SUBJECT: Recognition of Diplomatic Relations  
Between Haiti and Italy.

To : Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

1. With reference to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs' memorandum 6/1280/553 of December 15, Political Section has to state that the assumption of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs that the Haitian Government has shown its willingness to resume diplomatic relations with Italy is correct. In fact, this was made clear in Admiral Stone's letter of October 26 to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs informing the Ministry that all of the American Republics, with the exception of Argentina, have expressed desire to resume relations.

2. Insofar as the specific recognition of relations between Haiti and Italy is concerned, a dispatch has recently been received from the American Embassy at Port-au-Prince that the Haitian Government notified the United States Government on October 25 of its decision to recognize the Italian Government and to request the United States Government to handle Haitian representation in Italy until such time as a Haitian representative might be appointed.

SUBJECT: United States Representation in Italy of Haitian Interests.

With reference to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs' memorandum 6/1280/553 of December 15 to the Political Section, a copy of which has been given to this office, the assumption of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs that the Haitian Government has shown its willingness to resume diplomatic relations with Italy is correct. In fact, this was made clear in Admiral Stone's letter of October 26 to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs informing the Ministry that all of the American Republics, with the exception of Argentina, have expressed desire to resume relations.

Insofar as the specific resumption of relations between Haiti and Italy is concerned, a dispatch has recently been received from the American Embassy at Port-au-Prince that the Haitian Government notified the United States Government on October 25 of its decision to recognize the Italian Government and to request the United States Government to handle Haitian representation in Italy until such time as a Haitian representative might be appointed.


