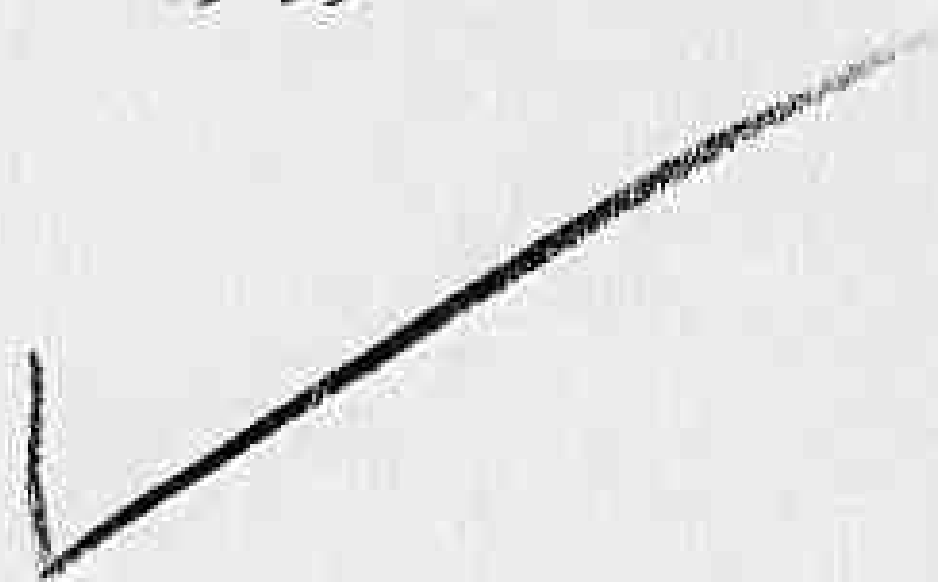

2. The views of the British Minister have been given as follows:

" When it was decided that M. Carlier could go to Italy the words used in the note to the Belgian Embassy in London announcing this decision were that it had been agreed 'that the Belgian authorities may proceed as soon as possible as they desire to the appointment of a Belgian Consul to Southern Italy'. M. Carlier in fact went to Naples. But in view of what the Belgian Government were told we would have no ground for preventing him from establishing himself in Rome if he wishes to do so. It is however worth noticing that the grounds which M. Carlier himself advances for wishing to go to Rome are not the proper ones. As a Consular Officer he has nothing to do with either the Italian Government or the Advisory Council. The advantage of letting him go to Rome is that it will tend to satisfy any desire which the Belgian Government may have for some form of special representation at the seat of the Italian Government."

3. The Office of the U. S. Political Adviser and G-2 have no objection to raise to the proposal.

M. Carlier has been the most intolerable nuisance to the Political Section ever since his arrival in Italy, and at one time Mr. Reber had the full intention of asking A.F.H.Q. to have him removed. Having said this, I should in fairness add that his position, as well as that of all other representatives of the United Nations who are not members of the Advisory Council, has been hard. They are nobody's baby.

At present there are in Rome the Belgian, Brazilian and Polish Consuls General. As regards the three points in Para 3 of Lewin Harris' letter:-

(a) Would it be possible for any part of A.C.C. to arrange for them to be allowed to draw petrol in the same way as petrol is drawn by members of the Advisory Council?

(b) The Belgian Consul General is at present at the Flora. The Polish Consul General is at some lesser hotel. Could they both be moved to the Grand? And, if so, could the Netherlands Consul-General be accommodated there when he arrives?

(c) Can A.C.C. authorize any of these to draw British or American rations?

So much for the Rome picture: but, of course, the same applies in Naples and the Yugoslavs have been raising all the same questions with Mr. Schott about their treatment in Naples.

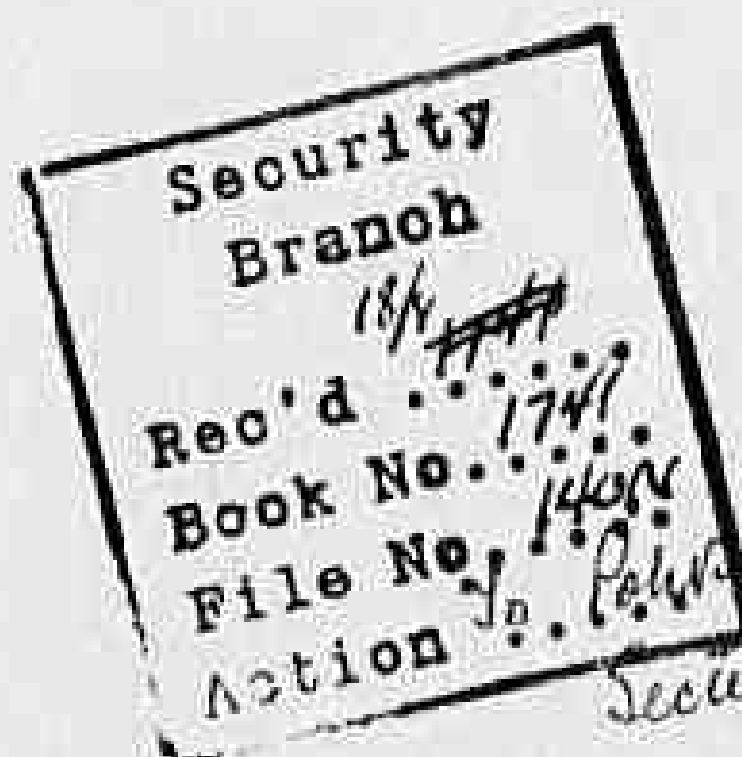
1. Subject a BELGIAN refugee who became a civil servant, working for the BELGIAN Ministry for Foreign Affairs, at LISBON in Apr. 44, states that he was appointed Vice-consul for NAPLES on 5 Jul. 44. On 14 Jul. 44, he arrived in ALGIERS in a party of refugees from SPAIN. On 21 Jul., ALGIERS received a report from PCO, LISBON, and a certificate from the BELGIAN ambassador to PORTUGAL, both of which describe him as a volunteer for the BELGIAN forces, bound for the U.K.
2. In view of the unsatisfactory nature of the case, further enquiries are being made, and subject is being interrogated further in ALGIERS. Meanwhile we shall be grateful if you will let us know if he was accredited by you to the post of Vice-consul at the time of his appointment by the BELGIAN Embassy, or on the occasion of his application, made in ALGIERS, for travel to ITALY.

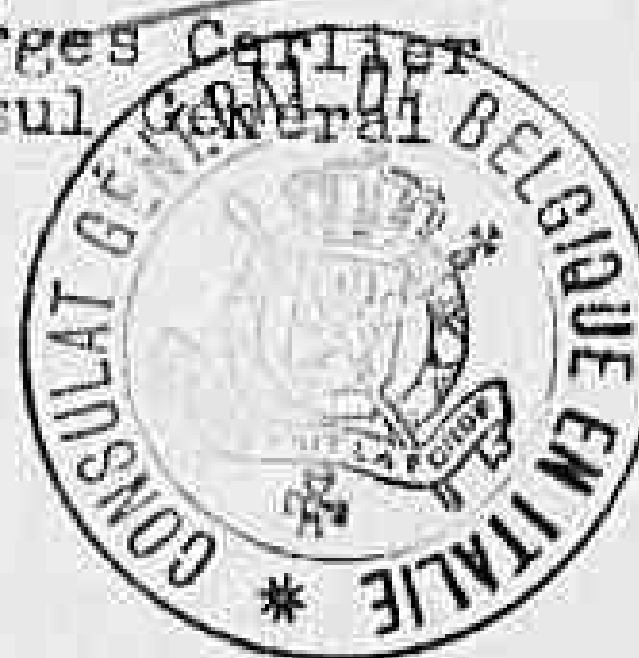

Now that Allied Control Commission Headquarters have been transferred to Rome, instructions have been received by this Regional Headquarters that in future any messages which were submitted by you to the Political Section for transmission to the Belgian Ambassador, Algiers, or to the Belgian Government London, should in future be submitted through this headquarters for similar action.

With reference to your letter of May 14, concerning your appointment by the Belgian Government as Belgian Consul General for Allied occupied Italy, I have the honor, under instructions from the Chief Commissioner, to inform you that the Allied authorities have no objection to the proposal set forth in your letter.

As soon as you are prepared to open the Belgian Consulate in Naples, the Allied Control Commission will be glad to transmit notification thereof to the Italian Government, and on its part to notify the appropriate Allied authorities.

Insofar as communications are concerned, pouch facilities through Allied military channels may be afforded for communications which will not be subject to censorship. Cipher facilities for telegrams can not, however, at this time be permitted.

So long as the present general restrictions on diplomatic communications into and out of England exist, it will be appreciated that direct communication between your Consulate and your Government in England can not be permitted, and to that extent the authority granted for pouch facilities must be inoperative until such general restrictions are removed.

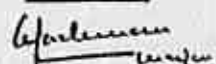

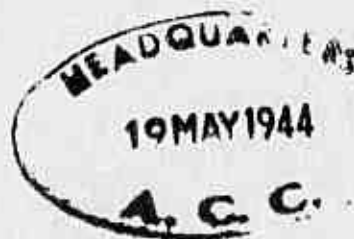

1. Reference is made to this Section's Cable F25265 of 30 March to which, in the absence of a reply from you, it is assumed you had no objection..

2. Attached are texts of two messages which the Belgian and Netherlands representatives in Algiers have asked should be communicated to the Belgian and Netherlands representatives on the Internees and Displaced persons sub-commission. It will be seen that these messages instruct the representatives on behalf of their Governments to assume consular functions.

3. The messages have reached this Section from the Office of the British Resident Minister who expresses the view, with which this Section concurs, that the texts follow the general instructions received from CGS in such matters and are unobjectionable.

4. Will you please ensure the speedy delivery of the message to the persons in question and inform this HQ of the location of the Consulates agreed upon. Once this has been done there is no further formality to observe.

5. A further short message from the Netherlands Government to their representative on the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission. It would be appreciated if this second message could be delivered at the same time as the message to him in 1 above.
