SUBJECT: Present Population of Allied Occupied Italy.

Ref:- ACC-RC &amp; MG Section, File 2153/INFO, 17th March 1944.

1. I forward, in duplicate, copies of a lucid report submitted to me by Lt. Col. Bonham Carter, in reply to the a/m inquiry.
2. I also attach a map of the Province, showing the four Military Divisions into which the Province is divided and, in red patches, the known dispersal areas of troops.
3. I wish to emphasize the following facts:-
  - (a) There are at least 34,500 troops in billets.
  - (b) That 55 communes have suffered anything from 1-20% destruction.
  - (c) That nearly 5,000 persons have been affected by the destruction.
  - (d) That the civilian population has increased by some 30,000.
4. In view of the above and the fact that, in spite of my protests 1,333 refugees have been forced upon this Province, I consider it would be unreasonable and unfair to expect the local authorities to try and cope with any more.
5. Unless proper facilities are made available, and the supply of suitable material for the construction of refugee camps is forthcoming, no further adequate accommodation can be found until after some of the troops have been evacuated from this area.

SUBJECT: Population.

1. Reference the Regional Commissioner's letter of 5 April and the enclosure from the Deputy Executive Commissioner dated 17 March.

2. The attached plan shows the military position as accurately as can be discovered. This is the best reply which can be made directly to paragraph 2(b) of the Deputy Executive Commissioner's letter. The military population is approximately:-

The figure "in billets" is 7.3% of the present civilian population. The total figure is ~~nearly~~ 19% of the present civilian population.

3. In direct answer to paragraph 2(c) it can only be said that no communes have suffered destruction beyond 20%.

The percentage of destruction in Ariano is 5% which is 1218 persons. 14 other communes have figures representing over 100 persons each.

4. (a) It is suggested that the following figures must be considered in order to get a true picture.

(b) It must be assumed that normal capacity of the Province is 445.643. This has been reduced by destruction by 4.188 and now is 441.455.

The Ration Card population is, therefore, 10.7% over present capacity. No adjustment has been made for other causes of civilian displacement, e.g., some 800 evacuees from S. Angelo dei Lombardi, Rocca S. Felice, and Guardia Lombardi where a range has had to be cleared, nor the considerable numbers affected as a result of the billeting referred to in paragraph 2. above.

5. In conclusion, I would bring the following points to your notice.

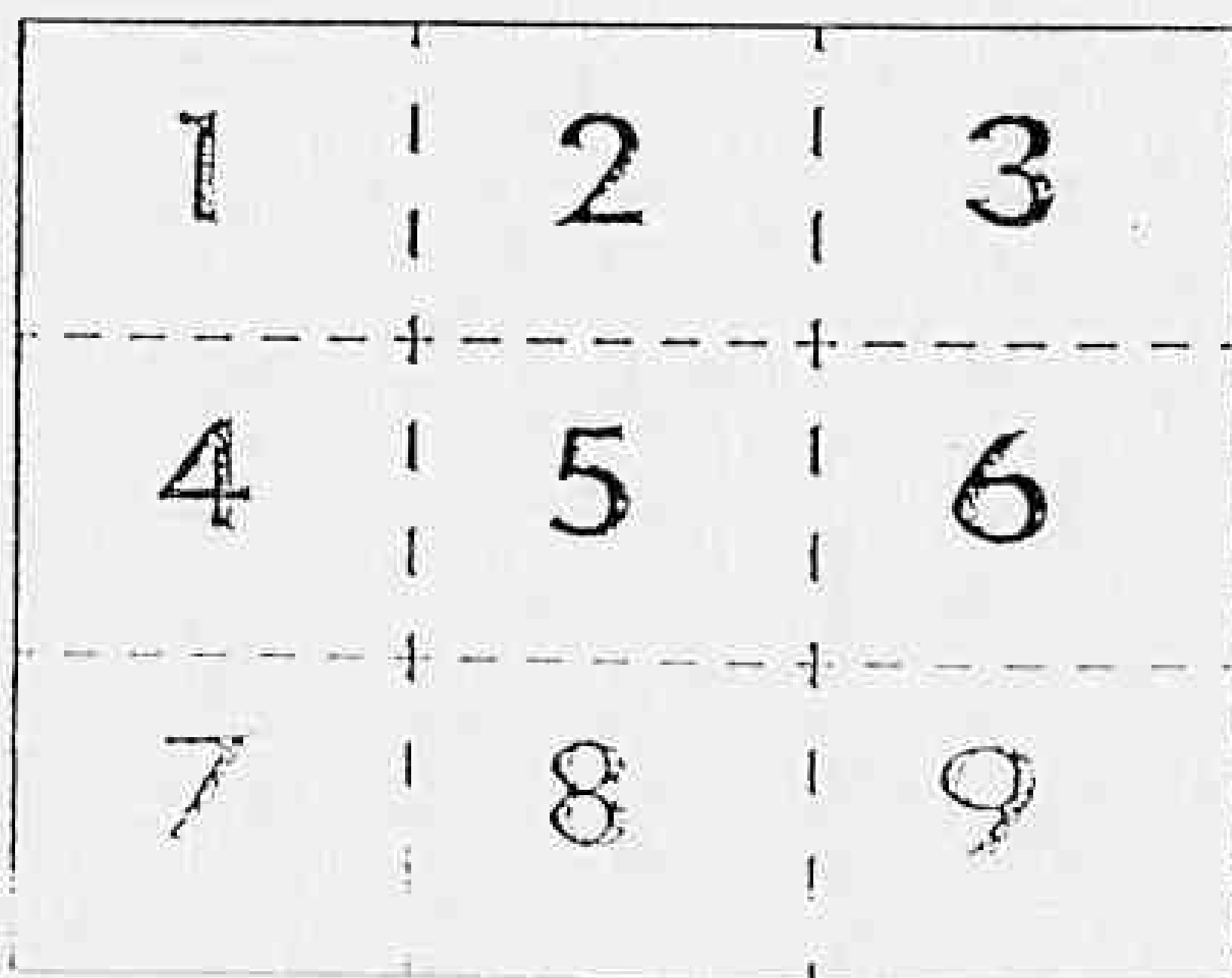
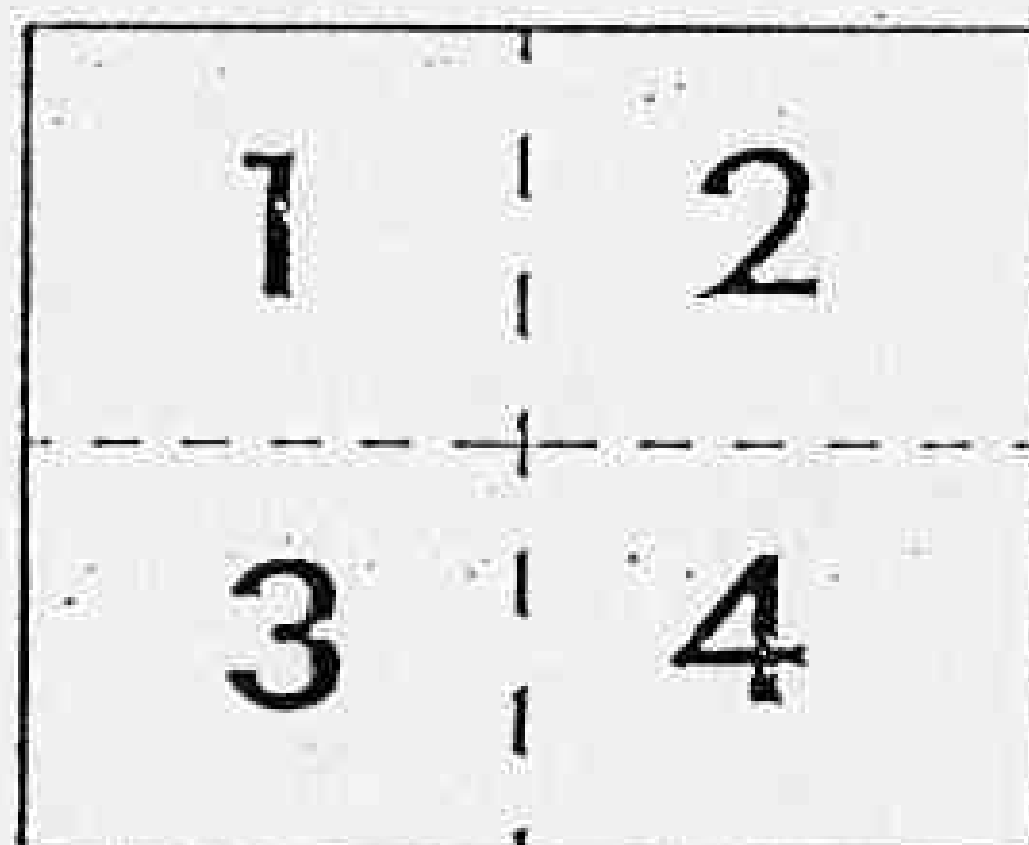

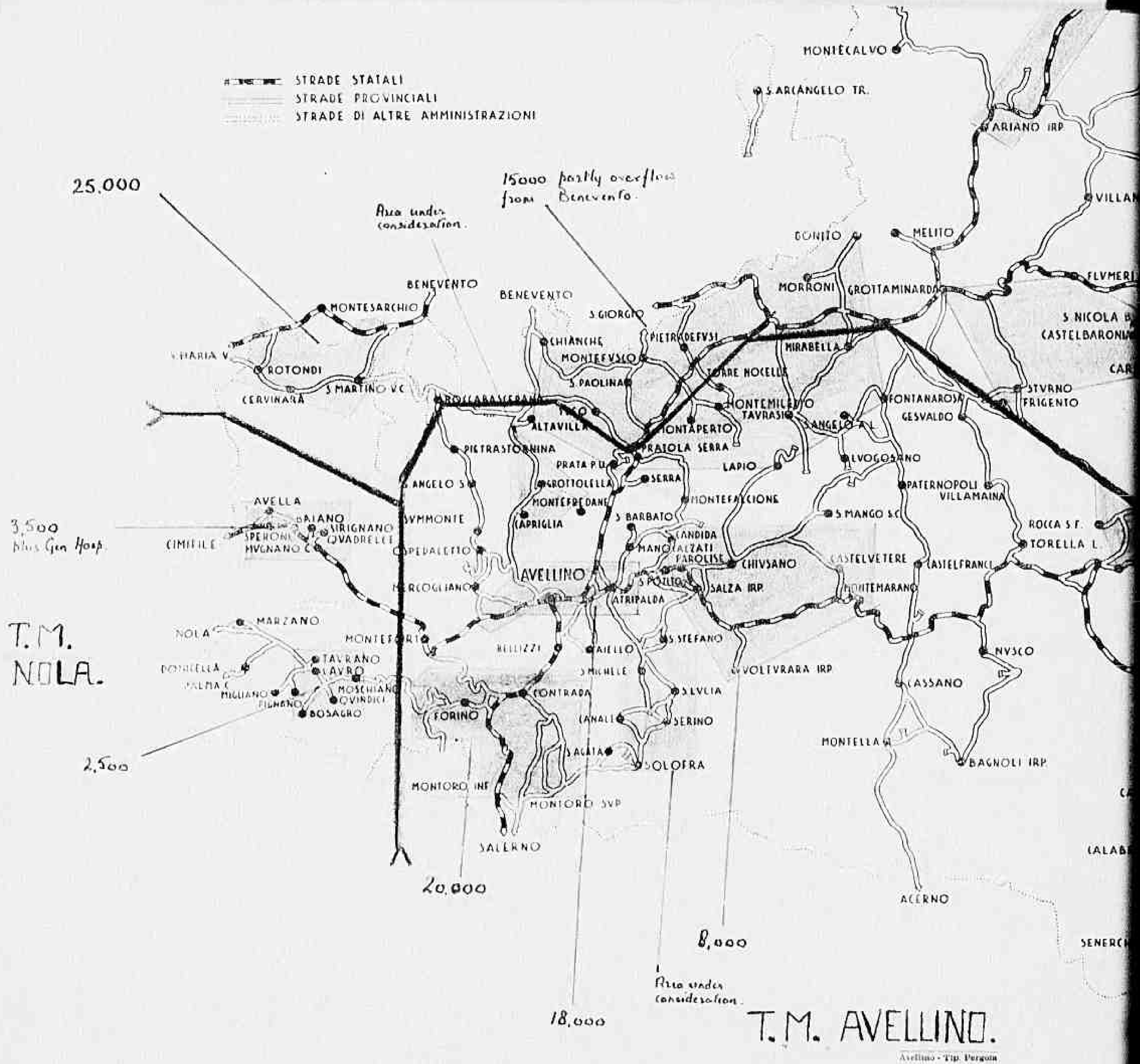

(b) I have to refer you to my letter No AMG/S/18 dated 6th April 1944. I also refer you to the attached copy of another letter received from 94 Sub-Area ref. 282/Q dated 13th April 1944.

The Communes north of the line as indicated in the attached Sub-Area letter are as per list A attached.

The Communes south of the line are as per list B attached.

It should be noted that the population of the Communes into which Refugees are permitted, is only 172,492 as compared to 600,376 being the population of the Communes reserved for Allied Troops.

(c) There are very few Communes which have suffered as much as 50% destruction as this is an extremely high percentage. The only ones which can be considered under this category are Eboli and Battipaglia. There are however many Communes with a 10% to 20% destruction which, of course, generally means the equivalent displacement of population. With the exception of Sapri however, all damaged Communes are in the area reserved for the Allied Troops.

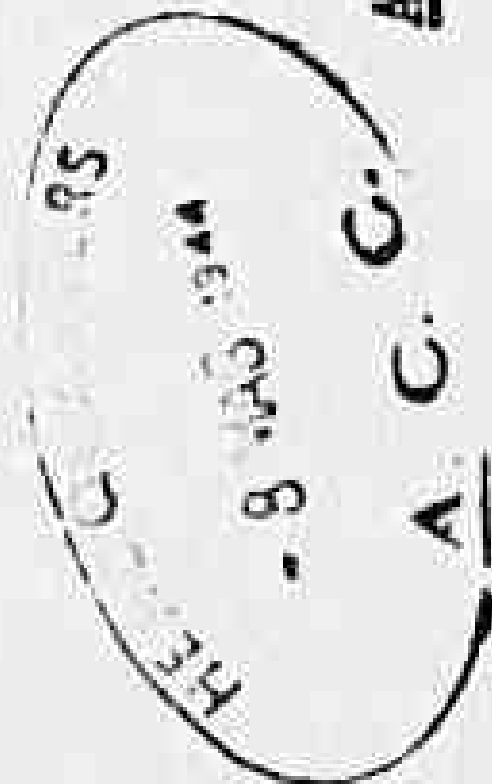

Subject: Population - Naples Province.

To: Adjutant,  
Region 3, ACC.

With further reference to letter from Colonel Fiske, Deputy Executive Commissioner, ACC, under date of 17 March 1944, I communicated with our Principal Provincial Officers, Majors Simson and Cantor. They advised that practically every Comune in Naples Province at the present has many troops and from day to day the number is increasing. Most Communes have the approximate population as shown on the Prefect's list of 21 April 1936, except the Communes of San Sebastiano, Massa and to some degree a few other towns in the Vesuvius area, but even these towns have troops in or about to come in. I am unable to furnish any more detailed information.

I feel that the Communes in this province are just about of the saturation point.

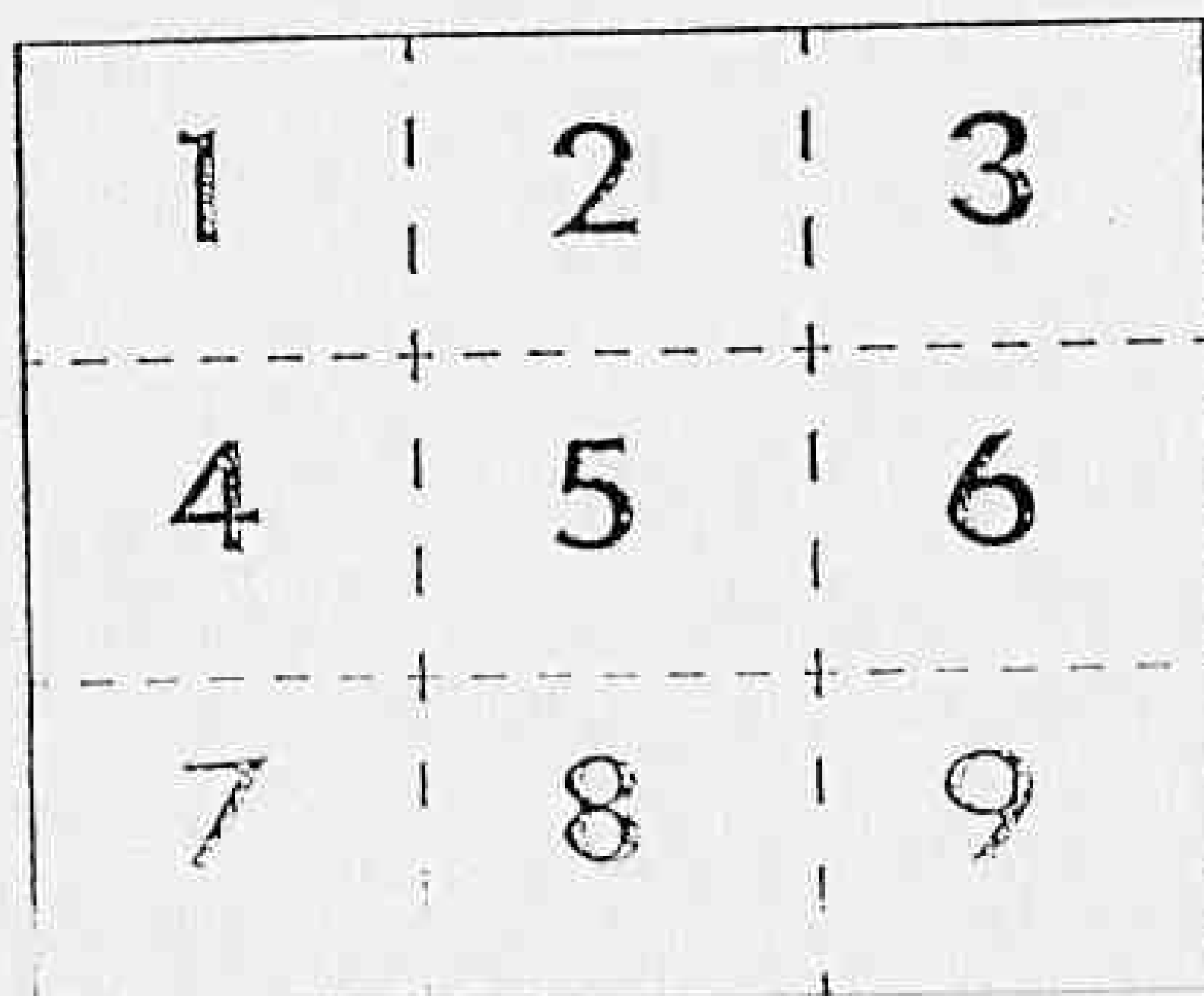
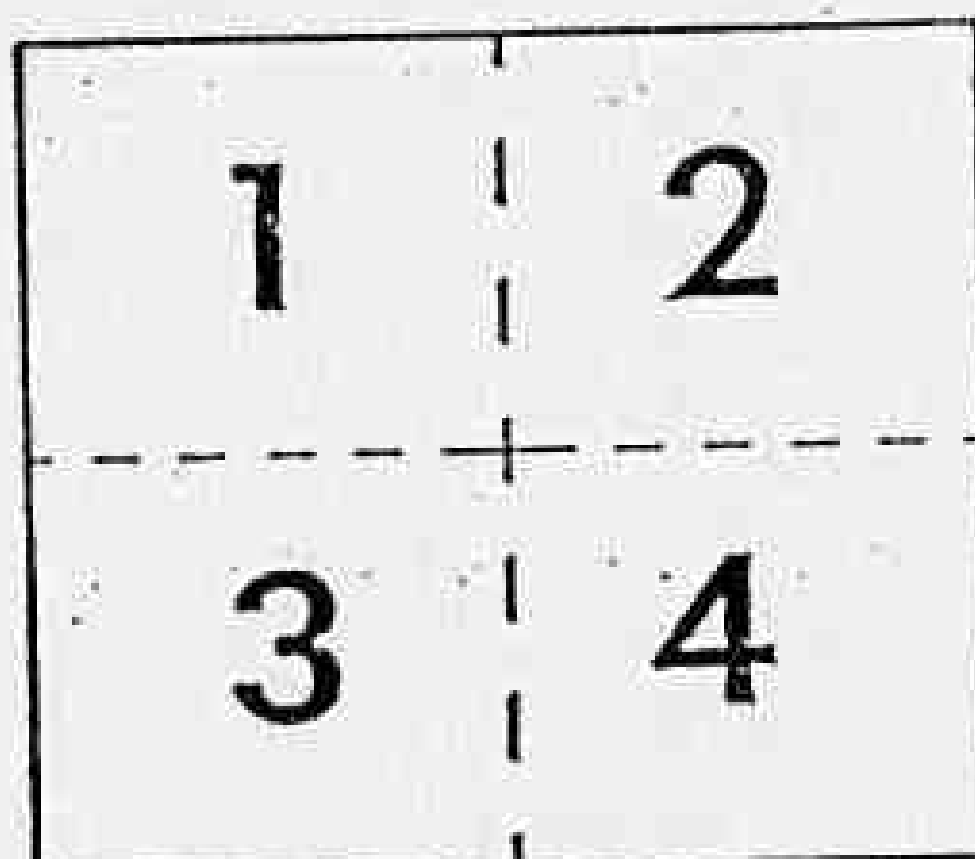
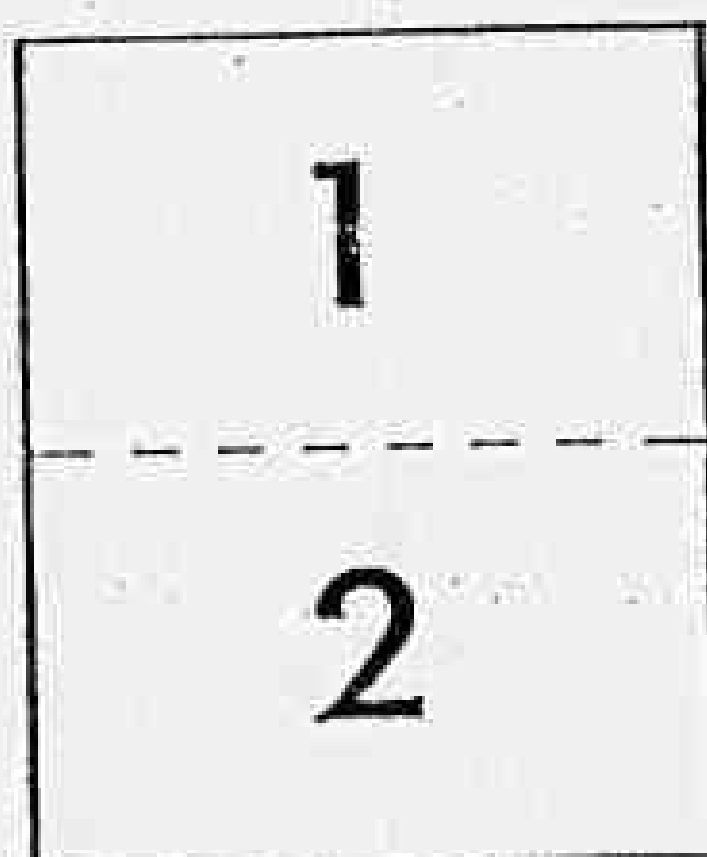

1. In response to your memo of 24 April asking that your Hq. be placed on distribution for three intelligence reports, our enquiry has disclosed the following information:

a. War Office Intelligence Summary: The British organization charged with automatic distribution of periodic reports is at present en route to Naples. It is suggested that you contact them there, address Number 9 Publications Depot CMP.

b. Chief of Staff's Intelligence Report: G-2 Secretariat here has no knowledge of a report so entitled. The only report approximating this is a weekly one with a very limited distribution entitled Commander's Bulletins. Arrangements have been made with the AC of S, G-2 here to forward this report to the CG ACC personally.

c. Foreign Office Political Intelligence Report: We have contacted the Office of the British Resident Minister concerning this report and they state that it would be necessary to submit a formal request to the Foreign Office, London, giving a more detailed description of the report in question. However, they have suggested that Sir Noel Charles, British High Commissioner to the Advisory Council for Italy probably receives these reports and that in all likelihood he would be glad to arrange for you to see them.

Troops of the 7th Indian Division almost captured the town last month, but were halted by a Jap attack through the mountains which cut their supply lines. After defeating this Jap attempt, the Indian forces regrouped and are once again on the offensive.

## JAP SUPPLY LINES

The seizure of Buthidaung is vital to Jap advance along the coastal plain toward Akyab, for it was from this base that the Japs had supplied their forces in the Mayu mountains to the west. Other units of the 14th Army have captured an enemy position on this flank in the Mayu foothills about five miles east of Maungdaw. Further to the east, 40 miles from Maungdaw, West African troops captured another enemy strong point in the Kaladan River valley.

of the necessity of bringing back Italo-Russian relations to that basis of constructive and friendly cooperation which was temporarily and tragically abandoned by the regime which we are today fighting together."

An official government spokesman noted that Soviet Russia has resumed relations "notwithstanding the mistakes committed by the Fascist regime." The Italian people, he said, "will not easily forget this gesture taking place in one of the most tragic moments of their history."

Russian resentment advanced to another stage the relationship between Italy and the Allies. Contact was established first through General Dwight D. Eisenhower when he was supreme commander of this theater, and then carried on through the Allied Control Commission.

The situation is complicated by the fact that the Allies have recognized Italy only as a co-belligerent, and the question of restoring diplomatic relations with Italy does not formally arise until the armistice has been replaced by a peace settlement.

The present chapter in the relations between Russia and Italy opened four months ago with the appointment of Andre Viskinsky as Soviet representative on the Allied Advisory Council for Italy, charged with carrying out policies laid down at the Moscow conference. Between November and January, Viskinsky spent some time touring various parts of liberated Italy and hearing the viewpoints of leading opponents of the present government.

It is believed that Viskinsky completely dissociated himself from any contact with the left parties in this country, and proceeded only on the basis of how to increase Italy's contribution to the Allied war effort.

## German Prisoners Hang Fellow Soldier

PHOENIX, Arizona, March 14

A German prisoner was hanged Sunday by inmates of a Nazi prisoner of war camp near here, the camp commandant, Col. A. H. Means, disclosed today. He said that a board of inquiry has been appointed to investigate the matter.

Although no details were released with the news, it is known that in some camps the ardent Nazis have severely beaten anti-Nazi Germans with whom they are imprisoned.

## Old Political Rule Revived

NAPLES, March 14—Initial steps

to re-establish liberal and democratic forms of local government in the Naples area were taken today by the Allied Control Commission which ordered abolition of the Fascist provincial political system.

The ACC mandates, similar to one introduced in Sicily some months ago, abolishes the local government decrees of 1934 and restores, with certain temporary restriction, the legality of laws of 1915 when Italy was still under a liberal democratic constitution.

The pre-Fascist system provided for elected municipal and provincial governments similar to those found in the United States and Britain. In accordance, however, with Allied policy for Italy, popular elections will not be held until the political and military situation here is clarified.

Until elections can be held, prefects of the provinces will fill vacancies in the local administrations by appointment but they have been advised by the ACC order to "bear in mind the various political tendencies of the community. Also, labor and agriculture as well as industry and the professions are barred from posts in the new local governments."

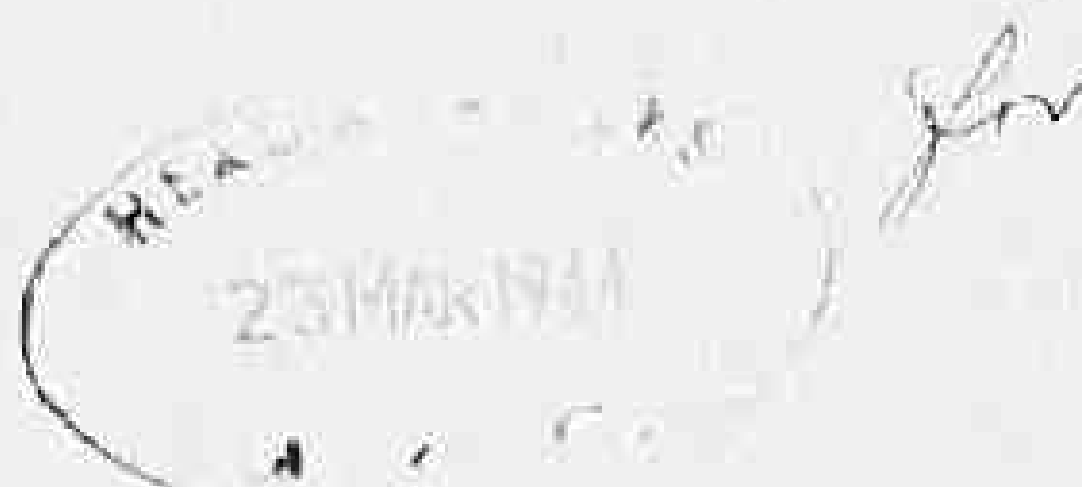

Reported to have Lt Roberts on the morning of the 27 Jan at 1930: Found Lt to be very interested and very willing to help: Sent the morning before looking at the library with a particular interest of finding books which I thought would be of value to this cause; while looking for books had a long discussion with Lt Roberts as to whom to approach and the method of approach in order to better accomplish the mission: He was very helpful in giving me not only books which we considered helpful and which were later registered by Sgt Aquila; but also gave me addresses of various institutions from where I would most likely be able to get the books.

I resumed the person that same afternoon at about 1300, and having accepted seriously Lt Roberts advice of going first to see Professor Scotti, director of the Camera di Commercio Library at Piazza della Borsa; I made it my first stop. Unfortunately, both the director and vice director had gone to see Region III officials at the Municipio building. Therefore I made an appointment to see either one of them the following morning at 0900.

From this building I went directly to the office of Genio Civile at the Musei Nazionali to see the director; Professor Pugliese: Even here the director was absent due to the fact that he had been called to a teacher's conference at the University. Although I spoke to the librarian who assured me that they had none of those books since theirs is an archaeological library. Nevertheless, I insisted on seeing the index of books on hand: and to my surprise I wasn't able to find any having a title related to the ones I was looking for. (I did this because Lt Roberts told me that I would be able to find some of the books in this library.) Even the librarian here suggested the University library as being the likely spot where I could find what I was looking for, and Prof. Scotti as being the logical man to approach; as a second best place she suggested 'la Biblioteca Reale' (Royal Library) at the Royal Palace. Thus was spent the first day:

At nine o'clock the next morning I found myself in Prof. Scotti's office. The professor had gone to Region III Hq, but the vice director Dottor Fiore, was there waiting for me. I asked him if he was in possession of a few books, mentioning a couple of the titles. He seemed interested and very willing to help. Though he said, after I showed him the list of books, almost one week they had all of them, but that during the period of the last three months most of their books were requisitioned by Allied officers and a lot of them flew from Algiers to get those books.

After going over the list with him, and after explaining him our office position in the Allied Headquarters; he said certain that he had some of the books and that he could tell us the location of the rest of the books if I could procure him a list of the titles. Promission to bring the list as soon as I could I left the building.

I typed more copies of the said list and on my way to the Camera di Commercio Library I stopped at the Tribunale Legale Library where I found the following: *Franchese--Le Leggi Usuali del Regno d'Italia* and *Lex--1935, 1940, 1941, 1943*. I found the other two law books: *I Cinque Codici* and *Legislazione Vigente* at the Etat Library; Via Roma. I told the two stores to hold copies until I call for them. I finally got to Dr. Fiore's office, and this time both Prof. Scotti and Dr. Fiore promised me to give me by Tuesday morning the books which they'll be able to find in the library and a list of the whereabouts of the remaining books.

On the afternoon I took a walk to the Royal Library, but unfortunately the custodian was to be found nowhere. I left work that I'd be there in the morning.

My intentions are to get all the books available at the Royal Library and have them have a similar list as the Camera di Commercio Library for the sake of comparison. Meanwhile took into lesser important libraries to see the extent of the availability of those books. It is believed that they'll most likely be not found in small libraries on account of their technicality.

## ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION (SIR RICHARD PHILLIPSON)

Mr. Ivor Thomas asked the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs whether he will ask for the removal of Sir Richard Phillipson from any position of influence in or over the Italian Government at Bari, in view of his anti-British attitude and his introduction of Filippo Baldi into the Press Bureau.

Mr. Eden: Inquiries are being made about Sir Richard Phillipson, and until they are completed I have no statement to make about him.

Mr. de Botschuld: Is the right hon. Gentleman aware that from the beginning of the Mussolini era, Sir Richard Phillipson was a strong opponent of Fascism and that he spent many years in prison?

Mr. Eden: Yes, Sir, I have had some information to that effect, but I thought I ought to check up on all the information.

Mr. Ivor Thomas: Is the right hon. Gentleman aware that Sir Richard Phillipson took part in the March on Rome, and that he has been a most frivolous character ever since, changing his opinion according to the circumstances?

Mr. Eden: There seems to be a clash of opinions on this matter. What I heard was that he was at one time a Liberal member of Parliament, which is, in all respects a most respectable occupation.
