Reference your memorandum No. R/1239 of December 18th.

2. On the assumption that M. Gruevski represents, as Consul, the Royal Yugoslav Government which is the only Government at present recognised by the British and United States Governments, and that he has been recognised by the Italian Government as Yugoslav Consul at Naples, his status vis-à-vis the Italian authorities should be the same as that of other Consuls in Italy representing the several Allied Governments. There would, therefore, be no objection to his dealing directly with the local Italian authorities on matters of a routine nature but he should keep you generally informed of his activities and particularly in matters of political importance.
3. As regards the status of Yugoslav subjects domiciled in those parts of Dalmatia which were Yugoslav territory up till the outbreak of the present war, the Political Section understands that the nationality of such persons was not altered by virtue of the Italian occupation of those areas at the beginning of the war.
4. With reference to the fourth paragraph of your letter under reply, the Political Section is informed that no Yugoslavs are at present being sent from France to Italy. In so far as Yugoslavs do arrive in Italy from France they are strictly speaking displaced persons and not ex-prisoners of war and they must accordingly be handled by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission.

SUBJECT: Jugoslav Consul in Naples.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394.

1. Reference is to your P/223-Yu of 8 January 1945.
2. It is assumed that M. Branica as consul represents the Royal Jugoslav Government, the only Government presently recognized by the British and United States Governments, and that M. Branica, has been sent to and accepted by the Italian Government as Jugoslav Consul at Naples.
3. In such case, it is believed that his status vis-a-vis the Italian authorities is the same as that of other consuls in Italy representing the several Allied Governments.
4. With respect to Jugoslav citizens domiciled in portions of Dalmatia which were Jugoslav territory prior to the outbreak of the present war, it is believed that the nationality of such persons was not altered by virtue of Italian occupation of such areas at the beginning of the war.
5. Reference your paragraph 3, no Jugoslavs are presently to be sent from France to Italy. Insofar as Jugoslavs are coming into Italy from France, they are not ex P/W but strictly Displaced Persons and must accordingly be dealt with by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission.

SECRET: Question of Yugoslav consul
of Naples with local Italian
authorities.

To : 1st section, Allied Force Headquarters,

1. The newly appointed Yugoslav consul at Naples, under
[REDACTED], has made inquiries as to his legal status
vis-a-vis the local Italian authorities. He states that, to the
best of his knowledge, a state of war still technically exists
between Italy and Yugoslavia. At all, the situation was stated
by the United States and Great Britain on behalf of the other
United Nations so that although the Yugoslav Consul is correct
in saying that a state of war exists, Yugoslavia is in precisely
the same relationship toward Italy as the other allies.
2. Consul Ivanic has further enquired whether he should
treat as Yugoslav Nationals citizens who, though Yugoslav
by birth, are citizens by the Italian Government as Italian sub-
jects by virtue of the Italian occupation of the Dalmatian coast
at the outbreak of the present war.
3. The Yugoslav Consul has also requested that the Allied
authorities should agree that these parties of Yugoslav
soldiers who are recruited from those should be sent across
Italy from Naples to Sicily in compact parties without causing under
the jurisdiction of the displaced persons and migration sub-
commission.
4. The allied section would be glad to have the guidance of
our section, in replying to these questions.



1. I received this morning a visit from the newly-appointed Yugoslav Consul, Mr Branica, to Naples. He raised three questions which appeared to be important enough to be referred to you.

2. He wishes to know the legal aspect of the Yugoslav Consulate vis-a-vis the Italian Authorities. To the best of his knowledge a state of war still technically exists between Italy and Yugoslavia.

3. He wishes to know the status in respect of Dalmatian citizens who might apply to him for information and assistance. They are Yugoslavs by birth, but he understands that the Italian Government claims them as Italian Subjects by virtue of Italian occupation of the Dalmatian coast at the outbreak of the present war.

4. He wishes to know whether it would be possible for us to agree that those parties of Yugoslav soldiers which are recruited in France should be sent across Italy from Naples to Bari in compact parties without coming under the jurisdiction of the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

(a) Subversive Movements or Political Organizations of Security Interest.

i. On 21 November 1944, a body of Yugoslavs consisting of one Lieutenant Guido BRANICA and six soldiers, all armed with various weapons, called upon the Consul of Yugoslavia, in Naples. His wife, alone with a servant, was frightened and would not open the door. Then when the leader of the group rapped on the door as if to force it, she fled by another exit to the apartment of the Brazilian Consul, in the same building.

At this point, the Yugoslav Consul, returning from a 4-day trip to Rome, arrived and found the armed men at different landings of the staircase. When the leader of the group demanded the archives of the Consulate, the Consul answered that as a matter of honor he would not relinquish the files at the point of a gun. The leader then explained that the armed men were his formal guard. The transfer of the archives took place.

Meanwhile, Headquarters, F.R.S., had been alerted and steps were immediately taken to (1) investigate the incident, (2) protect the life of the Consul and his wife, (3) arrest and disarm, if need be, the members of the armed party. The investigation disclosed that while he was in Rome, the Yugoslav Consul had received orders from a "Dr. SMOGLAKA", the new Yugoslav Delegate in Italy, to turn over his Consular duties and office to Lieutenant Branica of Naples. When interrogated, the present Consul stated that Dr. Smoglakas was a Foreign Affairs Representative of Marshal Tito and that the armed party was the Military Commission which the Communists had appointed to effect such transfers of office. He stated that this is the usual way for the Communists to act in such circumstances. He added that what had happened was strictly a political movement and that nothing could be accomplished by force at this time. He explained that he, himself, was of the Nationalist Party of Yugoslavia and a follower of King Peter. He had been a Consul for the past 20 years and had now been transferred to Rome to another Yugoslav Delegation in the Vatican Area. Realizing that steps were taken for his protection, the Consul indicated that he wanted no publicity or undue confusion to be created concerning the matter. The above was brought to the attention of competent headquarters and orders were given to withdraw the Military Police assigned to the task of protecting the Consul and his family and to take no further step for the time being.



A communication has been received from the French representative to the Allied Control Commission advising that M. Maurice Rivoire, French Consul in Naples, will be replaced on August 15 by Consul Yves Debroux. It is proposed also on the same date to resume French consular services at Rome under the direction of M. Blach, Consul General now at Algiers.

Similarly, communications have been received from the Royal Yugoslav Delegate to the Advisory Council for Italy advising that the Yugoslav Consulate, attached to the Royal Yugoslav Delegation to the A.C.I. has been opened at Rome under the direction of Mr. Ilije P. Djaković, First Secretary of the Delegation, and also that a Consulate Plenipotentiary, First Secretary of the Delegation, and also that a Consulate General in like manner has been opened at Naples under the direction of Mr. Jovan L. Ristic, Counselor of Legation, as Consul General.
