Dear *Stewart Brown*.

I was perhaps precipitate when I rang you this morning as I had not then obtained the comments of Eighth Army on the free movement of correspondents in Italy. Fifth Army have already agreed to there being no restrictions in North and North-Western Italy but the problem of VENEZIA GIUGIA remains.

I have today signalled my DDEPR Eighth Army requesting him to contact Thirteen Corps so that they may be able to express their views. In this signal I mentioned that Tanjug has set up a news service in Trieste, the implication being that if this is the case, Italians should be allowed similar facilities. 674

In my own opinion, all Allied correspondents should now be permitted entry into this province but that Italians, if Thirteen Corps agree, should be limited to representatives of their three Agencies. This, I understand, is borne out by you in a conversation which you had with Major Nicholls this afternoon.

So soon as I hear from Eighth Army in reply to my signal, I will draft a signal to all concerned which I will submit for your approval before sending. *W.*

1. Your letter of April 3d has come to us through channels.
2. In order to be properly authorized it would be advisable to ask your Agency in London to contact the Foreign Office and have them inform AFHQ of your status.
3. In the meanwhile we are prepared to issue an AC correspondent's card. However before doing that it is necessary to know something about your identity. It is not clear from your letter what your nationality is. If Italian we must ask you to submit biographical data, two photographs and a completed bohedra personale which we enclose. If you are British or American only the photo-871graphs are necessary.

I enclose a letter from the Civil Censorship Group of your Commission with a request that:-

- (1) Mr. FRANCIS C. FURST should have facilities to function as a photographic agent for The Black Star Publishing Coy, Inc. of New York and London and Paul Guillumette, Inc. of New York.
- (2) You will notice that there is no indication as to how it is proposed the pictures should be transmitted to London and New York. Until radio picture transmission becomes commercially available to the Italians, the only method of transmission would presumably be by ordinary post.
- (3) The matter of course comes within your province and not that of PRO, AFHQ as stated by Censorship Group, A.C.

ETA

I presume that in a case like this you would approach both London and Washington. If my memory is correct, the Black Star Publishing Coy, LONDON, was on the War Office and M of I "black list" when I left England last July.

I am sending a copy of this letter to our officer, Major H.J. French, who is with General McChrystal at Caserta, so that if the matter eventually reaches AFHQ, he knows what it is all about.

Dear Mr. Fuerst:

We are very glad to get your card of December 20 and to hear from you. We are pleased to learn that you are well and that you expect to take up your professional work as soon as possible.

We would very much like to get pictures from Italy as soon as these can be sent. Hardly any pictures of the non-combat zone of Italy have come through to the United States, and as you probably know, the chances to get pictures of that kind published here are enormous since every magazine in this country would like to get some material.

We are sending you the enclosed letter addressed to the Allied Military Government in Florence, which you may submit and which may be of help. We have no idea if and under what conditions they would give permission to take pictures. No doubt you have to submit them to the Allied Censorship and there may be other restrictions which you will have to comply with.

I hardly think that we have to tell you what the American reader is interested in the way of pictures from Italy. Everything that deals with the present and difficult economic and political situation in that country is salable. We would like to get pictures of leading personalities in the democratic government; we would like to see how people in Florence build up their new democratic life; even pictures showing Florence now; pictures of reconstruction; of works of art and architecture; others showing the life and activities of American soldiers in Florence on a furlough or for

rest periods, etc. Of course, we know that all of these could only be photographed with the permission and under certain restrictions if the Allied Military Government, and we hope this can be secured.

Since you do not mention it, we presume that you have filmmaterial and also facilities to develop and print your pictures.

1. The subject matter of your memorandum of 19 October has been communicated to Mr. Matthews of the "New York Times".

Mr. Matthews strongly denied that he had in any way misrepresented the situation in the article referred to and had the following observations to make.

- (i) Your memo was written on the day that 19 Italians were killed and 104 wounded in Palermo. Also, that the "Unita" called attention to the killed and wounded peasants near Avemano and, incidentally, along with the "Avanti", referred to previous incidents such as Licata, Grosseto, and others and another which Mr. Matthews was unable to recall.
- (ii) In his article, in which he described the alleged incident of brigandage, when the driver of the automobile was killed, he introduced the words "was told me this morning" and the fact that the whole story of general arrest was based upon this incident is denied by him in view of the incidents quoted in para (i).
- (iii) Mr. Matthews maintains that anybody has only to go through the newspapers in recent months to find dozens of incidents of arrest and violence.

2. You will appreciate that I am only passing on Mr. Matthews' comments, with which I do not associate myself. Not being acquainted with the political side of recent events in Italy, it is hard for me to argue with, or refute, statements made by him. I cannot help feeling that the wisest course would be for you to see him personally in order to correct with him the reportage in general of the troubles he claims are taking place.

1. On September 23 authors of the New York Times filed a lengthy despatch about what he called "the first open public demand that ACC should leave Italy." Authors note that "the New York Times was in a position to say that the Jewish resistance were not alone in their criticisms of A.S.S. Italy, without exaggeration, was in an alarming state of misery and powder shortage, with a consequent degree of lawlessness that could only be underlined by the piling on top of each other of incidents and events of known instances throughout the whole liberated zone. We then went on to quote a case of brigandage on a regular Sunday from a provincial town in Italy one night about a week ago. The passengers were robbed and then leaving one of the brigands told them "I forgot to tell you, but you will find the chauffeur's body under the front wheel."
2. It appeared that authors' "very violent imitations" - e.g. "lorens and dozens of instances" - were based on one example. We have, since September 23, made very careful enquiries in Southern Region to find out whether in fact such an incident ever did occur, or whether even there was any incident remotely similar which might have led to an exaggerated story. After an exhaustive enquiry throughout the province, it is absolutely clear that no such incident - and no case of "autobus brigandage" - ever occurred.
3. You will appreciate, I am sure, that some action is called for when the responsible correspondent of an influential paper bases such a violent attack on one of our men which turns out to be purely imaginary.

Dear Mr. Fano:

I understand from a mutual friend that you might be willing to serve as an Allied Labor News correspondent in Italy. I would be delighted if you would do this, as events in Italy are not only of profound importance but also of growing interest to our readers. To fill in a few details about A.L.N. which you may not have: it is an international news service, gathering news by cable and wireless from its correspondents in 22 countries. In the United States, this news is released to by newspapers subscribing to ALN - most of them AFL, CIO and independent labor papers. We also service a few commercial papers, such as the Christian Science Monitor and NY. Four U.S. Government agencies subscribe: OWI, OSS, OW and the Latin American Affairs Committee. The service is sent overseas - mostly by airmail but also in a few cases by cable and radio - to 22 countries. I understand from a mutual friend that you might be willing to serve as an Allied Labor News correspondent in Italy. I would be delighted if you would do this, as events in Italy are not only of profound importance but also of exciting interest to our readers. To fill in a few details about A.L.N. which you may not have: it is an international news service, gathering news by cable and wireless from the correspondents in 22 countries. In the United States, this news is released to 65 newspapers subscribing to ALN - most of them AFL, CIO and independent labor papers. We also service a few commercial papers, such as the Christian Science Monitor and PM. Four U.S. government agencies subscribe: CWI, OSS, OSW and the Latin American Affairs Committee. The service is sent overseas - mostly by airmail but also in a few cases by cable and radio - to 22 countries. It is very widely published throughout Latin America, also in Canada, Australia, Britain, S. Africa, India, China and other countries.

Dear Mr. Pano,

By this time I'm wondering whether you are back in Italy. I very much hope so as we are badly in need of an Italian correspondent. I was delighted to get your V-mail of May 21, saying that you would be willing to write for us. If it is convenient, therefore, please accept this letter as formal notice that you have been accredited as Allied Labor News correspondent in Italy authorized to send cable and radio messages marked PRESS COLLECT to the above address. If any further accreditation is necessary, I would be glad to send it. In the meantime I have instructed both RCA and Mackay, which have offices now in Italy, to accept Press Collect messages from you. As I pointed out to you in my letter of April 29, we need an average of about 500 words per week, depending of course of the nature of the news breaking. We are now publishing the service twice weekly - on Tuesdays and Fridays - so that it would be preferable to file two stories a week - totalling about 500 words together - to meet our deadlines at 10 a.m. (New York time) on Tuesdays and Fridays. However, when possible, it would be better to file on Mondays and Thursdays. You can use our cable address ALNA NEWYORK. There is a tremendous amount of important news breaking in Italy which we ought to cover. For instance the New-York Times carried a half-inch story this morning - based on a Bari Radio report - stating that a united labor conference would be held in Naples July 29-30. It is extremely important that we have full coverage of this conference. Similarly there was an OWI report here three weeks ago that the three main branches of the trade-unions movement had united, at a conference in Rome to form a new Labor Confederation. We should have a full report on this together with all subsequent developments.

As I stated in my earlier letter, however we not only need news which is directly about the trade-unions, but also news which is of general but decisive importance to labor, such as partisan developments in the North economic and social rehabilitation in the liberated areas, political changes taking place in the country as a whole, and trends within the new government. In this latter connection, interviews with cabinet members would be of great interest and importance. You must remember in this connection that authoritative news about Italy is still quite scarce, despite good reporting by such correspondents as Herbert Matthews, Alexander Uhl and Homer Bipart. These men mostly, however, are writing for the particular whims of their papers. Down to earth reporting, reflecting real mood of the Italian people is still needed, and this gap your ALN reports can fill. Please wire me as soon as you get this, giving me an address where I can reach you by cable. We need your reports going right away.

I have nothing against Orlando: the trouble is that with this pass he gets past all our security posts and goes anywhere and the result is that he gets facilities denied to other journalists. Yesterday, for instance, he crept into a conference to which no journalists were admitted and I had to turn him out. If this giving of passes to journalists continues it will be embarrassing and I should like to know why the pass was issued.

As you probably know, the Grand Hotel was originally taken over by the ACC for senior officers. There is a serious lack of accommodation in Rome and at one time it was thought that correspondents could not be allowed to remain in the hotel owing to the demands made on the ACC by visiting personalities. Captain Stone however decided that correspondents already in the Grand Hotel should not be asked to leave.

Difficulties of accommodation have lately grown so much that the ACC is compelled to see that all available space is occupied and that visitors of senior rank are not required to share rooms, or, as has sometimes occurred, find no accommodation available. It seems only fair to point out that your retention of more than one room is unfair to others, and I hope you will agree to move to a single room. I have deferred making this request for a considerable time, but I am now asked to make it at once in view of immediate requirements, and I am assured by the ACC Billeting Officer that you will be given all possible facilities consistent with the demands made upon us for accommodation.

May I ask a favour? In the course of our work here we have to entertain correspondents to some extent. They come constantly to us with letters of introduction from England, U.S., Algiers and other parts of Italy. They want to talk things over at some length and the constant succession of visitors makes that impossible in office hours. The Flora, which is the only place we can go to now (since we are not Colonels!) is so crowded that one is sometimes lucky to get a seat at all and invariably one has to sit with a lot of others: any serious talk is impossible. The present rule is that 4 officers may have rations. I would ask if rations might, as an exception, be allowed to three of us, viz. Major Bergin, Major Leacacos and myself. If this exception could be made in our favour it would help. At present I find myself having to take correspondents to the Grand Hotel at 400 lire a head and even for a millionaire like me it mounts up. Will you be kind?

Lumby is now well on the way to creating a Press "incident", and I don't wonder!

Subject: Correspondents in Grand Hotel.

To: Acting Chief Commissioner.

I have been asked on various occasions by Colonel Monfort and lately by Colonel Clough to turn out from the Grand Hotel the nine war correspondents who are living there.

The matter is one which arouses violent feeling not only among the journalists directly concerned but also among journalists generally. It is felt that if ACC allow civilians to remain at the Grand Hotel there is no reason why they should turn journalists out. Moreover accommodation in Rome is difficult; and I cannot persuade ACC to do anything to help find other accommodation for these people.

Both Colonel Astley, DDBR, AFHQ, and Colonel Poletti feel that such action would be the greatest blunder and would earn for ACC the enmity of these influential correspondents. I certainly feel that it is extremely unwise to give them notice to quit unless we find other - and similar - accommodation. Admittedly, if it was the intention of ACC to clear the hotel these people should never have been allowed in; but now that they are there I think that the ACC would be wise to see that they don't have a legitimate grievance.

I should appreciate direct orders from you on the point.

REGULATIONS FOR WAR CORRESPONDENTS

Section II, AFHQ Circular Number 52, 1943 series, and Section I, AFHQ Circular Number 2, 1944 series, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. General. These regulations are published under the authority granted the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, and apply only to accredited and recognized correspondents attached to AFHQ or units under its control. The regulations complement those published by the various Allied nations and in no way should be construed as superseding said regulations.

2. Policy of Control and Administration. As a matter of policy, representatives of all information media accredited to AFHQ will be shown every courtesy and given the fullest cooperation. Within the limits of security, and military necessity, no arbitrary restrictions shall be placed on the movements of any accredited or recognized war correspondents attached to AFHQ. The activities of correspondents will be controlled by the military commanders of the areas in which the correspondents operate. The Public Relations Officer is available to assist military commanders in control of correspondents. Correspondents will be subject to the normal regulations and discipline of the forces to which they are attached. They will wear the uniform and insignia prescribed by their respective governments. They will at all times maintain the same high standards of cleanliness and neatness of appearance required for officers and will comply with the uniform regulations of the area where they operate. When there is any doubt about a correspondent's physical condition he will be given a thorough physical examination before being permitted to visit advanced areas.

3. Acceptance by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater. War correspondents will continue to receive basic accreditation from the appropriate authorities of their own governments. However, no correspondent will be accepted at AFHQ or subordinate units without the specific authority of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, who reserves the right to reject an applicant without explanation. Correspondents who arrive at AFHQ or any of its subordinate units without prior acceptance by the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater will not be permitted to remain in this theater of operations. Accepted correspondents will be accredited to AFHQ. Under special circumstances, individual correspondents accredited to other theaters of operations may be allowed to visit areas controlled by AFHQ. Their status will be similar to that of recognized correspondents, as described in Paragraph 1b, FM 30-26, W.D. "Regulations for Correspondents Accompanying United States Army Forces in the Field", and in Paragraph 7,

War Office "Regulations for Press Representatives Accompanying a Force in the Field". Employees of government agencies who have been given correspondents' cards for purposes of identification are not entitled to the facilities supplied press and radio correspondents.

4. Message Priority. Because operational messages have priority over press copy, it will be necessary to restrict the number of words transmitted by government radio or wire in areas of limited communications facilities. Because of the communications problem, it is also necessary to limit the number of correspondents accredited to AFHQ.

5. Censorship. From time to time Censorship Branch will issue specific regulations on copy. Correspondents will keep themselves aware of these regulations and changes. Correspondents will refrain at all times from disclosing information which, though true, might be damaging to the interests of the Allies, might embarrass the Allies or neutral nations, or prove detrimental to the war effort.

6. Pooling. When AFHQ finds it necessary to prescribe that stories or pictures be pooled, correspondents will carry out pool agreements and process copy as indicated by the Public Relations Officer.


7. Transportation, Accommodations and Equipment. Under normal circumstances, when military operations permit, air, rail, motor, and water transportation will be made available to U.S. correspondents without charge. They will apply to the Public Relations Officer for travel orders. For British correspondents, unless otherwise stipulated, the ordinary fares will be payable for accommodations in transports, aircraft, and troop trains. Billets will be furnished without charge when such billets are available without extra cost to the government concerned or when emergency conditions make collection impracticable. Under other conditions, the cost of the billets will be paid to the billeting officer. The regularly indicated tariffs for messes will be paid in all cases. They are accountable for all military equipment of any character issued to them and they will be required to return this equipment to the proper authorities before leaving this theater of operations. Private transportation will not be used in the forward areas.

8. Women Correspondents. The presence of women correspondents in combat zones beyond forward limits in which women personnel are on duty will be subject to specific approval of the command concerned. (AG 100.74-1 A-0)

I could likely do stuff for The Maple Leaf and DPR too if I were over there and wandering over the front (and I mean Front) would be exactly my dish as you know. That's what they would like to have me doing and what I am anxious to do, but through some technical difficulty (DPR being a sort of orphan as far as belonging to any Branch) they don't seem able as yet to make the arrangements to send me over. It is all very silly, but as you know there is nothing I can do about it. The request, if any, would have to go through Lt-Col Malone and Brig A W Beaumont thence to my OC here, Lt Col F X Jennings. Sure would like to get over there."

3. I don't need to tell you how happy I should be if you could do anything to get Les brought over. He has fought like a wildcat to get into uniform and overseas. Wangled his way into Artillery, then got lifted out by PR, and is stagnating and eating out his heart in Ottawa. It's a shame to batter a top-notch cartoonist like him around that way.
