SUBJECT: Treatment of Diplomatic and Consular Personnel.

MEMORANDUM TO: Headquarters, AMF, 5th Army

1. With reference to your letter 11/2 of 3rd November regarding the treatment of diplomatic and consular personnel, Political Section agree that it is desirable that directives on the above subject should continue to be issued. They also agree that, as some of the present instructions are out-of-date, a new directive might be issued to commanding officers in future operations.

A draft of a revised order is attached.

2. Political Section also agree that the document might be treated as "confidential" rather than "secret".

Directive

1. The following instructions will be strictly observed by all concerned:

a. AXIS POWERS.

(1) All diplomatic and consular officials of Germany, Japan, Hungary and Rumania will be detained. They should be treated courteously but their escape must be prevented. This Headquarters will be notified immediately in case of detention.

(2) Embassy, Legation and Consular premises of Germany, Japan, Hungary and Rumania should not be entered or searched unless there is proof of abuse of diplomatic privilege. Such abuse would include any hostile action committed from any Embassy, Legation or Consular premises such as the use of W/T transmitters, storage of war material other than the recognized mission armory, the laying of explosive charges etc.

(3) The private residences of diplomatic and consular officials of the above named Axis Powers will not be entered or searched without proof that such residences are being used for a purpose harmful to the Allied war effort. Such residences would not be occupied or requisitioned but will be sealed until taken over by the protecting power.

(4) Embassy and Legation premises and private residences of Ambassadors, Legation and consular staffs will be protected from wanton damage. If available, guards should be provided for them until taken over by the protecting power.

b. Former AXIS SATELLITES.

(1) The instructions laid down above will be equally applied in the case of diplomatic or consular officials purporting to represent any so-called "national" or puppet governments set up by the Germans in respect of Rumania, Bulgaria and Finland.

DRAFT DIRECTIVE (CONT'D)

(c) Countries wholly or partially over-run by the AXIS

(1) All diplomatic and consular officials of Vichy France will be detained and action taken as set forth in paragraph 1. (a)(1) above. Their official premises and private residences will not be occupied or requisitioned but will be sealed unless in the custody of the protecting power in which case no action will be taken.

(2) Danish diplomatic and consular officials and their premises and private residences will be accorded the same treatment as in the case of neutral countries as set forth in paragraph 1. (d)(1) below.

(3) Diplomatic and consular officials of the puppet states of Slovakia and Croatia together with their premises and residences will be treated in the same way as those of the Axis Powers as laid down in paragraph 1. (a) above.

(d) Neutral Countries.

(1) All Consular privileges will be accorded to representatives of neutral countries at all times. No official or personal premises of officials of neutral countries will be entered without proof of abuse of such privileges.

1. Attached are copies of two orders issued by H.Q. Fifth Army to all troops on the above subject. This office has recently been asked whether or not it is still considered desirable that these orders should continue to be issued to new units coming under command of the Army.

2. It is felt desirable here that some such directive should still be put out for the guidance of Commanding Officers in future operations. At the same time recent events have made the wording of some clauses obsolete.

It is also considered that such a document might be graded as "confidential" rather than "secret".

3. It would be much appreciated if you would send us your comments together with suggestions for a draft of a revised order for submission to the CG, Fifth Army.

Paragraphs 1a (3) and 1b (1) of the letter, this Headquarters, subject and file as above, dated 25 January 1944, are amended to read as follows:-

1. a. (3) The private residences of Diplomatic and Consular officials of the Axis and Satellite powers hereinbefore named will not be entered or searched without proof that such residences are being used for a purpose harmful to our war effort. Such residences will not be occupied or requisitioned, but will be sealed until taken over by the protective power.
- b. (1) All Diplomatic and Consular officials of Vichy France will be detained, and action taken as set forth in paragraph 1a (1) hereof. Their official premises and private residences will not be occupied or requisitioned, but will be sealed, unless in the custody of the protective power, in which case no action will be taken. In the case of the Danish diplomatic and Consular officials and their official premises and private residences, the same treatment will be accorded as in the case of neutral countries, as set forth in paragraph 1c (1).

SUBJECT: Treatment of Enemy Diplomatic and Consular Property.

TO : All Concerned.

1. The bona fide diplomatic and consular property of enemy governments (including their diplomatic and consular archives) and the property of enemy diplomatic and consular personnel, found in the territory of third powers occupied in the course of hostilities, will be accorded the following treatment:

a. If any such property is in the custody of the protecting power, that custody will be respected in every way.

b. If any such property is not in the custody of the protecting power, it will be safeguarded until such time as the governments represented by the occupying forces may give specific instructions as to its disposition. In such cases, important diplomatic and consular archives may be copied, pending disposition, but not confiscated.

2. This policy with respect to bona fide diplomatic and consular establishments does not preclude the Theater Commander, at his discretion and on his responsibility, from entry and search of premises allegedly diplomatic or consular in character, which he has substantial reason to believe to be, or to have been recently used for clandestine, warlike operations against his own forces, or examination of which he believes to be essential to the security of his own forces, communications, and operations.

3. In the case of property in the custody of the protecting power, the Theater Commander will request the representatives of that power for permission to search the premises. If such permission is refused or unreasonably delayed, however, entry and search by the Theater Commander is not precluded. In all such cases a full report must be rendered to the governments to which he is responsible, justifying the entry and search.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Secretary General, Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The following message from the Italian Minister at Stockholm to the Italian Government, dated October 23, has been received:

I have the honor to report, with reference my dispatch No. 7 of the 8th October that I had a second meeting with the Hungarian Minister who appears to wish to maintain friendly relations with the Royal Italian Legation. He discussed relations between Rumania and Hungary and said that Germany intrigues have so far frustrated attempts to reach an agreement between the two countries. In his opinion the Hungarian Government would be glad in the spirit of sincere collaboration to reach a satisfactory settlement on the main outstanding questions in order to show their good will towards the Allied powers.

In passing on this message the Allied Commission of Control have been instructed to re-peat that the Italian Minister in Stockholm should be warned to restrict his relations with representatives of powers at war with the Allied to the minimum and to refuse to act as intermediary in overtures of this kind. It is suggested that a similar warning might be sent to other Italian representatives in neutral countries.

1. A procedure has now been established whereby any United Nations Government may transfer, through the remittance system, to its representatives in Italy, funds to meet personal and office expenses of such representatives.

2. It is assumed that the term "representatives in Italy" includes the Allied Nations Missions (except those represented on the Advisory Council for Italy).

3. Please inform the representatives of the Allied Nations Missions of the establishment of the procedure described in para 1 above, and suggest to them that they arrange with their governments to deposit Dollars or Sterling in post liberation blocked accounts with correspondent banks in the U.S. or U.K. of the Bank of Sicily or the Bank of Naples. The lire equivalent of such sums deposited would then be paid to the designated representatives in Italy.

4. Pending receipt of such remittances, AFA branches are hereby authorized to make temporary advances of limited amounts of lire to United Nations representatives (for personal and office expenses only) on the understanding that such advances will be repaid from the proceeds of subsequent remittances to be effected in the manner suggested in para 3 above. Where an advance in excess of Lire 100,000 is requested, the matter should be referred to AFA, HQ, except in extreme emergencies.

5. The form of undertaking (F/P 12 (a)) to be used in connection with these temporary advances is enclosed. As the use of this form is limited, it has not been printed; therefore;

it will be necessary to type the form in each case.

6. In each case, the representative of the United Nations must present credentials certified by AFHQ, or by the Political Section, ACC, authorizing him to act as the representative of and incur obligations on behalf of his government.

7. The suggestion has been made by this Headquarters that the remittance from London or the U.S. may include funds for office and personal expense and also funds for other unspecified purposes such as relief for nationals in Italy of their own volition.

8. The present procedure in respect of advances to the Advisory Council for Italy (including its delegations and members) is not affected by establishment of this new procedure for other United Nations representatives.

SIGNED MAGISTRATI FOR ITALIAN FOREIGN OFFICE

I have to confirm that our colleagues who had been sent from many parts of Europe to Italy by the Germans have, after a stay in Salso Maggiore, been freed, but they were made to promise that they would reside in areas North of the Po River. Some have been arrested in Rome, including Degrenet, whom the Vatican authorities are endeavoring to liberate according to reports from the Royal Chargé d'Affaires to the Holy See. It is feared that the Fascist authorities will soon exert strong pressure on functionaries remaining in Rome and refusing to cooperate.

Our military internees in Germany and Poland continue to be subjected to strong pressure from the Germans with a view to forcing them to enlist in the Fascist Army. Despite the threat of being considered deserters and being punished accordingly most of them refused.

Reference your 741 of November 3. FATIMA FROM MURPHY SIGNED EISENHOWER CITE FICIV.

We do not want Italian representatives in neutral countries to act as intermediaries on behalf of enemy powers who wish to make overtures to us. In this connection following message from Italian Minister at Stockholm to the Italian Government dated October 23 has been received. Paraphrased. With reference to my despatch number 7 of October 8 I have the honor to inform your Excellency that I had a second meeting with the Hungarian Minister who seems to wish to maintain friendly relations with this legation. He discussed relations between Rumania and Hungary and stated that the Hungarian Government would be willing in the spirit of sincere collaboration to consider an agreement between the two countries. He said that German intrigues have frustrated previous attempts in this direction. In his opinion Hungarian Government would be glad to reach a satisfactory settlement of main questions pending in order to show their goodwill towards the Allied Powers. In passing on this message to Badoglio you should urge him to warn his Minister in Stockholm and any other Italian representative to whom a similar warning may be necessary to restrict his relations with representatives of powers at war with the Allies to the minimum and to refuse to act as intermediary in overtures of this kind.

It is therefore impossible to request Spanish authorities to increase such allowances, all the more since no regulation on matter is provided for by regulations and agreements. Royal Naval Attaché has already spent 60,000 pesetas to meet first and most urgent needs and received from this Embassy for the same purpose 100,000 pesetas drawn from loans contracted in Spain (See special investigations on matter).

The above sum represents a considerable burden beyond the prior estimate. Have raised fund among Royal offices and Italian nationals in Spain but all above sums are certainly inadequate in consequence of large number of sailors to be assisted and of other workmens expenses for general items and (? avert ? merciful) treatment of wounded in private institutions.

Measures should be urgently taken to meet such serious situation: The possibility might be studied that Anglo-American Governments in the spirit of collaboration between the Armistice Signatory Powers help us to meet such needs by assigning normal pay to all officers, petty officers and sailors.

The above measure would also undoubtedly have a (?) ... influence on their morale.
