January 1948 and that the Allocating Sub-Commission and the Secretariat should bring before the Board a proposal which would eliminate duplications and which would provide a sounder basis in fact for arriving at the percentages to be allotted in further actions.

8. Applications received by the Commerce Sub-Commission appeared to cover different time intervals making it impossible to compare the requirements of one organization directly with those of another. The Board directed that the procedure for further allocations should provide for applications on a comparable time basis.

9. The Board directed the Commerce Sub-Commission to prepare future reports of availability which would take into consideration the production of the factory run by the 5th Army, plus the imports reported to be arriving soon in the port of Livorno.

10. The Board discussed briefly the problem of allocating tires and directed the Sub-Commission to expedite work already underway and make any necessary modifications in the light of the experience thus far in dealing with clothing allocations.

11. The Board approved procedure whereby all applications by groups outside the AC for salvage clothing for refugees should be filed initially with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission for collating and presentation to the appropriate Allocating Sub-Commission.

12. The Board noted that the general procedure for handling allocations was now being circulated for comments and concurrence by all Allocating Sub-Commissions.

1. The meeting opened with the reading of Executive Order No. 4 of 8 January 1946, and a reading of ...
2. It was pointed out by Transportation Sub-commission that Paragraph 4 of Executive Order No. 4 might be interpreted to mean that claims should be sent directly to the Priority Board, whereas the procedure proposed stipulated that all claims should be filed with designated Allocating Sub-commission. It was agreed that claims should be filed with Allegating Sub-commission and that copies should be furnished to direct via the procedure whereby this matter to the same list who received the Executive Order. It was agreed that there would be no confusion as to the place to file claims for payment or otherwise.
3. The draft procedure was reviewed and discussed. The Board agreed that it should be rewritten to incorporate the suggestions brought forth in the ...

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4. It was agreed that special meetings of the Board would be called by the Secretary, and that any Allocating Sub-Committee could request the Secretary to call a meeting.

5. It was agreed to hold a regular monthly meeting of the Board on the third Tuesday of each month.

6. In order to keep the progress of making the allocations of goods and services and allocation program well informed on the progress for each allocation in the Secretariat. It was agreed that the Allocating Sub-Committees themselves would maintain the records necessary to ascertain that movements actually followed allocations of goods, primarily by means of actual receipts and a set of movement forms; and that periodic progress reports should be submitted to the Board based on such records.

7. It was agreed that the Secretariat would develop necessary forms in consultation with Allocating Sub-Committees. Such immediately required forms would be the applications on which decisions are made requests for materials with Allocating Sub-Committees and the forms on which Allocating Sub-Committees will present cases to the Board through the Secretary.

8. Paragraph 5 of the draft procedure will be amended to permit continued functioning of the present procedure whereby civilian claims for movements are noted and processed. It is agreed to continue the basic procedure and to have arrangements to make necessary and present all civilian claims to appropriate sub-committees.

9. Paragraphs 6 and 7 of the draft procedure will be re-written in consultation with the Transportation Sub-Committee and Mr. Cleveland.

10. Some doubt was expressed as to whether the Board would be able to meet in the Secretariat building at 10:00 hours; however, the Transportation Sub-Committee will see that this can be arranged.

11. The Board called a special meeting at 10:00 hours on 15 January 1947 to consider allocation of civilian supplies of salvage clothing and will be presented by the Commerce Sub-Committee. Civil claims should be prepared and presented for presentation to the Board at that time.
