SUBJECT: Delay in Transmission of Military Travel Authorization Documents to outgoing Passengers.

TO : CI Section, G-2, AFHQ.

1. On 12 January 1945 three outgoing passengers, in possession of N. T. A. documents dated 23 November 1944 and valid until 31 December 1944, presented themselves for clearance through this security control point. See Mr. and Mrs. ZANOTTI-BLANCO and WILL on SI 4 forms 25D and 24D dated 12 January 1945.

2. This Agent learned from interrogating these parties that these documents were given to these passengers by a non-commissioned officer in the Liaison Section, Allied Commission on 11 January 1945. When those parties pointed out the outmoded date of the documents they were assured that this was of no importance.

3. This Agent, acting on his discretion, extended the date of these documents until 15 January 1945. Lt. Lodebole affirmed the correctness of this decision.

4. This is not the first instance of such a situation occurring. See Mr. and Mrs. CHIUSANO on SI 4 form 18D dated 10 January 1945.

5. This Agent recommends that an investigation be made to determine the reason for the delay in the transmission of these documents by the Allied Commission.

4. It is requested that it be ensured that adequate notice be given to this HQ of any further similar proposals in order that full consideration may be given.





Marchese VISCONTI VENOSTA receives continual insistences from the parties of the " COMITATO DI LIBERAZIONE NAZIONALE" in view of the change of the members of the Italian diplomatic service on post abroad.

I have been instructed this morning by the Undersecretary of State for Foreign Affairs to beg the Political Section to arrange that an Allied ship leaving Italy for Gibraltar, whether in convoy or not ,should carry the following members of the Italian diplomatic service :

- Marchese ROSSI LONCHI, with wife, two sons and maid-
- Dott. MAZIO, with wife, and maid -
- Marchese FARUCE with wife, tree children and nurse -
- TERESA ARGESE COS, maid of Mr. MASCLIA - Charge' d' Affaires in Madrid; the departure of the above mentioned ought to be the soonest possible.

Since Admiral Morgan has refused to grant permission for an Italian ship to do the journey, Marchese Visconti Venosta draws the kind attention of the Political Section upon the extreme urgency that the departure of these officials should take place without delay and within the month of september . They are ready to leave at any moment from tomorrow on, with a warning of tree days beforehand.

Mr. Schott:

Jr. Commander C. M. Reiley, the young lady of G-5 Section, AFHQ, to whom you were speaking this morning about the diplomats & families leaving Italy, called at 2:30 p.m.

She said she checked with the Shipping Section of AFHQ and learned that it would be absolutely impossible to arrange a ship for them before a month or six weeks. She said they told her the ship coming from Gibraltar with the large group of repatriating personnel was not going back.

Her suggestion was that the male diplomats travel to their post by plane, and their families follow later.

by plane
_____ If we agree, she would like us to arrange for the departure of the male diplomats, and then send her a letter requesting arrangements to be made for the families by ship. Then she will approach the Shipping Section, who, she says, will be able to arrange some sort of transportation by ship, but not before a month or a month and a half.

She reassured me that it was quite impossible for them to return by the same ship which was coming from Gibraltar; and that no other ships were available for several weeks.







SUBJ: TRAVEL OF INDIVIDUALS FROM ITALY ABROAD.

1. There is attached a memorandum entitled, "Travel of Individuals from Italy abroad", which indicates the procedure to be followed by the persons indicated prior to obtaining authorization for travel abroad from Italy.

2. It is suggested that Italian Heads of Foreign Missions and all commissioned Italian diplomatic and consular officers be relieved of the requirement of obtaining Military Travel Authorization through Public Safety Subcommission, A.G.C., as are allied and neutral officers. If this is not desirable, could these officials have the authorizations issued without reference to the Region? After all, Italian heads of mission are approved for appointment by G-5, AM, and by the British Foreign Office after their names have been proposed by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and submitted by the A.G.C. It is not significant for them therewith to be obliged to call at a Public Safety Office, or be called upon by an officer from that office for purposes of screening.

To a lesser extent, but equally undesirable from a diplomatic point of view, is it for subordinate commissioned diplomatic and consular officers to undergo this process of screening after their appointments have been agreed upon between the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Political Section, A.G.C. (usually, but not necessarily, with the approval of G-5, AM, the Office of the U. S. Political Adviser or the Office of the British Resident Minister).

3. The views in the matter of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs are set forth in its memorandum to the Political Section, A.G.C., No. 6/556/294, dated October 4, 1944, of which a copy is attached, and the present procedure is indicated in memorandum No. AGC/1401B/8/1/P from the Public Safety Subcommission dated October 3, 1944, to Regional Commissioner, Radio Section (Attention: PPSC), of which a copy is attached.

4. It would be appreciated were G-S Section, A.M.C., able to subscribe to the recommendations of the Political Section in the above regard, and to agree to the deleting from the memorandum first referred to, of that section of paragraph II (a) beginning in line 8 with, "together with a completed application" and ending in line 10 with, "enquiries have been made in the region".

Paragraph VI then will read from line 8 to the end, as follows:- "Public Safety Sub-Commission, A.G.C. These forms are submitted to G-S Section, A.M.C., which in turn passes them to G-A Section, A.M.C., for approval, and thereupon to G-I Section, A.M.C., with a request for the issuance of travel orders which G-S Section, A.M.C., then forwards to the Public Safety Sub-Commission, A.G.C., for onward transmission to Political Section.

5. Should the necessity for military travel authorization be insisted upon, but screening by the Legion be abolished, the memorandum as written may remain unchanged save for deleting in line 10 the words, "after the usual enquiries have been made in the Legion".

6. An early expression of the views of G-S Section, A.M.C., in this matter would be appreciated.

MEMORANDUM

TRAVEL OF INDIVIDUALS FROM ITALY ABROAD

I. Allied and Non-Participating Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

These do not require Military Travel Authorizations.

Their requests for travel are transmitted by the Political Section, A.G.C., to G-3 Section, AFHQ, who inform G-2 Section, AFHQ, and arrange for issuance of travel orders by G-1 Section, AFHQ, which are then forwarded to the Political Section, A.G.C.

II. Diplomatic and Consular Officials.a. Heads of Foreign Missions.

Notification of appointments of Attachments and Attachments by the Italian Government are transmitted to G-3, AFHQ, for approval which will be given only upon receipt of the British Foreign Office. It is not necessary to consult the U. S. State Department in these cases. If, however, the approval is obtained, the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents a "Form" (see copy attached) duly filled in, to the Political Section, A.G.C., who add Part II (Agency) and I (recommendation) and submit the Form to Public Safety Sub-Commission, A.G.C., together with a completed application for Military Travel Authorization. These forms are submitted to G-3 Section, AFHQ, after the usual inquiries have been made in the Region, G-3, AFHQ, in turn passes them to G-2, AFHQ, for approval, and issue of Military Travel Authorization, and thereupon to G-1 Section, AFHQ, with a request for the issuance of travel orders, which G-2 Section, AFHQ, then forwards to Public Safety for onward transmission to the Political Section, A.G.C.

b. Subordinate Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

Military Travel Authorization and travel orders are obtained as above under (a) without prior consultation with, one approval by, G-2 Section, AFHQ.

III. Non-Commissioned Diplomatic and Consular Personnel and Unofficial Agents (including servants of all Diplomatic and Consular Officials bearing immediate precedent already established for one servant for each family,) whose names are submitted to the Political Section by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The same procedure is followed as under II but Public Safety sub-Commission, A.G.C. transmits the applications for Military Travel Authorization to Public Safety, Region IV, for processing prior to passing them on to G-3 Section, AFHQ.

The justifications for the journey will be stated in greater detail ³⁶²⁴ on the request form.

Pointed that in the case of Italian Diplomats appointed abroad, in agreement with the competent Allied Authorities, the M.T.A. was not necessary and that a T.O. issued by the Political Section was sufficient.

For holders of passports on Government Service and ordinary passports, the M.T.A. was obligatory.

Subsequently, Major Ballance, of the Public Security Branch, referring to the departure of a group of diplomats appointed to Lisbon, has made:

1. that according to the latest information in his possession (dated February 1944) all Allied or neutral diplomats are exempt from M.T.A., with the exception of Italian Diplomats;
2. that the forms relative to the M.T.A. must be filled and forwarded under the care of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, but must be filled in by the parties concerned in the Office of the National Commissioner (Capt. Baker);
3. that after the presentation of these forms over 15 days must elapse so as to enable the Intelligence Office (Via Sicilia) to make enquiries.

In this connection the Ministry of Foreign Affairs wishes to point out:

- a) that there does not seem to be any reason that justifies a discrimination between Italian diplomats and those of other countries, all the more so in view of the fact that the appointment abroad of these officials is on the basis in agreement with the Allied Governments;
- b) that in previous instances (departure of Masca for Lisbon and of Confalonieri for Dublin) no formalities of the kind was reported;
- c) that in view of further movements of officials it appears necessary and urgent to regulate the matter with the least possible delay.

Consequently, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs would be much obliged if the Political Section, A.C. could kindly examine the question in conjunction with the other competent Allied Authorities in order to come to a speedy and definite solution on the lines of the above-mentioned communication of September 16th ult.

TRAVEL OF INDIVIDUALS FROM ITALY ABROAD

I. Allied and Neutral Accredited Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

These do not require Military Travel Authorizations.

Their requests for travel are transmitted by the Political Section, A.C.C. to G-5 Section, AFHQ, who informs G-2 Section, AFHQ, and arranges for issuance of travel orders by G-1 Section, AFHQ, which are then forwarded to the Political Section, A.C.C.

II. Italian Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

a. Heads of Foreign Missions.

Notification of appointments of Ambassadors and Ministers by the Italian Government are transmitted to G-5 Section, AFHQ, for approval which will be given only upon consent of the British Foreign Office. It is not necessary to consult the State Department. When this is obtained, the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents a "Rom" (see copy attached) and duly filled in, to the Political Section, A.C.C., who adds Points 3 (urgency) and 9 (recommendation) and submits the same to ② Public Safety Sub-Commission, A.C.C., together with a completed application ③ for Military Travel Authorization. These forms are submitted to G-5 Section, AFHQ which in turn passes them to G-2, AFHQ, for approval, and thereupon to G-1 Section, AFHQ, with a request for the issuance of travel orders, which G-5 Section, AFHQ, then forwards to the Political Section, A.C.C.

b. ~~Other~~ Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

Military Travel Authorization and travel orders are obtained as above under (a) without prior consultation with, and approval by, G-5 Section, AFHQ.

III. Unofficial civilians (including servants of all Diplomatic and Consular Officials) whose names are submitted to the Political Section by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

These forms are submitted to G-5 Section A.H.Q. which in turn passes them to G-2, A.H.Q., for approval, and thereupon to C-1 Section, A.H.Q., with a request for the issuance of travel orders which C-5 Section, A.H.Q., then forwards to the Political Section, ACC.

b. ~~Subordinates~~ Diplomatic and Consular Officials.

Military Travel Authorization and travel orders are obtained as above under (a) without prior consultation with, and approval by, C-5 Section, A.H.Q.

III. Unofficial civilians (including servants of all diplomatic and consular officials*) whose names are submitted to the Political Section by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The same procedure is followed as under II but Public Safety Sub-Commission, ACC transmits the applications for Military Travel Authorization to Public Safety, Region IV, for screening prior to passing them on to C-5 Section, A.H.Q.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE POLITICAL SECTION, A.C.

On September 15th ult., the Political Section, A.C., informed that in the case of Italian Diplomats appointed abroad, in agreement with the competent Allied Authorities, the M.T.A. was not necessary and that a T.O. issued by the Political Section was sufficient.

To holders of passports on Government service and ordinary passports, the M.T.A. was collatoral.

Subsequently, Major Ballance, of the Public Security Branch, referring to the departure of a group of diplomats appointed to Lisbon, has informed:

1. - that according to the latest information in his possession (dated February 1944) all Allied or neutral Diplomats are exempt from M.T.A., with the exception of Italian Diplomats;
2. - that the forms relative to the M.T.A. cannot be filled and forwarded under the care of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, but must be filled in by the parties concerned in the Office of the Regional Officer (Cent. Baker).
3. - that from the presentation of these forms over 15 days must elapse so as to enable the Intelligence Office (Via Sicilia) to make enquiries.

In this connection the Ministry of Foreign Affairs wishes to point out:

- a) - that there does not seem to be any reason that justifies a discrimination between Italian diplomats and those of other countries, all the more so in view of the fact that the appointment abroad of these Officials is each time decided in agreement with the allied Governments;
- b) - that in previous instances (departure of Vescia for ^{Sicilia} ~~Tunis~~, of Confalonieri for Dublin) no formality of the kind was requested;
- c) - that in view of further movements of Officials it appears necessary and urgent to regulate the matter with the least possible delay.

Consequently, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs would be

2. - that the forms relative to the M.T.A. cannot be filled and forwarded under the care of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, but must be filled in by the parties concerned in the Office of the Regional Officer (Capt. Baker).
3. - that upon the presentation of these forms over 75 days must elapse so as to enable the Intelligence Office (Via Sicilia) to make inquiries.

In this connection the Ministry of Foreign Affairs wishes to point out :

- a) - that there does not seem to be any reason that justifies a discrimination between Italian diplomats and those of other countries, and the more so in view of the fact that the appointment abroad of these officials is each time decided in agreement with the Allied Governments ;
