Reference Special Orders No. 11 dated 3 December 1945.

1. Comments

In accordance with Special Order No. 12, paragraph 11, 13, Colonel Rogers will, after the arrival of 100% of S. and Descriptive Officers, be in command of the Palestine Detachment, 100% of S. and will appoint an Acting Liaison Officer, Rear Party, Lt. Col. Davis, 100% of S. will also remain with Rear Party pending orders from HQ ACC.

2. Instructions

HQ ACC remains at Tel Aviv until notification by cable is received of when it will open at Haifa. (probably about 12th December). Exact date will be notified by Commander, Rear Detachment, to all concerned as soon as cable is received.

3. File of Rear Party

After HQ ACC opens at new station (see paragraph 2 above), the Rear Party will be known as 100% of S. (Rear Detachment), changing to HQ ACC (Rear Detachment), as soon as the HQ ACC becomes known to HQ ACC.

4. Application of Orders

All existing orders issued by HQ ACC (for example the memorandum on Travel Orders and the orders regarding day's off) will continue to apply.

5. Movement of Officers to Haifa and Galilee

Forward movement of officers may be authorized by O.C. Rear Detachment in the responsible hands of the Station or Sub-Communication concerned concerning their presence at Haifa or Galilee necessary or if the officer has been ordered forward by HQ ACC (ACC).

6. Officers Arriving

Officers arriving to join the Rear Detachment, whether on leave, duty or permanent change of station will report to the HQ's office and then to the HQ ACC will publish their names in Orders.

7. Correspondence and Cables

(a) Pending any contrary orders, official mail addressed to HQ ACC will be forwarded by the HQ ACC. If the matter can be dealt with here, it will be dealt with here. If it obviously cannot be dealt with here, it will be forwarded to HQ ACC.

SUBJECT: Requisitioned Vehicles

TO : Heads of Sub-commissions, Sections and Branches.

1. Letter from Headquarters 4 December 1943, subject Motor Vehicles and Gasoline Consumption, directed that all requisitioned passenger motor vehicles be turned in to Headquarters Garages (A) or (B) unless the surrender of such vehicles would be seriously detrimental to vital projects. In the latter case, a letter stating the necessity for retention of the vehicle was to be submitted to Headquarters. Retention of requisitioned vehicles without reporting by letter as required will be a matter for disciplinary action.

2. Heads of Sub-commissions, Sections and Branches will institute a check of their subordinates and will certify in writing to the Executive Officers that to the best of their knowledge and belief all requisitioned passenger vehicles formerly held by members of their Subcommission, Section or Branch have been turned in to Headquarters Garages (A) or (B). If any vehicles have been retained, the certificate will list the vehicle, the officer or soldier holding the vehicle, and certify that the necessary report in writing has been made.

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1. For the information of the recipient, the following instructions governing the use of cables and the transmission of cables is published.

2. Preparation: Cables will be typed, and will be submitted to the Adjutant General in a total of five (5) copies, of which three (3) will be on the regular cable form, and two (2) on white tissue. Such other additional carbon copies as are desired for use by the Adjutant General's office or officer, may be prepared at the same time.

3. Distinction in Information: All cables submitted for transmission will bear the following distinguishing information:

(1) The name of the originating office and officer, typed in the lower left-hand corner of the sheet.

(2) The "city" number of the cable, typed in the extreme upper right-hand corner of the sheet. Example: "7 DCO 959".

The purpose of (1) is to enable quick reference to the originating office of either reply or question in connection with the original cable. It is for the protection of the originator.

The purpose of (2) is to facilitate quick reference at the point of the transmitting agency - Field Base Section.

CABLES NOT PREPARED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THESE REQUIREMENTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR TRANSMISSION.

4. Authentication: Signature and Initials:

(1) All cables will be authenticated by the initials of the originating officer, placed in the space provided for that purpose in the upper right-hand corner of the blank. Such initials will appear on the third carbon copy only.

(2) All cables will be authorized for transmission by the signature of the Adjutant General or this organization, or of one of his regularly appointed assistants.

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5. Justification of procedure or information in connection with cables may be referred to the Adjutant General's Section, Miscellaneous Division, Room 13, 11, Via Nevada.

ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES SECTION

1. The Allied Force Local Resources Section (A.F.L.R.S.) is hereby established as a Staff Section of this headquarters under the supervision of G-4, this headquarters.

2. The Section will:

- a. be responsible for the organization within various designated territories in this theater of operations, of local Boards to coordinate the procurement and allocation of all forms of local resources and services, except such as are allocated to other agencies available to the Armed Forces.
- b. assist the respective Boards in the development of information concerning local supplies and facilities and aid the Boards in the procurement of local supplies and facilities required for the Armed Forces.
- c. Through the Allied Force Headquarters Middle East Administrative Information Section (A.F.A.I.S.) obtain information concerning the Middle East Supply Center resources which may be made available to this headquarters.

3. The local Boards will ascertain what is available to the Armed Forces and coordinate prices to be paid, in liaison with the Allied Control Commission, Allied Military Government, or other government authority responsible for controlling the economy of the territory in which the Board is operating.

4. The Section will recommend to G-4, this headquarters, the basic policies under which the local Boards will operate. It will be responsible for the execution of these policies by the local Boards. Any matters for decision by higher authority will be forwarded by the Chairman to this headquarters.

5. The Chairman of local Boards will be appointed by this headquarters.

6. Each Board will be composed of a Chairman, Vice Chairman or Vice Chairman (U.S. and British) as the cases require, a Secretary and such members of the Board as the Chairman may, from time to time designate. **41**

7. By direction of the Executive Chairman, the Vice Chairman will be responsible for providing A.F.L.R.S. with copies of all minutes of the Board Meetings and such other reports as may from time to time be required.

ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES SECTION

1. The Allied Force Local Resources Section (A.F.L.R.S.) is hereby established as a Staff Section of this Headquarters under the supervision of G-4, this Headquarters.

2. The Section will:

7. By direction of the respective Chairman, the Vice Chairman will be responsible for providing A.F.L.R.S. with copies of all minutes of the Board Meetings and such other reports as may from time to time be required.

ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES (ITALIAN) BOARD

1. Pursuant to Administrative Memorandum No. 77, this headquarters, cc, the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board is hereby set up to carry out the policies of this headquarters in regard to the local procurement and allocation of supplies, facilities and services, except rail and water transport and petroleum, required by the military within the Italian mainland, now or in the future, occupied by the Armed Forces under the command of this headquarters.

2. The Board will coordinate all Navy, Army and Air Forces requirements from local resources and decide on policies and procedure for the procurement of them. It will allocate to the interested agencies of the Armed Forces the local resources available for each.

3. In giving effect to paragraph 3 of Administrative Memorandum No. 77, this headquarters, cc, the Board will work in liaison with the Allied Control Commission and Allied Military Government.

4. Nothing in this Administrative Memorandum shall abrogate the responsibility of the Allied Control Commission, or Allied Military Government to utilize and develop the local resources of ITALY.

6. The Vice Chairman shall be officers designated for full time duties with the Board.

7. Members of the Board may designate one permanent officer to act as substitute for them in the event of their absence.

8. The Board shall meet regularly, as directed by the Chairman or Vice Chairman.

9. There will be a permanent Joint U.S. and British Secretariat of the Board responsible for maintaining records of all meetings and furnishing the secretarial requirements of the Sub-Committees referred to in paragraph 12 below.

10. The Allied Control Commission will provide the Board with information regarding local resources of all kinds and also state the minimum needs of civilian requirements. The Board will, in coordinating the needs of all interested agencies of the Armed Forces with the needs of the Control Commission, allocate to the Military agencies concerned the local resources available for each.

11. Any matters for decision by higher authority will be forwarded by the Chairman to this Headquarters.

12. To assist it to carry out its functions, the Board may establish Sub-Committees as necessary. The membership and duties of these Sub-Committees will be determined by the Board, which will insure that all interested parties are represented.

13. Additional Boards, where necessary, under the Chairmanship of the Base Section Commander (American) or Commander Base Sub-Area (British), as the case may be, may on the advice of the Board, be set up as necessary to deal with local questions. The names of any additional Boards set up will indicate the areas for which they are responsible to the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board set up by this memorandum. (AG 321(AFLRS)CDS-ACM)

RELATIONS WITH REGIONAL HQ

1. General Principles. The Regional Civil Affairs Officer (RCAO) shall be responsible to the CMO for the administration of military government in his region. Generally speaking he will have full power of command and decision on all matters relating to government, subject to the following limitations:

a. Action taken will be within the framework of policies established by AMG HQ by proclamation, order, director or otherwise. Interpretations issued by AMG HQ of proclamations and orders will be binding upon each region. RELATIONS WITH REGIONAL HQ

(13) The subject matter involves a substantial change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than of local application (e.g. modification of social insurance systems, agricultural control, tax structure.

(d) appointments or removals of Prefects and other administrative officers of like rank will be subject to approval by AMG HQ. Appointments or removals of certain judicial, educational and other officials, to be separately notified, will also be subject to approval. Appointments or removals of all officials will be reported to AMG HQ.

2. Personnel. ROMOs will command all personnel assigned to their respective regions. ROMOs, together with the senior regional officer of the opposite nationality, will have the power to discipline personnel under their command and will make recommendations for promotions and transfers.

In the case of army officers and some Mi/ORs assigned to regions, the field of activity in which they are to be engaged will be specified. Any assignments of such specialists personnel must be observed except in cases of emergency when they will only be of a temporary nature.

J. Communications. Orders to personnel in the regions, including specific list personnel, will be issued only by the ROMO. Communications on techni-

In the case of many officers and some BN/ORs assigned to regions, the field of activity in which they are to be engaged will be specified. Any assignments of such specialists personnel must be observed except in cases of emergency when they will only be of a temporary nature.

3. Communications. Orders to personnel in the regions, including specialist personnel, will be issued only by the AMG HQ. Communications on technical matters may be sent directly from a Sub-Commission or Division CMD. F. AMG

HQ to the specialist personnel in the regions, provided that in each case a copy of the communication is sent to the RCMO.

Officers from AMG HQ may and will make frequent inspection trips within the regions. On such occasions they will make their presence and the nature of their mission known to the RCMO, or where impracticable, to the nearest SOLO. No orders or directives will be communicated by such officers to the specialists in the field; technical instructions by, however, be so communicated. If such instructions are in written form, copies will be furnished to the RCMO.

4. Procedure. For obvious reasons it will be desirable that procedure adopted by RCMOs, particularly in dealing with the Italian administration, shall be uniform as between the regions. In cases where uniform procedure has been or is hereafter prescribed by AMG HQ, such procedure will be binding uniformly on the staffs in each Region.

5. It is obvious to be impracticable to establish by specific category all of those matters which are within the authority of the RCMO and those which are reserved for AMG HQ. *If* the subject of any proposed action is not specifically dealt with herein or in memoranda supplemental hereto, *it* will be referred to AMG HQ when good judgment would indicate that uniformity of action is required or that a major matter of policy is involved.
