Dear Marchese Visconti Venosta:

In reply to your letter 61/00663/dp of 18 August, I am writing to confirm that no objection has been seen to the proposed replacement of Signor Longetti, the present Italian Minister in Stockholm, by Signor Guarascielli nor to the withdrawal of the present Italian Minister in Dublin, Signor Berardis, and the appointment of Baron Confalonieri as First Secretary.

In the case of Signor Longetti it is not at present possible to make immediate arrangements for his repatriation; but it is not thought impossible that passage may be secured for him and his wife in due course.

In addition, I am glad to be able to inform you that there is no objection to the two appointments of H.S. Giuliano Cora to Angora in place of Ambassador Ricci and of Count Dalaratti Scotti to Madrid in place of Marques Paulucci.

According to the local newspapers Italy Liberated Nazibar Fascist Mattino Italy, the present Italian representatives Madrid, Ankara, Stockholm, Lisbon would be recalled to Rome in order to present themselves to the Antifascist Epuration Commission. I would be very grateful to you if you will send to me detailed information for eventual contradiction. "Garbaccio" Daieta.

SUBJECT: Replacement of Personnel in Italian Missions Abroad

TO : Allied Force Headquarters
(Attn: G-5 Section)

1. In my telegram No. 2658 of the 11th August, I informed you of the Italian Government's desire to enlist Allied support in replacing in their missions abroad all personnel who have represented Fascism and I have now received a further letter on this subject from the Under Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of which is attached.

2. The Italian Government are bound to be subjected to the criticism of their press and public opinion if they appear ready to leave such well known Fascists as Signor Rasetti at their posts and such criticism cannot but affect their standing in the country. To allay this criticism they have now published the fact that such Italian representatives are to be recalled. But their announcement will only bring conviction when action is taken and I shall therefore be grateful for anything that can be done to expedite an Allied decision in this matter and a reply given to the Italian proposals which were set out in my telegram under reference and previous correspondence concerning Italian Missions at Dublin and Stockholm as well as Lisbon.

DRAFT TELEGRAM TO C-5 BRITISH RESIDENT AND US POLITICAL ADVISER

Italian Government are anxious to withdraw from their Missions abroad all personnel who have represented fascist ~~Government~~ and substitute new personnel. They realize that this process will have to be gradual for reasons of transport but trust that they can rely upon our good offices particularly in the case of heads of Missions. Their proposals has regards Lisbon, Madrid, and Buenos Aires have already been submitted to you, but they have now approached us about Stockholm and Dublin.

2 As regards Stockholm their Minister Renzetti is a notorious fascist who obtained his present appointment partly owing to the personal intervention of Goering. They have not so far been able to remove him from his post owing to difficulty of communication and undesirability of his remaining in Stockholm as dissident element after dismissal. In addition it has been considered that the First Secretary would be unsuitable to take charge of the Italian Legation. Italian Government now enquire whether transport has improved sufficiently to enable Renzetti and his wife to be withdrawn and if so whether the Allied Governments would have any objection to nomination in his place of Guernaschelli, Italian ex-minister at Helsinki, who is now at Stockholm.

3 As regards Dublin latest reports received by Italian Government show that Minister Perdis apart from other disabilities is not in fit state of health ^{mental and physical} to carry on. Italian Government have not yet decided on nominee to propose as his replacement, but wish to recall him urgently and send Confalonieri, the ~~ye~~ as First Secretary to look after the Legation. Confalonieri has been working in the Italian Foreign Office for some time past but ~~he~~ in no way collaborated after the German occupation of Rome.

4 We should be grateful for reply as soon as possible whether these ~~these~~ proposals can be approved.

Dear Green,

* I spoke to you yesterday concerning the 230 persons who for months now have been waiting for the authorisation to return to Italy from the Iberian Peninsula.

You know that the question is, for us, a serious one : on the one hand, the Allied Control Commission insists that the greatest economy be exercised in respect of our offices abroad, and in fact programs and plans have been elaborated in order to realise, as quickly as possible, this aim ; on the other, the necessary visas and transportation are granted very sparingly and with great delay.

The result is that our expenses continue to be uselessly heavy ; that a state of uncertainty and uneasiness is spreading to all our communities in the Iberian Peninsula ; that diffidence grows and that no rational program of economy and interchange of personnel can be realized by us. *

I shall be extremely grateful if, with your unfailing courtesy, you will help us to get out of this stalemate. You are aware of our intention to renew all our personnel abroad : I mentioned yesterday that Caccia has been appointed to Madrid and ^{to} Confalonieri to Dublin. It is absolutely necessary that this interchange, which involves also some Heads of Missions, should take place as rapidly **1-7-79-**
