DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS OF THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

- 1) - Countries with which diplomatic relations were never interrupted: Argentina, Ireland, Portugal, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, Holy See, Afghanistan.
- 2) - Countries with which diplomatic relations were re-established:
The following countries have communicated to the Italian government their decision to re-establish diplomatic relations: Great Britain, United States, Russia, Poland, China, Brazil, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru¹, Dominican Republic and Venezuela.

(With Peru¹ it was reached an agreement to elevate to Embassies the respective representations).

(The U.S. Secretary of State communicated in date 25 October the American Republics had all agreed, with the exception of Argentina, to re-establish diplomatic relations with the Italian government; relative communications from the governments of Bolivia, Guatemala and Haiti have^{not} arrived yet).
- 3) - Countries which for the present have ~~have~~ a consular representative in Rome: Czechoslovakia, Holland, Belgium.
- 4) - Countries in which the Italian government has diplomatic representatives, but which due to present circumstances have no representative in Rome and with which Italy wishes to have diplomatic relations: Rumania, Bulgaria.

(With the re-establishment of diplomatic relations with the British government it can be assumed that the situation is normal again also with the Dominions. The only exception may be South Africa, with which ~~xx~~ Italy had direct diplomatic relations.)

(Diplomatic relations with Israel were not established yet ~~because~~ ^{although} it is ~~not~~ already formally recognized its independence.)
