1. Reference is made to your letter P/387.1. dated 4 December 1944, regarding derequisition of the above property.

2. The property has been derequisitioned this date, the papers having been served on Ing. Gino Puccini, administrator of Soc. Immobiliare Viareggio, on whom the requisition was served on 21st June 1944, and are reported to be the owners of the property. Ing. Puccini stated his company had obtained the property through the Italian Tribunal of Rome and paid the "Pensa del Lavoro" 2,000,000 lire. He also stated the bank had no lien on the property.

3. A letter has been sent to the bank, however, notifying them that we have derequisitioned the property and have no further interest in it.

SUBJECT: Ex Lithuanian Legation at Rome.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, A.P.O. 394

1. Under date of 1 September 1944 (Ref 387) you brought to the attention of this Headquarters a problem which had arisen respecting the ex-Lithuanian legation in Rome, which was then under requisition for use as an Allied Mess. It was determined that no change would be made in the requisition pending advice from the Foreign Office and the State Department, and on 5 September 1944 (Reference G-5: 386.2) you were so advised.

2. On 9 September 1944 General Suslaparov wrote to Commanding General Rome Area Allied Command requesting that he be permitted to occupy the subject premises. General Suslaparov's letter was endorsed to this Headquarters and under date of 22 September 1944 you were again advised to make no change respecting the ex-Lithuanian legation at Rome pending further advice.

3. The views of the Foreign Office and the State Department have been ascertained. It is suggested that the Allied Military authorities should terminate the requisition of the ex Lithuanian legation and withdraw from the premises.

4. It is further suggested that every appearance of turning over the subject premises directly to representatives of the Soviet Union is to be avoided. The notification by the Allied Military authorities of the termination of the requisition should be made to the entity from whom the premises were requisitioned, which is believed to be the Banca del Lavoro. General Suslaparov should merely be informed that Allied Military authorities have vacated the premises, and that the Banca del Lavoro has been so advised.

MEMORANDUM TO: G-5 Section

SUBJECT: Ex-Lithuanian Legation at Rome

Reference is made to Political Section, AGO memorandum (reference 267) of September 1, 1944 and memorandum from this office to G-5 Section, AGO, dated September 13, 1944, both regarding disposition to be made of the ex-Lithuanian Legation at Rome, which the Soviet representative to the Italian Government has requested be placed at his disposal. The Department of State has now informed us in this connection that it is of the opinion that the Allied Military Authorities should terminate the military requisition on this property and withdraw from their present occupation of the Villa, since the Italian Government had in fact recognized Soviet ownership of the former Lithuanian Legation prior to the outbreak of hostilities between Italy and the Soviet Union and since Italian Government has recently confirmed that the property belongs to the Soviet Government.

The Department suggests that in solving this problem the Allied Military Authorities should avoid any appearance of turning the property directly over to the representatives of the Soviet Government. The notification by the Allied Military Authorities of the termination of the military requisition should be made to the entity from whom the villa was originally requisitioned and which is understood to be the Banca del Lavoro.

Finally the Department suggests that in replying to Major General Sushlopov's letter of September 9, he should be informed that the Allied military officers have vacated the premises and that the Banca del Lavoro has been advised of the fact.

1. On 1 September 1944 your letter (Ref. 387) to this Headquarters on the above subject raised certain questions about the disposition of the subject premises. On 5 September 1944 we replied, and suggested that the building remain under requisition pending further instructions.

2. On 9 September 1944 General SUSLOPAROV wrote to CG RAAC requesting that he be permitted to occupy 116 Via Nomentana, the premises in question. By 1st indorsement dated 16 September 1944 General Susloparov's letter was forwarded to this HQ.

3. The correspondence referred to in paragraph 2 has been brought to the attention of the U.S. Political Adviser and the British Resident Minister, and the question will be considered by the State Department and the Foreign Office.

4. Pending further advice it is suggested that no change be made.

Subject : Ex-Lithuanian Legation at Rome

Reference is made to Political Section, ACC memorandum (reference no. 387) of September 1, 1944 regarding the disposition to be made of the ex-Lithuanian Legation at Rome, which the Soviet representative to the Italian Government has requested be placed at his disposal.

This matter was submitted to the Department of State, which has replied that it would prefer that a military requisition be maintained on the building and that if possible the building be occupied by some Allied unit. The Department stated that it desired to avoid, for the time being at least, the second alternative suggested in the Political Section's memorandum under reference, which involved permitting the Italian Government to recognize a right on the part of the Soviet Government to take over property of the Lithuanian State.

We understand that the Political Section, ACC has already been informed of the Department's views in this connection by the Office of the American Representative, Advisory Council for Italy.

1. I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 9 September 1944, in connection with my desire to enter into occupation of the Villa 116 Via Nomentana.

I am very grateful for the explanations which were so kindly accounted in your letter, for I actually had not known the existing regulations established by the Allied Command as regards of the requisition procedure and the utilization of the accommodations.

I would like to inform you that the Villa 116 Via Nomentana is the property of the Soviet State and, consequently, not subject for requisition. This house was bought by the former Lithuanian Government in 1937 at the price 3,000,000 Italian lire with the term of payment till 1966.

As you know in 1940 the Lithuanian State incorporated into the U.S.S.R. and as a result, this Villa, as well as all the values of the Lithuanian State, became the property of the Soviet Union.

By the time of the war between Italy and the U.S.S.R. there had been paid for this Villa by the Soviet Union to the Banco del Lavoro over one million and a half Lire. Naturally when the war started the next payments were discontinued and on this ground the Banco di Lavoro stepped forward again as the owner of the Villa.

At the present time the Italian Government by official letter confirmed that the Soviet Union is the owner of this house. Consequently, there is no doubt that the Villa belongs to the Soviet Union.

Considering all accounted above I kindly request your to undertake all necessary steps before A.C.H.C. with the effect that the Villa 116 Via Nomentana be handed over in my disposal.

5. This property was sold by a notary's deed of the 6th July 1927 to the State of Lithuania represented by the Lithuanian Minister in Italy. After the Russian annexation of Lithuania the estate was transferred in 1941 to the Soviet Government. Subsequently in 1943 at the request on a mortgage on the property appears not to have been paid the holder of the mortgage, namely a branch of the Credito Italiano calls upon Lithuania for payment and a forced sale. As a result, on 17 August 1943 the property passed by decree of transfer to the ownership and possession of the Soviet Institute - Vionagio. This decree was given by the Rome Tribunal.

5. Nam which day L. Montoyer requested the Italian Government that the property should once again be placed at the disposal of the Soviet Representative in the Italian Government. The Italian Government for their part are ready and anxious to comply with this request. In the meantime however Allied forces have occupied the building and installed a garrison. From the telegram received A.S.I. under reference it appears that Allied troops will only be in the building until the 10th September. It is therefore a matter of urgency to know what will be said to the Soviet Representative about the possibility of his taking over the building after that date.

4. There are broadly two alternatives: (a) the requisition on the building can be maintained in which case some other Allied unit should be installed in this property for housing or other purposes; (b) the requisition on the property can be cancelled in which case it is clear that the Italian Government will make arrangements to hand it over to the Soviet Representative. If course (b) is followed, it will be appreciated that we shall have invited the Italian Government to

2. The soldier (B) in charge stated that by 3 Sept 44 they will have moved out but that there were some Italian civilians living on the third floor.
3. From what Major General Susloparov said the Russians expect to begin cleaning and repairing the place as soon as it has been evacuated by the British.
4. He asked that we (ACC) notify the Italians to move right away.
5. What should be the position of ACC in the matter?

MEMO TO: Colonel Densmore

SUBJECT: Property at 116 Via Nomentana

I saw Colonel Camrass, Real Estate Officer RAAC, today and he stated that AAI were moving out of the property on the 7th of September. He checked with AAI regarding the "political implications" and AAI stated that as far as they are concerned they have no further interest in whatever disposition is made of the property. Colonel Camrass stated that his inclination would be to de-requisition the property, thus turning its control back to the Italian Government, and let them make disposition. However, Colonel Camrass said that AFHQ has stated that all property occupied by AAI will be "frozen" in its present status and that no change will be made without approval of AFHQ. Therefore we must look to them before anything further can be done.

1. In a phone conversation on 10 August it was requested that information be furnished on the question of the Villa at 116 Via Montenapoleone.

2. The reason for the request was the desire expressed by the Italian Government to return it to the Soviet Representative, since the building which had been the Lithuanian Legation was in 1941 transferred to the Soviet Government.

3. On August 10 the reply was given that the Villa at present contained an officers' mess of A. L. M. G. and that the question of their departure would be looked into. Since then nothing further has been heard.

4. Since then the matter has become more pressing and it is requested that the situation be clarified at the earliest possible date.

A few days ago M. Kostylev informed me that the former residence of the Lithuanian Legation at 116, Via Nazionale, which in 1941 had been transferred to the Soviet Government, had subsequently been occupied by Offices of the Ministry of the Interior, adding, at the same time, that he would much appreciate if the building could once more be placed at the disposal of the Soviet Representative with the Italian Government.

In accordance with M. Kostylev's wishes, our Ministry approached the Ministry of the Interior, and we were assured that the latter had given instructions to vacate the Villa. Meanwhile, however it appears that British Forces have occupied it for the purpose of installing there a military mess.

I should much appreciate, dear Admiral, if you would kindly consider the possibility of your intervention in order that the Villa might be abandoned by the occupying forces and returned to the Soviet Representative.
