SUBJECT: Italian Vises for Entry into Italy

TO : Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

1. Certain Italian Missions and Consulates abroad have been granting a certain number of visas for entry into Italy. The competent Allied Authorities wish to emphasize that while the Italian Government, if it so desires to issue these visas for entry into Italy, those visas will not in themselves be accepted as entry permits by the control and security personnel of the competent military authorities sea and air ports.

2. It is requested that the Italian Government instruct these Legations not to issue visas until it has been ascertained by the Legations themselves that the competent military authorities have, in fact, authorized the proposed travel for entry into Italy.

2. G-2 (CI) Section this HQ wish to emphasize that, while the Italian Government may, if it so desires, issue visas for entry into Italy, the visas will not, in themselves, be accepted as entry permits by this HQ's control and security personnel at sea and air ports.

3. It is requested that the Italian Government be advised to instruct its Legations not to issue visas until it has been ascertained by the Legation concerned that AFHQ has in fact authorized the proposed travel to Italy.

1. Reference is made to letter AC/14022/1/PS dated 7 February 1945 from Public Safety Sub-Commission to the Ministry of the Interior (copies to you and to this office).

2. It is considered that this letter may be interpreted by the Ministry as implying that, although the particular applications of ENGLAND and DENMARK have been refused by AFHQ, visas issued by Italian authorities abroad are valid authority for entry into Italy.

3. May it please be made quite clear to the Italians that their visas are not in any case recognised as permits for entering Italy, and that AFHQ is the sole authority for permitting such entry.

TO : Political Section ✓

1. Further to my letter, even number, dated 2 February, 1945, addressed to AFHQ, G-2 Section, copy to you, in which AFHQ were asked whether they were prepared to permit named Swedish nationals, to whom visas to entry Italy had been issued by the Italian Legation in Stockholm, to disembark at Italian ports.

2. AFHQ have now confirmed that the visas granted by the Italian Legation at Stockholm will not be accepted as valid authority for entry into Italy.

3. No form of entry permit to Italy is issuable in Sweden. AFHQ presumes that the individuals in question will travel via the U.K. in which case they will require Allied Force permits issued by the Military Permit Office, London, if they are to visit Italy. It is possible that the Swedish Embassy in London might be able to initiate application for these.

4. May we be advised please as to whether you have received from the Italian Government the assurances asked for in your letter P/505-ki, dated 31 January, 1945. It is considered advisable that these assurances should be given without delay.

SUBJECT : Entry into Italy - Swedish Nationals.

TO : AFHQ, G-2 (C.I) Section.

1. The Ministry of Interior has informed this Headquarters that the legation of Italy at Stockholm has issued visas for entry into Italy to the Swedish Nationals mentioned in paragraph 2 who are on their way to Turkey, and who, it is said, will probably disembark at Italian ports.

2. The persons referred to in paragraph 1 are :-

(a) Percival Calisendorff, agent of the Swedish Society Transitor, and his wife Mariana, in possession of service passport 528 and 529;

(b) Enric Gustaf Dahllof, Swedish Consul at Bucharest, service passport No. 23;

(c) Stig Hagelof, Vice Consul of Sweden at Bucharest, service passport No. 190;

(d) Goesta Mattias Edlund, Swedish Vice Consul at Belgrade, diplomatic passport No. 290;

(e) Torkel Soderstrom, civil engineer, service passport No. 515.

3. Political Section, this Headquarters, under their reference P/505-ki, dated 21 January, 1945, copy to you, requested an assurance from the Italian Government that all applications for permission to travel to Italy from other countries would, in future, be referred in the first instance to Allied Force, Headquarters.

4. Information is requested as to whether you are prepared to prepare to permit any or all of the persons named in paragraph 2 to disembark at Italian ports. On receipt of this information, steps will be taken to press the Italian Government to give the assurance referred to in paragraph 3.

The Political Section of the Allied Commission presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has the honour to state that it has been informed that by a letter dated the 15th November 1944 to the Italian Embassy at Madrid the Ministry authorised the return to Italy of Monsieur Henri Kirchen of Hungarian nationality.

2. The Political Section has been requested to point out to the Ministry that entry into Italy is necessarily controlled by the Allied military authorities for security reasons and that the Ministry should not issue authorisations for persons to travel from other countries to Italy without prior consent of Allied Force Headquarters. In this particular case the Allied authorities have refused permission to Monsieur Kirchen to enter Italy for the present.
3. The Political Section would be grateful if it might be furnished with an assurance that all applications for permission to travel to Italy from other countries will, in future, be referred in the first instance to Allied Force Headquarters.

1. ✓ Reference is made to letter, even number, dated 5 January, 1945, copy to you, in which AFHQ were asked to consider an application to enter Italy which was submitted by the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees on behalf of Henri KIRSCHEN, of Roumanian nationality, who is at present residing at Hotel Palace, Madrid.

2. The Italian Foreign Office, Terza Political Section, authorized the return of Kirschen to Italy under their letter dated 15 November, 1944, which they forwarded to Madrid by pouch.

3. AFHQ have now refused to allow Kirschen to enter Italy for the present, and have confirmed that the Italian Foreign Office has no authority to give permission unilaterally for travel from other countries to Italy. Entry into Italy is controlled by AFHQ.

4. Will you please take up this matter with the Foreign Office and obtain from them an assurance that all applications for permission to travel to Italy from other countries will be referred in the first instance to this Headquarters.

5. May this Sub-Commission be informed of the result of your representations, please.
