1. There are enclosed, in original, six telegrams which M. Scortese, the Rumanian Charge d'Affaires in Rome, wishes to transmit to his Government in Bucharest.
2. These telegrams, which appear to be harmless in themselves, were presented to the Message Center of this HQ on February 5th for transmission by commercial means after approval by the Political Section.
3. As you are aware, M. Scortese was formerly a member of the staff of the Rumanian Legation to the Holy See, but was recently appointed by the Rumanian Government, and recognized by the Italian Government, as Charge d'Affaires of the Rumanian Legation to the Vatican.
4. The Political Section understands, however, that the British, Soviet and U. S. Governments do not approve the resumption of direct diplomatic relations between ex-enemy countries.
5. In these circumstances, a ruling is requested as to whether communication between M. Scortese and his Government should be allowed. It is pointed out in this connection that the Italian Minister at Bucharest is permitted to communicate with his Government through Allied channels only.
