1. The British High Commissioner has informed us that he has heard from the British Ambassador at Cairo that the Netherlands Legation there have applied for permission to enter Italy to be obtained from APC on behalf of a Netherlands subject, Mr. P. E. Curtake who has been appointed by the Netherlands Shipping and Trading Committee in London as assistant to their representative in Naples, Captain Riedel. The London committee are anxious that Mr. Curtake should take up his appointment as soon as possible and have asked that the necessary authorization for his journey should be issued urgently. It will be appreciated, therefore, if we may be informed as a matter of urgency what reply should be transmitted through the British Ambassador at Cairo.

2. Since the channel used for taking up this case seems unnecessarily complicated (i.e. from British Ambassador Cairo to British High Commissioner in Rome to the Allied Control Commission and then to APC) we shall also be glad to know whether in the reply it may be suggested that in future such applications should be addressed by D.C.M.E. direct to A.F.H.C. Copy of this communication is being sent to the British High Commissioner.

Mr. Caccia,

H.M. Ambassador at Cairo reports that the Netherlands Legation there have applied for AFHQ permit to enter Italy on behalf of the Netherlands subject Mr. F.T. Zurhake who has been appointed by the Netherlands Shipping and Trading Committee in London as assistant to their representative in Naples, Captain Riedel. The London Committee are anxious that Mr. Zurhake should take up his appointment as soon as possible. Would you please obtain the necessary authorisation for Mr. Zurhake's journey and let me know in what form the permit should be issued? I will then telegraph to Cairo.

2. We are also informed by H.M. Embassy at Lisbon that diplomatic transit visas for Gibraltar were granted on August 28th to Mr. P.J. Droogendijk who has been appointed Netherlands Consul at Naples and to Miss K. Van Loen who has been appointed a secretary to the Consulate. Both these persons were due to leave Lisbon on or about September 10th.

Since my arrival in Italy I have not been in Florence. During the week ended October 8th. Mr. S. van Loen, Netherlands Consul attached to this Mission and Mr. A. Luydjens, press attaché, have visited Florence under my instructions in order to contact the Netherlands colony residing there and to report the conditions, under which these Netherland subjects are living. Moreover the above mentioned members of this Mission had to investigate the political reliability of some Dutchmen, whose actions had been brought to my attention.

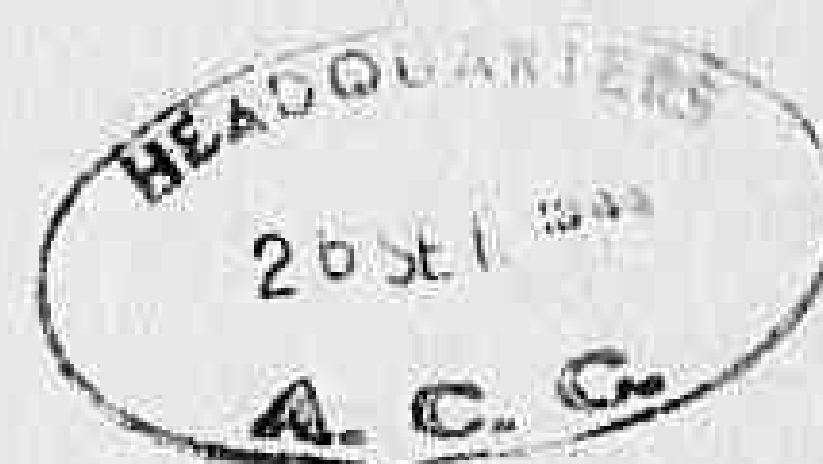

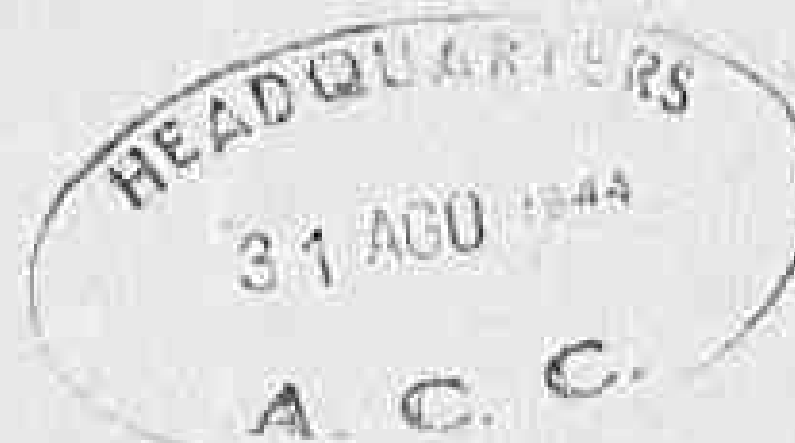

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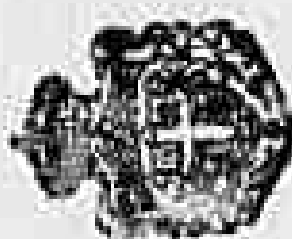

If the latter assumption of mine should prove correct I believe that, as a matter of form and mutual courtesy, it might be well to regularize his position vis-à-vis the Italian Authorities by an exchange of letters.

We shall however be able to enlarge on this proposal of mine on the occasion of one of your or Reber's trips to Salerno, as the matter would necessarily have to be brought to the attention of the Dutch Government in London.

With the occasion I wish however to point out a few facts on Italo-Dutch relations during recent years, namely that the two Countries, as you know, were never at war and that, up to the September armistice, the Italian Government succeeded in

maintaining its representatives in Holland. The Germans did not allow us to have a Minister at the Hague but we managed to have a so-called "Gerente per gli Affari Consolari" living in the Legation. On the other hand our Consuls continued to carry out their normal duties in Amsterdam and in Rotterdam and performed a very creditable job giving the Ministry a truthful picture of German misrule and Dutch steadfast resistance. Although under strict vigilance by the Nazis, our Representatives went out of their way in coming to the assistance of scores of victims of the Gestapo. At present, as far as I know, our officials in Holland, with no exception, have remained loyal to the Royal Government and have been accordingly dismissed from the service and probably interned.

Some day however they shall prove to be valuable witnesses of a very dark period of German domination in Holland.

I truly believe that all this should form the basis of a discussion on the present juridical situation in the relationship between the two Countries.

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Royal Netherlands Government have appointed me, in agreement with the American and British Governments, as Consul-General of the Netherlands for those parts of the Kingdom of Italy in Europe that have been or will be liberated from German influence by the United Nations. I shall in that function be seconded by Mr. S. van Loen, Consul of the Netherlands.

2. My Government have left the choice of the locality of my office to my discretion, while there is, so I am informed, no objection to my combining the functions of Consul-General and Netherlands Delegate to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission. In the latter capacity I have been established in Bari since 9th February 1944.

3. Upon the liberation of Rome a Consulate-General will have to be established in that city at the earliest possible moment. For the present the need of consular representation is being felt primarily at Naples, for the following reasons: (1) Your Excellency's headquarters are established
