My dear Colleague:

I was distressed to receive your letter of September 14 advising me of the treatment received by your Secretaries in the Grand Hotel. I was unable personally to rectify this matter on the evening on which I received your letter but next morning I immediately communicated its contents to the Headquarters Commandant, Allied Control Commission, the officer in charge of billeting and similar activities, with the request that he make a full investigation and provide proper facilities for the two gentlemen in question.

The reply of the Headquarters Commandant just now has been received by me and I hasten to transmit it to you with the hope that in some way it will modify your feelings in the matter which I thoroughly appreciate.

With renewed expressions of regret that this incident should have occurred, and assuring you of my constant desire to be of any service possible to you and to the gentlemen of your staff, I remain,




