SUBJECT: Petroleum Supplies

TO: ~~Governors, National City~~

1. My telephone message of your 297 of 31 January 43, in which you request that the existing allocation of petroleum products being made to the National City for automotive purposes may be substantially increased. In effect your request, if granted, would result in the gasoline being increased from 25,000 liters to 67,000 liters, the kerosene from 1200 gals. to 3200 gals., with a small reduction in the diesel from 22,000 gals. to 23,000 gals.

2. It will be recalled that in my previous communication to you in regard to the justification of this very substantial increase in the volume of gasoline and kerosene being made available to the National City for automotive purposes, it is suggested that the right to increase the supply of these products, namely, kerosene and gasoline, should be given to the National City through the direct control of private individuals, and that the right to increase the supply of these products should be given to the National City through the direct control of the National City. It is believed that the oil allocation made by the National City for automotive purposes should be divided into groups according to type such as motorcycles, cars, and trucks of various carrying capacity.

3. It is also noted from your letter under reply that the requirements of the National City have increased from 300,000 liters to 700,000 liters of gasoline and from 7000 gals. to 12000 gals. of diesel, whereas it is understood that the number of vehicles has been reduced from 100 to about 60. It would be appreciated, therefore, if some brief explanation could be given of the increased activities of this organization which have resulted or are expected to result in this very substantial increase, the more so as it is believed that the oil allocation originally made by the National City for automotive purposes should be divided into the figures indicated in your letter.

4. You state that the existing allocation of gasoline is 67,000 gals., which does not agree with the figure of 22,000 gals. understood to be the part of the total allocation of 67,000 gals. which is used for automotive purposes and it is requested that you will kindly check this figure and advise whether it is correct or not. If the figure is correct, there will also be a substantial increase in your diesel requirements.

We would like to make it clear that it is not the wish of this headquarters to restrict the activities of the Vatican by refusing supplies of petroleum products if they can be made available, but, as you are aware, we are experiencing difficulty in getting these products into the district and the measures for which you are asking will have to be justified by this headquarters as a higher authority.

SUBJECT: Apostolic Nunciature in Belgrade

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394.

Reference your 397 of 21 Oct 44.

1. A similar note to that addressed by the Secretary of State of His Holiness to the Personal Representative of the United States of America on the subject of the protection of the Apostolic Nunciature was addressed to Sir D'Arcy Osborne, British Minister to the Vatican.

2. It has been suggested that since there are no Allied troops (Allied in the sense of Anglo-American) in the neighborhood of Belgrade and since therefore there is nothing AFHQ could effectively do to protect the Nunciature, the Secretary of State of His Holiness should be advised to make his request to the Yugoslav Representative at the Vatican.

3. It may be that the Vatican does not perhaps realize that as the result of the recent agreement between Dr Subasic, Prime Minister of the Royal Yugoslav Government and Marshal Tito, C-in-C of the Yugoslav Army of National Liberation, the Partisan forces in Yugoslavia are now recognized by the Royal Government as the Yugoslav national forces. It should therefore be possible for the Yugoslav Delegate at the Vatican to seek information regarding the condition of the Nunciature, since Belgrade is now liberated, through the Royal Yugoslav Government to the Partisan Headquarters.

INSTRUCTIONS TO LIAISON DIVISION FOR DEALING WITH MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE VATICAN

Under existing instructions the channel of communication between the military authorities and the Vatican State is through the Charge d'Affairs, United States of America to the Holy See and the British Minister to the Holy See. It has further been laid down by A.S.I. that Vatican questions relating to the position of the civilian population should be dealt with by the Allied Control Commission, i.e. non-military matters. The Liaison Division of the Commission is the agency through which these affairs will be handled in the Commission.

The great mass of the matters to be dealt with are of a routine nature involving travel facilities, automobile licensing, gasoline and lubricants, food and materials, etc., and the Liaison Division will be responsible for following these matters through. This Division will have no policy functions with respect to Vatican affairs: It will carry out the policies communicated to it by the appropriate Section of the Commission.

The Liaison Division may deal directly with officials of the Vatican State in routine matters only where such direct communication has been specifically authorized. This authorization shall not extend to the arrangement of audiences with the Pope. The Division will concern itself only with matters pertaining to officials, citizens, institutions and property of the Vatican State. Ecclesiastics who are citizens of the Italian State and church institutions and property which are not the property of the Vatican will be dealt with directly by Allied Military Government in the field and by the Italian Government in territory under its control in the same manner as other individuals and property.

Relations of military formations with the Vatican are handled direct between the diplomatic missions to the Vatican and AFHQ, AAI and the Rome Allied Area Command as prescribed by letter 2052/02, 10 August 1944, HQ AAI to the diplomatic mission concerned.

1. With reference to cables in cipher received by C. & W. or R.C.A. from neutral governments to their representatives in the Vatican.
2. It is agreed that a right is established for the "stopping" of such messages and that the directive A.F. 311/043 B-0 of 22 Aug 44 gives such authority.
3. It is considered however that as such messages can be sent by radio direct to the Vatican City radio station there is little point in actually enforcing such a "stop".
4. It is therefore agreed that messages in cipher received by C. & W. or R.C.A. shall be passed to the Cable Censorship before being sent forward. Cable Censorship shall release such messages after they have had a photograph taken of them. These photographs will be forwarded to the Foreign Office, London, by G-2 (CC) to whom ACC, Communications Sub-Commission, should pass them.

Subject: News Outlets for Vatican.

By virtue of its neutral status the Vatican maintains press and radio services independent of PWB control.

Despite its neutrality the Vatican has a primary interest in Italy. While it keeps formally aloof from Italian politics, it can exercise a significant influence by means of special announcements, messages, sermons, etc. It is interested in securing the widest possible circulation for them.

PWB controls news dissemination in Italy proper. It would seem advisable to inform the Vatican authorities of the nature and possibilities of these facilities with a view to making them available for Vatican statements and announcements. Any material used over PWB radio and press networks would, of course, come under the normal PWB directives, and would thus be useful both to ourselves and to the Vatican.

In order to acquaint the Vatican authorities with the possibilities in this field it seems desirable that closer contact should be established.

We therefore propose, subject to your approval, to establish through Mr. Tittman contact with the Papal Secretary of State in order to inform him of the news facilities which might be available under proper control to the Holy See.

Agwar reports following recommendations made after conference with prominent Catholics:

(a) Liaison party between military Governor in Italy and Vatican should contain at least one U. S. Catholic layman. Captain Donald Sheehan, Headquarters 15th Air Force has been suggested as suitable. He is thought to be now in Naples.

(b) Officials of the Vatican should be informed of the efforts being made by Allied armies to save historic monuments and arts as well as church property in Italy from damage. It is suggested that Vatican authorities be furnished with a copy of Italian Atlas ASF Manual M 353-17.

Please consider and report what action you take.

Paraphrase of message from ACC to AFHQ for G-5, U.S. Political
Adviser and British Resident Minister (M251, 14 June 1944)

From local military and political viewpoints it appears that first suggestion in your F55892 would not be necessary. Five and Eight Army commanders have received instructions from Hq AAI that all dealings with the Vatican should be through Allied diplomatic representatives and since latter seem able to handle such dealings it would not appear desirable to have further personnel, especially military, in Rome. Both Tittman and Osborne, having been at the Vatican for some time, are thoroughly familiar with Vatican procedure and are in addition well known to authorities of the Vatican. I shall ~~not~~ therefore, unless considerations outside Italy are of greater importance, implement the first suggestion.

Regarding second proposal I shall ask that there be given to Vatican authorities the substance of Hq AAI directives on the occupation of Rome and on the preservation of Vatican and other religious property (conveyed in your F41945 and previous), in addition to documents and instructions issued by Monuments and Fine Arts Sub-commission to guide regional commissioners and commanders of operations in Italy. AFS Manual M353-17 will, as suggested, be given to Vatican authorities via diplomatic channels.

It would be appreciated if you would inform the British Minister of the contents of this Memorandum.

OCCUPATION AND PRESERVATION OF VATICAN AND OTHER RELIGIOUS PROPERTY

I. VATICAN CITY STATE

(1) This will be accorded the normal rights of a neutral and will be treated as an independent neutral state.

(2) Every precaution against violating the territory of the Vatican City State will be taken by Allied Forces.

(3) Pickets will be posted on the boundaries of the Vatican City State to ensure that its neutrality is respected. This will be done by agreement with the Vatican authorities (see also II below)

(4) The territory of the Vatican City State is defined by Article 3 AD Annex 1 of the Lateran Treaty of the 12 February 1929.

II. VATICAN PROPERTY IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE VATICAN CITY STATE

(1) There are a number of churches and buildings in Rome outside the boundaries of the Vatican City State, which are the property of the Vatican. Although these have no international status as neutral territory they are entitled to full diplomatic immunity under the Lateran Treaty. Such buildings and churches will be treated in exactly the same manner as the Vatican City State, except that during the assault on Rome the diplomatic immunity of these Vatican properties will not be allowed to interfere with military operations, bombing, artillery fire, etc.

(2) Pickets will, after occupation, be posted at the entrance to these buildings, and suitable notices posted warning troops that these are Vatican Property and may not be entered. This must be done in agreement with the Vatican authorities. This (and in I (1) above) will be the responsibility of the Army Commander concerned until the responsibility can be handed over to the Commanding General Rome.

(3) A list of Vatican Property in Rome outside the City State is given in Appendix A to this instruction.

III. VATICAN PROPERTY OUTSIDE ROME

5918

(1) All other Vatican property throughout Italy will be accorded the treatment of property of a neutral state in foreign territory.

(2) Except in the case of urgent military necessity no Vatican property, or property which existing occupants claim to be the

property of the Vatican, will be requisitioned or converted to military use without the authority in writing of this Headquarters.

(3) In the case of urgent military necessity the procedure set down in Administrative Instruction No. 10, para 3, for Historical Buildings will be adopted. (This Administrative Instruction is reprinted in the Allied Control Commission lists of protected monuments).

(4) At Appendix B is given a list of Vatican Property outside Rome which is of special religious and historical significance; these require special efforts to preserve them from damage.

IV. RELIGIOUS PROPERTY OTHER THAN VATICAN PROPERTY

(1) Religious property other than Vatican property, if essential for military operations, may be occupied. Churches are subject to special provisions, see sub-paragraph (3) below.

(2) All questions relating to requisition or occupation of religious property will in every case be referred to this Headquarters.

(3) Churches may only be used in cases of extreme necessity, temporarily to shelter wounded personnel awaiting evacuation as set out in Administrative Instruction No. 10, paragraph 3.

V. GENERAL

(1) It will be noted that authorities referred to in paragraphs III (2) and IV (2) above can only be granted, if at all, after prior approval, as approval has to be obtained from the Combined Chiefs of Staff, and is outside the power of this Headquarters.

(2) All uses of properties dealt with in this instruction under whatever degree of military urgency, will be reported to this Headquarters immediately, for notification to the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

It is requested that you take up with the Allied diplomatic representatives to the Vatican the communication to Vatican authorities of the substance of Headquarters Allied Armies in Italy Directive No. 2030/18/1/Q2 dated May 27, 1944, a copy of which is understood to be in the hands of the Commanding General City Administration Section, Fifth Army, as well as the delivery in your discretion of the various pamphlets referred to above.

In this connection, it has been suggested that Lieutenant Perry B. Cott, U.S.N.R. of the Monuments and Fine Arts Sub-Commission, who is now in Rome at Palazzo Assicurazione, Venezia, be consulted for background information of use in presenting to the Vatican authorities these documents as indicative of the efforts made by Allied authorities to spare historic monuments in Italy from destruction. In addition, the Chief of the Sub-commission, Major E. T. De Wald, expects shortly to be in Rome and would be glad to provide any supplementary information which may be desirable.

1. This instruction, issued in conformity with an AFHQ directive, deals with the occupation and preservation of Vatican and other Religious Property and will be in conjunction with this HQ letter 66/G(Ops) dated 13 Dec43 and Adm Instruction N°. 10. All other instructions on the above subject are cancelled, including:-

(a) AFHQ signal 48057 of Feb44, addressed FLAMBO, rptd FATIMA Rear and FARGO,

(b) AFHQ Adv Adm Echelon letter 30/18/Q2 dated 12 Feb 44, addressed ACMF, Fifth Army, Fifth Army (Br.Incr), Eighth Army, N°.2 District, N°.3 District, CG. PBS, copy to G(SD), "A" and Claims and Hirings,

(c) Appendices "A" and "B" to HQ ACMF letter 66/G(Ops) dated 13 dec 43. These appendices were issued to Fifth Army, Eighth Army and AFHQ Adv Adm Echelon on 4 Feb 44.

2. VATICAN CITY STATE

(a) This will be accorded the normal rights of a neutral and will be treated as an independent neutral state. ⁵⁰⁷³

(b) Every precaution against violating the territory of the Vatican City State will be taken by Allied Forces.

2

(c) Pickets will be posted on the boundaries of the Vatican City State to ensure that its neutrality is respected. This will be done by agreement with the Vatican authorities (see also (d) below).

(d) The territory of the Vatican City State is defined by Article 3 AD Annexe One of the Lateran Treaty of the 12 Feb 1929.

3.- VATICAN PROPERTY IN ROME OUTSIDE THE VATICAN CITY STATE

(a) There are a number of churches and buildings in ROME outside the boundaries of the Vatican City State, which are the property of the Vatican. Although these have no international status as neutral territory they are entitled to full diplomatic immunity under the Lateran Treaty. Such buildings and churches will be treated in exactly the same manner as the Vatican City State, except that during the assault on ROME the diplomatic immunity of these Vatican properties will not be allowed to interfere with military operations, bombing, artillery fire etc.

(b) Pickets will, after occupation, be posted at the entrances to these buildings, and suitable notices posted warning troops that these are Vatican Property and may not be entered. This must be done in agreement with the Vatican authorities. This (and in 2 (a) above will be the responsibility of the Army Commander concerned until the responsibility can be handed over to the CG. ROME.

(c) A list of Vatican Property in ROME outside the City State is given in Appendix "A" to this instruction.

4. VATICAN PROPERTY OUTSIDE ROME.

(a) All other Vatican property throughout ITALY will be accorded the treatment of property of a neutral state in foreign territory.

(b) Except in the case of urgent military necessity no Vatican property, or property which existing occupants claim to be the property of the Vatican, will be requisitioned or converted to military use without the authority in writing of this HQ.

(c) In the case of urgent military necessity the procedure laid down in Administrative Instruction No. 10, para 3, for Historical Buildings will be adopted. (This Administrative Instruction is reprinted in the Allied Control Commission lists of Protected Monuments).

(d) At Appendix "B" is given a list of Vatican Property outside

ROME, which is of special religious and historical significance; these require special efforts to preserve them from damage.

IV 5.- RELIGIOUS PROPERTY OTHER THAN VATICAN PROPERTY

(a) Religious property other than Vatican property, if essential for military operations, may be occupied. Churches are subject to special provisions, see sub-para (c) below.

(b) All question relating to requisition or occupation of religious property will in every case be referred to this HQ.

(c) Churches may only be used in cases of extreme necessity, temporarily to shelter wounded personnel awaiting evacuation as set out in Adm Instruction No. IO, para 3.

V 6.- GENERAL

(a) It will be noted that authorities referred to in paras 4(b) and 5(b) above can only be granted, if at all, after certain delay, as approval has to be obtained from the Combined Chiefs of Staff, and is outside the power of this HQ.

(b) All uses of properties dealt with in this instruction, under whatever degree of military urgency, will be reported to this HQ immediately, for notification to the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

MEMORANDUM TO: The Chief Commissioner

In connection with the anticipated arrival of Allied troops in Rome, it seems to us that certain aspects of relations with the Vatican may not have been properly presented to the Commanders in the field. As far as can be ascertained, various Liaison officers have been attached to the different units who will in all probability endeavor to establish their own channels of communication or direct contact with the Papal authorities. Under these circumstances there will inevitably be considerable confusion and possible conflicting demands made of the Vatican.

The United States and British Governments have their own representatives there who are both senior officials with long years of experience in the Vatican and of dealing with Vatican problems. Would it not be better, therefore, if, as was done with respect to Vatican property, clear directives could be issued to all units informing them of the presence in the Vatican City of the British Minister and the U. S. Charge d'Affaires, and instructing the Commanders that all dealings with the Vatican authorities should be carried on through these properly-accredited representatives of the two Governments? If you are seeing General Alexander tomorrow, you might wish to discuss this matter with him.



SUBJECT: Threatened Reprisals for Treatment of Fascists.

1. For your information and such action as you may consider proper, a paraphrase of the State Department's telegram No. 147, dated December 15, transmitting a message received from Tbilisi at the Vatican City is cited below:

"My British colleague and I have been requested by the Cardinal Secretary of State to recommend to our respective Governments that an official anti-Fascist in liberated areas of Italy circumspection be used, since the Fascist Government can take reprisals against anti-Fascists held as hostages in Northern Italy. The threat of such reprisals has been presented rather forcefully to the Cardinal Secretary of State."

2. The Civil Affairs Section would appreciate receiving an indication of your reaction on this subject.

Following paraphrase of message (# 311) from CCS is forwarded for your information and guidance; CINC MED and SAC also being informed.

Transmitted for your guidance are the following views of the Governments of the United States and United Kingdom, as to the treatment to be accorded the Vatican City, State and Vatican property.

- a. The Vatican City, State will be accorded the normal rights of a neutral and treated as an independent neutral state.
- b. Every precaution to avoid violating the territory of the Vatican City must be taken by the Allied Forces. Article III, Annex 1 of the Lateran Treaty of the 11th February 1921, defines the territory of the Vatican City.
- c. A number of other churches and buildings in Rome outside the boundaries of the Holy City, but which are on the property of the Holy See, as defined in Articles XIII - XVI and Annexes 2 and 3 of Lateran Treaty, also must be avoided by Allied Troops. Many buildings are not a part of the Vatican City, and, strictly speaking, have no international status as neutral territory. However these properties are entitled to full diplomatic immunity under the Lateran Treaty, and therefore must be treated in exactly the same way as the Vatican City itself after the assault on Rome. Although during the assault on Rome every precaution to avoid violating the territory of the Vatican City must be taken, the diplomatic immunity of Vatican properties located in Rome should

not be allowed to interfere with military operations, bombing, artillery fire, etc., during the assault. A complete list of these properties will be transmitted to you.

d. Pickets should be posted at the boundaries of the Vatican City State, to insure that its neutrality is respected. This should be done by agreement with the Vatican authorities. The buildings described in "c" above also should have pickets posted at their entrances, and troops should be warned that these properties, although lying outside the Vatican City, belong to the Holy See and are to be accorded the same immunities as the Vatican City itself after the period of the assault. Through arrangements with the Vatican these buildings should be clearly marked so that Allied Troops can easily identify them."

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
