SUBJECT: Payment and Accounting for Rations.

TO : Commanding Officers, All Units, Headquarters Command, AF.

1. Attention is directed to MTOUSA Circular 116, 1944 and Section II, HQ Administrative Memorandum 13, 1945.

2. Section IV of MTOUSA Circular 116, 1944, explains the method of payment and accounting for rations. Parts of the section are reproduced below.

(a) Enlisted personnel (United States) are entitled to subsistence without cost.

(b) "Officers, warrant officers, flight officers, WAC officers, members of the Army Nurse Corps, dieticians and physical therapy aides, United States Army, will have deducted on their next pay voucher the sum of seventy-five cents (75¢) per day in cash."

(c) "Members of the United States Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Public Health Service, correspondents, photographers, Red Cross personnel and civilians will pay the mess officer the sum of seventy-five (75¢) per day in cash. The mess officer will turn in the money received for the ration to the sales officer."

(1) These collections are to be forwarded to the Sales Officer, QM, PBS, APO 782, U. S. Army in the form of either an authorized check or Postal Money Orders made payable to the TREASURER OF THE UNITED STATES, and are to be accompanied with shipping tickets in quadruplicate, all of which are to be signed by the mess officer.

a. The sales officer will receipt and return to the mess officer the original and one (1) copy of the shipping ticket. After compliance with the provisions of WD Circular No. 158 dated 21 April 1944, paragraph 13, AR 35-6660 which require that the shipping ticket show the certification of the officer auditing the account and the approval or disapproval of the commanding officer of the organization, the original is to be forwarded by the commanding officer direct to the Finance Officer, PEBASE, APO 782, U. S. Army.

b. Payment and the forwarding of shipping tickets should be on a monthly basis.

(d) "All foreign military and naval personnel will sign a receipt for each ration received, except that when a large number is being fed at one mess, application may be made through this headquarters (MTOUSA) for one foreign officer of this number to be designated to sign for the group as a whole. All issues to foreign military and naval personnel will be recaptured by the mess officer by means of shipping tickets in quintuplicate. Separate shipping

tickets will be used for each nationality and will show in all cases the names, rank and organization of the officers and/or enlisted men to whom the rations were furnished. The shipping tickets will be signed by proper authority and .. will be forwarded in quadruplicate to the appropriate bases section or Air Force command for inclusion in Lend-Lease Report, or special report for co-belligerent accounting."

(1) The shipping tickets (in quadruplicate) should be forwarded to QUARTERMASTER, PBS, APO 782, US Army, on a monthly basis.

3. A report will be rendered to this Headquarters monthly showing the number and category of persons other than U. S. Army personnel that have been furnished rations for the previous month. This report will indicate that the prescribed arrangements were taken for payment or otherwise accounting for the rations which those persons were furnished. Where applicable a negative report will be submitted.

4. The monthly report will include the following headings for the form to be used:
