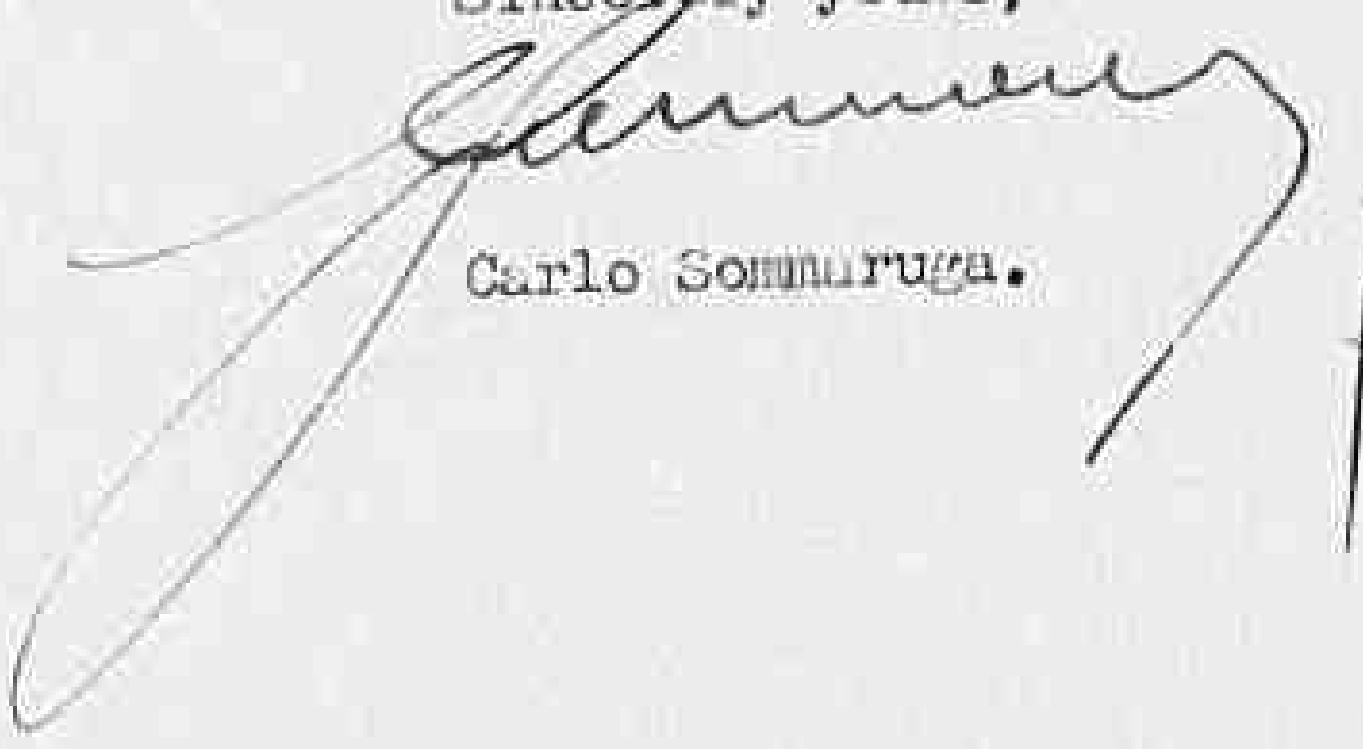

MEMORANDUM TO: Acting Chief Commissioner, Hq A.C.C.

SUBJECT: Marchese Giacomo MEDICI del VASCHELLO.

The Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs in a conversation early in August brought to my attention the case of Marchese Giacomo Medici del Vascello who desires to have his frozen bank account released. Since that time the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on several occasions has questioned me concerning him. I consulted Colonel Grafton-Smith, who provided me with the attached memorandum from the Director of the Security Branch, Hq A.C.C. From this it appears that Marchese Medici del Vascello has had the distinguished career of diplomacy, finance and engineering and that he was also a strong adherent to the Fascist Party and a co-laborer of Mussolini. It appears also that he did some good work in the educational field and probably in some charitable enterprises. At any rate his personal fortune is valued at six hundred million lire.

Colonel Grafton-Smith and I are in agreement that this matter should be handled with some delicacy and on the highest plane and it is felt that perhaps you might wish to discuss the present standing of Marchese Giacomo Medici del Vascello before any definite answer is taken in his case.

SUBJECT: Derequisition of Automobile

TO : Commanding General, Allied Force Headquarters

1. I am transmitting a copy of a communication received from the Swiss Legation in Rome by the Political Section of the Allied Commission. The vehicle referred to is one of the six selected by a representative of AFHQ from among the requisitioned cars in the Commission Headquarters Pool and transferred with a view to its being derequisitioned by the United States and rerequisitioned by the British.

2. In the circumstances, I feel that it would be well to return this vehicle and to select another in its place. The question of its status can then be gone into by the Commission and any resultant political difficulties overcome.

3. At the time that the selection was made, I raised the point that the status of this car was not clear and that it may have to be derequisitioned and returned to the custody of the Swiss Legation.

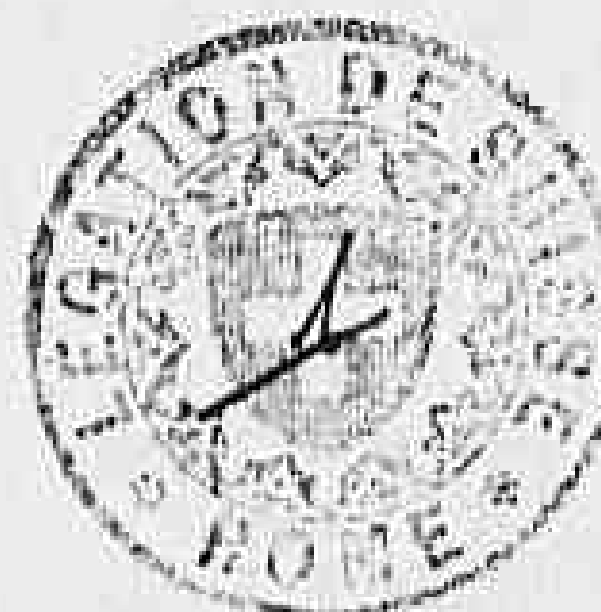

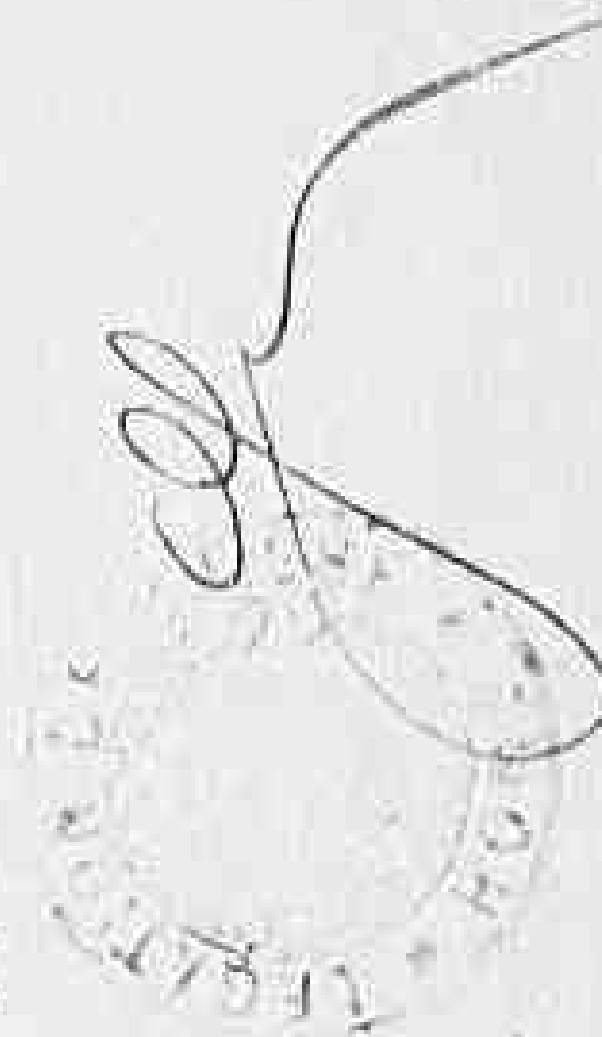

The British Consul-General at Leopoldville has received an application from Dr. Luca Germain David Menorini, an Italian subject aged 47, residing in the Congo, for permission to return to Italy with his wife.

3. Dr. Menorini went to the Congo in 1927 to join the Congo Medical Service and has been in their employ ever since. He was never in sympathy with the Fascist regime and there is evidence that he made his views known to the British Consul-General in 1940. He has also been, during the war years, in correspondence with Count Sforza and Alberto Siano. He states that he would place his services at the disposal of the co-belligerent Italian Government if he were allowed to return to Italy.

5. Dr. Menorini is entitled to a return passage for himself and his wife from the Congo Government and he states that he has 190,000 francs in his account at the Banque Congo Belge as well as other assets in the Congo. The Congo Government, who have continued to employ his services throughout the war, have informed him that they are willing to consider the termination of his colonial contract if he is permitted by the Allies to return to Italy.

4. We should be glad to learn whether, provided that transport is available, there would be any objection to Dr. Menorini's return to Italy.

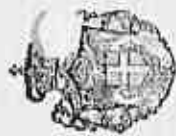
