MEMORANDUM FOR THE POLITICAL SECTION A.C.

On occasion of the departure for Lisbon on October 2nd ult., of a group of diplomatic officials appointed to posts in Spain and Portugal, the luggage of said officials that had been transported from Rome by lorry, was loaded on a barge that carried it on board the ship.

It was found on arrival that a small trunk destined to the Counsellor of the Italian Embassy in Madrid, Signor Mascia, was missing. The trunk was clearly labelled with the following address: "Comm. Luigi Mascia, U. Legazione, Madrid".

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be grateful if the A.C. will interest the Command of the Allied Police of Naples Harbour in carrying out the necessary enquiries in order to trace the said trunk should it have been lost before loaded on boardship.

1. There is no objection at this Headquarters to the proposed transfers. A list of Italians for repatriation from Spain, totalling over 100, is in course of preparation and to this will be added the names of Commandatore Ottaviani, la Terza and Signor Lucioli. Don Antonio Sanfelice and his wife and child are already on this list.

2. The Office of the British Resident Minister is proposing to arrange sea transportation and probably an Italian cruiser will collect the party at Gibraltar.

3. The journey of Signor Mascia from Rome to Madrid is also authorized and the same procedure should be adopted as outlined in our letter 091.112-31 dated 24 August concerning Signor Pannelli's journey.
