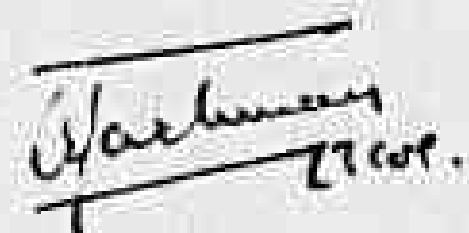

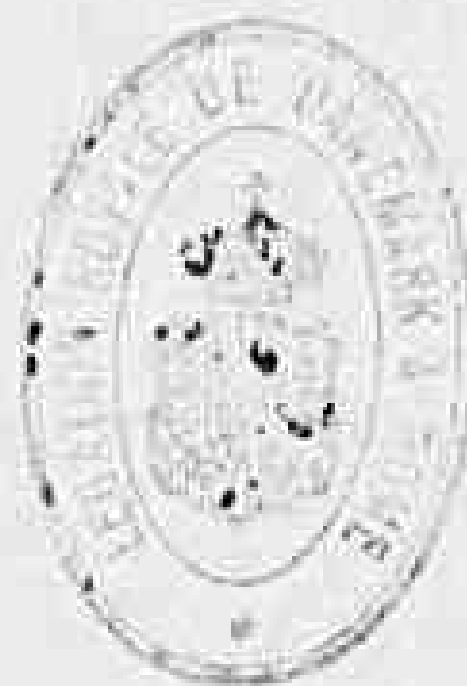

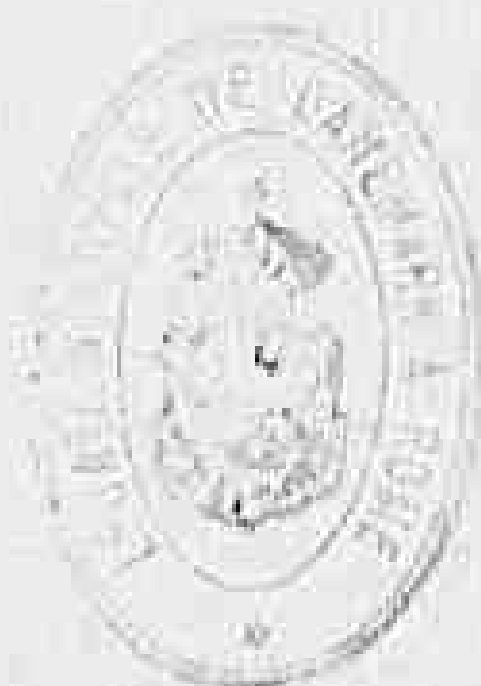

I have asked Reventlow to bring your proposal to the attention of the British Government, and have myself at once approached the Government of the United States. Danish Legation here has requested that Bull be authorized to take over and safeguard Danish interests in liberated sections of Italy in capacity of Charge d'Affaires (your 2222, July 1, 2 p.m.). Department has no objection to the proposal but before communicating with Secretary of CCAC with view to issuance of necessary instructions to General Wilson we requested British Embassy here to ascertain attitude of Foreign Office. Latter has now replied that it is referring matter to MacMillan and will follow his recommendations in the premises.

With reference to your memorandum 5/128/1 of 23 June about the Danish Legation in Rome the following is the text of a telegram which Mr. Tage Ball, the **selor** of the Danish Legation, requested should be forwarded to Washington for the Danish Minister:

"Exalted, the Danish Minister, last March, transferred Danish Legation to Venice, while I remained in Rome to look after local and current matters. I am able to remain in Rome and exercise these functions despite the imperative request of Germans, shortly before their troops retreated, to evacuate the Legation and move to Venice. I propose, subject to agreement of the Allied authorities, that I, in the capacity of *Chargé d'Affaires*, take over and look after the interests of Denmark in liberated Italy. My salary now per month is 5,160 Danish crowns, salary of *Chancelier* is 1,811 and expenses of *chancery* monthly amount to nearly 10,000 crowns. Would request that you effect the necessary transfer funds so that above expenses may be covered. Inform Government and reply by telegraph."

Mr. Ball is a relation of the Danish Minister in Washington and for this reason preferred to send his message to Mr. Kaufman rather than to the Danish Minister in London. It will be seen however that he has asked Mr. Kaufman to inform Count Sereniti.

Mr. Ball's message has been forwarded to the Department of State in Washington by the United States Representative to the Advisory Council for Italy.

The status of neutral diplomatic representations in Rome is understood to be still under discussion between the State Department and the Foreign Office. In the meantime we know however that both are agreed that if the Danish Minister is found in Rome he should be furnished with the opportunity of declaring his political sympathies, which are believed to be pro-ally, and reviewing his relationship with the Danish administration as his colleagues in London and Washington have done. We should be grateful if you would so inform the Rome Area Command, and if possible transmit the following message to the Danish Legation from the Danish Minister in London:

"Danish Legation Rome. It is requested by the Danish Minister in London to state the conditions and whereabouts of officials and staff".

My salary now per month is 3,180 Danish crowns, salary of Chancellor is 1,211 and expenses of Embassy monthly amount to nearly 10,000 crowns. Would request that you effect the necessary transfer funds so that above expenses may be covered. Inform Government and reply by telegraph."

Mr. Bull is a relation of the Danish Minister in Washington and for this reason preferred to send his message to Mr. Kaufman rather than to the Danish Minister in London. It will be seen however that he has asked Mr. Kaufman to inform Count Bernadotte.

Mr. Jørgen KJAR, a Danish subject, has applied to this Legation in view of the fact, that on June 8 last he has been incarcerated in the Regina Coeli prison at Rome, where he is still detained on an accusation of cooperation with the Germans. He maintains, however, that he has only acted as interpreter and translator of the English, German and Italian languages to the Italian State Railways, thereby earning his living.

The Legation is not in a position to form a definite opinion as to the facts of the case but does not, at the outset, see any reasons to doubt the veracity of the prisoner. The Legation would therefore be grateful for information respecting the statement made by Kjar, and for any leniency compatible with existing rules, which it might be possible to grant him.
