Liberati will remain in Madrid pending other arrangements for his travel.

It will have been noted that as a result of our representations the Italian authorities have agreed to recall Liberati to Italy in telegram No. 20 to Madrid of the 5th February, and that in telegram No. 52 of the 19th February from Madrid the Italian Ambassador reported that Liberati was ready to leave at once. In case he has second thoughts the Ministry of Foreign Affairs are anxious that transportation should be arranged with as little delay as possible, and have asked us to do anything that we can to expedite matters.

2. This request is brought to your attention in case it may be thought to the Allied interest in this particular case to waive certain requirements normally desired for the repatriation to Italy of Italian staff abroad.

There are enclosed copies of ten telegrams to the Italian Embassy, Madrid, nos. 11, 12, 13, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26; four telegrams for the Italian Legation at Bern, nos. 10, 11, 12 and 13; four telegrams for the Italian Embassy at Buenos Aires, nos. 5, 6, 7, 8; and one telegram for the Italian Legation at Lisbon, no. 9.

You will note that included among the Madrid telegrams are instructions ordering Liberati to report to the Foreign Ministry. I am informed that the cordial tone of the personal message from Prunas was dictated by the desire to persuade him to come to Southern Italy instead of rallying to the Republican Fascist Government.

The Italian Government has particularly asked that telegram no. 13 to Bern should be forwarded urgently. It requests the urgent intervention of the protecting power on behalf of Italian prisoners of war transferred to French control in North Africa. It will be recalled that the Italian Government has previously asked that this question be examined by Allied Force Headquarters.

It will be appreciated if copies of these messages could be down to the British Resident Minister's office before dispatch and if attention could be drawn to the fact that in paragraph 3 of telegram no. 11 to Madrid, the Italian Government has recalled Signor Cabalzer to Italy.

SUBJECT: Funds advanced to Italian Ambassador at Madrid.

The American Embassy in Madrid has sent the following telegram to the Department:

"Today February 3 the Embassy advanced to the Italian Ambassador the sum of 562,500 pesetas, representing the proceeds of a draft for \$51,472.81 as one half of his January requirements. This reduced figure follows from disallowance of amounts requested for the maintenance of Italian cultural institutions and schools in Tangier and Spain, and the suspension of the amount requested for the maintenance of the Consulate General at Barcelona pending the removal of Liberati from that post.

The British Embassy, with reference to the latter consideration, is unwilling to hold up funds for Barcelona in the absence of instructions and particularly since he believes, as I myself do, that the Italian Ambassador is doing everything possible to remove Liberati. It is clear, however, that the advance of funds for this purpose by the British will not nullify the effect of our withholding similar funds but will at the same time create an impression of disunity which would be unfortunate.

"Accordingly I urge that unless Liberati can be recalled immediately by the Italian Government or unless the British Embassy here can be instructed

at once to withhold funds for Barcelona pending Liberati's removal, I be authorized to advance an additional 26,500 pesetas for the January needs of the Barcelona Consulate General to the Italian Ambassador; this to be with the understanding of course that I remain convinced that he is continuing to exert all possible pressure to effect the removal of Liberati from Barcelona."

Subject: Removal of Italian Consul General at Barcelona.

With reference to this office's memorandum to you of January 18, 1944 on this subject, the following telegram has now been received from the Department of State: (No. 336, January 31, 1944).

"On the basis of reports received from the American Consulate General in Barcelona which demonstrated a doubtful loyalty to the present Italian Government on the part of the Italian Consul General Liberati, as well as the lack of any desire on his part to cooperate with the American and British Consuls in that city, the Department instructed the American Ambassador in Madrid to inform his Italian colleague that no further funds could be made available to the Italian Consulate General in Barcelona as long as Liberati remained in charge and until he was replaced by a consular officer of unquestioned loyalty to the cause of the United Nations and to the Italian Government. Madrid's reply to the Department was communicated to you.

"It is requested that you inform the Italian Government that if it is desired that the Italian Consulate General in Barcelona continue to receive financial support from the Government of the United States, immediate steps should be taken to remove or suspend Liberati as recommended by the Italian Ambassador at Madrid."

Sir:

Information has been received from the American Ambassador in Madrid to the effect that the Italian Ambassador has recommended the recall to Brindisi of Liberati, Italian Consul General at Barcelona. At the time the message was sent, the Italian Ambassador had received no reply from the Italian Government in this respect, but the American Ambassador has been instructed, pending the removal of Liberati, to advance no further funds for the maintenance of the Italian Consul General.

In this connection I have been further informed that as a result of an estimate submitted by the American Ambassador at Madrid on December 1, 1943, the latter was authorized during December to advance to the Italian Ambassador for his December allotment a total of 1,250,000 pesetas, which represented 50% of the Ambassador's estimate. The remaining half is to be advanced by the British Government. The total December estimate includes expenses of the Italian Embassy in Madrid, dependent offices in Spanish territory, and expenses of the Italian Consul General in Tangier.

So far the Italian Ambassador has received no reply from his Government. The American Ambassador in Madrid has in the meantime been instructed by the Department of State to advance no further funds for the maintenance of the Italian Consulate General in Barcelona pending the removal of Liberati.

As stated in my letter of December 31 forwarded through Marchioni and in my letter of January 19, immediate recall of Liberati to Italy is urgently needed. American Embassy inform me today on instructions from their Government that recall should take place immediately. British Embassy are also pressing for this measure.
