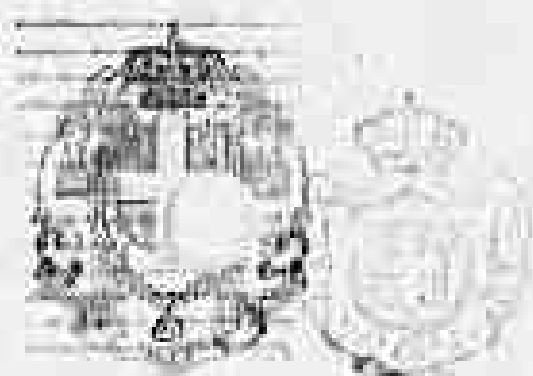

We attach a copy of a memorandum addressed to the Political Section of the Control Commission by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs on February 14th last requesting authorisation for the repatriation to Italy of a Mr. Piero Marchiori. The Political Section referred the request to us and asked our advice as to what reply should be given. At the same time they informed us that they were able to confirm that reliable officials such as Mr. Marchiori were badly needed in the South of Italy at the present moment.

2. We referred the enquiry to the Foreign Office from whom we have now received a telegram stating that the C.G.C.-I.C.C. East Africa, where Mr. Marchiori is interned, reports that there is no security objection to his repatriation. The Foreign Office ask us to report, however, whether the interested sections at A.F.D. would agree to his being repatriated. We should therefore be grateful for your comments.

3. If you see no objection to the repatriation we will inform the Foreign Office and the War Office will then try to arrange transport to Italy. We would at the same time inform the Political Section of the Control Commission, to whom we are sending a copy of this memorandum, to enable them to inform the Italian Government.

Dear Caccia,

The Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War has been approached by the Ministry for Finances with a view to obtaining the repatriation of Sig. Piero Marchiori, official of the Bank of Italy, who was attached to the Harrar Branch and is at present a civil internee in Africa (Tess. E. 21378 - Internment Camp n. 6 - Uganda).

The R. Ministry for Finances have pointed out that Sig. Marchiori is a particularly competent and much appreciated element, on whose work the Bank, at present short of specialised officials, relies for important and manifold banking operations.

It being question of a civil internee, the High Commissioner for Prisoners of War has accordingly asked us to approach the A.C.C. in the matter.

The case of Sig. Piero Marchiori has already formed the subject of two Memoranda, n. 591 of February 14th ult. and n. 1157 of March 9th addressed to the A.C.C. by the R. Ministry for Foreign Affairs. I might add that he is the brother of an official of this Royal Ministry, Sig. Carlo Marchiori, who arrived in Brindisi last October from Rome after having crossed the lines. Notwithstanding many efforts, Sig. Carlo Marchiori has not been able, after seven months in liberated territory,

to receive any news of his interned brother : all his letters have remained unanswered.

The Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs present their compliments to the Allied Control Commission and beg to consider what follows:

It has been requested to provide for repatriation of Mr. PIERO MARCHIORI, born in 1911, an official of the "Banca d'Italia" previously serving at the branch of Harar (Ethiopia).

Mr. Marchiori was in Harar at the moment the city was occupied by the British troops. Mr. Marchiori's family (wife and a baby) was repatriated, while he was interned.

His 1st internment Camp address was:

Tess. E. 21378 - Internment Camp N. 6 - UGANDA -

Mr. Marchiori's repatriation is asked on account of his being a particularly able official whose work has been requested by the "Banca d'Italia" which, at this moment, needs in South Italy a competent staff.

Mr. Marchiori has never been involved in political entanglements and his family is entirely loyal to the Royal Government.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs heartily point the above matter out to the attention of the Allied Control Commission and await a kind answer to the subject.
