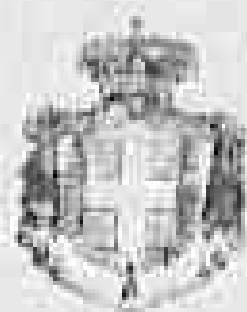

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

SUBJECT: Journalist Lino MASALA; Authoriza-

1. Prof. Lino MASALA, has applied to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in order to ask for an authorization to enter German territory.
2. He is a journalist who should proceed to Germany where he has been appointed, as correspondent, by the newspaper "Il Secolo" of Milan.
3. The a/n has pointed out that he has already obtained from the competent authorities a passport valid for Germany. He has made known, moreover, that the Allied Authorities seem to have made no objections for the granting of the same permit to other Italian journalists.
4. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be grateful to the Allied Commission if they kindly could grant the requested authorization on behalf of the aforesaid journalist.

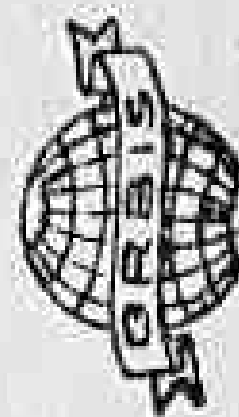

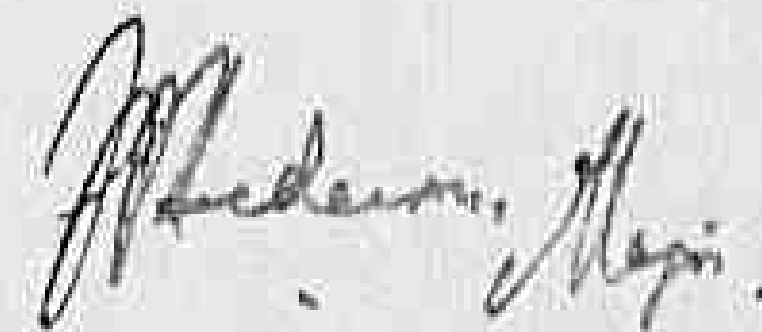

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

I am pleased to communicate to you the reply of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of Allied Military Government in Venezia Giulia in regard to the request you made on behalf of "La Voce Libera" of Trieste for an increase in the selling price of its newspaper.

The increase in the selling price, we are informed, was not deemed justified in the opinion of the Allied Information Service or of the Allied policy board controlling such matters. Since the request was made to you, the Senior Civil Affairs Officer reports that "La Voce Libera" has recently informed the Allied Information Service that it will not press its demand for an increase in its selling price as long as the cost of newsprint remains at the present level.

The matter, I trust, can be thus considered settled for the moment. However, for your information, the situation in Venezia Giulia as regards the selling price of newspapers does differ from that in the rest of Italy. For example, newsprint costs only 40 lire a kilo in Venezia Giulia and approximately 90 lire a kilo here. Venezia Giulia newspapers also receive free news services, whereas newspapers in all other sections of Italy have to pay for such services.

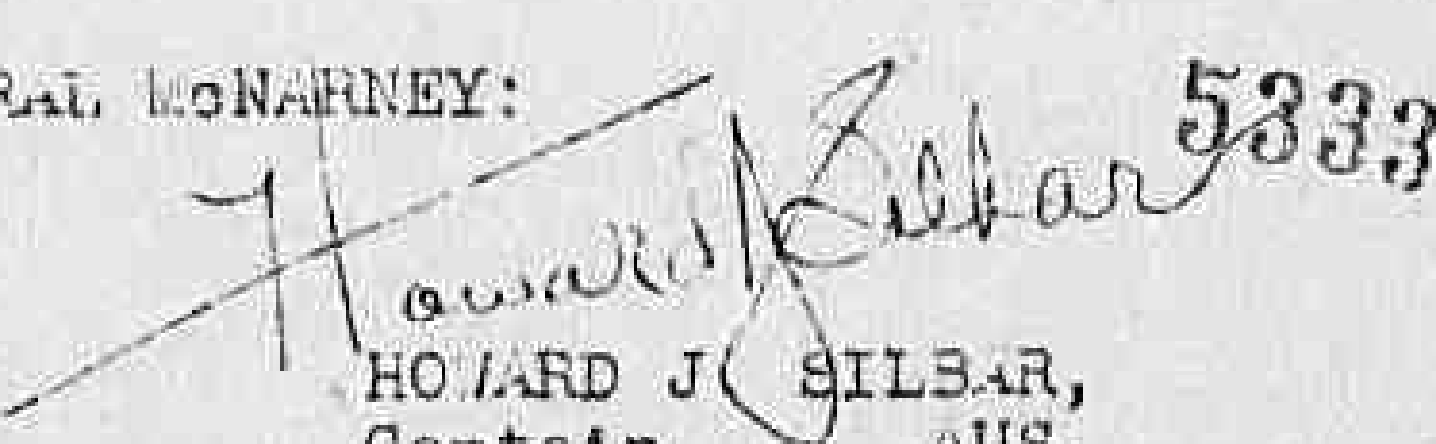

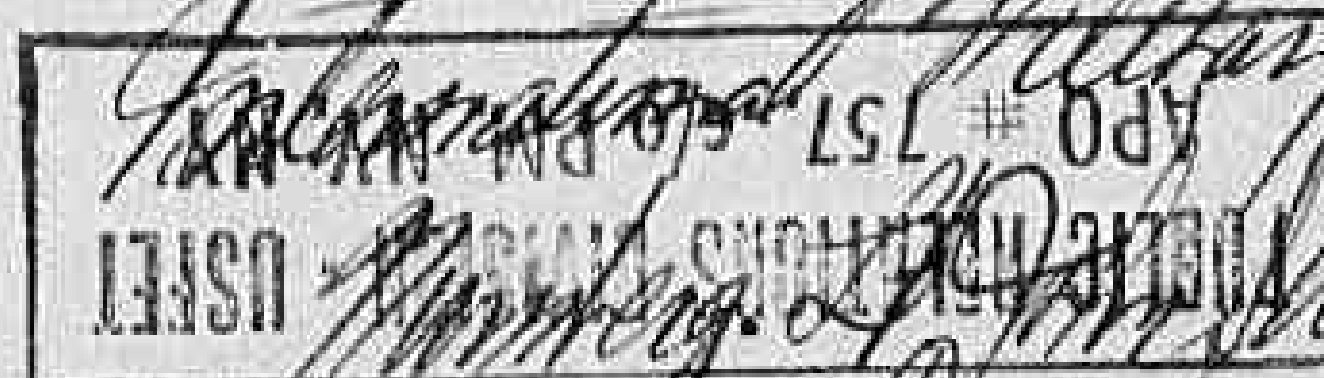

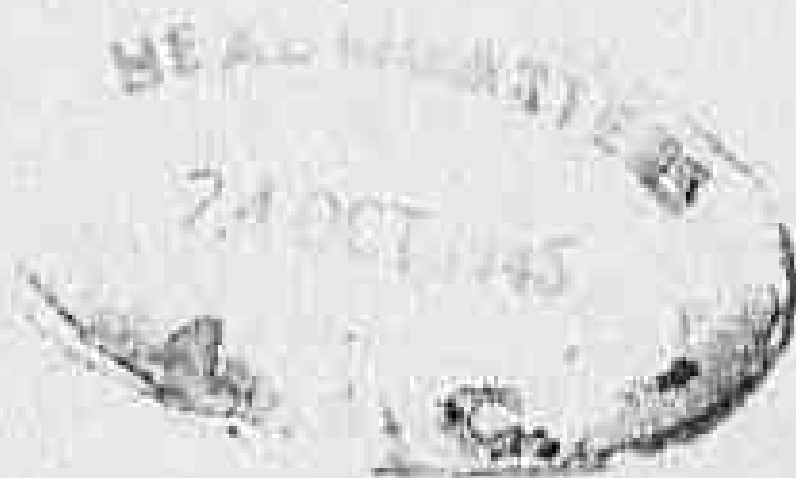

SUBJECT: Visit of Italian journalists to Germany

TO : G-5 AFHQ

1. The Public Relations Branch of the Allied Commission has received a request from an Italian journalist for permission to go to Nuremberg, Germany, to cover the war guilt trials. It is probable that we shall have similar requests from other journalists.

2. It is the general opinion of this Headquarters that such requests are legitimate and should be granted. The Chief Commissioner approves and indeed encourages favorable action, pointing out that according such a privilege would be in keeping with the spirit of Pan 487.
